Consenting to the Raising of Loans by certain Local Authorities and prescribing the Conditions thereof

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS the several local authorities enumerated in the Schedule hereto, being desirous of raising the respective loans stated opposite their names therein, have respectively complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loans:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the respective local authorities mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule of the respective loans set out in the second column of the said Schedule, up to the respective amounts specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

- (1) The terms for which the said loans or any parts thereof may be raised shall be the respective terms (in years) stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule.
- (2) The rates of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loans or any parts thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding the respective rates per centum per annum stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule.
- (3) The said local authorities shall, before raising the said respective loans or any parts thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing sinking funds under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable in any respective case, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking funds at intervals of not more than one year, at a rate or rates per centum which shall be not less than the respective rates stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule, such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said respective loans for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, the first such payment in each respective case to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender or lenders is computed on any loan or part thereof so raised.
- (4) No amount payable as either interest or sinking fund in respect of the said loans shall be paid out of loan-moneys.
- (5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the raising of the said respective loans or any parts thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.
- (6) The payment of interest and repayment of principal in respect of the said loans shall be made in New Zealand.
- (7) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

Consenting to the Raising of a Loan of £800 by the Port Chalmers Borough Council and prescribing the Conditions thereof

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS the Port Chalmers Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") proposes, pursuant to the terms of a requisition issued under section twenty-two of the Health Act, 1920, to raise a loan of eight hundred pounds (£800), to be known as "Water Reserves Extension Loan, 1943" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of purchasing additional land as a water-catchment area for the purpose of providing additional water for the borough:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of eight hundred pounds (£800), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

- (1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed ten (10) years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.
- (3) The said loan or any part thereof shall be repaid by the half-yearly redemption of debentures in the years set out in the first column of the Schedule hereunder of the amounts stated opposite each such year in the second column of the said Schedule.

The Tobacco Factories' Employees' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1943, No. 2

IN pursuance of the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, the Minister of Labour doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Tobacco Factories' Employees' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1943, No. 2.

2. This Order applies to W. D. and H. O. Wills (N.Z.), Limited, and to Godfrey Phillips (N.Z.), Limited, and to the employment in the Wellington Industrial District of casual female workers after 5 p.m. on any day on work coming within the scope of the Northern, Wellington, and Nelson Tobacco Workers' award dated the 19th day of March, 1943, and recorded in 43 Book of Awards 77.

3. The provisions of all Acts and regulations thereunder and of the said award are hereby suspended in so far as any such provisions operate (1) to restrict or prevent the employment of the workers referred to in clause 2 hereof for more than three hours per night or for more than two consecutive nights in any week, or (2) to require such workers to be paid for statutory holidays; but such suspension shall be subject to the condition that the employment of any such worker at night-time shall be at the overtime rate of pay of time and a half calculated for each hour worked on the basis of one-fortieth of the weekly rate of pay that would have been payable to such worker for such work performed during ordinary hours.

Medical Supplies Notice 1943, No. 2

PURSUANT to Regulation 6 of the Medical Supplies Emergency Regulations 1939, I, Michael Herbert Watt, Medical Supplies Controller, do hereby direct and give notice as under:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Medical Supplies Notice 1943, No. 2, and shall come into force on the day following the date of publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

2. No person shall sell or otherwise dispose of, or offer or agree to sell or otherwise dispose of, by wholesale, any drug named in the Schedule hereto to any person except—

- (a) A merchant dealing in that drug by way of wholesale only;
- (b) A registered medical practitioner;
- (c) A registered dentist;
- (d) A registered veterinary surgeon;
- (e) The proprietor of a pharmacy within the meaning of the Pharmacy Act, 1939; or
- (f) A Hospital Board.

3. No person shall sell or otherwise dispose of, or offer or agree to sell or otherwise dispose of, by retail, any drug named in the Schedule hereto, or any preparation containing that drug, except pursuant to a prescription signed by a registered medical practitioner and for the treatment of some person named in the prescription, or signed by a registered veterinary surgeon, acting in the practice of his profession.

4. This notice shall not apply to any preparation containing any drug named in the Schedule hereto if on the day of the coming into force of this notice that drug has already been combined or compounded in that preparation with other medicinal agents.

THE following substances, if so prepared as to be drugs or substances named and included in the British Pharmacopœia or in the British Pharmaceutical Codex:—

- 1. Bismuth.
- 2. Salts of bismuth.
