A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section fourteen of the Counties Act, 1920, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Whangarei County, shall be added to and form part of the Bay of Islands County; that the boundaries of the Whangarei County and Bay of Islands Counties as so altered shall be those set forth under the respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto; that the area added as aforesaid to the Bay of Islands County shall be included in the Russell Riding of the said county; and that the boundaries of the Russell Riding as so altered shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto; and I also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect as on and from the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five.

FIRST SCHEDULE

AREA EXCLUDED FROM WHANGAREI COUNTY AND INCLUDED IN BAY OF ISLANDS COUNTY

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing on the seashore at the northernmost corner of Whangaroa-Ngaiotonga No. 4A 9 Block and running south-easterly generally along the coast to the northern boundary of Whangaroa-Ngaiotonga No. 4F Block; thence south-westerly generally along the northern and north-western boundaries of the said No. 4F Block and the north-western boundary of Whangaroa-Ngaiotonga No. 4G Block; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of Tutaematai Block; thence north-easterly generally along the north-western boundary of Whangaroa-Ngaiotonga Nos. 4A 7 and 4A 9 Blocks to the point of commencement.

2. (1) Nothing in this notice shall apply with respect to any goods to which the Declared Goods (Control of Prices) Notice 1943, No. 1†, or the Declared Goods (Control of Prices) Notice 1944, No. 3‡, applies.

(2) Subject to the provisions of the last preceding subclause all goods of the kinds specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be goods to which the provisions of clause 9 of the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 3,* are applicable.

The foregoing notice does not operate as a prohibition of the sale of any goods, but is only a preliminary declaration specifying the several classes of goods with respect to which the Tribunal has authority to prohibit sales under the powers conferred on it by subclause (2) of clause 9 of the regulations cited in the notice. It is not the intention of the Tribunal to exercise its powers of prohibition (except in the event of special circumstances) for at least four weeks after the publication of the above notice in the *Gazette*. PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 376, and shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1945.

2. In this Order—

“Eltham Milk District” means the district comprising the Borough of Eltham and all that area within one mile of the boundaries of the said borough;

“Commercial user” means a person who buys milk or cream for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances);

“Consumer” means a person who buys milk or cream for purposes other than resale;

“Shop dairy” means a shop where milk or cream is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise and where the milk or cream so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to milk or cream sold to a Hospital Board for use in any institution under the control of that Board or to milk or cream sold for use in any separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all milk and cream wherever produced that is sold—

(a) To the occupier of any shop dairy within the Eltham Milk District;

(b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer within the Eltham Milk District.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK AND CREAM TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk or cream to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows:—

(a) In respect of milk or cream sold by the occupier of a shop dairy: As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy;

(b) In respect of milk or cream sold otherwise than at a shop dairy: As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.

(3) Where the quantity of milk delivered to any one purchaser in any one day (exclusive of quantities delivered in measurements of half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon, the maximum price that may be charged shall be computed by reference to the total quantity of milk so delivered to the purchaser during that day.

(4) Where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day, the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed as follows:—

- (a) For all milk supplied in measurements of half-pint or less than half-pint, the price shall be computed separately at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order:
- (b) If on any day within the period the quantity of milk supplied to the purchaser (exclusive of quantities delivered in measurements of half-pint or less) was not less than one gallon, the price of the milk so supplied shall be computed in accordance with subclause (3) hereof:
- (c) For all other milk to which the account relates the price shall be computed at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Schedule hereto for two pints.
- (5) Where any milk or cream to which this Order applies is sold otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Schedule hereto, or otherwise than in a multiple of any specified quantity, the price shall be computed as follows:—
 - (a) Where the quantity supplied is less than the smallest specified quantity, the price shall be a proportionate part of the price of the smallest specified quantity:
 - (b) Where the quantity supplied exceeds a specified quantity but is less than twice the specified quantity, the price of any surplus over that specified quantity shall be a proportionate part of the price of that specified quantity:
 - (c) Where the quantity supplied exceeds twice the amount of the nearest lower specified quantity but is not an exact multiple of that specified quantity, the price of any surplus over the nearest multiple of the specified quantity shall be a proportionate part of that specified quantity.
- (6) If in respect of any milk or cream the price charged in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price shall be the nearest upward halfpenny.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all milk and cream wherever produced that is sold—

- (b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer within the Hastings Milk District.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK AND CREAM TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk or cream to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows:—

- (a) In respect of milk or cream sold by the occupier of a shop dairy: As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy:
- (b) In respect of milk or cream sold otherwise than at a shop dairy: As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.
- (3) Where the quantity of milk delivered to any one purchaser in any one day (exclusive of quantities delivered in measurements of half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon, the maximum price that may be charged shall be computed by reference to the total quantity of milk so delivered to the purchaser during that day.
- (4) Where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day, the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed as follows:—

- (a) For all milk supplied in measurements of half-pint or less than half-pint, the price shall be computed separately at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order:
- (b) If on any day within the period the quantity of milk supplied to the purchaser (exclusive of quantities delivered in measurements of half-pint or less) was not less than one gallon, the price of the milk so supplied shall be computed in accordance with subclause (3) hereof:
- (c) For all other milk to which the account relates the price shall be computed at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Schedule hereto for two pints.
- (5) Where any milk or cream to which this Order applies is sold otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Schedule hereto, or otherwise than in a multiple of any specified quantity, the price shall be computed as follows:—
 - (a) Where the quantity supplied is less than the smallest specified quantity, the price shall be a proportionate part of the price of the smallest specified quantity.

Price Order No. 379 (Seed Potatoes)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 379, and shall come into force on the 4th day of June, 1945.

(2) Price Orders Nos. 244† and 260‡ are hereby revoked.

(3) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

2. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The said regulations” means the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939*:

“Certified seed potatoes” means seed potatoes that have been certified as “mother seed” or as “commercial seed” in accordance with the scheme for the certification of seed potatoes that is in operation under the control of the Department of Agriculture; and “uncertified seed potatoes” includes all seed potatoes that have not been so certified:

“Distributor”, in relation to any lot of potatoes, means a wholesaler, as defined in the said regulations, who sells those potatoes otherwise than to a retailer for purposes of retail sale:

“Group”, in relation to certified seed potatoes, means the group into which any potatoes have been classified by the Department of Agriculture in accordance with its scheme for the certification of seed potatoes:

“Grower”, in relation to potatoes, means a person engaged in the business of growing potatoes for sale:

“Seed potatoes” includes all potatoes that are sold, offered, or exposed for sale as seed potatoes:

“Standard-sized”, in relation to certified seed potatoes, refers to potatoes that comply with the standard prescribed by clause 5 hereof:

The expression “f.o.r.s.i.” means “free on rail, sacks or other containers included.”

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said regulations, when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by those regulations.

3. Subject to any general or specific directions that may be given by or on behalf of the Tribunal, any expenses that are reasonably incurred by a distributor, wholesaler, or retailer in undertaking the transport of any potatoes at his own expense, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates, may be regarded for the purposes of this Order as if they were transport charges paid by him, and the maximum price of the potatoes shall be determined accordingly.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. (1) This Order applies only to seed potatoes grown in New Zealand.

(2) Except as otherwise provided herein, this Order applies to all such seed potatoes (whether sold before or after the date of the coming into force of this Order) that are delivered to the purchaser on or after that date.

(3) In its application to growers' prices, this Order applies only to seed potatoes that are grown in the South Island.

(4) In its application to distributors' prices, wholesalers' prices, and retailers' prices, this Order does not apply to any seed potatoes which have been specially hand-picked in a distributor's or a wholesaler's store in the South Island and which are sold in lots exceeding 1½ cwt. in any case, but applies to all other seed potatoes grown anywhere in New Zealand.

FIXING PRICES OF SEED POTATOES

Specifications of Standard-sized Certified Seed Potatoes

5. (1) For the purposes of this Order the standard for certified seed potatoes shall be deemed to be a potato that weighs not less than 2 oz. and not more than 4½ oz.

(2) If in any sample of one hundred potatoes taken at random from any lot of certified seed potatoes more than eight of those potatoes fail to comply with the standard prescribed by the last preceding subclause, none of the potatoes comprised in the lot shall be deemed to be "standard-sized".

(3) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause all certified seed potatoes shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be "standard-sized".

Growers' Actual Prices for "Standard-sized" Certified Seed Potatoes

6. (1) The actual price to be charged by any grower for any "standard-sized" certified seed potatoes to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions of this clause.

(2) The basic price of such potatoes shall in every case be computed in accordance with the scale set forth in the Schedule hereto.

(3) Where any such potatoes are delivered by the grower f.o.r.s.i. any railway-station in the South Island, the actual price to be charged by the grower shall be the basic price, increased in accordance with the provisions of subclause (7) hereof, in cases to which that subclause applies.

(4) Where any such potatoes are delivered by the grower otherwise than f.o.r.s.i. a railway-station in the South Island, the actual price to be charged by the grower shall be the basic price, increased in accordance with the provisions of subclause (7) hereof in cases to which that subclause applies, then further increased by the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery, and then reduced by the charges that would have been incurred by the grower if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates to the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower's premises.

(5) The basic price fixed in the Schedule hereto for certified "mother seed" potatoes is fixed as for potatoes classified in Group 4.

(6) The basic price fixed in the Schedule hereto for certified "commercial seed" potatoes is fixed as for potatoes classified in Group 7.

(7) For seed potatoes classified in a higher group than Group 4 or Group 7, as the case may be, a premium of 5s. a ton shall be charged for each upward step in the classification.

Growers' Maximum Prices for Certified Seed Potatoes that are not "Standard-sized"

7. The maximum price that may be charged by any grower for any certified seed potatoes to which this Order applies that are not "standard-sized" shall be the price that would have been the actual price of those potatoes if they had in fact been "standard-sized".

Growers' Maximum Prices for Uncertified Seed Potatoes

8. (1) The maximum price that may be charged by any grower for any uncertified seed potatoes to which this Order applies shall be £9 a ton, delivered f.o.r.s.i. a railway-station in the South Island.

(2) Where any potatoes to which this clause applies are delivered by the grower otherwise than f.o.r.s.i. a railway-station in the South Island, the maximum price that may be charged by the grower shall be £9 a ton increased by the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery, and then reduced by the charges that would have been incurred by the grower if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates to the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower's premises.

Distributors' Prices

9. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding clause, the price that may be charged by any distributor for any seed potatoes to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:—

- The price actually paid or payable to the grower by the same or any other distributor;
- Any grading, transport, or other charges (not including brokerage) actually paid by the same or any other distributor;
- An amount computed at the rate of 5 per cent. of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof, or at the rate of 10s. a ton (whichever is the greater);
- Any disbursements actually incurred by the same or any other distributor by way of brokerage, not exceeding in the aggregate 2½ per cent. of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) hereof.

(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Order, the provisions of this clause as to the computation of distributors' prices shall apply with respect to every sale by a person who is ordinarily engaged in business as a distributor to a person who is ordinarily engaged in business as a wholesaler, notwithstanding that in any such case the purchaser may sell by way of retail any potatoes acquired by him from the distributor.

10. Where any wholesaler who does not normally carry on business as a distributor sells any potatoes to another wholesaler (thus becoming a distributor in respect of that transaction), the price to be charged by the vendor may exceed the maximum price determined in accordance with the last preceding clause by such amount as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties to the transaction: Provided that in any such case the maximum price that may be charged by the purchasing wholesaler in accordance with the next succeeding clause shall be determined as if he had bought those potatoes at the price paid by the wholesaler from whom he bought them.

Wholesalers' and Retailers' Prices

11. (1) When any seed potatoes to which this Order applies are sold by any wholesaler or by any retailer in lots exceeding 1½ cwt. the price that may be charged or received by the wholesaler or by the retailer shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:—

- The price actually paid or payable by the wholesaler or the retailer, as the case may be, to the grower or any other person;

(b) An amount not exceeding 2s. 6d. a ton in respect of any potatoes actually received into the wholesaler's or retailer's store, together with any grading, transport, or other charges actually paid by the wholesaler or retailer;

(c) An amount equal to 2½ per cent. of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof (to cover the estimated loss due to shrinkage and other natural causes), and a further amount equal to 1½ per cent. of the said sum in respect of potatoes actually received into store;

(d) An amount computed at the rate of £1 15s. a ton (in respect of seed potatoes sold in lots exceeding 1½ cwt., but less than a ton), and computed at the rate of £1 a ton for lots of 1 ton or more.

(2) Where any potatoes to which this Order applies are sold by any wholesaler or retailer in lots of 7 lb., or 14 lb., or 28 lb., or 56 lb., or 112 lb., or 168 lb., the price shall not in any case exceed:—

Subject to such conditions, if any as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any person concerned, may authorize special prices or margins of profit in respect of any potatoes to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary freight charges are incurred by any wholesaler or retailer in obtaining delivery from the source of supply that is nearest or most convenient of access to him. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of potatoes or may relate generally to all potatoes to which this Order applies sold while the approval remains in force.

DUTIES IMPOSED ON RETAILERS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS ORDER

14. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any potatoes to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the potatoes to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the following particulars:—

- The words "Certified Seed" or "Uncertified Seed," as the case may be;
- The name of the variety of potato;
- The retail price per pound.
