(2) Where any such beeswax is delivered by a beekeeper other-wise than free-on-rail as aforesaid, the maximum price shall be 2s. per pound, increased by a proportionate part of the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by him in effecting delivery to the purchaser, and then reduced by a proportionate part of the amount of the charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the beeswax free-on-rail as aforesaid.
