ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, comprising the City of Auckland, the boroughs of Devonport, Takapuna, Birkenhead, Northcote, New Lynn, Mount Albert, Mount Eden, Newmarket, One Tree Hill, Onehunga, Ellerslie, Otahuhu, Manurewa, and Papakura, the town districts of Henderson, Glen Eden, Howick, and Papatoetoe, the road districts of Mount Roskill, Mount Wellington, Panmure Township, Ostend, and Orapiu, the Titirangi, Waikumete, Takapuna, and portions of Waitakere, Waipareira, and Birkenhead Ridings of the Waitemata County, and the Mangere, Pakuranga, and portions of the Papatoetoe and Papakura Ridings of the Manukau County, the Auckland Domain and Hospital Reserve of the Eden County, the Port of Auckland and the Port of Manukau, and Pine, Brown's, and Motuihi Islands, and any other islands within the limits of the ports of Auckland and Manukau, and that portion of Waiheke Island not under the control of a local body: Bounded by a line commencing at a point on the west coast, being ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, comprising the within the limits of the ports of Auckland and Manukau, and that portion of Waiheke Island not under the control of a local body: Bounded by a line commencing at a point on the west coast, being the western corner of Wekatahi Block, and running north-easterly generally along the north-western boundary of that block and its production to the middle of the Anawhata Road; thence along the middle of the said road, to and along the middle of the Waikumete-West Coast Road, the middle of the Waitakere Scenic Drive, the middle of Forest Hill and Parr's Cross Roads, to the middle of the Oratia Stream; thence down the middle of that stream, to and along the southern, western, and northern boundaries of the Henderson Town District to the Henderson Creek; thence northerly generally down the western side of that creek, to and along the high-water mark and the high-water mark of the Waitemata Harbour to the middle of that road, to and along the middle of Hobsonville Main Road, to and along the middle of Hill and Trig Roads to the middle of Brigham's Creek – Hobsonville Road; thence along the middle of that road, to and along the middle of Riverlea Wharf Road to the high-water mark of the Waitemata Harbour; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly generally along the said high-water mark to the middle of Glendhu Road, being a point on the shores of Hellyer's Creek; thence along the middle of the said Glendhu Road, to and along the middle of Wairau Road to a point being the production south-westward of the north-western boundary of Allotment 105. (1) Pursuant to section 13 of the Finance Act (No. 2), 1942, I hereby authorize the Commissioner of Taxes, in any case where goods or articles are sold, disposed of, or delivered by any person to a worker and are subsequently repurchased or reacquired from the worker for consideration or for an increased consideration after work has been performed thereon, the consideration or difference in consideration being in effect a payment for the work performed by the worker, to collect social security charge and national security tax from the payments made by such person to the worker as if the moneys so paid, subject to the deduction of the amounts specified in clause 3 hereof, were salary or wages of the worker.

(2) For the purposes of this authority the term "worker" means any person who purchases, receives, or otherwise acquires goods or articles and performs work thereon or in relation thereto other than a person whose trade or business is or includes the performance of such work and whose business premises are registered under the Factories Act, 1921–22, as a factory for the performance of such work.

(3) In calculating the amount in respect of which social security charge and national security tax is payable there shall be deducted from the payments made by any person to a worker in respect of any goods or articles any amount paid by the worker to such person in respect of such goods or articles and any other amount which, in pursuance of subsection (4) of section 13 of the Finance Act (No. 2), 1942, may be fixed by the Commissioner as representing expenditure incurred by the worker in the production thereof.

(4) For the purposes of this authority all moneys credited to or applied on account of a worker or any person shall be deemed to have been paid when so credited or applied.

(5) For the purposes of this authority goods shall be deemed to have been repurchased or reacquired by a person if repurchased or reacquired by an agent of such person or by any firm or company in which such person has a substantial interest or which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is directly or indirectly under the control of such person.

Price Order No. 383 (Amending Price Order No. 289) (Onions)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

- This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 383, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 289† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

 2. This Order shall come into force on the 2nd day of July, 1945.

 3. The principal Order is hereby amended as follows:—
- (a) Subclause (2) of clause 8 is hereby revoked, and the following subclause substituted therefor:—

WAIMEA ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Waimea Electric-power Board hereby resolves as follows:
