## ADDITIONAL STATUTE

SEAL OF THE ORDER

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, to all to whom these Presents shall come.

Greeting!

WHEREAS by the Fifty-second and last Clause of the Statutes of the Most Recites Statutes, EXCELLENT ORDER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE bearing date the Thirtieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, power was reserved to the Sovereign of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with the same or any part thereof by a notification under the Royal Sign Manual.

30th July, 1937.

And whereas We deem it expedient to make some alterations in the Twentyfirst, Thirty-sixth and Fortieth of the aforesaid Statutes.

WE therefore in pursuance and in exercise of the power so vested in Us do annul the said Twenty-first, Thirty-sixth and Fortieth of the aforesaid Statutes, and the same are hereby annulled accordingly; and in lieu thereof We have made, ordained and established and by these Presents sealed with the Seal of the Order, do make, ordain and establish the following Statutes:-

XXI.
