Altering the Boundaries of the Bay of Islands Electric-power District

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of every other power in anywise enabling me in that behalf, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Bay of Islands Electric-power District so as to include the area described in the Schedule hereto.

ALL that area situated in the North Auckland Land District, comprising that portion of the Mangonui County, bounded towards the west, north, and east by the Tasman Sea and towards the south by the Opoe and Rangaumu Survey Districts. As the same is more particularly delineated on Sheet 5 of the plan marked P.W.D. 95221, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington, and thereon hatched red.

Crown Land set apart as Provisional State Forest

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section eighteen of the Ferrate A. 1997 Co. upon me by section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921–22, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby set apart the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto as a provisional State forest.

WESTLAND LAND DISTRICT.—WESTLAND CONSERVANCY

ALL that area in the Westland Land District, containing by admeasurement 626 acres, more or less, being part of Section 3215, Block XIII, Ahaura Survey District, and part of Section 2665, Block I, Kopara Survey District, and Crown land (creeks), and described generally as follows: Commencing at the north-western corner of Section 3215, Block XIII, Ahaura Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction along the south-western boundary of that section for a distance of 3711 links; thence by a right line bearing 116° 00′ for a distance of 10000 links and by a right line bearing 149° 00′ to its intersection with the south-eastern boundary of Section 2665, Block I, Kopara Survey District; thence in a north-easterly direction along the last-mentioned boundary to the

western side of the Nelson Creek - Kopara Road; thence in a north-westerly direction by the western side of that road to its intersection with a road forming the north-western boundary of Section 3215 aforesaid; thence in a south-westerly direction along the southern side of that road to the point of commencement: excluding there-from Reserves 688, 689, and 1565. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan No. 120/29, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

Open Seasons for Imported Game and Native Game in North Canterbury and Wellington Acclimatization Districts

IN exercise of the powers vested in him by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, the Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby amend the Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby amend the Warrant dated 23rd March, 1945, made under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921–22, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 21 of the 27th idem at page 329 et seq., by deleting all those portions of such Warrant included under the headings "North Canterbury Acclimatization District" and "Wellington Acclimatization District," and doth hereby declare open seasons for imported game and/or native game of the kinds hereinafter specified in the acclimatization districts specified hereunder, except in the areas shown under the heading "Excepted Areas," during the periods set forth in connection with each district, subject, in each case, to the following general conditions and subject to the special conditions specified in connection with each district. Any person taking or killing any imported game or native game otherwise than in terms of this notification (including the general conditions hereinafter set out and the special conditions specified in connection with each acclimatization district) is liable on conviction to a fine of £20.

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. No person shall commence shooting earlier than one hour before sunrise or continue shooting later than one hour after sunset on any day during the open season concerned.

2. (a) No person shall use live birds of any species as decoys nor shall use more than fifteen artificial decoys at any one time, and no such artificial decoys shall be spread over a greater area than thirty wards source. than thirty yards square.

(b) No person shall place any artificial decoys within 100 yards of the nearest of any other artificial decoys set out by any other
