(2) The foregoing proviso of this clause shall not apply to any worker in respect of any week if he or she is entitled otherwise than under this Order to receive a higher minimum weekly payment that week.

STATUTORY REGULATIONS

U NDER the Regulations Act, 1936, statutory regulations of general legislative force are no longer published in the New Zealand Gazette, but are supplied under any one or more of the following arrangements:-

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
