HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS the Kaiapoi Borough Council (hereinafter called the "said local authority"), being desirous of raising a loan of five thousand five hundred pounds (£5,500), to be known as "Pensioners' Dwellings Housing Loan, 1944" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of erecting dwellings for pensioners, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of five thousand five hundred pounds (£5,500), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

- (1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed thirty (30) years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds (£3) per centum per annum.
- (3) The said loan or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.
- (4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no instalments shall be paid out of loan-moneys.
- (5) No amount shall be payable for brokerage, underwriting, or procurement fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof.

WHEREAS under the authority of clause sixteen of the Mount Eden Borough Loans Conversion Order 1934 (No. 1), the Mount Eden Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") stipulated in certain of the securities issued pursuant to such Order for the redemption thereof at the option of the said local authority on such date prior to that specified in the said securities as the said local authority might fix by notice in that behalf to be published in the *Gazette* at least six (6) months before such prior date:

And whereas the said local authority proposes, in exercise of the said option, to redeem on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, certain of such securities amounting in the aggregate to the sum of twenty-nine thousand pounds (£29,000), the date specified in such securities for the redemption thereof being the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one:

And whereas the said local authority, being desirous, in order to give effect to such proposal, of raising a loan of twenty-nine thousand pounds (£29,000), to be known as "Mount Eden Redemption Loan, 1946" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by such Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of twenty-nine thousand pounds (£29,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

- (1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed five (5) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan shall be repaid on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one.

(4) It shall not be necessary to establish a separate sinking fund for the redemption loan of twenty-nine thousand pounds (£29,000), and the proviso to subsection three of section thirty-two of the Finance Act, 1938 (as set out in subsection two of section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1941), shall apply, and, accordingly, the provisions of subclause two of clause twenty-one of the Mount Eden Borough Loans Conversion Order 1934 (No. 1), shall be construed as if the debentures amounting to twenty-nine thousand pounds (£29,000) redeemed on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, had not been redeemed as at that date, but had been redeemed on the date specified in clause three hereof.

(5) The payment of interest and the instalment of principal in respect of the said loan shall be made in New Zealand, and no amount payable as interest or principal shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(6) The amount payable for brokerage, underwriting, or procurement fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not exceed in the aggregate one-quarter per centum of any amount raised.

(7) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS the Waikohu County Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising a loan of one thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500), to be known as "Bruce's Road Loan, 1945" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of meeting the cost of new road access to S.G.R. 44A, including fencing and metalling, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of one thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty (20) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said local authority shall, before raising the said loan or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking fund at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates per centum which shall be not less than three pounds twelve shillings and sevenpence (£3 12s. 7d.), such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said loan for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, the first such payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender or lenders is computed on the said loan or any part thereof so raised.

(4) The payment of interest and the repayment of principal in respect of the said loan shall be made in New Zealand.

(5) No amount payable as either interest or sinking fund in respect of the said loan shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(6) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurement fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

WHEREAS the several local authorities enumerated in the Schedule hereto, being desirous of raising the respective loans stated opposite their names therein, have respectively complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loans :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the respective local authorities mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule of the respective loans set out in the second column of the said Schedule, up to the respective amounts specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, consent was given to the raising by the Dannevirke County Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of twenty-five thousand pounds (£25,000) (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of erecting bridges, of which an amount of nine thousand nine hundred and thirty pounds (£9,930) has not been raised :

And whereas by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, the authority conferred by the said Order in Council was revoked in so far as it had not been exercised, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to borrow any moneys to which the said Order in Council relates except in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council that may be made under section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the borrowing in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum or any part thereof for the purpose for which the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

- (1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be borrowed shall be twenty (20) years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per centum per annum.
- (3) The said sum or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.
- (4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no such instalment shall be paid out of loan-money.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby license and permit the Chatham Islands County Council (hereinafter called "the Council," which term shall include its successors or assigns, unless the context requires a different construction) to use and occupy parts of the foreshore of Pitt Island, Chatham Islands, as shown on approved plans marked M.D. 6242, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of maintaining thereon a wharf, as shown on the said plans, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE
CONDITIONS

1. THIS license is subject to the Foreshore License Regulations 1940, and the provisions of those regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto.

2. The annual sum payable by the Council shall be one shilling (1s.), payable on demand.

3. The term of the license shall be fourteen years from the 27th day of May, 1945.

4. The master of every vessel discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

*Vesting the Control of Part of the Foreshore at Muriwai in the
Motutara Domain Board*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to the Motutara Domain Board (hereinafter called "the Board," which term shall include its successors or assigns, unless the context requires a different construction) the control of the foreshore at Muriwai, described in the First Schedule hereto, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

THAT portion of the foreshore at Muriwai commencing at the mouth of the Muriwai Stream and extending generally southwards to the southern boundary of the Motutara Domain; as the same is shown on plan marked M.D. 5834, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

SECOND SCHEDULE

1. In these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides;

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to those parts of the foreshore as shown in red on plan marked M.D. 5834, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

3. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress out and over the said foreshore without payment.

4. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are or may hereafter be in force.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore.

6. The Board may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by by-law fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts, provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

7. The Board may, subject to the provisions of section 171 of the Harbours Act, 1923, erect or license or permit the erection of bathing-sheds or boat-sheds on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, and may make by-laws regulating the use thereof, and may fix charges for such use, provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore for the benefit of the public.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to remove, or cause to be removed, any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

9. By-laws made by the Board under the said Act in respect of the foreshore shall not have effect unless and until approved in writing by the Minister.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years from the 5th day of May, 1945, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Board in New Zealand.

*Open Seasons for the taking or killing of Opossums in certain
Acclimatization Districts*

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and declare that opossums may be taken or killed within the acclimatization districts specified in the Schedule hereto, except in any sanctuary other than a scenic reserve, subject in all cases to the general regulations made by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and to the special conditions specified in connection with each district.

ASHBURTON ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT

(b) In relation to other citrus fruit to which this Order applies, means a package of the kind numbered 5 in the said First Schedule :

“ Quarter-bushel case ” means a package of the kind numbered 7 or 9 in the said First Schedule.

(2) References in this Order to grades are references to grades determined in accordance with the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940‡.

(3) Terms and expressions defined in the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939*, when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by those regulations.

4. No fruit to which this Order applies shall be graded or regraded by any auctioneer.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

5. This Order applies with respect to all New-Zealand-grown citrus fruits, including Meyer lemons, but not including any other kind of lemons.

6. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

7. (1) The provisions of this Order as to maximum wholesale prices shall apply notwithstanding that any fruit to which this Order applies is sold otherwise than in bushel cases, three-quarter-bushel cases, half-bushel cases, or quarter-bushel cases.

(2) If any lot of fruit to which this Order applies is sold by a wholesaler otherwise than in a case of one of the sizes specified in the last preceding subclause, the maximum price of the lot shall be determined as follows:—

(a) Where the fruit (other than Meyer lemons) in the lot is over a bushel, the price of the lot shall bear the same proportion to the maximum price of a bushel-case lot as the net weight of the lot bears to 41 lb. :

(b) Where any lot of Meyer lemons is over three-quarters of a bushel (whether or not the lot exceeds one bushel), the price of the lot shall bear the same proportion to the maximum price of a three-quarter-bushel-case lot as the net weight of the lot bears to 33 lb. :

(c) Where any lot of Meyer lemons is over a half-bushel but is less than three-quarters of a bushel, the price of the lot shall bear the same proportion to the maximum price of a half-bushel-case as the net weight of the lot bears to 17 lb. :

(d) Where the fruit (other than Meyer lemons) in the lot is over a half-bushel but is less than a bushel, the price of the lot shall bear the same proportion to the maximum price of a half-bushel-case lot as the net weight of the lot bears to 20 lb. :

(e) Where the fruit in the lot is over a quarter-bushel but is less than a half-bushel, the price of the lot shall bear the same proportion to the maximum price of a quarter-bushel-case lot as the net weight of the lot bears to 11 lb.

MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES

8. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum wholesale price of any Meyer lemons to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price prescribed in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum wholesale price of any other citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) The maximum wholesale prices fixed by subclauses (1) and (2) hereof are fixed as for cases containing fruit of a weight not less than as follows:—

	Minimum Weight of Fruit.
One-bushel case (No. 1 case)	39 lb.
Three-quarter-bushel case (No. 3 case)	31 lb.
Half-bushel case (No. 5 case)	19 lb.
Half-bushel case (No. 6 case)	16 lb.
Quarter-bushel case (No. 7 and No. 9 case)	10 lb.

(4) Where any case does not contain the prescribed minimum weight of fruit set out in subclause (3) hereof for that particular type of case, the maximum wholesale price of the case shall be reduced for each pound or part of a pound by which the weight of the fruit is less than the prescribed minimum weight as follows:—

In respect of Meyer lemons—

Extra fancy and fancy grade—

During months June to October, inclusive: By 9d.

During months November to May, inclusive: By 11d.

Commercial grade—

During months June to October, inclusive: By 8d.

During months November to May, inclusive: By 10d.

In respect of oranges (sweet)—

Extra fancy and fancy grade: By 10d.

Commercial grade: By 8d.

- In respect of mandarines, tangerines, and tangelos—
 - Extra fancy and fancy grade : By 11d.
 - Commercial grade : By 9d.
- In respect of oranges (Poorman), New Zealand grapefruit, or other grapefruit—
 - Extra fancy and fancy grade—
 - During the months of—
 - May to August, inclusive : By 7d.
 - September to October, inclusive : By 8d.
 - November to April, inclusive : By 9d.
 - Commercial grade—
 - During the months of—
 - May to August, inclusive : By 5d.
 - September to October, inclusive : By 7d.
 - November to April, inclusive : By 8d.

(5) For the purpose of calculating the weight of the fruit in any case an allowance shall be made on account of the weight of the case as follows :—

- For one-bushel cases (No. 1 case) : An allowance of 8 lb.
- For three-quarter-bushel cases (No. 3 case) : An allowance of 6½ lb.
- For half-bushel cases (No. 5 case) : An allowance of 4½ lb.
- For half-bushel cases (No. 6 case) : An allowance of 4 lb.
- For quarter-bushel cases (No. 7 or No. 9 case) : An allowance of 3½ lb.

(6) For the purposes of this Order every case in any lot of cases sold to a retailer shall be deemed to contain not less than the prescribed minimum weight of fruit set out in subclause (3) hereof unless on the day of sale and before removal of the lot from the premises of the wholesaler the retailer has caused the lot to be weighed and found to the contrary.

(7) Where with respect to any lot of cases that is sold to a retailer at any one time it has been established by the retailer in accordance with subclause (6) hereof that the total weight of the fruit in the lot averages less than the prescribed minimum weight set out in subclause (3) hereof, the maximum wholesale price that may be charged or received for the lot shall be the respective price fixed in the First or Second Schedule of this Order (whichever is applicable) reduced in accordance with subclause (4) hereof for each pound or part of a pound by which the total weight of the fruit in the lot is less than the total weight necessary to average the prescribed minimum weight as aforesaid.

(8) Where with respect to any lot of cases the provisions of clause (7) hereof apply the wholesaler shall mark on the invoice relating to the sale the correct weight of fruit contained in the lot.

(9) No sale at a price which is later reduced in accordance with the provisions of clause (7) hereof shall be deemed to be a breach of this Order.

(10) The wholesale prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery at the wholesaler's store or other premises from which delivery to the purchaser is effected.

(11) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler elsewhere than at premises occupied by him, he may add to the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the First or Second Schedule hereto the reasonable cost of delivery, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES

9. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum retail price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any fruit to which this Order applies shall be at the rate of a price per pound equal to the sum of the following amounts :—

- (a) The price per pound actually paid or payable by the retailer for the fruit :
- (b) The transport charges (if any) actually paid or payable by the retailer for each pound of the fruit (not exceeding in any case the charges that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates) :
- (c) An amount equal to 40 per cent. of the several amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof : Provided, however, that for the purposes of this subparagraph the amount added in respect of transport charges shall not exceed an amount calculated at the rate of 6d. for a three-quarter-bushel case (in the case of Meyer lemons) or 6d. for a bushel case in the case of any other fruit to which this Order applies.

(2) The retail price of any citrus fruit, computed in accordance with the last preceding subclause, shall be calculated by reference to the prices and grades disclosed in the appropriate invoices.

(3) No citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall be sold or offered or exposed for sale by any retailer otherwise than at the appropriate retail price per pound fixed by this Order.

(4) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this clause, but subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, the retail price of any Meyer lemons to which this Order applies shall not exceed the price prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto, and the retail price of any other citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall not exceed the price prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

(5) If in respect of any lot of fruit to which this Order applies the transport charges exceed an amount calculated at the rate of 6d. for a three-quarter-bushel case (in the case of Meyer lemons), or 6d. for a bushel case in the case of any other citrus fruit to which this Order applies, the prices prescribed in the Third and Fourth Schedules respectively may be correspondingly increased by an amount not exceeding the rate per pound of such excess.

(6) If in respect of any lot of citrus fruit sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

DUTIES IMPOSED ON RETAILERS FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ORDER

10. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the fruit to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated, in legible and prominent characters, the following particulars :—

- (a) The retail price per pound of the fruit :
- (b) The grade of the fruit :
- (c) Except in the case of Meyer lemons, the words " New Zealand grown " :
- (d) In the case of Meyer lemons, the word " Meyer " .

11. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any citrus fruit to which this Order applies shall keep for a period of not less than two months a record showing with respect to every purchase of such citrus fruits made by him by way of wholesale the following particulars :—

- (a) The date of purchase :
- (b) The name and address of the wholesaler from whom the fruit was purchased :
- (c) The description and grade of the fruit :
- (d) The number of cases of each grade purchased and the net weight of each case :
- (e) The price paid.
