The Tobacco Factories' Employees' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1945

IN pursuance of the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, and of the Industrial Man-power Emergency Regulations 1944, the Minister of Labour doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Tobacco Factories' Employees' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1945.
2. This Order applies to W. D. and H. O. Wills (N.Z.), Limited, and to Godfrey Phillips (N.Z.), Limited, and to the workers who are employed in the Wellington Industrial District by those companies and whose employment is subject to the provisions of the Northern, Wellington, and Nelson Tobacco Workers' award dated the 23rd day of June, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 332.
3. The provisions of all Acts and regulations thereunder and of the said award are hereby suspended in so far as any such provisions operate to prevent the workers referred to in clause 2 hereof from being employed on the terms and conditions herein set forth.
4. The weekly hours of work shall be forty-five, and the daily hours shall be as mutually agreed upon in respect of each factory between the management and the workers' union, the starting-time on each day to be not earlier than 7.45 a.m.
5. All time worked in excess of eight hours on any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.
6. Hours of work in excess of those herein prescribed may be worked by agreement between the management and the workers, payment for such hours being made in accordance with the provisions of the award.
7. On the application of any female worker the management may, subject to the approval of the Man-power Officer, grant such exemption from the hours of work hereinbefore prescribed as the circumstances of such worker may warrant, having regard to the domestic responsibilities of such worker.
8. In all other respects the provisions of the said award shall apply.
9. This Order shall come into effect on the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force until the 21st day of December, 1945.

Price Order No. 366 (Raw-leaf Tobacco)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 366, and shall come into force on the 7th day of May, 1945.
2. In this Order—

- “Flue-cured leaf” means leaf that has been treated in the kiln for at least three successive days immediately after picking—for the purpose of yellowing, fixing colour, drying, and drying mid-ribs;
- “Air-dried leaf” means leaf other than flue-cured leaf.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all raw-leaf tobacco grown in New Zealand during the 1944-45 season: Provided that the Tribunal may, in any case where it considers it proper so to do and subject to such conditions (if any) as it thinks fit, exempt any such tobacco from the operation of this Order.

FIXING AVERAGE PRICES OF RAW-LEAF TOBACCO TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) The average price to be paid by any tobacco manufacturer for raw-leaf tobacco to which this Order applies shall be not less than—

- (a) For flue-cured leaf: 1s. 11½d. per pound.
- (b) For air-dried leaf: 1s. 8½d per pound.

(2) For the purposes of this clause the weight of any raw-leaf tobacco shall be deemed to be its weight at the time and place of delivery by the grower to the manufacturer or to his agent in the district in which it is grown: Provided, however, that in any case where the grower and the manufacturer or his agent agree that the moisture-content of the leaf in any lot of tobacco is excessive, then for the purpose of calculating the value of the lot the weight of the lot shall be deemed to be reduced by a reasonable amount to make allowance for the excessive moisture.

5. This Order shall be read subject to the provisions of the Board of Trade (Raw Tobacco Price) Regulations 1943†.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 367, and shall come into force on the 14th day of May, 1945.
2. In this Order—

“Toys” means any articles used or intended to be used by children as playthings or any articles customarily referred to as toys and includes souvenirs which may be used as toys.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all toys manufactured in New Zealand.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF TOYS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price (exclusive of sales tax) that may be charged or received for any toys to which this Order applies that are sold by way of wholesale shall be determined as follows:—

(a) Where delivery is effected from the manufacturer's premises	The manufacturer's approved selling-price increased by an amount equal to 10 per cent. thereof.
