Price Order No. 142, Amendment No. 6 (Apples and Pears)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 142, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 142† (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").
2. This Order shall come into force on the 30th day of August, 1943.
3. The First Schedule to the principal Order, as set out in Price Order No. 142, Amendment No. 5‡, is hereby revoked and the following Schedule substituted therefor:—

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it has been found desirable for the use, convenience, and enjoyment of the Wellington - New Plymouth Railway to take further land at Otaki in addition to land previously acquired for the purposes of the said railway:

Now, therefore, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections thirty-four and two hundred and sixteen of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes above mentioned.

Being Lots 28 and 29, D.P. 633, and being part Hanganoaibo No. 1 Block.

Situated in Block IX, Waitohu Survey District, Borough of Otaki.
