By-laws under the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922, WHEREAS by section 8 of the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922, all electric light and power works theretofore provided, erected, or constructed by the Crown in or in connection with the Town of Rotorua remain vested in the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, as incorporated by the Rotorua Town Act, 1907, and the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922:

And whereas in respect of these works the said Department has and may exercise all the powers for the time being conferred by law on Borough Councils, except the power to borrow money by way of special loan or to make and levy any rate:

And whereas by licenses granted by the Governor-General in Council, as published in the New Zealand Gazette of the 5th November, 1931, and 1st October, 1936, respectively, the said Department is authorized to generate electricity and erect electric lines within the Borough of Rotorua and portion of the County of Rotorua as set out in the Schedules of the said licenses:

Now, therefore, the said Department, in pursuance of the powers hereinbefore recited and all other powers thereunto enabling it, doth hereby amend the Rotorua Borough By-laws published in the Gazette on the 18th day of February, 1937, at page 431, by revoking by-law number 35 (as substituted by the Rotorua Borough By-laws published in the Gazette on the 2nd day of February, 1939, at page 136, and further amended by the Rotorua Borough By-laws published in the Gazette on the 10th day of July, 1941, at page 2103) and substituting the following by-law, and doth hereby declare that the instrument published in the Gazette of the 10th day of July, 1941, at page 2103 as aforesaid is consequentially revoked, and that this instrument shall take effect on and from the 1st day of February, 1944.

BY-LAW 35

The price for electrical energy supplied by the Department will be calculated on the Board of Trade unit consisting of 1,000 watt-hours. All energy will be charged according to meter-register, but should a supply be given before a meter is installed the consumer shall pay for current supplied during such period a sum based upon the number and capacity for lamps and other apparatus installed.

In all cases units may, at the option of the Department, be measured as kilovolt-ampere hours instead of kilowatt-hours if the power factor of the consumer's load falls below 90 per cent.

hours if the power factor of the consumer's load falls below 90 per cent.

Should the meter prove defective in any way, or be removed for testing or repair, the consumer shall pay per month for energy supplied during such period a sum based on the average former reading of the meter.

If the revenue from any existing or proposed installation does not cover the cost of supply, the Department may impose a connected-load charge in addition to the charge by meter. meter.

meter.

Prepayment meters may be installed in any installation at the discretion of the Department.

The Department may read meters monthly or quarterly or at any other interval that best suits its convenience. Should a special reading be required at any time to suit the convenience of the consumer, such reading will be made or a card will be forwarded on which the consumer can enter the reading of the meter or meters, and an account will be prepared from the readings on this card. A charge may be levied to cover the cost of the special readings as above.

Where premises are occupied intermittently and/or a

Where premises are occupied intermittently and/or a reading of the meter is not obtained at the time of the ordinary meter-reading, a card may be left for or sent to the consumer. This card shall be filled in by the consumer and returned to the Department to enable an account to the premared

Failing the receipt of the card within a period of ten days, the Department will assume that the premises have been unoccupied for the last period between regular meter-

been unoccupied for the last period between regular meterreadings and an account computed in accordance with
clause 35 (d) will be forwarded to the consumer.

In cases where the previous account or accounts have
been assessed in accordance with the preceding paragraph,
the Department on receiving a reading of the meter may
compute the consumption on the basis that the consumer
has been in occupation for the whole or part of the period
from the date of the last actual reading. Such computation
shall not, however, prejudice the right of the consumer to
certify that the premises were occupied for a greater or
lesser period than that assessed by the Department. On
receiving such a certificate the Department may adjust the
account accordingly, provided the periods when the premises
were unoccupied exceed one month continuously.

- (c) If a switch, or the means of control, is supplied by the Department, the consumer shall pay rent for such at the rate of 1s. per month.
- (d) Under special conditions this rate will be available for energy (except lighting) consumed between the hours of $10.30\,$ p.m. and $7\,$ a.m.
- (iii) Prepayment Meters.—Where prepayment meters are installed the charge shall be—

5½d. per unit for lighting; and 1gd. per unit for domestic heating and cooking purposes.

(B) COMMERCIAL AND FARMING

(i) Lighting:—

All units .. 3d. per unit.

(ii) Heating and Power (Monthly):—
1-1,000 units . . . 2d. per unit.
Balance of units . . 1d. "

(iii) Water-heating. - As for "Domestic" (see clause (A) (ii)).

Where in cow-sheds energy for lighting is supplied through a single-phase power meter, then the first 3 units per month will be charged lighting rates for one light, with one additional unit added for each additional light.

(C) EXTRAORDINARY SUPPLY

In cases where an extraordinary supply is given or in cases not covered by the above subclauses (A) or (B), the Department may fix a charge which is considered reasonable under the circumstances.

(D) MINIMUM CHARGE

The minimum charge shall be not less than 2s. 6d. per month for each connection to the system in the Borough of Rotorua and not less than 4s. per month for each connection outside the borough boundary, with the exception of churches and Maori meeting-houses, where 2s. 6d. per month minimum charge is required. Where two or more consumers are supplied through the one connection, then a minimum charge will be levied on each consumer.

(E) DEMAND CHARGE

- (i) All charges are net monthly charges, and the net account will be computed on these charges. The gross amount payable will be the above net account plus an additional charge of twopence (2d.) per one shilling (1s.) of the net account (parts of a shilling not to be taken into account for the purpose of computing this charge). If payment is made on or before due date (see clause (F')) the additional charge will be deducted as a discount.
- (ii) The additional charges in (E) (i) shall not be added to accounts for Government Departments, local bodies, hospitals, fire or other Boards.

(F) DISCOUNT
(i) Discounts will be allowed on current accounts only, and subject to the conditions-

That the full amount of the account, including all arrears, is paid within fourteen days of the reading of the meter:

Provided that should the last day of the period allowed for discount be a Saturday, Sunday, or public holiday, discount shall be allowed if such payment is made on the working-day immediately following.

IIIS Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve of the following Immediate Operational Awards in recognition of gallant and distinguished service during operations on Treasury Islands in the South Pacific Area:—

2ND NEW ZEALAND EXPEDITIONARY FORCE

Bur to the Distinguished Service Order

Brigadier Robert Amos Row, D.S.O. (No. 38618), Commander, 8th New Zealand Infantry Brigade.

For gallant and distinguished service in the field. Brigadier Row was in charge of the operations which resulted in the capture and occupation of the Treasury Islands. These operations extended over the period from 26th October to 20th November, by which latter date practically every Japanese on the Island had been killed. The landing force comprised numerous technical troops in addition to the normal Brigade Group, and the smooth landing of successive transport echelons and the general development of the whole operation was eloquent proof of the thorough and careful way in which Brigadier Row had conceived and planned the expedition. In the operations ashore he displayed similar skill and aggressive and courageous leadership. His personal appearance at each threatened point of his defences did much to inspire his officers and men with confidence in the general direction of the operations, and contributed in large measure to their success. For gallant and distinguished service in the field. Brigadier their success.

The Military Cross

2nd Meutenant Leslie Thomas George Booth (No. 14759), 36th Battalion.

At approximately 1030 hours on 27th October, 1943, he took part in the assault on the Japanese Headquarters. At this time the beach and the L.S.T's. were being subjected to very heavy and accurate enemy mortar fire from a high ridge west of the Saveke River. Casualties were being suffered by the unloading parties, and the unloading operations on the beaches were in danger of being disorganized. 2nd Lieutenant Booth was ordered to attack and capture the mortar position. Only a general indication of the direction from which the fire was coming could be given. 2nd Lieutenant Booth led his platoon up a very steep ridge in face of heavy machine-gun fire and rifle fire. Although the enemy was in considerable force on this ridge, 2nd Lieutenant Booth succeeded in driving the enemy from the ridge and captured two 75 mm. howitzers which had also been shelling the beaches. Both guns' barrels were hot when they were taken. Realizing that the enemy still had a mortar in operation higher up on the ridge, 2nd Lieutenant Booth left one section to hold the gun positions and pushed on up the ridge. After an advance up a very steep ridge, the platoon encountered a strong position surrounding the mortar. Despite being outnumbered, a determined attack was made on the enemy with tommy guns and grenades, and the position was captured. At approximately 1030 hours on 27th October, 1943, he with tommy guns and grenades, and the position was captured.

The enemy fled, leaving ten dead around the position. With the mortar was approximately five hundred rounds of mortar ammunition and a large quantity of grenades and S.A.A. One L.M.G. was also captured. 2nd Lieutenant Booth destroyed L.M.G. was also captured. 2nd Lieutenant Booth destroyed the mortar and howitzers and withdrew. His platoon suffered seven casualties (wounded) in this action. 2nd Lieutenant Booth showed himself an officer of outstanding courage and initiative, and the successful termination of the unloading of the L.S.T's, was due in no small measure to his action.

The Distinguished Conduct Medal

No. 530023 Sergeant William Albert Cowan, Headquarters, 8th New Zealand Brigade.

For distinguished conduct prior to and during operations in the Solomons area. Sergeant Cowan was selected to command two patrols to Treasury Islands before the landing of 8th Brigade Group on 27th October, 1943. The first patrol was sent in to obtain information as to the strength of the enemy and his dispositions. The object of the second patrol was to cut a main telephone line between the enemy O.P. on Laifa Point and the Japanese Headquarters, and to pass information as to enemy movements after the landing had been effected. The first patrol was carried through most successfully under difficult conditions, and resulted in much valuable information being obtained: The second patrol successfully cut the telephone line at 0400 hours on 27th October, and thus delayed information of the approach of the assaulting troops reaching the enemy. During the next five days the patrol was continuously active behind the enemy lines, and much information was obtained. Throughout, Sergeant Cowan showed resource and determination of a high order and high present leavening and conferent tion of a high order, and his personal example and coolness in face of considerable danger was largely responsible for the successful achievement of the missions.

The Military Medal

No. 584617 Sapper Jack Keith Duncan, 23rd Field Coy., New Zealand Engineers.

For bravery in the field during the landing of 8th Brigade Group on Treasury Islands on 27th October, 1943. Beaches were subjected to very heavy shelling and mortar fire for about five hours after the initial landing had been made. This resulted in many casualties to personnel and damage to ships that were unloading. Sapper Duncan, during the whole of this time and with utter disregard for his own personal safety, continued to operate his bulldozer on and in the close vicinity of these beaches in constructing the tracks vitally necessary for the expeditious unloading of ammunition, stores, and equipment. His fine example was a very steadying influence on unloading and carrying parties.

No. 68809 Private Joseph Edward Smith, 34th Battalion.

For gallant conduct during a determined enemy attack at Soanotalu on 2nd November, 1943. Private Smith was with Soanotalu on 2nd November, 1943. Private Smith was with a party of ten, including one officer and one Staff Sergeant, who defended the small beach at Soanotalu. The defenders were considerably outnumbered. When the officer and Staff Sergeant had been mortally wounded and the situation was at its worst Private Smith took command and, by his resolute actions and calmness, kept the defence intact; finally, after five hours' fighting, completely annihilating that portion of the enemy force which had penetrated to the beach.

No. 578368 Corporal Frederick Arthur Armstrong, 36th Battalion.

578368 Corporal Frederick Arthur Armstrong, 36th Battalion. On 5th November, 1943, Corporal Armstrong, as a member of a fighting patrol from his Battalion, was acting as a point scout with Sergeant Ilala, a native guide, when a Japanese fired at Sergeant Ilala. The native Sergeant's rifle jammed when he tried to return the fire, but Corporal Armstrong ran towards the Japanese and shot him at close quarters. The Japanese was not killed, however, and fell down a cliff, and in following him, a strong Japanese party armed with one L.M.G., rifles, and grenades was discovered in a series of caves on the seashore. In the ensuing action, in which ten Japanese were killed and one captured, Corporal Armstrong displayed an absolute disregard of personal safety, and by his courage and leadership inspired his section. One of the enemy was hidden in a cave from where he was able to shoot and kill Sergeant Baird. Fire could not be brought to bear on him, and when grenades were thrown into this cave he scooped them out. Corporal Armstrong then took this cave he scooped them out. Corporal Armstrong then took two grenades, and, crawling down the cliff to a little ledge above the cave, he pulled the pin from a grenade, held it for three seconds, and then tossed it into the cave. He repeated this with the second grenade, and then jumped into the cave to find the Language dead. Hed it not been for Corporal Armstrongic the Japanese dead. Had it not been for Corporal Armstrong's action, the casualties suffered by the patrol would, in all probability, have been heavier.

No. 590948 Private Edward Valentine Owen, 29th Battalion.

For bravery in the field during and subsequent to the landing on Treasury Islands. Private Owen, who is a man of forty years, has shown outstanding devotion to duty during the Treasury Island campaign. He landed with the assaulting companies and immediately carried out a daring reconnaissance. As a result of this he led a fighting patrol against a strongly held enemy post. During the attack on this post, and with a total disregard for his own personal safety, he advanced and threw a grenade into the post, which enabled the rest of the patrol to close in. He has since been most active on patrols into enemy the results of which have on several occasions. territory, the results of which have, on several occasions, enabled the Battalion to effect adjustments to the line held. His devotion to duty and example have been an inspiration to all ranks.

Notes on the Weather for December, 1943

General.—December was a warm settled month. Disturbances which crossed New Zealand were weak and any strong winds were of short duration. Most districts have had excellent conditions for harvesting and shearing, although some of the wool has been short. There has not been sufficient rain for many of the small crops, and burnt pastures are adversely affecting dairy production. By the end of the month the fire hazard throughout the country was becoming serious.

Rainfall.—With few exceptions the month was very dry. Average totals were reached locally at Whangarei and about Taupo and exceeded at most places between Hastings and East Cape. Other districts were dry, the South Island as a whole had only about half its usual rainfall and Canterbury considerably less. In northern parts of that province some totals were extremely small.

Temperatures.—Mean temperatures for the month were mostly one or two degrees above normal. Temperatures were persistently high but on the 6th there were some light frosts, affecting garden growth in parts of Southland.

Sunshine.—Except in the south-eastern portion of the Auckland Province the duration of sunshine was more than average, generally substantial amounts. Wellington (with 313·2 hours) and Hokitika experienced the largest surpluses.

Weather Sequence.—At first a slight depression in the north was giving a few showers about the Bay of Plenty and northern Hawke's Bay. As a cold front crossed New Zealand from the west on the 2nd and 3rd most districts, except Hawke's Bay and those south of Banks Peninsula, experienced a period of rain. A small circulation developing north-west of Cook Strait caused heavy falls on either side of the Strait.

An anticyclone advancing over the northern Tasman covered New Zealand on the 4th, when conditions were mainly fair.

A trough which advanced from the south between the 4th and 6th gave a few showers in eastern districts and rather cool temperatures in the south. During a thunderstorm near Tophouse on the afternoon of the 5th, 1.41 in. of rain fell in thirty minutes.

An anticyclone from the south had spread over New Zealand by the 6th, moderate northerlies predominated and, except for isolated rain at first in the far north, the weather was fair with temperatures becoming warmer. A trough, which had been off southern New Zealand, gave rain in the far south-west on the 10th, but when it advanced the next day light south-easterlies were accompanied by negligible rain and only slightly cooler temperatures. An anticyclone soon covered the South Island and merged with the other east of the North Island. The weather was mainly fair, but on the 14th north-westerlies began to freshen in central and southern districts, with some gales on the 15th and 16th near Cook Strait. Intermittent rain developed in the west of the South Island and some heavy rain extended along the ranges to Taranaki. After disturbances passed off south-western New Zealand a weak cold front advanced northward on the 16th and brought only a brief southerly to the east coast of the South Island.

Pressure continued relatively high to the north-east but became very low to the extreme south, and north-westerlies or westerlies became strong in exposed positions. Isolated showers fell in western districts and there were scattered thunderstorms in the Auckland Province, where it had been warm and humid.

A moderate southerly change on the 18th and 19th gave a few showers mainly in Otago and Canterbury, and later a disturbance deepening north of the Auckland Province gave some steady rain in northern districts, especially in the Napier-Gisborne - Bay of Plenty area.

On the 21st an anticyclone was intensifying over the Tasman Sea, the weather becoming fair

appreciably cooler.

An anticyclone from the west covered New Zealand on the 28th, with fair to cloudy weather prevailing. A shallow trough passing over the South Island on the 30th gave a brief period of south-westerlies with insignificant rain and cooler temperatures, but as the trough continued northwards it became still weaker and the following anticyclone merged with the one ahead.
