A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the First and Second Schedules hereto is hereby taken for public works, and that an easement is hereby taken for a public work over the land described in the Third Schedule hereto vesting in His Majesty the King the full and free liberty, right, license, and authority in perpetuity to construct and use a right-of-way with the right for His Majesty's servants, agents, and workmen from time to time and at all times hereafter to go, pass, and repass with or without horses or other animals or vehicles over the said land, such easement to be held appurtenant to the land described in the Second Schedule hereto, and that the leasehold estate or interest held from His Majesty the King by Albert Small, of Wangamoa, Farmer, under and by virtue of renewable lease, Volume 35, folio 151 (Nelson Registry), in the land described in the Fourth Schedule hereto is hereby taken for a public work, and that the Crown Land described in the Fifth Schedule hereto is hereby set apart for a public work; and I do also declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four.

WHEREAS by a Warrant dated the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four, you, the said Francis Vernon Frazer, John Wood, and Drummond Holderness, were constituted and appointed to be a Commission in terms of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, to inquire into and report on certain matters relating to proposed developmental works near the mouth of the Hutt River, and upon such other matters arising thereout as may come to your notice in the course of your inquiries and which you consider should be investigated in connection therewith, and upon any matters affecting the position which you consider should be brought to the attention of the Government with the object of ascertaining the necessity or desirability of the several proposed works:

Now, therefore, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby declare and appoint that the time at or before which you shall present to me your report aforesaid is hereby extended to the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four:

The Licensed Hotels Labour Legislation Modification Order 1944

WHEREAS it appears to me to be necessary for securing the public safety, the defence of New Zealand, the efficient prosecution of any war in which His Majesty may be engaged, and for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, pursuant to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Licensed Hotels Labour Legislation Modification Order 1944.

2. This Order shall apply to all persons bound by the New Zealand Licensed Hotel Employees' award dated 5th day of August, 1940, Book of Awards, Vol. 40, page 1249.

3. The award is hereby modified by deleting paragraph (g) of clause 7 and by adding after clause 7 the following clause:—

"7A. Part-time barmen may be employed in establishments wherein one or more full-time barmen are employed on the following conditions:—

"(i) A part-time barman shall not be employed on more than five days a week:

"(ii) The employment in each day shall be continuous:

"(iii) Part-time barmen shall not be employed in any establishment in a greater proportion than one part-time barman to each two full-time barmen employed, provided that one part-time barman may be employed where only one full-time barman is employed:

"(iv) Payment shall be 12s. per day for service not exceeding two hours a day:

"(v) Where more than two hours are worked in any one day the payment for that day shall be twelve shillings, increased by 2s. 6d. for each period of half an hour or part thereof in excess of two hours:

"(vi) For the purpose of payment for annual holidays or other payments, pursuant to clause 5 of the award, the full pay of the part-time barman shall be deemed to be his average weekly wages in respect of the employment for the period covered by the payment, but shall not include payment for board and lodgings:

"(vii) The employer shall not be bound to provide meals or board or lodgings for any part-time barman:

"(viii) The employer engaging a part-time barman shall within three days give to the secretary of the union for the district written notice specifying the name and address of the part-time barman:

"(ix) Each part-time barman if not already a member of the union shall forthwith join the union on being employed:

"(x) The employer shall, where the part-time barman consents, deduct from his wages each week a sum equivalent to the weekly union fees and pay such moneys on behalf of the worker to the secretary of the union:

"(xi) No worker who is engaged as a part-time barman pursuant to this clause shall at the same time be employed by the same employer in any other capacity:

"(xii) Service under this clause shall be treated as a separate employment for the purposes of clause 5 of the award:

"(xiii) For the purposes of this clause 'full-time barman' means a worker employed as a barman on a weekly engagement otherwise than pursuant to this clause, but does not include a porter-barman:

"(xiv) The rates of wages specified herein shall not be affected by any orders made pursuant to the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940 prior to the day of the date hereof."

4. This order shall come into effect on the day of the date herof.

The Canister Workers Employees' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1944

IN pursuance of the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, the Minister of Labour doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Canister Workers Employees' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1944.

2. This Order applies to Alexander Harvey and Sons (Wellington), Ltd., and to the workers who are employed by the company and whose employment is subject to the provisions of the New Zealand Metal Trades' Employees' award dated the 30th day of June, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 655.

3. The provisions of all Acts and regulations thereunder and of the said award are hereby suspended in so far as any such provisions operate to prevent the workers referred to in clause 2 hereof from being employed on the terms and conditions herein set forth.

4. Females eighteen years of age and over may be employed as casual workers during the hours from 5.30 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week.

5. For all time worked during the hours mentioned in the preceding clause the workers shall be paid 2s. 6d. per hour, inclusive of increases granted by the Court of Arbitration in pursuance of the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940.

6. This Order shall come into effect on and from the day of the date hereof.

The Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and its Amendments.—Fixing the Closing-hours of Chemists' Shops within the Combined District of Dunedin

WHEREAS a requisition in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the chemists' shops within the Combined District of Dunedin, comprising the City of Dunedin and the boroughs of St. Kilda, Port Chalmers, West Harbour, and Green Island, has been forwarded to me, desiring that all such shops within the said combined district, save and except the shop (hereinafter referred to as "the exempted shop") established at 55 Moray Place, within the City of Dunedin, for the purpose only of the sale of medicines and surgical appliances that are urgently required, and known as the "Associated Chemists, Limited," be closed as set out below, and that subsection (4) of section 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, should not apply to any shop within two miles and a half of the exempted shop while medicines and surgical appliances are obtainable from the exempted shop: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at 5.30 p.m., on Fridays at 9 p.m., and on Sundays for the whole of the day, with the following exceptions: (1) On the working-day that first precedes Christmas Day and on the working-day that first precedes New Year's Day, the closing-hour shall be 11 p.m.; (2) on the working-day that first precedes Good Friday, the closing-hour shall be 9.30 p.m.:

And whereas the Minister of Labour is satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said combined district, and that all the occupiers of the said shops within the said combined district affected by section 35 (1) of the said Act have been afforded an equal right to share in a reasonable cost in the profits of the business carried on by the exempted shop:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of sections 32 and 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and in pursuance of section 15 of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927, I do hereby direct that on and after the 26th day of June, 1944, all the chemists' shops within the Combined District of Dunedin, save and except the exempted shop, shall be closed accordingly.

The notice dated the 25th September, 1936, and gazetted on the 1st October, 1936, fixing the closing-hours of chemists' shops in the Combined District of Dunedin shall be and is hereby cancelled as from the date of the coming into operation of this notice.

PURSUANT to the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942,* the Rationing Controller hereby gives the following directions:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Clothing Rationing Coupon Notice 1944.

2. The notices specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

3. The appropriate number of coupons required for the supply of any rationed goods specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall be as indicated in that Schedule:

Provided that one-half of the number of coupons so indicated shall be required—

(a) For second-hand articles (other than garments) when sold at a price at least 25 per cent. lower than the corresponding price of new articles:

(b) For damaged, shop-soiled, or imperfect goods (other than women's hosiery) if they are clearly marked as such when offered for sale, and if the price is reduced by at least 25 per cent. These goods must not be advertised or publicly displayed.

4. No coupons shall be required for the supply of any rationed goods specified in the Third Schedule hereto.

5. Coupons of the classes specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be available for the supply of rationed goods as indicated in that Schedule.

6. Every trader licensed as a retailer of goods declared to be rationed goods by the Clothing Rationing Order 1942† shall, within seven days after the end of each calendar month, furnish to the Rationing Controller a return in the form prescribed by the Controller of all coupons and permits surrendered to the trader in respect of sales of such goods made during the month, and shall either—

(a) Forward the coupons and permits to the Controller together with the return; or

(b) With the prior consent of the Controller, attach to each duplicate sales docket the coupons or permits surrendered in respect of the sale to which the docket relates.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF MEAT TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any meat to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto.

(2) If in respect of any lot of meat to which this Order applies the maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

(3) No additional charges shall be made by a retailer for wrapping any meat to which this Order applies, or for trimming or other incidental and customary services performed in relation to the retailing of any such meat.

RETAILERS TO EXHIBIT RETAIL PRICES

5. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any meat to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to that meat as to be obviously in relation thereto a ticket, placard, or label showing in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound or per unit, as the case may be.
