

A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby taken and that the Crown land described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby set apart for public works; and I do also declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four.

### THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

**P**URSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Desmond Colin Parkes, of Wakefield, Nelson, Farmer (hereinafter referred to as " the licensee"), wakened, reison, rarmer (nerematter referred to as "the licensee "), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of 88 Valley Stream, situated in Section 25, Block IV, Gordon Survey District, in the Land District of Nelson, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding 1.5 cubic feet per second at any one time, and to erect the electric lines hereinafter described.

### CONDITIONS

### 1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Waterpower Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

### 2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and is subject thereto and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purposes of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the stream at the point at headworks situated within the said Section 25, Block IV, Gordon Survey District, indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 117968, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington, and shall be returned to the said stream at or near the power-house.

### 4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 117968 :--

- (a) Headworks consisting of an intake and water-race and pipe-lines leading to the water-wheel and power-house, here-inafter referred to, giving a static head of approxi-mately 25 ft.;
  (b) Water-wheel and power-house with all necessary equipment for generating electricity;
  (c) Electric lines leading from the power-house aforesaid across Section 25 and Part 2 of Section 12 and the adjoining 88 Valley Main Road to the licensee's dwelling situated on Part 2 of Section 12, Block IV, Gordon Survey District, the said lines being more particularly delineated by means of broken black lines on the aforementioned plan P.W.D. 117968.

### 5. DUBATION OF LICENSE

Unless sooner determined or cancelled, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1965. or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

### 6. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating and transmission voltages shall be approximately 230 volts direct current.

### 7. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this license, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department, and failing such installation the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at 1 kilowatt, and falls within the classes described in paragraph (c) of subclause (B) o clause (1) of Regulation 6 of the Water-power Regulations 1934.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Rection Electric Light and Power Company, Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto on the following conditions.

### CONDITIONS

### 1. PURPOSE OF LINES

THE said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

### 2. LICENSE TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

### 3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be direct current, and is classified as coming under paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. Electrical energy shall be transmitted at a pressure of 230 volts between terminals.

### 4. CHARGES ON SALE

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 9d, per unit for lighting purposes and 4d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes : Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes.

### 5. DURATION OF LICENSE

Unless sooner lawfully determined, this license shall continue in force until the 15th day of February, 1958, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

(£15,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed seven (7) years.
(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.
(3) The said loan or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.
(4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no instalments shall be paid out of loanmoneys.

for which such person may be tried by court-martial, whether such offence shall have been committed before or after the date of this Warrant; and I hereby further authorize you to confirm the pro-ceedings of any such courts-martial and to cause any sentence thereof to be put into execution according to law: Provided, however, that no sentence of death shall be carried into effect unless the execution thereof be approved by myself as Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand in Council : And I do further authorize you to direct your warrant to any officer of the Royal Air Force or of the Royal New Zealand Air Force not below the rank of Squadron Leader giving him a general authority to convene general courts-martial for the trial of any persons subject to the said Act and regulations who shall be charged with any offence for which such person may be tried by court-martial, whether such offence shall have been committed before or after the date of the warrant directed by you to such officer, and also to exercise in respect of the proceedings of such courts-martial the power of confirming the findings or sentences thereof according to law, or, if you should so think fit, of directing him to reserve for your confirmation the proceedings of all or any such courts-martial, in which case you are hereby authorized to exercise in respect of the proceedings so reserved all the powers of a confirming officer in accordance with the said Act and regulations : And that there may not in any case be a failure of justice from the want of a proper person authorized to act as judge-advocate, I do hereby further empower you, in default of a person appointed

And that there may not in any case be a failure of justice from the want of a proper person authorized to act as judge-advocate, I do hereby further empower you, in default of a person appointed by me or deputed by the Solicitor-General, or during the illness or occasional absence of the person so appointed or deputed, to nominate and appoint, and to delegate to any officer duly autho-rized to convene a general court-martial the power of appointing, a fit person from time to time for executing the office of judge-advocate at any court-martial for the more orderly proceedings of the same : the same :

.5. The workers on No. 1 and No. 2 shifts shall receive not less than 1s. 3d. per hour and the workers on No. 3 shift shall receive not less than 1s. 7d. per hour plus, in all cases, the increases granted by the Court of Arbitration in its general orders of the 9th August,

6. The workers on No. 2 and No. 3 shifts shall receive in addition to their wages the sum of 1s. 6d. per shift for each shift worked.

### Price Order No. 197 (Effervescent Saline)

**P**URSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,\* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:-1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 197, and shall come into force on the 28th day of February, 1944.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

2. This Order applies only with respect to-

- (a) Effervescent saline manufactured by J. C. Eno, Ltd. (incorporated in England), and marketed under the trade name of "Eno's Fruit Salt"; and
  (b) Effervescent saline manufactured by Scott and Turner, Ltd., and marketed under the trade name of "Andrews' Liver Salt" Liver Salt.'

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF EFFERVESCENT SALINE TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Manufacturers' Prices

3. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum prices that may be charged or received by the respective manufacturers for any effervescent saline to which this Order applies that is sold to a wholesaler shall be :-

Eno's Fruit Salt-

(a) For "Household" (8 oz.) bottles: 36s. 6d. per dozen.
(b) For "Regular" (4 oz.) bottles: 22s. per dozen.

Andrews' Liver Salt-

- (a) For large (8 oz.) tins (in three-gross lots or more): 30s. 3d. per dozen.
- For large (8 oz.) tins (in less than three-gross lots): 30s. 9d. per dozen. (b) For small (4 oz.) tins (in three-gross lots or more): 17s. 6d.
  - per dozen. For small (4 oz.) tins (in less than three-gross lots): 17s. 9d. per dozen.

(2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are the prices as for delivery in accordance with the following provisions :-

- (a) Where the wholesaler's place of business is at a port and delivery is effected by sea, delivery to the wholesaler shall be free of freight charges to that port:
  (b) Where delivery is effected by rail, delivery to the wholesaler shall be free of freight charges to the wholesaler shall be free of free
- railway-station nearest or most convenient of access to
- (c) Where delivery is effected otherwise than by sea or by rail, delivery to the wholesaler shall be free of freight charges to his place of business.

(3) The maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be reduced by a discount of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. thereof where payment is made on or before the 20th day of the month following the month in which delivery is made to the wholesaler.

Wholesalers' Prices

4. (1) The maximum prices (exclusive of sales tax) that may be charged or received by any wholesaler (other than the manufacturer) for any effervescent saline to which this Order applies shall be :-

Eno's Fruit Salt-

(a) For "Household" (8 oz.) bottles: 41s. 6d. per doze
(b) For "Regular" (4 oz.) bottles: 25s. 3d. per dozen. 41s. 6d. per dozen.

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### Andrews' Liver Salt-

- (a) For large (8 oz.) tins (in one-gross lots or more): 32s. per dozen.
- For large (8 oz.) tins (in less than one-gross lots): 33s. per dozen.
- (b) For small (4 oz.) tins (in one-gross lots or more): 18s. 6d.
  - per dozen. For small (4 oz.) tins (in less than one-gross lots): 19s. 2d. per dozen.

(2) The maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be reduced by a discount of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. thereof where payment is made on or before the 20th day of the month following the month in which delivery is made to the retailer.

### Retailers' Prices

5. (1) The maximum prices that may be charged or received by any retailer for any effervescent saline to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions, namely :-

(a) In the case of effervescent saline sold by a retailer to whom a wholesale supply is available, free of freight charges, for delivery at his store from any source whatever—

Eno's Fruit Salt-

- (i) For "Household" (8 oz.) bottles: 4s. 9d. per (ii) For "Regular" (4 oz.) bottles: 2s. 10d. per
- bottle.

Andrews' Liver Salt-

(i) For large (8 oz.) tins: 3s. 9d. per tin.
(ii) For small (4 oz.) tins: 2s. 3d. per tin.

(b) Where freight charges are incurred by a retailer in obtaining delivery of any effervescent saline at his store the maximum retail prices of such effervescent saline shall be the appropriate maximum prices fixed by para-graph (a) hereof, increased to the nearest halfpenny by graph (a) hereof, increased to the nearest halfpenny by a proportionate part of the freight charges incurred by the retailer: Provided that, where any effervescent saline to which this paragraph applies is obtained by the retailer from a source of supply that is not the nearest or most convenient of access to the retailer's store, the increase of the price authorized by this paragraph shall not exceed a proportionate part of the freight charges that would have been incurred by the retailer if the effervescent saline had been obtained from the source of supply nearest or most convenient of access to his store and if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates.

(2) If in respect of any effervescent saline sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

### NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JANUARY, 1944

Notes on the Weather FOR JANUARY, 1944 General.—The weather during January was mainly warm and settled. Most of the low-pressure troughs were effective in bringing showers only to the more southern districts, where pastures and crops were refreshed. Elsewhere droughty conditions were serious, although the rains between the 18th and 21st gave some alleviation and also decreased the danger of forest fires. Burnt pastures have meant a lack of fattening feed for all stock and a substantial decline in the milk-yield, particularly so throughout the dairyng districts of Taranaki. Vegetables have suffered and many crops ripened prematurely. For harvesting and shearing the weather has been very satisfactory. *Rainfall*.—There was a general shortage of rainfall, most areas having far less than half the normal January total. Deficiencies were most pronounced in the Waikato, Nelson, and Marlborough, and were also appreciable in Taranaki. Westland, Canterbury, and North Otago. Surplus rain occurred between Castlepoint and East Cape with very substantial excesses in the Wairoa-Gisborne region. *Temperatures.*—East of the North Island ranges and over the Auckland Peninsula mean temperatures were slightly below normal, but elsewhere they were warm. The departures above normal, for example, were 2° F. at Auckland, Nelson, and Westport. There were a few light ground frosts inland in the south on the 3rd, in parts of Wellington Province on the 4th, and in several districts on the 12th. *Sunshine.*—Except near Hawke's Bay, most places experienced more than the normal duration of bright sunshine. Large excesses were recorded in Auckland, Taranaki, and Canterbury provinces, Auckland City and Timaru being outstanding in this respect. *Weather Sequence.*—An anticyclone was over northern New Zealand on the 1st, but on the following two days a cold front crossed the rew anticyclone being over the North Island. There was scattered rain in Southland and Otago on the 5th, with a low-pressure trough which soon became very weak as an anti-c

generally on the 6th.

A cold front reaching Southland on the 7th moved off the North Island on the 9th ; ahead, north-westerlies became strong in central districts, moderate rain fell in Westland, lighter rain fell in Southland, and elsewhere amounts were mostly negligible. A more rapid cold front crossed the country late on the 9th and 10th and a depression formed and deepened near Chatham Island, while an anticyclone remained to the south of New Zealand. In the west the weather was fine and mild but it was colder in eastern districts, with strong southerlies at times and a few showers occurred. Winds moderated generally on the 12th. A shallow depression advancing from the west on the 13th gave rather cloudy conditions with some local rain, notably near Kaipara and towards East Come where some then depression formed from the Tacmer See measured by Tachada the 15th and the

towards East Cape, where some thunderstorms occurred. An anticyclone from the Tasman Sea was over New Zealand on the 15th, and the weather was more generally fair. On the 16th there was rain in Westland and Southland associated with a cold front on which a secondary depression developed and moved to the south of Southland. North-westerly winds became strong in central and southern districts, and the heavy precipitation experienced in and west of the southern ranges caused some slips. Occasional rain extended to Taranaki where the trough of the depression became stationary on the 18th, but this moved off the North Island on the 20th, a cyclone being then near Kermadec trough of the depression became stationary on the 18th, but this moved off the North Island on the 20th, a cyclone being then near Kermadec Islands. Southerlies became strong in central districts and rain became fairly general over the North Island and also north of Banks Peninsula, while it remained fine in Westland, Otago, and Southland. On the 21st, southerlies were of gale force about Cook Strait and South Taranaki, and heavy rain occurred in many places between Kaikoura and East Cape, there being several intense thunderstorms towards the north of this belt. Pressure rose in the south on the 23rd and conditions were improved generally. After a weak cold front from the south-west an anticyclone built up over the South Island on the 25th. Temperatures were slightly cooler and a few isolated showers fell. An anticyclone from the Tasman Sea spread over the North Island. The next cold front arriving on the 28th gave moderate rain in Otago and Southland, but it was weak thereafter causing only a slight moderation in the warm temperatures prevailing. Pressure was high generally on the 29th with fair to cloudy weather. A trough associated with a deep depression in high latitudes passed during the last two days, and, apart from a few showers near Foveaux Strait, little rain fell, and on the 31st an anticyclone covered most of New Zealand.
