WHEREAS the Dunedin City Council (hereinafter called the said local authority"), being desirous of raising portion, sixty thousand pounds (£60,000) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), of the Electricity Loan, 1940, one hundred thousand pounds (£100,000), for the purpose of carrying out improvements to the electrical reticulation system and erecting garage, store, and dwellings for employees, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said sum: of the said sum:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum for the said purpose up to the amount of sixty thousand pounds (£60,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be

raised shall not exceed fifteen (15) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds five shillings

(£3 5s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said local authority shall, before raising the said sum or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking fund at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates per centum which shall not be less than five pounds four shillings (£5 4s.), such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said sum for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, the first such payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender or lenders is computed on the said sum or any part thereof so raised

(4) The payment of interest and repayment of principal in respect of the said sum shall be made in New Zealand.

Prohibiting the Cutting of Grass for Seed on Roads and Streets

In pursuance and exercise of the powers, provisions, and authorities vested in it in that behalf by the Counties Act, 1920, and section 161 of the Public Works Act, 1928, or otherwise enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the County of Waihemo deth hereby, by special order, make and ordain the following

by-law:—

1. The short title of this by-law shall be "The Wathemo Council By-law No. 2 (Prohibiting the Cutting of Grass for Seed on all Roads and Streets) 1944."

2. This by-law shall read as follows: The Waihemo County Council prohibits the cutting of grass for seed on all roads and streets within the County of Waihemo without the previous consent in writing of the said Council.

3. Every person who infringes this by-law or who refuses to comply with any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds (£10).
