Authority from the Minister of Finance to the Commissioner of Taxes to collect Combined Charge on Payments in respect of Rabbit-skins Rabbit Carcasses, and Opossum-skins

- (1) Pursuant to section 13 of the Finance Act (No. 2), 1942, I hereby authorize the Commissioner of Taxes to collect social security charge and national security tax upon-

 - (a) All payments made by a purchaser to the seller of any rabbit-skins, rabbit carcasses, or opossum-skins in respect of the purchase thereof from such seller; and (b) All payments made by any auctioneer or dealer (whether acting on behalf of the seller or on behalf of the purchaser) to the seller of any rabbit-skins, rabbit carcasses, or opossum-skins in respect of the purchase thereof from such seller;

as if the eys so paid, subject to the deduction of any amount fixed by the commissioner under subsection 4 of section 13 of the Finance Act (No. 2), 1942, as representing the expenditure incurred by the seller in the production thereof, were salary or wages of the seller.

(2) This authority shall not apply to any payment made to a licensed dealer, or to any payment made on a sale of any skins or carcasses by any person subsequent to the sale or disposal thereof by a licensed dealer, or to any payment made to an auctioneer or dealer acting as agent for a seller, or to any payment made in respect of goods purchased by retail in a shop.

(3) For the purposes of this authority all moneys credited to or applied on account of a seller shall be deemed to have been paid when so credited or applied.

- (4) In this authority the following definitions and rules of construction shall apply:
 - (a) "Auctioneer" or "dealer" means and includes any person carrying on a business which comprises or includes the sale by auction or otherwise of any one or more of the above-mentioned classes of goods as auctioneer or agent on behalf of the seller, or the purchase of such goods as agent for a buyer or buyers:
 (b) "Licensed dealer" means—

(i) In respect of dealings in rabbit-skins, any broker, country dealer, or wholesale trader who is licensed as such under the Sale of Rabbit Skins Emergency Regulations 1942:

(ii) In respect of dealings in opossum-skins, any broker who is licensed as such under the Opossum Regulations 1934:

Regulations 1934:

(iii) In respect of dealings in rabbit carcasses, any person who is for the time being engaged in carrying on the business of purchasing rabbit carcasses for resale or for processing for resale, and who has procured from the Commissioner of Taxes a certificate that he is a licensed dealer in rabbit carcasses for the purposes of this authority. (Such certificate shall be granted as of right and without fee or charge to every such person as aforesaid who applies in writing therefor):

(iv) In respect of dealings in any of the said three classes of goods, any other person who has procured from the Commissioner of Taxes a certificate that he is a licensed dealer in such class of goods. (Such certificate may be granted or refused in the discretion of the Commissioner and may be revoked by him at any time):

Industry Licensing (Pulp and Paper Manufacture) Notice 1939, Amendment No. 1

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby give notice as follows:

1. This notice may be cited as the Industry Licensing (Pulp and Paper Manufacture) Notice 1939, Amendment No. 1.
2. This notice shall be read together with and form part of the Industry Licensing (Pulp and Paper Manufacture) Notice 1939 (hereinafter called "the principal notice").
3. Paragraph 2 of the principal notice is revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

- "2. The industry to which this notice relates is the following: The manufacture of (a) pulp, or (b) paper and board, or (c) multiwalled paper bags, as herein respectively defined."
- 4. Paragraph 3 of the principal notice is revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

"3. For the purpose of this notice-

- "(a) 'Pulp' means the crude fibre which is produced either mechanically or chemically from fibrous cellulose materials, whether raw or waste, and from which by suitable treatment, paper and board, plastics, or rayon
- suitable treatment, paper and board, plastics, or rayon may be made:

 "(b) The term 'paper and board' means a matted or felted sheet, whether homogenous or laminated, made of pulp material and formed on screening equipment from a water suspension, and in particular includes the products generally described as paper, bristol, cardboard, paperboard, wallboard, hard board, and insulating board: papero. board:
- "(c) 'Multi-walled paper bag' means any container-

"(i) The walls of which are composed of two or more plies of paper of not less weight than 20 lb. (24 by 36, 480); and
"(ii) Which is designed either to hold commodities such as cement, fertilizer, fruit, cereals, or the like or

to be an outside container for packaged or bottled commodities; and

"(iii) In which each ply of paper forms an individual tube so fabricated into the bag that the longitudinal seams are not in alignment and so nested into the bag

seams are not in alignment and so nested into the oag that before the ends are fastened it is moveable relatively to the other tubes; and "(iv) In which either the bottom ends or the bottom ends and top ends respectively of each of the tubes are closed and also fastened to the corresponding ends of the other tubes whether by sewing, stapling, or sticking with adhesives, or by two or more of these methods so as substantially to close such end or ends, except that a valve or other opening may be provided for filling or emptying." emptying.

5. Except as hereby modified the principal notice shall continue in full force and effect.

The Woollen Mills Labour Legislation Suspension and Modification Order 1943

PURSUANT to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, the Minister of Labour doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as The Woollen Mills Labour Legislation Suspension and Modification Order 1943.

2. This Order applies to all industries carried on in woollen-mills (including woollen-hosiery mills) where the manufacture of woven or machine or hand-knitted fabrics or hosiery is carried on.

3. The provisions of all Acts and of all regulations thereunder, and of all awards and industrial agreements under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all agreements under the Labour Disputes Investigation Act, 1913, and of all other voluntary agreements affecting conditions of employment are hereby (1) suspended so far as any such provisions operate to prevent the employment of women and boys on shift-work, or on Sundays or holidays in any industry to which clause 2 hereof applies; and (2) modified in respect of the employment of all workers on shift-work in any industry to which clause 2 hereof applies, to the extent necessary to give effect to the terms and conditions hereinafter provided.

4. Subject as hereafter set out, each male adult worker

- necessary to give effect to the terms and conditions hereinafter provided.

 4. Subject as hereafter set out, each male adult worker employed on shift-work shall receive, in addition to his ordinary wages, the sum of 3s. per shift, and each female worker and each youth employed on shift-work shall receive, in addition to his or her ordinary wages, the sum of 1s. 6d. per shift: Provided that in addition to the foregoing payments each female worker on night shift (irrespective of age) shall receive a bonus of 1s. 6d. per shift, which payment shall not be included as part of the total sum to be distributed to day workers under the provisions of clause 5 hereof.

 5. (a) Where a shift (hereinafter referred to as "the first shift") is worked within the ordinary daily clock-hours prescribed by the Woollen Mills Employees' award in force for the time being, the shift rates prescribed by clause 4 hereof shall not be payable to the workers employed on such first shift, but an amount equivalent to the total amount of the additional shift rates payable to the workers employed on the second shift, or if more than two shifts are worked, an amount equivalent to the total amount of the additional shift rates payable to the workers employed on the second shift, or to the total amount of the additional shift rates payable to the workers employed on the first shift, and for this purpose such first-shift workers who work on the first shift, and for this purpose such first-shift workers shall be classified as under, viz.:—

 A. Senior male workers:
 - A. Senior male workers:

 - B. Senior female workers:
 C. Junior workers, whether male or female.

The distribution shall be equal between members of each class, but a-Class A worker shall receive twice the amount that a Class B worker receives, and a Class B worker shall receive twice the amount that a Class C worker receives.

worker receives, and a Class B worker shall receive twice the amount that a Class C worker receives.

(b) Where no shift is worked completely within the ordinary daily clock-hours hereinbefore mentioned, the workers on all shifts shall be paid the additional shift rates prescribed by clause 4 hereof.

6. For all work done on Sundays or whole holidays double time shall be paid. All extended hours beyond the daily or weekly limits prescribed in any Act, award, or agreement applicable shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

7. Satisfactory arrangements shall be made for conveying female workers employed on the late or night shifts to their homes. Where female workers are employed on the third shift provision shall also be made for their conveyance to work if necessary.

8. The employer shall provide each night-shift worker with tea at the usual meal interval and also at one other time (as may be mutually arranged) during the course of the shift.

9. Where regular shifts are worked thay shall, wherever practicable, rotate so that workers are employed alternately in four-weekly periods on day or night shifts respectively.

10. The Woollen Mills Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1940, and the Woollen Mills Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1940, Amendment No. 1, are hereby revoked.

11. This Order shall come into effect on the day of the date hereof.

 - (b) Every worker who in that week is for the time being employed or engaged in or in connection with that undertaking shall in that week work until a time not earlier than the usual closing-time on Wednesday, the 22nd day of December, 1943.
 - 3. Subject to the provisions of this notice
 - (a) Every undertaking in the sawmilling industry shall, in the week commencing on the 3rd day of January, 1944, be operated from a time not later than the usual commencing-time on Wednesday, the 5th day of January, 1944; and
 - (b) Every worker who in that week is for the time being employed or engaged in or in connection with that undertaking shall in that week work from a time not later than the usual commencing-time on Wednesday, the 5th day of January, 1944.
- 4. (1) Where, pursuant to Regulation 20 of the Industrial Man-power Emergency Regulations 1942, any direction has been or is hereafter given by the Timber Controller in respect of any undertaking in the sawmilling industry requiring that undertaking to be operated for a specified number of hours in any week or requiring the workers employed or engaged in or in connection with that undertaking to work for a specified number of hours in any week, nothing contained in that direction shall apply with respect to the weeks commencing on the 20th day of December, 1943, the 27th day of December, 1943, and the 3rd day of January, 1944, respectively.

 (2) Except as otherwise specially provided herein, the provisions of this notice shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of any such direction as aforesaid.

 5. Nothing in this notice shall be construed to require that any of the operations of any undertaking in the sawmilling industry be

of the operations of any undertaking in the sawmilling industry be not carried on at any time during the period commencing at the usual closing-time on Wednesday, the 22nd day of December, 1943, and ending at the usual commencing-time on Wednesday, the 5th day of January, 1944, or that any worker employed or engaged in or in connection with that undertaking shall cease to work at any time during that period time during that period.

Notes on the Weather for October, 1943

General.—Although conditions were frequently unsettled during October the month was an improvement on September. Several deep depressions passed over the New Zealand region from the north-west, but there was no persistence of strong westerly winds as is commonly experienced in the spring. Instead, the east coast had more dull southerly weather than is usual. Unsuitable weather has further delayed farming programmes and the season is about a fortnight late. Towards the end of the month growth became more rapid, but pastures especially would have been much improved by more sunshine.

Rainfall.—In spite of the rather frequent occurrence of rain, totals were fairly light over extensive areas. Average values were exceeded about the Bay of Islands, near New Plymouth, and in coastal districts from Gisborne to Dunedin. About Gisborne and Wellington City totals were more than double the average, but otherwise the excesses were not appreciable. The deficiencies experienced over most of the remainder of the country were most marked in South Auckland, Western Otago, and Southland, this being the second successive month of low rainfall about Foveaux Strait.

Temperatures.—At most places it was a cool month, departures being about 1° F, in the North Island but often 2° or 3° between Wairarapa

Temperatures.—At most places it was a cool month, departures being about 1° F. in the North Island but often 2° or 3° between Wairarapa and Otago. In Westland, however, temperatures were slightly above normal. Light frosts between the 17th and 19th were sufficient to injure tender garden plants in several districts.

Sunshine.—Except in the extreme north, Taranaki, and Westland, it was a dull month, there being substantial deficiencies of bright sunshine from North Otago to Tauranga with new low records established at a few stations.

Weather Sequence.—As a depression was passing to the south-east of Castlepoint on the 1st westerlies gave showers to the north, while

southerlies brought considerable drizzle and rain in eastern districts to the south. Occasional showers persisted in the east, but an improvement extended from the west as southerlies became general. After a trough on the 4th, however, southerlies freshened, and showers were

heaviest east of the North Island ranges.

On the 6th a ridge of high pressure was over New Zealand with mainly fair and milder conditions. During the 8th and 9th, as a slow-moving trough advanced northward, considerable rain fell about and west of the southern ranges. This disturbance was overtaken on the 10th by another trough which gave light rain in most districts. Conditions improved the following day when an anticyclone passed over New Zealand.

New Zealand.

A complex system of disturbances then crossed New Zealand—one depression passed south of Stewart Island on the 12th, a deep centre crossed Southland on the 13th, and finally another travelled across Taranaki and Wellington on the 14th. Northerly gales were fairly widespread on the 13th, and further strong gales occurred in Auckland, Taranaki, and other parts of the North Island on the following day, during the course of which winds backed westerly. The heaviest rain occurred in districts from New Plymouth southward. On the 14th a cold southerly change brought dull wet weather to the east coast of the South Island, and southerlies gradually extended to northern districts as a depression in South Taranaki moved in to the Bay of Plenty.

An anticyclone which was advancing on to the South Island on the 17th covered most of New Zealand on the 19th, by which time showers finally cleared in the Gisborne region and settled conditions became general. Some light frosts occurred in the North Island about

An anticyclone which was advancing on to the South Island on the 17th covered most of New Zealand on the 19th, by which time showers finally cleared in the Gisborne region and settled conditions became general. Some light frosts occurred in the North Island about this time. As this anticyclone moved east on the 22nd a depression began to approach Westland from the north-west. North-easterlies increased to gale force in some exposed positions, and the weather was cloudy with rain chiefly south of New Plymouth. On the 24th a southerly change advanced to the Wellington Province with an anticyclone moving to the east of the South Island. Winds from an easterly quarter then prevailed and gave dull weather to the windward coasts and to the central provinces.

A depression from the region of Lord Howe Island was west of the Auckland Peninsula on the 27th, and two days later it moved to the eastward. While the weather was mostly fair south of Taranaki there was considerable cloud elsewhere, with scattered drizzle and some heavy rain fell north of Auckland. As a second centre developed north of Chatham Islands winds turned south-easterly from Cook Strait northward. At the close of the month an anticyclone was extending over New Zealand and the weather improved.

Price Order No. 177 (Tomatoes)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 177, and shall come into force on the 15th day of January, 1944.
 (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"The said regulations" means the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939*:

"Commercial user" means a canner, or a manufacturer of condiments, or any person engaged in the business of processing or compounding tomatoes:

"Tomatoes" means all produce commonly known as tomatoes, other than the produce known as tree tomatoes.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said regulations and used in this Order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by the said regulations.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) This Order applies with respect to the sale for human consumption of all tomatoes grown in New Zealand (whether grown outdoors or otherwise) other than tomatoes sold to commercial users.

outdoors or otherwise) other than tomatoes sold to commercial users.

(2) Every sale of any such tomatoes shall be deemed to be a sale for human consumption unless at the time of the sale there is a bona fide agreement or stipulation between the buyer and the seller that the tomatoes to which the sale relates are intended for a specific purpose other than human consumption.

4. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction, as well as to other sales.

5. The provisions of this Order fixing prices by reference to the weight of the tomatoes to which any sale relates shall apply notwithstanding that in any such case the seller may sell or purport to sell otherwise than by weight.

6. The wholesale prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales of the following classes, namely:—

- (a) Sales to retailers (whether made by the grower or any other person); and
- (b) Sales to users in any case where a lot of not less than 2 cwt. of tomatoes to which this Order applies is sold to any one purchaser for delivery at any one time.

MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES

- 7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause the maximum wholesale price of any tomatoes to which this Order applies shall be at the rate of the appropriate wholesale price prescribed in the Schedule hereto.
- (2) The wholesale prices prescribed in the Schedule hereto are fixed as for delivery at the wholesaler's store or other premises from which delivery to the purchaser is effected.
- (3) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler elsewhere (3) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler elsewhere than at premises occupied by him he may add to the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the Schedule hereto the reasonable cost of delivery, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES

- 8. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause the maximum retail price of any tomatoes to which this Order applies shall not exceed a price at the rate of a price per pound equal to the sum of the following amounts:-
 - (a) The price per pound actually paid or payable by the retailer for the tomatoes:
 - (b) The transport charges (if any) actually paid or payable by the retailer on each pound of the tomatoes:
 - (c) An amount equal to 40 per cent. of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof.
- (2) The retail price of any tomatoes, computed in accordance with the last preceding subclause, shall be calculated by reference to the prices and weights disclosed in the appropriate invoices.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this clause, the maximum retail price of any tomatoes to which this Order applies shall not in any case exceed a price at the rate of the appropriate price prescribed in the Schedule hereto.
- (4) If in respect of any lot of tomatoes sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward half-pence. halfpenny.
- 9. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any tomatoes to which this Order applies shall keep for a period of not less than two months a record showing with respect to every purchase of such tomatoes made by him by way of wholesale the following particulars :-
 - (a) The date of purchase:

 - (c) The trade description of the tomatoes purchased:
 - (d) The number of cases purchased:
 - (e) The price paid.
