Amending and Extending a License authorizing the Bay of Islands Electric power Board to use Water for the Purpose of generating Electricity and to maintain and use Electric Works (Puketotara Stream Diversion)

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

TN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and section seventy-six of the Electric-power ■ Works Act, 1928, and section seventy-six of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Bay of Islands Electric-power Board (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), subject to the conditions hereinafter referred to, to take and use from the Puketotara Stream a stream of water not exceeding eight upping for the public for the publi exceeding eight cubic feet per second for the purpose of generating electricity, and doth horeby amend, as set forth in the Schedule hereto, the Order in Council (hereinafter referred to as "the license") dated the third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty, and published in the *Gazette* of the eleventh day of the same month and published in the *Gazette* of the eleventh day of the same month at page 690, authorizing the licensee to use water from the Keri Keri River for the purpose of generating electricity and to maintain and use electric works ; and, further, for the purposes of section seventy-six of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, doth hereby authorize the licensee to construct, maintain, and use the additional works described in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE

1. VOLUME OF WATER

The operative part of the license is amended by deleting therefrom wheresoever they appear the words "twenty-five cubic feet per second", and substituting therefor the words "thirty-three cubic feet per second ".

2. Additional Works Authorized

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the additional works indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 119165, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington, such works consisting of-

- (a) A weir, with automatic intake gate and by pass, constructed across and in the Puketotara Stream, being a tributary of the Keri Keri River:
- (b) Water-race leading from such intake gate across Lot 1, D.P. 29633, the Kaeo-Ohaeawai Road, Lot 1, D.P. 29895, being part O.L.C. 60, Puketotara Road, and Lot 5, D.P. 6704, being part O.L.C. 60, Block X, Keri Keri Survey District, North Auckland Land District, to the watercourse shown on the said plan watercourse shown on the said plan.

3. The said additional works and the taking and using of the waters of the Puketotara Stream shall be subject in every respect to the provisions and conditions set forth in the license as if they had been expressly authorized in that license from the beginning.

WHEREAS the Auckland City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising a loan of one hundred and twelve thousand pounds (£112,000), to be known as "Consolidated Loan, 1945" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of repaying, to the extent that sinking funds are

insufficient, the Zoological Loan of £20,000, the Libraries Loan of £16,000, and the Streets Improvement Loan, 1923, of £109,000, which mature in London on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Permission to use " Left-hand Drive " Motor-vehicles

Notes on the Weather for August, 1944

General.—August had no vary severe weather, and there was less wind and more cloud than usual in most districts. It has completed what has been a fairly easy winter for stock, which are in very good condition. Lambing has commenced with favourable weather, but some small losses resulted from the wet southerly in the Wairarapa on the 19th and from the rain at the close of the month on parts of the Mariborough coast. Cultivation in some places has been prevented by the wetness of the ground and the absence of drying winds. Rainfall.—The month's totals showed many variations. The more conspicuous excesses occurred in Nelson and Marlborough, between Tauranga and Napier, and locally near Wellington City, and Balclutha. There was some minor flooding near Napier on the 20th. The differ areas included Pates, Wanganui, Timaru, Oamaru, and the Province of Westland. Values were slightly below normal in the north-west and far south of the North Island, also in Marlborough, and rather more so about Christchurch and mid-Canterbury. Elsewhere temperatures were milder than usual, the highest departures occurring at Gisborne. Most places total of 1959 hours. *Sunshine*.—While in Westland and to the east of the North Island ranges sunshine was above normal, totals were deficent elsewhere. At Wanganui and Wellington the values were more than one hour per day below normal. Gisborne had the highest total of 1959 hours. *Weather Sequence.*.—After a depression moved east of Southland a cold front advanced on the 2nd and 3rd, bringing a change from the amounts were smaller, except near the path of a depression which moved along the front accoss South Auckland and later deepend as it moved towards Chatham Islands. On a cold front which reached central New Zealand on the 6th a slight disturbance developed west of Taranaki and caused some rain over most of the North Island. A more vigorous front crossing the South Island on the 7th brought strong south-westerlies with showers, including some snow and hail in Southland, but there was a clearance that evening. On the 8th and 9th fresh westerlies gave isolated showers in the west, but fine weather predominated. A rapidly moving cold front on the 10th and 11th gave a temporary south-westerly change, with a period of rain in Westland and brief showers elsewhere. An anticyclone then moved on to southern New Zealand and became more extensive. This was associated with a settled spell with several frosty nights, until it moved off to the north-east on the 17th, when a shallow disturbance was giving rain in the towards the South Island and a depression travelled south-eastward across the North Island. Southerlies became strong in central districts and rain occurred there and northward with several heavy falls, especially in the Bay of Plenty and Hawke's Bay. There was an early improvement over most of the Auckland Province. By the 22nd an anticyclone over the Tawana was causing a more general improvement temperatures howers howers have a clear the set of the anticyclone over the set of the Auckland Province.

By the 22nd an anticyclone over the Tasman was causing a more general improvement, temperatures, however, being cold. On the 24th there were a few brief showers with a cold front, but an improvement soon followed. On the 27th and 28th a depression was moving from the north-west towards Westland, and rain spread from the far north to the central provinces. This disturbance, after partly filling up, remained stationary, there being much cloud and at times fog with drizzle, which was very persistent in the Nelson Province.

- (iii) An amount equal to such percentage of the sum of the amounts calculated in accordance with subparagraphs (i) and (ii) hereof as has been or may be duly approved by the Tribunal as permissible overhead costs. Any approval given for the purposes of this subparagraph may be of general application or may be limited in its application in accordance with the terms thereof:
- (iv) An amount equal to 10 per cent. of the sum of the amounts calculated in accordance with subparagraphs (i), (ii), and (iii) hereof :

(b) In respect of the services of foremen, the maximum charge shall be 8s. 3d. per hour :

(c) In respect of the services of apprentices, the maximum charge shall be 2s. 10d. per hour :

(2) In respect of materials used for the purposes of any work to which this Order applies (including tools or other machinery used for the purposes of the work) no charge shall be made unless, if not actually incorporated in the work, they are rendered unfit for any further use and a certificate to that effect is given by or with the authority of the Controller of Shipbuilding.

(3) For the purposes of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subclause (1) hereof, the award rate of wages payable to any workman shall be deemed to include any cost-of-living allowance payable to that workman.

(4) For the purposes of this Order the references to "foremen" in paragraph (a) and paragraph (b) of subclause (1) of this clause shall not include any foreman who is in receipt of a salary, but shall be limited to include only foremen whose wages are computed on a time basis.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Com-merce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order :--

1. (1) This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 281, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 196† (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

(2) Price Order No. 271‡ is hereby revoked.

(3) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into force on the 28th day of September, 1944.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) This Order applies with respect to all potatoes which, being subject to the principal Order, are sold by a grower for delivery at any time after the commencement of this Order and on or before the 30th day of November, 1944.

(2) For the purposes of this Order no potatoes sold on the basis of f.o.b.s.i. or f.o.r.s.i. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order if—

- (a) In the case of sales f.o.b.s.i., the vessel on which the potatoes are laden leaves the port of shipment at any time before midnight of the 27th day of September, 1944; or
 (b) In the case of sales f.o.r.s.i., the trucks on which the potatoes are laden leave the grower's station at any time before midnight of the said date.

(3) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, potatoes sold f.o.b.s.i. or f.o.r.s.i. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order notwithstanding that they may have been actually laden on board any vessel or trucks before the commencement of this Order.
