*Price Order No. 202 (Amending Price Order No. 128) (Eggs)*

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,\* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 202, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 128† (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Order”).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 27th day of March, 1944.

3. The Second Schedule to the principal Order, as set out in Price Order No. 198‡, is hereby revoked and the following Schedule substituted therefor:—

*Varying the Determinations in respect of the Gisborne Harbour Board's Loan of £185,000*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 22nd day of March, 1944

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

**W**HEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three (hereinafter referred to as "the said Order in Council"), and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising in New Zealand by the Gisborne Harbour Board (hereinafter referred to as "the said local authority") of a loan of one hundred and eighty-five thousand pounds (£185,000), to be known as "Redemption Loan, 1944" (hereinafter referred to as "the said loan"):

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not yet been exercised, and it is expedient to vary the determinations aforesaid in respect of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby vary the determinations aforesaid in respect of the said loan by prescribing as follows:—

(1) In lieu of a rate of interest not exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum, as specified in clause two of the said Order in Council, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per centum per annum.

(2) In lieu of repayment by equal annual or half-yearly instalments of principal and interest, as specified in clause three of the said Order in Council, the said loan shall be repaid by half-yearly instalments in the half-years set out in the first column of the Schedule hereunder of the amounts set opposite each half-year in the second column of the said Schedule. Each such half-yearly instalment includes a repayment of principal of the amount set opposite each such half-year in the third column of the said Schedule and a half-year's interest calculated at the rate of three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per centum per annum, as specified in clause one above, on the amount of principal outstanding immediately prior to the date of payment of such instalment.
