Open Season for Imported Game and Native Game in Tauranga Acclimatization District

In exercise of the powers vested in him by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, the Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby declare open seasons for the taking or killing of imported game and/or native game of the kinds hereinafter specified in the Tauranga Acclimatization District, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 17 of 12th March, 1925, at page 753, during the periods set forth in each case and subject in all cases to the conditions set out hereunder:—

1. Season for cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail: 6th May to 16th June, 1944 (both days inclusive).
2. Season for grey duck, spoonbill duck, black swan, and pukeko: 6th May to 21st May, 1944 (both days inclusive).

CONDITIONS

- 1. No person shall commence shooting earlier than one hour before sunrise or continue shooting later than one hour after sunset on any day during the open season concerned.
- 2. (a) No person shall use live birds of any species as decoys nor shall use more than fifteen artificial decoys at any one time, and no such artificial decoys shall be spread over a greater area than thirty yards square.
- (b) No person shall place any artificial decoys within 100 yards of the nearest of any other artificial decoys set out by any other person.
- (c) No person shall in any place during the period in that place of the open season, hereby declared, use in connection with the taking or killing of imported and/or native game, any form of decoying game by the aid of corn, wheat, oats, barley, maize, or any other grain or any products of grain or any other food placed by any person in or near the margin of any river, stream, lagoon, pond, swamp, estuary, or other water.
- 3. No person shall use or cause to be used any motor-vehicle in connection with the taking or killing of imported game and/or native game: Provided that this condition shall not be so construed as to prohibit the use of any motor-vehicle for the purpose of travelling either generally or to or from a rendezvous.
- 4. No person shall use or cause to be used for the purpose of taking or killing any imported or native game any unmoored floating stand, pontoon, hide, mai-mai, or loo, or any boat artificially dressed or covered in any way.
- 5. No person engaged in shooting from any shelter, mai-mai, mudhole, boat, louvre, or other contrivance shall use more than one gun: Provided that a person so engaged may have a second gun in a condition not immediately suitable for use, and held for use only in the event of the first gun becoming damaged or otherwise unfit for use.
- 6. Licenses to take or kill such imported game and native game within the Tauranga Acclimatization District will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of thirty shillings (30s.) each: Provided that licenses to take or kill imported game and native game within the said district will be issued to persons receiving an age benefit or a miner's benefit under the Social Security Act, 1938, on payment of the sum of twenty shillings (20s.) each; and the Secretary of the Tauranga Acclimatization Society, or any person authorized by such Secretary in that behalf, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses. to sign and issue the said licenses.
 - 7. No person shall in any one day take or kill more than-

- (a) Nine head of cock pheasants;(b) Twenty-five head in all of grey duck, spoonbill duck, and black swan;
- (c) Fifteen head in all of grey duck and/or spoonbill duck; and
- (d) Eight head of pukeko.
- 8. No person shall take or kill native or imported game on the 8. No person shart take of kin hartve or imported game on the 6th, 7th, or 8th days of May, 1944, while occupying any stand, hide, loo, or position, as commonly used by duck-shooters (hereinafter referred to as "a stand"), which has been duly claimed by any other license-holder in accordance with the following provisions :
 - (a) A stand may be claimed by the planting thereon at any time after noon on the 29th day of April, 1944, of a stake with a board attached having plainly marked thereon the name and address of the claimant and the number of his license:

(b) No person shall claim more than one stand:
(c) No stand shall be claimed on or within 100 yards of a stand which has already been duly claimed by any other person, except with the consent of such last-mentioned person:

Provided, however, that any stand which is not occupied by the claimant within half an hour after sunrise on any of the aforesaid days may be occupied on that day by any other license-holder:

Provided further that nothing in this clause contained shall be deemed to affect in any way whatsoever the rights of owners or occupiers of any lands in respect of shooting on such lands.

Price Order No. 219 (Meat sold in Wellington Abattoir District)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 219, and shall come into force on the 17th day of April, 1944.
2. (1) Price Order No. 176† is hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, "the said specification" means the New Zealand Emergency Standard Specification (No. N.Z.S.S. E. 79) entitled "Grades of Meat for Sale on the Local Market and Definitions of Joints and Cuts," issued by the New Zealand Standards Institute under the authority of the Minister of Agriculture and the Minister of Industries and Commerce, and, subject to the proviso hereto, includes any amendment of the said specification that may hereafter be made:

Provided that, for the purposes of this Order, no such amendment shall have any effect before the expiration of seven days after the date of publication in the Gazette of a notification of the making of the amendment.

(2) References in this Order to the kind, description, or grade of any meat shall be deemed respectively to be references to the kind, description, or grade of such meat within the meaning and for the purposes of the said specification.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

- 4. (1) This Order applies only with respect to retail sales of meat intended for human consumption and sold within the Wellington Abattoir District constituted under the Meat Act, 1939.
- (2) All meat sold or delivered to a purchaser during the currency of this Order shall be deemed to be intended for human consumption unless it is sold for some other specific purpose.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF MEAT TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 5. (1) The basic retail prices of meat of the kinds and descriptions specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate prices prescribed in that Schedule.
- (2) Except where an increase or reduction in the retail price of any such meat is authorized or required to be made in accordance with the Second Schedule hereto, or the following provisions of this Order, the maximum retail price of any such meat shall be calculated at the rate of the appropriate basic price fixed in accordance with the First Schedule hereto.

 (3) If in respect of any lot of meat the maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

 6. (1) The maximum retail prices as aforesaid are fixed in respect of cash sales of meat delivered over the counter.

 (2) Where delivered over the counter is effected etherwise them counter where the calculated are the maximum retail price.

 (3) No additional charges shall be made by a retailer for wrapping any meat to which this Order applies, or for trimming or other incidental and customary services performed in relation to the retailing of any such meat.

- 7. (1) For the purposes of this clause the basic wholesale values of meat shall be as follows:-

 (g) Second-grade Pork: 5½d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop.
 (i) First-grade Lamb: 7½d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop.
 (j) First-grade Hogget: 6d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop.
 (k) First-grade Mutton: 5d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop.
 (l) Second-grade Mutton: 4d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop.
 (m) Third-grade Mutton: 3d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop.

- (3) The maximum retail price fixed in accordance with the last preceding subclause shall continue to operate for a period of four successive weeks, irrespective of any variation within that period of the prices paid by retailers in the said abattoir district.

 (4) Thereafter, in each successive period of four weeks, the maximum retail price in the said district shall, if necessary, be adjusted, by increase or further reduction, as the case may require, at the rate of one halfpenny per pound for every full halfpenny per pound of the average increase or reduction during the preceding period of four weeks, in the prices paid by retailers, but so that in no circumstances shall the maximum retail prices fixed in accordance with clause 5 hereof and the Second Schedule hereto be exceeded.

RETAILERS TO EXHIBIT RETAIL PRICES

- 8. (1) Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any joints or cuts of meat to which this Order applies shall affix to each joint or cut a ticket, placard, or label on which the total retail price of such joint or cut shall be stated in legible and prominent characters.
- (2) In the case of meat items which in accordance with the customary practice within the trade are offered or exposed for sale otherwise than by the joint or cut the retailer shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the meat to which it relates as to be obviously in relation thereto a ticket, placard, or label showing in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound or per unit, as the case may be.

Price Order No. 220 (Meat sold Elsewhere than in the Wellington Abattoir District)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 220, and shall come into force on the 17th day of April, 1944.
- 2. (1) Price Order No. 98† is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
- 3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, "the said specification" means the New Zealand Emergency Standard Specification (No. N.Z.S. E. 79) entitled "Grades of Meat for Sale on the Local Market and Definitions of Joints and Cuts," issued by the New Zealand Standards Institute under the authority of the Minister of Agriculture and the Minister of Industries and Commerce, and, subject to the proviso hereto, includes any amendment of the said specification that may hereafter be made: Provided that, for the purposes of this Order, no such amendment shall have any effect before the expiration of seven days after the date of publication in the Gazette of a notification of the making of the amendment.
- (2) References in this Order to the kind, description, or grade of any meat shall be deemed respectively to be references to the kind, description, or grade of such meat within the meaning and for the purposes of the said specification.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

- 4. (1) This Order applies only with respect to retail sales of meat intended for human consumption and sold elsewhere than in the Wellington Abattoir District constituted under the Meat Act, 1939.
- (2) All meat sold or delivered to a purchaser during the currency of this Order shall be deemed to be intended for human consumption unless it is sold for some other specific purpose.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF MEAT TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 5. (1) The basic retail prices of meat of the kinds and descriptions specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate prices prescribed in that Schedule.
- (2) Except where an increase or reduction in the retail price of any such meat is authorized or required to be made in accordance with the Second Schedule hereto, or the following provisions of this Order, the maximum retail price of any such meat shall be calculated at the rate of the appropriate basic price fixed in accordance with the First Schedule hereto.
- (3) If in respect of any lot of meat the maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.
 - 6. (1) The maximum retail prices as aforesaid are fixed in respect of cash sales of meat delivered over the counter.
- (2) Where delivery of any meat is effected otherwise than over the counter or where the sale is not for cash, the maximum retail price of that meat shall be the appropriate maximum retail price as fixed by this Order, increased by 1d. per pound.
- (3) No additional charges shall be made by a retailer for wrapping any meat to which this Order applies, or for trimming or other incidental and customary services performed in relation to the retailing of any such meat.

VARIATION OF MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES BY REASON OF VARIATION IN PRICES OF PRIME-QUALITY LIVE-STOCK

- 7. (1) For the purposes of this clause the basic wholesale values of meat derived from prime-quality live-stock shall be as follows:—

 - (a) Veal: 4½d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop:
 (b) Ox and Heifer Beef: 36s. per 100 lb. carcass-weight of cattle purchased on the market or, alternatively, 4d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop:

 - (s) Pork: 7d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop:
 (d) Lamb: 7½d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop:
 (e) Wether and Maiden Ewe Mutton (other than hogget mutton): 5d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop:
 (f) Hogget Mutton: 6d. per pound of carcass delivered into retailer's shop.
- (2) If in any locality within which this Order applies the average price paid by retailers for meat derived from prime-quality live-stock is less during any continuous period of four weeks than the basic wholesale value of such meat fixed in accordance with the last preceding subclause, the maximum retail price in that locality of meat of the same kind shall, after the expiration of the said period of four weeks, be at the rate of the appropriate maximum retail price fixed in accordance with clause 5 hereof and the Second Schedule hereto, reduced by one halfpenny per pound for every full halfpenny per pound by which the average price paid by retailers during the aforesaid period of four weeks is less than the basic wholesale value.
- (3) The maximum retail price fixed in accordance with the last preceding subclause shall continue to operate for a period of four successive weeks, irrespective of any variation within that period of the prices paid by retailers in the locality.

(4) Thereafter, in each successive period of four weeks, the maximum retail price in the locality shall, if necessary, be adjusted, by increase or further reduction, as the case may require, at the rate of one halfpenny per pound for every full halfpenny per pound of the average increase or reduction during the preceding period of four weeks, in the prices paid by retailers, but so that in no circumstances shall the maximum retail prices fixed in accordance with clause 5 hereof and the Second Schedule hereto be exceeded.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF MEAT OTHER THAN "PRIME-QUALITY" MEAT

8. The maximum retail price per pound of any meat of a kind mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, but of a quality other than "prime-quality," shall be the maximum price per pound fixed in accordance with this Order as for prime-quality meat of the same kind, reduced by an amount equal to 20 per cent. thereof.

RETAILERS TO EXHIBIT RETAIL PRICES

- 9. (1) Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any joints or cuts of meat to which this Order applies shall affix to each joint or cut a ticket, placard, or label on which the total retail price of such joint or cut shall be stated in legible and prominent characters.
- (2) In the case of meat items which in accordance with the customary practice within the trade are offered or exposed for sale otherwise than by the joint or cut the retailer shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the meat to which it relates as to be obviously in relation thereto a ticket, placard, or label showing in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound or per unit, as the case may be.

 (c) The description "plucked, drawn, and trussed" means poultry from which all feathers, head, shanks, and internal organs have been removed and which is shaped by means of skewers or string ready for cooking purposes.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

 (1) This Order applies with respect to wholesale and retail sales of dead poultry.
 (2) The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction, as well as to other sales.
 (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any poultry to which the Order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF POULTRY TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES Wholesalers' Prices

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any poultry to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the Schedule hereto.

(2) The wholesale prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery at the wholesaler's store or other premises from which delivery to

the purchaser is effected.

(3) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler elsewhere than at premises occupied by him, he may add to the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the said Schedule the reasonable cost of delivery, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier, at current freight rates.

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any poultry to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the Schedule hereto.

(2) If in respect of any poultry sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the Schedule hereto is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the poultry shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

DUTIES IMPOSED ON RETAILERS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS ORDER

6. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any poultry to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position, in such proximity to the poultry to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof, a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the following particulars:—

- (a) The retail price per pound of the poultry:(b) With respect to chickens and boiling fowls, the grade thereof:
- (c) With respect to plucked poultry that has not been drawn, the word "undrawn".
