Altering the Boundaries of the Grey and the Westland Electric-power Districts

A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Grey and the Westland Electric-power Districts by excluding the area described in the First Schedule hereto from the Westland Electric-power District and including such area in the Grey Electric-power District, and do hereby declare that the boundaries of the Grey and the Westland Electric-power Districts shall be those described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto respectively.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Westland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the right or northern bank of the Taramakau River with the mean high-water mark of the Tasman Sea, and proceeding thence generally in an easterly direction along the said right or northern bank of the Taramakau River (as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1922, page 2851, constituting the Grey Electric-power District) to its junction with the eastern boundary of Block VII, Waimea Survey District; thence due south along that boundary across the Taramakau River and a public road to the eastern boundary of Section 2069; thence generally in a southerly and westerly direction along the eastern and southern boundaries respectively of Section 2069 to the north-eastern corner of Section 3185; thence in a southerly direction by the eastern boundary of that section and by the south-eastern boundary of that section crossing the Greymouth-Kumara tramway; thence by the production of that boundary across Crown land and the Greymouth-Kumara Road to the north-eastern boundary of Section 3184; thence in a south-easterly and south-westerly direction by the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries respectively of that section to the northern side of the D.J. Road; thence generally in a westerly direction by the northern side of that road to the south-western corner of Section 129 (E.E.R.); thence in a southerly direction across the said D.J. Road, to and along the north-western boundary of Section 3222 to a point in line with the production of the southern boundary of Section 2545; thence in a westerly direction across a public road, the Hokitika-Greymouth Railway, and again across a public road to the south-eastern corner of the said Section 2545; thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of that section and the production thereof across a public road to the mean high-water mark of the Tasman Sea; thence in a northerly direction by the said mean high-water mark of the Tasman Sea to the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 112302, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

SECOND SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Westland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the right or northern bank of the Taramakau River with the eastern boundary of Block VII, Waimea Survey District, and proceeding due south along that boundary across the Taramakau River and a public road to the eastern boundary of Section 2069; thence generally in a southerly and westerly direction along the eastern and southern boundaries respectively of Section 2069 to the north-eastern corner of Section 3185; thence in a southerly direction by the eastern boundary of that section and by the south-eastern boundary of that section crossing the Greymouth-Kumara Tramway; thence by the production of that boundary across Crown land and the Greymouth-Kumara Road to the north-eastern boundary of Section 3184; thence in a south-easterly and south-westerly direction by the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries respectively of that section to the northern side of the D.J. Road; thence generally in a westerly direction by the northern side of that road to the south-western corner of Section 129 (E.E.R.); thence in a southerly direction across the said D.J. Road to and along the north-western boundary of Section 3222 to a point in line with the production of the southern boundary of Section 2545; thence in a westerly direction across a public road, the Hokitika-Greymouth Railway, and again across a public road to the south-eastern corner of the said Section 2545; thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of that section and the production thereof across a public road to the mean high-water mark of the Tasman Sea; thence in a northerly direction by the said mean high-water mark of the Tasman Sea to the mouth of the Ten Mile Creek, Block II, Te Miko Survey District; thence along the said creek to its source at the summit of the Paparoa Range to Trig. L; thence along the summit of the said range to Trig. G at the source of the Moonlight Creek, continuing down the said creek to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 11, Block XII, Waiwhero Survey District; thence to the south-western corner of the said section; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Sections 11 and 12, eastward along the northern boundary of Section 12; thence along the western boundary of Sections 15 and 16; thence along the northern boundary of Section 16 to the Big River; thence down the said river to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 3021, Block XII, Waiwhero Survey District, continuing along the said boundary to the north-east corner of the said section; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section 2762, Block IX, Mawheraiti Survey District; thence along the north-western boundary of the said section to the Craigieburn River; thence down the said river to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 3, Block IX, Mawheraiti Survey District; thence in a north-easterly direction along the north-western boundaries of Sections 3 and 257, Block IX, Mawheraiti Survey District, and Sections 180, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, and 29, Block X of the said survey district, continuing on same bearing to a point on the right or western bank of the Rough River; thence following down the said river bank to its intersection with the northern or left bank of the Grey River; thence due south across the Grey River to its left or southern bank; thence easterly generally along the said left bank till a point is reached due north of the said north-east corner of Section 5, Block IV, Ahaura Survey District; thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of Section 5 to the intersection with Section 6; thence following the southern boundaries of Sections 6 and 7 to the southern corner of Section 7; thence along the south-western boundaries of Sections 7, 8, 9, and 10, continuing on till a point on the Waipuna Creek is reached; thence down the said creek to the confluence with Noble's Creek; thence up the said creek to its source on Napoleon Hill; thence following track and road in a westerly direction through Orwell Creek Township till the north-western corner of Section 107, Block II, Ahaura Survey

District, is reached; thence in a southerly direction following the road along the eastern boundary of Sections 106 and 11 till the Ahaura River is reached; thence up the said river to a point due north of Trig. I, Block VI, Ahaura Survey District; thence to Trig. I; thence by a right line to Trig. A, Block X of the said survey district; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of Section 1, Block 13 of the said survey district; thence by a right line to the intersection of Kotuku - Bell Hill Road and Grey Valley - Taramakau Road, continuing in a southerly direction along the said road to the intersection with the north-eastern boundary of part of Subdivision I, Block XI, Te Kinga Survey District; thence along the said boundary to the eastern corner thereof; thence in a south-westerly direction generally following the south-eastern boundary of said subdivision, Subdivision 6 in the said block and survey district, and Section 21, Block X of the said survey district; thence along the north-eastern, south-eastern, and south-western boundaries of Section 2852, Blocks XI and XV, Te Kinga Survey District; thence in a south-westerly direction along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 18 and 17, Block X of the said survey district, part Subdivision I, Blocks XIV and XIII of the said survey district, and part Section 868, Block I, Otira Survey District; along the western boundary of Sections 2208 and 2311, Block I of the said survey district, till a point on the right or northern bank of the Taramakau River is reached; thence westerly generally along the said right bank of the Taramakau River to the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plans marked P.W.D. 55566 and P.W.D. 12302, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington, and thereon bordered green and red respectively.

Road to the south-western corner of Section 129 (E.E.R.); thence in an easterly direction generally along the northern side of D.J. Road to south-eastern corner of Section 3184; thence north-easterly and north-westerly by the south-eastern and north-eastern boundary of Section 3184 to a point where the south-eastern boundary of Section 3185 produced meets it; thence north-easterly across the Greymouth-Kumara Road and Crown land to the south-eastern corner of Section 3185; thence northerly by the south-eastern boundary of that section across the Greymouth-Kumara Tramway, and again by that boundary and the eastern boundary of Section 3185 to the southern boundary of Section 2069; thence in an easterly and northerly direction along the southern and northern boundary of Section 2069 to the eastern boundary of Block VII, Waimea Survey District; thence due north across a public road to the point of commencement, excluding therefrom the boroughs of Hokitika and Ross. HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Order in Council dated the twelfth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and published in the *Gazette* of the twentieth day of the same month at page 316, vesting the management of certain wharves in the Hokianga Harbour Board by revoking clause one in the Schedule to the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council and substituting the following clause:—

"1. The vesting of the management of the wharves is subject to the Foreshore License Regulations 1940, with the exception of clauses twenty and twenty-one of the said regulations which for the purpose of this Order in Council are hereby excluded, and the provisions of the said regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto."

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act, 1941, and of every other power in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby constitute and declare the parts of New Zealand described in the Schedule hereto a catchment district under the said Act as from this first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four, and doth hereby assign to such catchment district the name of the "North Canterbury Catchment District."

SCHEDULE

ALL those areas in the Canterbury Land District comprising:—
That portion of the County of Ashburton, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea-coast in line with the centre-line of Acton Road forming the north-eastern boundary of R.S. 9585, Block XI, Rakaia Survey District, being a point on the south-eastern boundary of the County of Ashburton (*New Zealand Gazette*, 1939, page 2115); thence north-westerly by a right line across the road reserve to and along the said Acton Road to its junction with the Great South Road at the south-eastern boundary of Rakaia Township; thence south-westerly along that road to its junction with the road forming the south-western boundary of Rakaia Township aforesaid; thence north-westerly along that road to its junction with the West Town Belt; thence north-easterly along the said West Town Belt to Rakaia Road; thence north-westerly along that road passing through Highbank Settlement, Blocks I and II, Corwar Survey District, to its junction with Terrace Road; thence along that road and the closed portion of the said road, now Rural Sections 33478x and 26588x, to the West Coast Road; thence along that road to its junction with the Rakaia Gorge Bridge Road; thence westerly along that road to a point at the westernmost corner of Rural Section 19667, Block X, Hutt Survey

District; thence proceeding in a north-westerly direction along the watershed between Rakaia River and Pudding Hill Stream, across Rural Sections 33476, 19752, and 19754, along the eastern and northern boundary of Rural Section 30421, the northern boundary of Rural Section 30315, to and across a road; thence northerly to and along the summit of Mount Hutt Range, passing through Trig. Station W, Block VI, Hutt Survey District, and Trig. Station, Mount Hutt (P), Block III, Hutt Survey District, to the Trig. Station, Steepface Hill (B), Block I, Hutt Survey District; thence generally westerly along the watershed between the Swift River, Middle Creek, and Cascade Glen, passing through Redcliffe Saddle, the summit of Middle Hill (N), Block IV, Somers Survey District, to the summit of Black Hill Range; thence northerly along that range to Trig. Station, Black Hill (L), Block IV, Somers Survey District; thence westerly along the watershed between Turton's Stream and Glenrock Stream, through Turton's Saddle and the source of north branch of Ashburton River to Trig. Station B, Block VII, Glenrock Survey District; thence southerly along the watershed between Godley Stream, Home Creek, and the said north branch of Ashburton River, passing through Trig. Station, Godley Peak, Block VII, Glenrock Survey District, Trig. Station, Mount Catherine (O), Block I, Somers Survey District, Clent Hills Saddle, along the summit of Taylor Range to Trig. Station, Mount Taylor (B), Block X, Somers Survey District, along the summit of Mount Somers Range to a point opposite the watershed between the west branch of Stour River and south branch of Swin River; thence westerly to and along the said watershed to Trig. Station K, Block IX, Somers Survey District, on Longman Range; continuing along the watershed south of Swin River and Lake Heron; thence northerly along the watershed between the source of the Ashburton River and Cameron River, passing through Trig. Station, Pyramid (V), Block VI, Heron Survey District, the summit of Wild Man's Hill, Wild Man's Brother; between Ashburton Glacier and Douglas Glacier, to the summit of Trig. Station, Mount Arrowsmith, Block XII, Ramsay Survey District; thence northerly along the summit of Arrowsmith Range, passing through Trig. Stations, Couloir Peak and Jagged Peak, Blocks XIII and IX, Whitcombe Survey District, respectively; thence westerly along the watershed between the sources of Lawrence River and Rakaia River, passing through Trig. Station, Mount Gould, Block VIII, Ramsay Survey District, and continuing between Lyell Glacier, the Shanks Glacier, and Frances Glacier to the summit of Trig. Station, Mount Tyndall, on the Southern Alps, Block I, Tyndall Survey District, being a point on the north-western boundary of the County of Ashburton; thence generally north-easterly, south-easterly, and south-westerly along the boundary of the County of Ashburton aforesaid to the point of commencement.

Department of Internal Affairs,
 Wellington, 7th March, 1944.

THE following special order made by the Kawhia County Council is published in accordance with the provisions of the Counties Act, 1920, in so far as publication is required by that Act. Pursuant to section 100 of the aforesaid Act, as amended by section 3 of the Counties Amendment Act, 1921-22, I hereby fix the 31st day of March, 1944, as the date from which the redivision of ridings set out in the special order shall take effect.

SPECIAL ORDER

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Counties Act, 1920, the Kawhia County Council hereby by way of special order resolves as follows:—

"1. On and after the 1st day of April, 1944, the Awaroa and Te Kauri Ridings of the county shall be abolished, and there shall be in lieu thereof a new riding to be known as the 'Awaroa-Te Kauri Riding.'

"2. The boundaries of the said Awaroa-Te Kauri Riding shall be as follows:—

"All that area in the Kawhia County, bounded towards the north by the Oparau River and the Oparau Riding (as described in *New Zealand Gazette* No. 81 of 9th November, 1922, page 2957); towards the east by the Otorohanga and Waitomo Counties (as described in the Waikato and King-country Counties Act, 1921-22); towards the south by the Marokopa Riding (as described in the aforesaid *Gazette*, page 2958); and towards the west by the Waiharakeke Riding (as described in the aforesaid *Gazette*) and the Kawhia Harbour.

"3. The said Awaroa-Te Kauri Riding shall elect one councillor to the Kawhia County Council.

"4. At the first election of councillors held after the 1st day of April, 1944, and thereafter, the Taharoa Riding of the county shall elect two councillors to the Kawhia County Council instead of one councillor as heretofore."

I certify that the above special order was duly passed at a special meeting of the Kawhia County Council held on the 14th day of December, 1943, and confirmed at a meeting of the said Council held on the 25th day of January, 1944.
