Price Order No. 178 (Australian Oranges)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 178, and shall come into force on the 30th day of November, 1943.
2. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 “The said regulations” means the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939*;
 “Bushel case” means an Australian case of the type and specification used in the ordinary course of trade for packing the quantity of oranges recognized as one bushel.
- (2) References in this Order to counts are references to the average number of oranges, according to size, customarily packed in a bushel case.
- (3) References in this Order to metropolitan areas are references to the metropolitan areas described in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (4) Terms and expressions defined in the said regulations and used in this Order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by the said regulations.
3. The maximum prices fixed by this Order include the prices of the cases or other containers in which the oranges are delivered to the purchaser.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to all Australian oranges.
5. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction, as well as to other sales.

MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum wholesale price of any oranges to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate wholesale price prescribed in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) The wholesale prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery at the wholesaler’s store or other premises from which delivery to the purchaser is effected.
- (3) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler elsewhere than at premises occupied by him, he may add to the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the First Schedule hereto the reasonable cost of delivery, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum retail price of any oranges to which this Order applies shall be at the rate of the appropriate retail price prescribed in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) No oranges to which this Order applies shall be sold or offered or exposed for sale by any retailer otherwise than at the appropriate retail price per dozen fixed by this Order.
- (3) If in respect of any lot of oranges sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any oranges to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the oranges to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated, in legible and prominent characters, the following particulars:—

- (a) The retail price per dozen of the oranges:
- (b) The count of the oranges:
- (c) The words "Grown in Australia."

9. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any oranges to which this Order applies shall keep for a period of not less than two months a record showing with respect to every purchase of such oranges made by him by way of wholesale the following particulars:—

- (b) The name and address of the wholesaler from whom purchased:
- (c) The count of the oranges purchased:
- (d) The number of cases of each count purchased:

Price Order No. 179 (New Zealand Lemons other than Meyer Lemons)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 179, and shall come into force on the 30th day of November, 1943.
2. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"The said regulations" means the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939*:

"Three-quarter-bushel case" means a package of the kind numbered 3 in the First Schedule to the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940†, as substituted by Regulation 6 of the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 3‡, or a package having the following dimensions (inside measurements)—namely, depth, 7½ in.; width, 11¼ in.; length, 18 in.

- (2) References in this Order to counts are references to counts determined in accordance with the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940†.

(3) Terms and expressions defined in the said regulations and used in this Order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by the said regulations.

3. The maximum prices fixed by this Order include the prices of the cases or other containers in which the lemons are delivered to the purchaser.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to all New-Zealand-grown lemons other than Meyer lemons.
5. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction, as well as to other sales.

MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum wholesale price of any lemons to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate wholesale price prescribed in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The wholesale prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery at the wholesaler's store or other premises from which delivery to the purchaser is effected.

(3) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler elsewhere than at premises occupied by him, he may add to the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the Schedule hereto the reasonable cost of delivery, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum retail price of any lemons to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate retail price prescribed in the Schedule hereto.

(2) No lemons to which this Order applies shall be sold or offered or exposed for sale by any retailer otherwise than at the appropriate retail price fixed by this Order.

Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any lemons to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the lemons to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated, in legible and prominent characters, the following particulars:—

- (a) The retail price per dozen of the lemons:

9. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any lemons to which this Order applies shall keep for a period of not less than two months a record showing with respect to every purchase of such lemons made by him by way of wholesale the following particulars:—

Price Order No. 180 (New-Zealand-grown Citrous Fruits)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 180, and shall come into force on the 30th day of November, 1943.
2. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Bushel case” means a package of the kind numbered 1 in the First Schedule to the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940†, as substituted by Regulation 6 of the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 3‡:

“Three-quarter-bushel case” means a package of the kind numbered 3 in the said First Schedule:

“Half-bushel case”,—

(a) In relation to Meyer lemons, means a package of the kind numbered 6 in the said First Schedule; and

(b) In relation to other citrous fruit to which this Order applies, means a package of the kind numbered 5 in the said First Schedule:

“Quarter-bushel case” means a package of the kind numbered 7 or 9 in the said First Schedule.

(2) References in this Order to grades or counts are references to grades or counts determined in accordance with the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940.†

(3) Terms and expressions defined in the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939* and used in this Order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by those regulations.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all New-Zealand-grown citrous fruits, including Meyer lemons, but not including any other kind of lemons.

4. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum wholesale price of any Meyer lemons to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price prescribed in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum wholesale prices of any other citrous fruit to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) The wholesale prices fixed by this Order include the prices of the cases in which the fruit is delivered to the purchaser.

(4) The wholesale prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery at the wholesaler's store or other premises from which delivery to the purchaser is effected.

(5) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler elsewhere than at premises occupied by him, he may add to the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the First or Second Schedule hereto the reasonable cost of delivery, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum retail price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall be at the rate of a price per dozen equal to the sum of the following amounts:—

- (a) The price per dozen actually paid or payable by the retailer for the citrus fruit :
 (b) The transport charges (if any) actually paid or payable by the retailer for each dozen of the citrus fruit (not exceeding in any case the charges that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates) :
 (c) An amount equal to 40 per cent. of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof.

(2) The retail price of any citrus fruit, computed in accordance with the last preceding subclause, shall be calculated by reference to the prices and grades disclosed in the appropriate invoices.

(3) The retail prices fixed by this Order include the prices of the cases or other containers in which the fruit is delivered to the purchaser.

(4) No citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall be sold or offered or exposed for sale by any retailer otherwise than at the appropriate retail price per dozen fixed by this Order.

(5) If in respect of any lot of citrus fruit sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

7. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the fruit to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated, in legible and prominent characters, the following particulars:—

- (a) The retail price per dozen of the fruit :
 (b) Except in the case of Meyer lemons, the grade of the fruit :
 (c) ~~Except in the case of Meyer lemons, the words "Grown in New Zealand"~~ :
 (d) In the case of Meyer lemons, the word "Meyer" .

8. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall keep for a period of not less than two months a record showing with respect to every purchase of such citrus fruits made by him by way of wholesale the following particulars:—

- (a) The date of purchase :
 (b) The name and address of the wholesaler from whom purchased :
 (c) The description and grade of the citrus fruit purchased :
 (d) The number of cases of each grade purchased :
 (e) The price paid.
