ROYAL NEW ZEALAND NAVAL VOLUNTEER RESERVE OFFICERS Confirmation and Promotion in Time of War (N.A. 9/12/6)

The rules for promotion and confirmation of Royal New Zealand Naval Volunteer Reserve Officers in time of war have been revised and consolidated and are issued herewith for information. 2. In the Schedules appended to this Navy Order—

Schedule A contains the rules for confirmation and promotion of all R.N.Z.N.V.R. officers entered or promoted prior to 1st May, 1943 :

Schedule B contains the rules for confirmation and promotion of all R.N.Z.N.V.R. officers entered or promoted on or after 1st May, 1943, with retrospective provision for promotion to the rank of Acting Sub-Lieutenant:
 Schedule C contains the rules under which Junior Reserve

Officers may be recommended for accelerated promotion.

3. The names of officers who are eligible for promotion should be reported to the Naval Board, certifying the date on which each of the requirements has been satisfied. Officers not recommended for confirmation or promotion when qualified by age and service are to be the subject of a special report accompanied by form S. 206. (Attention is drawn to paragraph 4 of C.A.F.O. 1312/40.)

4. (a) The naval watchkeeping certificate is to be worded as follows :-

"[Rank], [name], is competent to take charge of a watch at sea as a Lieutenant, and to perform efficiently the duties of that rank."

(b) Where a Commanding Officer does not feel justified in awarding the full naval watchkeeping certificate, as shown above, a restricted certificate may be awarded by the addition of a paragraph to the following effect :-

"2. This certificate is granted for [insert class of vessels] only."

(c) Where the additional paragraph referred to above is added, the certificate will not be regarded as a full naval watchkeeping certificate, and the notation (W/K) will not appear against the officer's name in the Navy List.

(d) Copies of watchkeeping certificates awarded are to be forwarded at the time of the award or with the recommendation for promotion if at the time of the award the officer is due for promotion.
5. Henceforth no R.N.Z.N.V.R. officer, Executive Branch, will be promoted to the confirmed rank of Lieutenant in the Executive Branch unless in possession of a watchkeeping certificate, irrespective

Branch unless in possession of a watchkeeping certificate, irrespective of the officer's age or date of entry. Where officers have not had an opportunity of qualifying for a naval watchkeeping certificate owing to the exigencies of the Service, this requirement for promotion may be dispensed with if they are certified by their Commanding Officers as competent to carry out in an efficient manner the duties upon which they are employed. In such cases, officers without watchkeeping certificates will be promoted to Acting-Lieutenant only, and will be eligible for the confirmed rank of Lieutenant on obtaining a watchkeeping certifi-cate, and seniority as such will be antedated to the date of promotion to the acting rank. The same rate of pay applies both to the acting and confirmed rank. 6. The naval watchkeeping certificate is to be granted by the

and confirmed rank.
6. The naval watchkeeping certificate is to be granted by the Commanding Officer of the ship in which the officer is serving except in the case of minor war vessels, where the watchkeeping certificate is to be granted by the appropriate administrative authority. NOTE.—All seagoing vessels in the R.N.Z.N. other than the cruisers are to be regarded as minor war vessels.
7. In future, ratings promoted from the lower deck will, if under nineteen and a half years be promoted to Midshiman or if own.

7. In future, ratings promoted from the rower dock win, it under nineteen and a half years, be promoted to Midshipman or, if over nineteen and a half years, to Acting Sub-Lieutenant or relative rank. Candidates entered direct from civil life as officers will normally, if under nineteen and a half years, be appointed as Probationary Temporary Midshipman in their appropriate branch or, if over

nineteen and a half years, as Probationary Temporary Acting Sub-Lieutenant. They will be eligible for confirmation after three months' service if recommended by their Commanding Officer or, in the case of Air Engineer Officers, on the grant of a certificate of competency.

s. In order to reduce correspondence between ships and Navy Office arising out of confirmation in rank and promotions of Reserve officers from Midshipman to Acting Sub-Lieutenant and from Acting Sub-Lieutenant to Sub-Lieutenant, it has been decided that these confirmations and promotions will be promulgated by Navy Office on the date on which the officer becomes qualified by age or service, provided that his Commanding Officer has not *previously* informed Navy Office that he does not intend to recommend the officer for confirmation in rank or promotion, and subject to previous reports being satisfactory. Otherwise, it will be assumed that the officer is recommended and no recommendation need be forwarded. As it will not be possible to revert officers confirmed or promoted, it is essential that Commanding Officers should report by signal to Navy

As it will not be possible to revert officers confirmed or promoted, it is essential that Commanding Officers should report by signal to Navy Office in good time that they do not intend to recommend an officer for confirmation in rank or promotion. 9. Consideration, will be given to recommendations for accelerated promotion to the rank of Lieutenant of R.N.Z.N.V.R. officers (both permanent and temporary) who are considered by their Commanding Officers to be outstanding in the performance of their duties. Before forwarding recommendations, Commanding Officers are to satisfy themselves that officers comply with the conditions of Schedule C of this Order, and are sufficiently outstanding in com-parison with the average officer of their rank to justify accelerated promotion being considered. In no circumstances will recom-mendations be considered in respect of officers who do not satisfy the service and age requirements in Schedule C, which shows the minimum conditions under which an officer can be recommended. Recommendations are to be submitted by Commanding Officers of major war vessels direct to Navy Office or, in the case of officers serving in minor war vessels, to administrative authorities, who are to forward them to Navy Office stating whether they concur in the recommendation. Recommendations are to be accompanied by form S. 206. For the purpose of recommendations of officers for accelerated mention.

to forward them to Navy Office stating whether they concur in the recommendation. Recommendations are to be accompanied by form S: 206. For the purpose of recommendations of officers for accelerated promotion, acting and probationary time may be included for calculating the period of qualifying service laid down.
10. Where a representation or request, &c., concerning confirmation in rank, promotion, award of watchkeeping certificates, &c., is made by an officer in writing, it should be considered by his Commanding Officer, who should in turn make representations through the administrative authority to the Naval Board indicating the reason for his recommendation, (e.g., Navy Order, Schedule A, B, or C), and stating the date on which the request is recommended for approval. NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR FEBRUARY

General.—February was a month of mixed weather with several heavy rains. These have promoted an abundance of growth, which has been very beneficial to dairy production and to young crops for winter feed. Conditions were, however, not very favourable for harvesting grain.

grain. Rainfall.—Many places had large rainfall totals. The Taupo - Bay of Plenty region experienced at least twice its usual amount, and new records were established near Rotorua. Several rainfalls reported in that vicinity were over 5 in. on the 22nd when Lake Rotorua and Rotoehu had falls of 9 in. Southern Taranaki and most of the Wellington Province outside the city area had rainfalls appreciably below normal. Apart from the coast from Gisborne to East Cape, the remainder of the North Island had surplus rain. Nearly all the South Island, also, had excess rain, the country from Greymouth and Ashburton southward to Queenstown and Waipiata had at least treble the February average, and places near the Waitaki River had exceptional surpluses of 350 per cent. The rainfall to the southward decreased, so that in Foreaux Strait and Stewart Island totals were near normal. The only other part failing to receive excess rain. *Temperatures.*—Mean temperatures were moderately above normal over the North Island, except near the Bay of Plenty and at New Plymouth. Most of the South Island was slightly cooler, Nelson and Westland, however, being somewhat warmer than normal. Humidities were frequently high throughout the month. On the 8th, light frosts were experienced in several districts. *Sunshine.*—Most eastern districts had less sunshine than usual, noticeably so at Hanmer, Dunedin, and Gore, while the far north and Wanganui had appreciable excesses.

Weather Sequence.—At the beginning of the month an anticyclone moved away to the north-east. On a cold front which crossed the South Island on the 2nd and the North on the 3rd a depression developed which remained active near Westland. Ahead of the front northerly winds were strong at times, but later southerlies extended over the country. Most districts received some rain which was heaviest in Westland, but falls were substantial also in Canterbury. A cold change advancing on the 6th was accompanied by brief showers and isolated hail in the south, but the weather soon cleared and an anticyclone spread over New Zealand on the 7th. A truth appreciable with a depression to the south crossed from the west on the 9th and 10th. Northerly winds were strong in central

anticyclone spread over New Zealand on the 7th.
A trough associated with a depression to the south crossed from the west on the 9th and 10th. Northerly winds were strong in central and northern districts, with gales in Cook Strait. A deep centre which had developed off Westland caused widespread heavy rain near and west of the Alps with some floodings. Nelson and Canterbury also received a considerable amount of rain, while most of the North Island
experienced moderate falls. By the 11th, except for scattered rain between Gisborne and Russell, the weather was fair.
Southerlies freshened on the 13th, there being an anticyclone over the Tasman Sea and a small depression off Gisborne. It was showery in eastern districts, but conditions rapidly improved from the south and the anticyclone moved to the east.
A cold front, which reached the South Island late on the 16th, crossed most of it the next day and then retreated. Meanwhile, an anticyclone was built up near Auckland. At first there were very heavy falls near Greymouth and Hokitika, and, later, rain extended to the Southern Sounds and Otago.

the Southern Sounds and Otago. For several days a high-pressure system persisted to the east and caused a flow of warm, moist air over New Zealand. A deep depression passed Norfolk Island on the 20th, west of North Cape at noon on the 21st, and was near Southland the next morning. North-easterly winds increased throughout the Auckland Province and in many other places, and Taranaki and Nelson experienced very strong gales. Rain extended from the north, falls being heaviest over the Auckland Province. On the 22nd it became more settled over the South Island and began to improve over the North Island from the north and west. A frontal zone lying in a N.-S. direction was near Coromandel Peninsula on the night of the 21st and did not move clear of Bay of Plenty till after the 25th. This disturbance was associated with a line of thunder activity, and flood-producing rains were experienced in the Rotoma-Whakatane region. Between the 25th and 28th a weakening cold front crossed New Zealand from the south-west and was followed by an anticyclone. Winds remained moderate and, except in isolated cases, showers were light and scattered. It was very dull on the mornings of the 27th and 28th on the east coast of the South Island. A new cold front was crossing southern New Zealand on the 29th accompanied by occasional rain, which was heavy in South Westland.
