Altering and redefining the Boundaries of the Wharepuhunga-Korakonui and the Pukeatua Rabbit Districts.—(Notice No. Ag. 4068)

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by section thirty-three of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that the boundaries of two or more contiguous rabbit districts may from time to time be altered by the Governor-General in Council in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Board of each of the districts affected:

And whereas the districts known as the "Wharepuhunga-Korakonui Rabbit District" and the "Pukeatua Rabbit District" (hereinafter referred to as "the said districts") have been constituted under and for the purposes of Part II of the said Act:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Board of the Wharepuhunga-Korakonui Rabbit District on the twenty-second day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three, and a similar resolution was passed by the Board of the Pukeatua Rabbit District on the same day praying in each case for the alteration of the boundaries of the said districts in the manner described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the said districts in accordance with the said resolutions and in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the said districts so constituted as aforesaid, and doth hereby declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Wharepuhunga-Korakonui Rabbit District, shall be added to and form part of the Pukeatua Rabbit District; that the boundaries of the said districts shall be those set forth in Parts I and II respectively of the Second Schedule hereto; and doth further declare that this Order in Council shall take effect on the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

FIRST SCHEDULE

AREA EXCLUDED FROM THE WHAREPUHUNGA-KORAKONUUI RABBIT DISTRICT AND INCLUDED IN THE PUKEATUA RABBIT DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, in the counties of Otorohanga and Waipa, containing by admeasurement approximately 6,825 acres: Bounded, commencing at the junction of the Waipari River and Puniu River in Section 1, Block I, Wharepapa Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction generally up the Waipari River to the north-western boundary of Section 6, Block VI, Wharepapa Survey District; thence in a south-westerly direction generally along the north-western boundary of Section 6 aforesaid to the Ngaroma Road; thence in a north-westerly direction generally along that road to the Mangaharakeke Stream; thence due south by a right line passing through Section 5, Block VI aforesaid, to the northern boundary of Section 2, Block X, Wharepapa Survey District; thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of Sections 2 and 1, Block X aforesaid, and Section 1, Block IX, Wharepapa Survey District, to the Puniu River; thence in a northerly direction generally down the Puniu River to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE

PART I

Boundaries of the Wharepuhunga-Korakonui Rabbit District

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, Otorohanga and Waipa Counties, containing by admeasurement approximately 44,325 acres. Bounded, commencing at the south-eastern corner of Section 10s, Pukemapou Settlement, in a northerly direction generally along the eastern boundaries of Sections 10s, 9s, 8s, 7s, and 6s, Pukemapou Settlement, to the northernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the south-western corner of Section 1, Block III, Mangaorongo Survey District; thence again in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Section 1, Block III aforesaid, the eastern boundaries of Lot 2 on D.P. 25759, Rangitoto A part No. 1 on D.P. 12831, Rangitoto A part 1s 2 on D.P. 24007, and along the eastern and northern boundaries of Lot 2 on D.P. 8634, to the south-eastern corner of Rangitoto A 58s 2s Block; thence along the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned block to the southern boundary of the Tokanui Mental Hospital Reserve; thence in an easterly direction along that boundary to the Mangatutu Stream; thence in a northerly direction generally along the Mangatutu Stream to its confluence with the Puniu River; thence again in an easterly direction generally along the Puniu River, to and along the Owairaka Stream, to and along the Kaiwhio Stream to the Rotongata Road; thence in a westerly direction generally along Rotongata, Aotearoa, and Wharepapa Roads to the Puniu River; thence in a southerly direction generally along the Puniu River to the northern boundary of Section 1, Block IX, Wharepapa Survey District; thence in a westerly direction along that boundary, across a public road, and along the northern boundary of Section 4, Block IX aforesaid, to the Mangatutu River; thence in a north-westerly direction generally along the Mangatutu River to the northernmost corner of Rangitoto A No. 5 Block; thence in a westerly direction generally along the northern boundary of Rangitoto A No. 5 Block, to and along Mangatutu Road, to and across another public road; thence in a south-easterly direction generally along the western side of the last-mentioned road to the northern

boundary of Section 9, Block IX, Wharepapa Survey District; thence along the north-western and south-western boundaries of Section 9 aforesaid to the northernmost corner of Section 11, Block XII, Mangaorongo Survey District; thence in a westerly direction generally along the northern and western boundaries of Section 11 aforesaid, to and along a public road, to and along the northern boundary of Lot 7 on Deposited Plan 11788 to another public road; thence in a north-westerly direction generally along and across the last-mentioned public road, to and along the north-eastern boundary of Section 3, Block XII, Mangaorongo Survey District, to its northernmost corner; thence along the north-western boundary of the last-mentioned section, to and along the north-eastern boundary of Section 7, Block XI, Mangaorongo Survey District, to Paewhenua Road; thence again in a north-westerly direction generally along Paewhenua Road to the north-eastern corner of Section 3, Block XI, Mangaorongo Survey District; thence across the said road to and along Mangaorongo Stream to its intersection with Maihihi Road; thence in an easterly direction generally along Maihihi Road to its intersection with the north-eastern boundary of Rangitoto A No. 15E 2 Block; thence in a north-westerly direction along the last-mentioned boundary to the south-western corner of Section 12s, Pukemapou Settlement, and thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundaries of Sections 12s, 11s, and 10s, Pukemapou Settlement, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section, the point of commencement.

PART II

Boundaries of the Pukeatua Rabbit District

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, in the counties of Waipa and Otorohanga, bounded as follows: Commencing at the south-western corner of Maungatautari No. 4H 8 Block, situated in Block V, Maungatautari Survey District; thence in an easterly direction generally following the boundary of the Waikato Central Rabbit District (*Gazette*, 1932, page 2133), along the southern boundaries of Maungatautari No. 4H 8 and No. 4G 2 Blocks, the eastern boundaries of Maungatautari No. 4G 2 and No. 4G Blocks, and a right line to the Maungatautari Trig. Station; thence in a south-easterly direction along the Matamata County boundary to the Waiteti Stream; thence in a southerly direction generally up the Waiteti Stream, along the western boundaries of Sections 10A and 7A, Tautari Settlement, the south-western boundary of Section 7A aforesaid and its production to the Mangare Stream; thence down the Mangare Stream and up the Waikato River to the northern boundary of Section 10, Block IV, Wharepapa Survey District; thence in a south-westerly direction generally along the Otorohanga County boundary to the Whatauri Trig. Station at the northernmost corner of Section 2, Block VI, Wharepapa Survey District; thence along the north-western boundary of Section 2 aforesaid to the Waipari River; thence in a south-easterly direction generally up the Waipari River to the north-western boundary of Section 6, Block VI aforesaid; thence in a south-westerly direction generally along the north-western boundary of Section 6 aforesaid to the Ngaroma Road; thence in a north-westerly direction generally along that road to the Mangaharakeke Stream; thence due south by a right line passing through Section 5, Block VI aforesaid, to the northern boundary of Section 2, Block X, Wharepapa Survey District; thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of Sections 2 and 1, Block X aforesaid, and Section 1, Block IX, Wharepapa Survey District, to the Puniu River; thence in a northerly direction generally down the Puniu River to its intersection by the Wharepapa Road in Block I, Wharepapa Survey District; thence in a north-easterly direction generally along the Wharepapa, Aotearoa, and Rotongata Roads to the Kaiwhio Stream; thence in a north-westerly direction generally down the Kaiwhio and Owairaka Streams to the south-eastern corner of Maungatautari No. 4B Block; thence in a north-easterly direction generally along the generally eastern boundary of Maungatautari No. 4B Block, a public road, the eastern boundaries of Maungatautari Nos. 5A 1A 2 and 5A 1B Blocks, the Mangaohoe Stream, and the Parawera and Hairini-Puahue Roads to a point in line with the north-western boundary of the Puahue School-site; thence along the generally eastern boundaries of Lot 1 on D.P. 6591 and Lot 2 on D.P. 3649 to the westernmost corner of Section 6s, Puahue Settlement; thence in a north-easterly direction along the south-eastern side of the road forming the north-western boundaries of Sections 6s, 22s, 3s, and 2s, all of Puahue Settlement, and its production through Section 1s, Puahue Settlement, to the north-eastern boundary of that section; thence in an easterly direction generally along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 1s, 2s, 4s, 5s, and the generally northern and eastern boundary of Section 10s, all of Puahue Settlement, to the point of commencement: save and excepting the Maru Rabbit-proof Fencing District (*Gazette*, 1921, page 3008, and *Gazette*, 1923, page 1060), and Mangare Rabbit-proof Fencing District (*Gazette*, 1926, page 1218).

Authorizing the Auckland City Council to reclaim Land at Parnell in Auckland Harbour

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS it is provided by section one hundred and sixty-eight of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, authorize any local authority or Harbour Board to reclaim from the sea areas not exceeding five acres in extent in any case where he considers that the reclamation will not affect navigation and is for the benefit of the public:

And whereas the Auckland City Council (hereinafter called "the Council") is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain land at Parnell, in Auckland Harbour, and the said reclamation is of such nature as aforesaid, and the Council has applied to the Governor-General in Council for an order authorizing the execution of the said harbour works:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed harbour works will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and is for the benefit of the public:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize and empower the Council to reclaim from the sea at Parnell, in Auckland Harbour, the area of land coloured red and shown on plan marked M.D. 8266, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with the said plan marked M.D. 8266.

Imposing Levy on the Owners of Coal-mines situated within the Ohai Rescue-station Levy Area

WHEREAS by section six, subsection four, of the Coal-mines Amendment Act, 1936, it is provided that every rescue-station established in accordance with section six of the said Act shall be established in respect of an area to be defined by the Minister of Mines by notice published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas by section six, subsection five, of the said Act, it is provided that, for the purpose of recouping the cost of the establishment and maintenance of any such rescue-station, the Governor-General, by Order in Council, may from time to time impose levies on the owners of coal-mines situated within the area defined in respect of such rescue-station, not exceeding in respect of any mine for any year a levy computed at the rate of one penny for every ton or part of a ton of marketable coal raised from the mine during the preceding year ended on the thirty-first day of December:

And whereas the Minister of Mines, by notice appearing in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty, defined an area in respect of which a rescue-station might be established:

And whereas the Minister of Mines has established a rescue-station (hereinafter called "the Ohai Rescue-station") in respect of the coal-mining area defined in the said notice:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said section six, subsection five, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby, for the purpose of recouping the cost of the establishment and maintenance of the Ohai Rescue-station, impose on the owners of coal-mines situated within the area defined in the said notice in respect of each mine within the said area a levy, computed at the rate of one penny for every ton or part of a ton of marketable coal raised from the mine during the year ended on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the following resolution passed by the Petone Borough Council on the fifteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three, viz:—

"The Petone Borough Council, being the local authority having control of the street hereinafter mentioned, hereby resolves and declares that the provisions of subsection one of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to the eastern side of that portion of Britannia Street fronting the land comprising Lot 2 on Deposited Plan 809, Wellington Registry";

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Monday, the seventeenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four, at eight o'clock p.m., at the Public Library, Owaka, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Monday in each quarter at the time and place aforesaid, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman for such meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

Immediate Operational Awards approved by His Majesty the King

Office of the Minister of Defence,
Wellington, 7th January, 1944.

HIS Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve of the following Immediate Operational Awards in recognition of gallant and distinguished service during operations in the South Pacific Area:—

2ND NEW ZEALAND EXPEDITIONARY FORCE

The Distinguished Service Order

Lieutenant-Colonel Cyril Frederick Seaward, M.C. (No. 69402), 35th Battalion.

This officer commanded the 35th Battalion. In the initial stages of the operation he showed great resourcefulness in getting his Battalion within striking distance of the enemy. At first contact at Timbala on 28th September, 1943, he went through to the forward platoons and regardless of his own safety personally directed the action at a most critical period. It was due mainly to his splendid example and good leadership that the enemy was pinned down in the final position. He has commanded the 35th Battalion since January, 1942. The high state of efficiency displayed by all ranks in their first engagement was a direct result of the unflagging energy and personality which Lieutenant-Colonel Seaward displayed during his period of command.

The Military Cross

Lieutenant Sidney Joseph Bartos (No. 17904), 37th Battalion.

This officer was mainly responsible for the capture of a large enemy barge and the annihilation of its crew of fourteen at Tambama Bay during the initial stages of the 37th Battalion's operations. While one portion of the party boarded the barge he with the remainder of his party stayed ashore and surrounded the enemy. Part of the enemy then attempted to return to the barge by a small boat, but were met by the fire of those on board and were killed. Lieutenant Bartos then called on the remainder to surrender, but was met by heavy fire. With complete disregard for his own safety he led his party straight at the enemy and annihilated them. The leadership of Lieutenant Bartos on all occasions while in contact with the enemy was outstanding and deserves the highest commendation.

The Distinguished Conduct Medal

No. 68108 Sergeant Thomas James Walsh, 35th Battalion.

This N.C.O. performed outstanding work as a patrol leader right through the operations carried out by the 35th Battalion in the northern portion of Vella Lavella during the period 28th September to 2nd October, 1943. Repeatedly, and at great personal risk, he pushed forward and gained information of the utmost value. His uncanny bush sense, combined with his absolute disregard for his own safety, enabled him to pin point enemy machine-gun positions on at least three occasions. The result was that the artillery were able to concentrate on these positions, and thereby enable the infantry to get forward without heavy casualties. This N.C.O. set a standard of leadership of the highest order.

No. 50691 Corporal Lewis Nesley Dunlea, 37th Battalion.

In operations in the vicinity of Warambari Bay in Vella Lavella this N.C.O. was a member of several patrols which were operating against concealed enemy positions. Throughout all these operations he displayed courage and resource of an exceptional character. On 6th October, 1943, the officer commanding one of the patrols was seen to fall some distance away and in close proximity to the enemy positions. Corporal Dunlea with others then volunteered to go forward and bring him to safety. In spite of heavy fire from the enemy the attempt was successful, and the officer, who was

found to be dead, was brought back. In performing this duty Corporal Dunlea displayed the utmost gallantry, and continued throughout the operation to give a splendid example to the men under his command.

The Military Medal

No. 71387 Private Robert Armour, 35th Battalion.

From 28th September to 2nd October, 1943, this man acted as Company Runner during the operations at Timbala Bay in Vella Lavella. By his determination and courage under fire he was successful in bringing back information of the greatest importance. On one occasion, when unable to break through the enemy lines, he swam out to sea and round the enemy's flank, again under fire from enemy positions ashore, and, although practically exhausted, succeeded in delivering his report. His courage and determination were an example to his fellow soldiers.

No. 515123 Private Alfred McCullough, 37th Battalion.

During landing operations at Warambari Bay in Vella Lavella on the 5th October, 1943, Private McCullough was wounded in both hands and in the leg by an enemy L.M.G. In spite of this he continued to fight at close quarters, picking up and returning a Japanese grenade which had landed near him. The grenade killed one of the enemy. His courage and determination were an inspiration to the remainder of the platoon and contributed largely to the final destruction of the enemy in that particular locality.

1. This notification may be cited as the Shipping Control (Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour) Notice 1943, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Shipping Control (Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour) Notice 1943† (hereinafter referred to as the principal notice).

2. Clause 6 of the principal notice is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new subclause:—

“(3) Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, no master or person in charge of any ship to which this clause applies shall cause or permit the ship at any time after sunset and before sunrise to enter or move in any part of the waters described in the Fifth Schedule hereto.”

3. The principal notice is hereby amended by revoking the Fourth Schedule and substituting the following new Schedules:—

“FOURTH SCHEDULE

“RESTRICTED PASSAGE FOR PLEASURE VESSELS AT ALL TIMES

“The waters of Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour within the following limits: From North Head by a straight line (through the prohibited anchorage secondly described in the Second Schedule to this notice) to Illiomana Beacon; thence by a straight line to a point on the southern shore of Rangitoto Island at the intersection with that shore of the western limit of the explosives anchorage; thence along the southern, western, and northern shores of Rangitoto Island to Gardiner's Gap between Rangitoto Island and Motutapu; thence in a 355° direction to Bollon's Rock (on the western side of Tiritiri Island); thence in a 040° direction to longitude 174° 55' E.; thence in a 090° direction to a position in latitude 36° 33' S., longitude 175° 01' E.; thence in a 146° direction to Thumb Point on Waiheke Island; thence in a 000° direction to latitude 36° 30' S.; thence in a 285° direction to Flat Rock; thence in a 310° direction to Kawan Island; thence along the southern shore of Kawan Island to the southern entrance point of Bon Accord Harbour; thence by a straight line to Fish Point (latitude 36° 26' 2" S., longitude 174° 47' E.); thence along the coast of the mainland to North Head, the commencing point; including also the waters of Mahurangi Harbour, Waiwera Creek, Weiti River, and all other rivers, creeks, and streams entering the Gulf or Auckland Harbour between Fish Point and North Head.

The Shipping Safety (Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour) Order 1943, Amendment No. 1

PURSUANT to Regulation 4A of the Shipping Safety Emergency Regulations 1940,* the Minister of Defence doth hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Shipping Safety (Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour) Order 1943, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Shipping Safety (Hauraki Gulf and Auckland Harbour) Order 1943† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by revoking clause 7 and substituting the following clause:—

“7. (1) This clause shall not apply with respect to—

“(a) Vessels engaged on Government or Harbour Board service;

“(b) Trading vessels;

“(c) Vessels being used during a period of emergency, within the meaning of the Emergency Reserve Corps Regulations 1941‡, for the purposes of any emergency precautions service established under those regulations.

“(2) Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, no master or person in charge of any small craft to which this clause applies shall cause or permit the vessel to enter or move in any part of the waters described in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

“(3) Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, no master or person in charge of any small craft to which this clause applies shall cause or permit the vessel at any time after sunset and before sunrise to enter or move in any part of the waters described in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

“(4) No master or person in charge of any small craft to which this clause applies shall cause or permit the vessel at any time after sunset and before sunrise to move in any part of the waters described in the Sixth Schedule hereto.”

3. The principal Order is hereby further amended by revoking the Fourth Schedule and substituting the following new Schedules:—
