The Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941, Variation No. 26

The principal Order is varied as follows—namely, the provisions of the principal Order shall not apply to a worker coming within the scope of any of the awards specified in the following Schedule in respect of any occasion when such worker having worked for twenty-four hours (inclusive of intervals for meals), or all day and night or all day and up till midnight (exclusive of intervals for meals), continues to work on.

The Shipping Safety (Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour) Order 1943

PURSUANT to Regulation 4a of the Shipping Safety Emergency Regulations 1940,* the Minister of Defence doth hereby make the following Order:—

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Shipping Safety (Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour) Order 1943.

(2) This Order shall take effect on the day following the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

2. (1) This Order is in substitution for the Shipping Safety (Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour) Order 1942†, and that Order is hereby consequentially revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the date of the taking effect of this Order.

3. Except where otherwise specially provided, this Order shall apply with respect to all small craft, as defined in the Shipping Safety Emergency Regulations 1940‡, to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939§ do not apply.

4. No master or person in charge of any small craft to which this Order applies shall cause or permit the vessel to be in any part of the waters described in the First Schedule hereto.

5. No master or person in charge of any small craft to which this Order applies shall cause or permit the vessel to be anchored in any part of the waters described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto.

6. Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, no master or person in charge of any small craft to which this Order applies shall cause or permit the vessel to enter or move in any part of the waters described in the Third Schedule hereto.

7. Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, no master or person in charge of any small craft to which this Order applies shall cause or permit the vessel to enter or move in any part of the waters described in the Fourth Schedule hereto: Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply with respect to—

- (a) Vessels engaged on Government or Harbour Board service;
- (b) Trading vessels;
- (c) Vessels being used during a period of emergency, within the meaning of the Emergency Reserve Corps Regulations 1941||, for the purposes of any emergency precautions service established under those regulations.

8. The provisions of this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of the Public Traffic Regulations 1939¶ for the Port of Auckland.

FIRST SCHEDULE

PROHIBITED PASSAGE

3. No master or person in charge of any ship to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939 for the time being apply shall cause or permit the ship to be in any part of the waters described in the First Schedule hereto.

4. No master or person in charge of any ship to which the said regulations for the time being apply shall cause or permit the ship to be anchored in any part of the waters described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto.

5. Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, no master or person in charge of any ship to which the said regulations for the time being apply shall cause or permit the ship to enter or move in any part of the waters described in the Third Schedule hereto.

6. (1) This clause shall apply with respect to all ships to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939 for the time being apply, except—

- (a) Vessels engaged on Government or Harbour Board service;
- (b) Trading vessels;
- (c) Vessels being used during a period of emergency, within the meaning of the Emergency Reserve Corps Regulations 1941§, for the purposes of any emergency precautions service established under those regulations.

(2) Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, no master or person in charge of any ship to which this clause applies shall cause or permit the ship to enter or move in any part of the waters described in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

7. The Public Traffic Regulations 1939 for the Port of Auckland are hereby amended by revoking paragraph 24 and substituting the following paragraph:—

“24. *Examination Anchorage, Position and Limits.*—The examination anchorage is situated in the area contained within the following limits: From a position 000° 7.5 cables from Rangitoto Beacon, by a straight line to a position 000° 12.5 cables from Rangitoto Beacon; thence by a straight line in a westerly direction to a position 000° 10.35 cables from Northern Black Buoy (showing flashing red light) in a charted position 289° 7 cables from Rangitoto Beacon; thence by a straight line to a position 000° 5.35 cables from the said Northern Black Buoy; thence by a straight line in an easterly direction to the above-mentioned commencing position 000° 7.5 cables from Rangitoto Beacon.”

Alterations to the Scale of Charges upon the New Zealand Government Railways

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Robert Semple, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations to the General Scale of Charges and to the Goods—Local Rates Scale of Charges made on the 13th day of April, 1939, and published in the Supplement dated the 19th day of April, 1939, to the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 13th day of April, 1939, in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic.
