HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS, under the authority of clause sixteen of the Dunedin City Loans Conversion Order, 1934, the Dunedin City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") stipulated in certain of the securities issued pursuant to such Order for the redemption thereof at the option of the said local authority on such date prior of that specified in the said securities as the said local authority might fix by notice in that behalf to be published in the *Gazette* at least three (3) months before such prior date:

And whereas the said local authority proposes, in exercise of the said option, to redeem on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four, certain of such securities amounting in the aggregate to the sum of eighty-one thousand one hundred pounds (£81,100), the date specified in such securities for the redemption thereof being the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven:

And whereas the said local authority being desirous, in order to give effect to such proposal, of raising a loan of eighty-one thousand one hundred pounds (£81,100) to be known as "Conversion Loan, Third Repayment Loan, 1943" (hereinafter called "the said loan"),

has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by such Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of eighty-one thousand one hundred pounds (£81,100), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed three (3) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds five shillings (£3 5s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan shall be repaid on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven.

(4) It shall not be necessary to establish a separate sinking fund for the repayment loan of eighty-one thousand one hundred pounds (£81,100), and the proviso to subsection three of section thirty-two of the Finance Act, 1938 (as set out in subsection two of section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1941), shall apply, and accordingly the provisions of subclause two of clause twenty of the Dunedin City Loans Conversion Order, 1934, shall be construed as if the debentures amounting to eighty-one thousand one hundred pounds (£81,100), redeemed on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four, had not been redeemed as at that date, but had been redeemed on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven.

(5) The payment of interest and instalments of principal in respect of the said loan shall be made in New Zealand, and no amount payable as interest or principal shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(6) The amount payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurement fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-quarter per centum of any amount raised.

(7) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

WHEREAS the several local authorities enumerated in the Schedule hereto, being desirous of raising the respective loans stated opposite their names therein, have respectively complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loans:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the respective local authorities mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule of the respective loans set out in the second column of the said Schedule up to the respective amounts specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The terms for which the said loans or any parts thereof may be raised shall be the respective terms (in years) stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule.

(2) The rates of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loans or any parts thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding the respective rates per centum per annum stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule.

(3) The said respective loans or any parts thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the respective terms as determined in (1) above.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the fourteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty (hereinafter called "the said Order in Council"), and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Putaruru Town Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of ten thousand pounds (£10,000), by a loan to be known as "Water-supply Loan, 1938" (hereinafter called "the said loan"):

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not yet been exercised:

And whereas the authority has lapsed in accordance with the provisions of clause five thereof, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to raise any portion of the said loan except in accordance with the provisions of a further Order in Council that may be issued pursuant to section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"):

And whereas it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to raise the said loan on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan up to the amount of ten thousand pounds (£10,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any portion thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty (20) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any portion thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per annum per annum.

(3) The said loan shall be free of repayment of principal for the first year, but thereafter shall be repaid by the annual redemption of debentures in the years set out in the first column of the Schedule hereunder of the amounts stated opposite such years in the second column of the said Schedule.

(b) For woolpacks delivered by the retailer elsewhere than at one of the ports mentioned in paragraph (a) hereof: 7s. each ex store at the place of delivery, increased to the nearest halfpenny by a proportionate part of the freight charges incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery from such one of the said ports as is nearest or most convenient of access to his store:

Provided that where any woolpacks to which this paragraph applies are obtained by the retailer elsewhere than from such one of the said ports as is the nearest or most convenient of access to his store the increase authorized by this paragraph shall not exceed a proportionate part of the freight charges that would have been incurred by the retailer if the woolpacks had been obtained from that port and if delivery had been effected at current freight rates.

(2) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to paragraph (b) of the last preceding subclause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,\* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

#### PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 171, and shall come into force on the 5th day of November, 1943.

2. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—  
“The said regulations” means the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939\* :—

“Grower”, in relation to maize, means a person engaged in the business of growing maize for sale :

“Grower’s station”, in relation to any grower, means the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower’s premises :

The expression “f.o.b.s.i.” means “free on board, sacks or other containers included”, and the expression “f.o.r.s.i.” means “free on rail, sacks or other containers included.”

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said regulations and used in this Order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by those regulations.

3. Subject to any general or specific directions that may be given by or on behalf of the Tribunal, any expenses that are reasonably incurred by a wholesaler in undertaking the transport of any maize at his own expense may be regarded for the purposes of this Order as if they were transport charges paid by him, and the maximum price of the maize shall be determined accordingly.

4. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any maize to which the Order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight.

5. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction, as well as to other sales.

#### APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

6. This Order applies only with respect to maize grown in New Zealand.

#### FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES (OTHER THAN RETAIL PRICES) OF MAIZE THAT IS SUBJECT TO THIS ORDER

(3) Where any maize to which this Order applies is delivered by the grower elsewhere than at one of the aforesaid ports, or elsewhere than at the grower’s station, the maximum price that may be charged by the grower shall be the appropriate price in terms of subclause (1) hereof, increased by the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of the charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the maize f.o.b.s.i., such one of the aforesaid ports or f.o.r.s.i. such railway-station as would have been appropriate in the circumstances of the case.

(4) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any grower for any maize sold by him to a wholesaler shall be the price fixed in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause with respect to other sales, reduced by an amount equal to 5 per cent. of the said price.

#### WHOLESALE PRICES

8. (1) Subject to the provisions of subclause (2) hereof the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any maize to which this Order applies shall be—
