1. The Proclamation dated the twenty-third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-sixth day of the same month at page 2391, proclaiming and declaring certain French territories to be enemy countries for the purposes of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939 and the Enemy Trading Emergency Regulations 1939, is hereby revoked so far as it relates to the territories referred to in the First Schedule hereto.
