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Boundaries of Christchurch Drainage District altered

A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by section two of the Christchurch District Drainage Amendment Act, 1920, as extended by the Christchurch District Drainage Amendment Act, 1944, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto shall be added to and form part of the Christchurch Drainage District; and, with the like powers and authorities, do hereby also declare that the areas described in the First Schedule hereto shall form a new sub-district of the said district to be called the Sumner Sub-district, and that the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto shall be added to the Heathcote Sub-district of the said district.

FIRST SCHEDULE

AREAS DECLARED TO FORM THE SUMNER SUB-DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the easternmost corner of Reserve No. 4324 (McCormack's Bay), being a point of the boundary of the City of Christchurch (*New Zealand Gazette*, 1945, page 341); thence proceeding north-easterly along the north-western side of the Sumner Road and south-easterly generally by the estuary of the Avon and Heathcote Rivers and the mean high-water mark of the sea to Godley Head; thence south-westerly generally by the mean high-water mark of the Lyttelton Harbour to a point due south of the Trig. Station MM., being a point on the boundary of the Borough of Lyttelton (*New Zealand Gazette*, 1938, pages 2831-2); thence due north and generally south-westerly and north-westerly along that boundary to its intersection with the western boundary of Lot 1 on plan deposited in the Canterbury District Land Registry Office at Christchurch as No. 4018; thence northerly along the western boundary of that lot and along the western boundary of the Redcliffs Rifle Range to its westernmost corner; thence along a right line to the north-eastern corner of Lot 47 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 3416; thence along the northern boundary of that lot and the north-western boundary of Lot 48 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 3416 to Moncks Spur Road; thence westerly along the northern boundaries generally of Lots 55 and 57 and northerly along the eastern boundary of Lot 61, all on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 3565, to the northernmost corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence along a right line running due west to the easternmost corner of Reserve No. 4324 aforesaid, the point of commencement.

Also all that area in the Canterbury Land District, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the westernmost corner of Reserve No. 4324 (McCormack's Bay), being a point on the boundary of the City of Christchurch (*New Zealand Gazette*, 1944, page 1299); thence proceeding easterly and south-easterly by right lines bearing 95° 09', distance 2792.2 links, and bearing 146° 32', distance 2701.7 links, to the easternmost corner of the said Reserve No. 4324; thence westerly and north-westerly along the northern side of the Sumner Road to the westernmost corner of that reserve, the point of commencement.

Also all that area in the County of Heathcote of the Canterbury Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the southernmost corner of Lot 48 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 3721, being a point on the boundary of the City of Christchurch (*New Zealand Gazette*, 1945, page 237); thence proceeding north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of the said Lot 48 to a point on the Mount Pleasant Road opposite the westernmost corner of Lot 1 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 11515; thence easterly across the Mount Pleasant Road to the westernmost corner of the said Lot 1; thence proceeding generally in a southerly direction along the eastern side of the said Mount Pleasant Road to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Lot 8 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 10400; thence south-westerly across the Mount Pleasant Road, to and along the said south-eastern boundary of that lot and the south-eastern boundary of Lot 7 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 10400, and its production to the south-western side of Muritai Terrace; thence north-westerly along the south-western side of that terrace to and across Major Hornbrook's Road; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along the south-western and north-western side of that road to the southernmost corner of Lot 1 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 9478; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of the said Lot 1 and Lot 7 on that plan and Lot 5 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 10015 to the westernmost corner thereof; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of Lots 4, 2, and 1 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 10015 to Major Hornbrook's Road; thence north-easterly along the north-western side of that road to a point opposite the southernmost corner of Lot 48 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 3721; thence across Major Hornbrook's Road to the said southernmost corner of that lot, the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE

AREAS INCLUDED IN THE HEATHCOTE SUB-DISTRICT

ALL that area in the County of Heathcote of the Canterbury Land District, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the existing boundary of the Special Area of the Christchurch Drainage District (*New Zealand Gazette*, 1941, page 1016) on Albert Terrace, being the easternmost corner of Lot 3 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 10297; thence south-easterly along the south-western side of the said Albert Terrace to the southern boundary of Lot 9 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 10297; thence westerly along the said southern boundary of that lot and northerly along its western boundary and the western boundaries of Lots 8, 7, 6, and 5, on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 10297, to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Lot 1 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 7566; thence by a right line to the southernmost corner of that lot, being a point on the boundary of the Special Area of the Christchurch Drainage District aforesaid; thence northerly and north-easterly along that boundary to the point of commencement.

Also all that area in the County of Heathcote of the Canterbury Land District, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the intersection of the north-eastern boundary of the Christchurch-Lyttelton Railway Reserve with the northern boundary of R.S. 91, being a point on the existing boundary of the Christchurch Drainage District; thence westerly and southerly along the northern and western boundary of the said R.S. 91 to the easternmost corner of Lot 1 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 6729; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of that lot to and across Opawa Road; thence north-westerly along the south-western side of that road to the south-eastern boundary of Reserve 3803; thence south-westerly, southerly, and westerly along the south-eastern, eastern, and southern boundaries of Reserve 3803 aforesaid, to and across Bishopworth Street; along the southern boundary of the land

contained in Certificate of Title, Volume 294, folio 59 (Canterbury Registry), to and across Port Hills Road; thence north-westerly along the south-western side of that road to the eastern boundary of Lot 3 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 10809; thence southerly along the said eastern boundary of that lot and the eastern boundary of Lot 1 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 5798 to the south-eastern corner thereof; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the said Lot 1 and Lots 2 and 4 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 8156 to and across Rapaki Road; thence southerly along the western side of that road to the northern boundary of Lot 2 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 9206; thence westerly along the said northern boundary of that lot to and across Vernon Terrace; thence northerly along the western side of that terrace to the southern boundary of Lot 133 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 675; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that lot and across a drain to the south-eastern corner of Lot 100 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 675; thence northerly and westerly along the eastern and northern boundaries of that lot to and across Victoria Street; thence westerly along the northern side of Roscoe Street and its production across Albert Terrace to a point on the existing boundary of the Christchurch Drainage District; thence northerly, south-easterly, and north-easterly generally along that boundary to a point in line with the southern boundary of Lot 2 on plan deposited as aforesaid as No. 11204; thence proceeding easterly and north-easterly generally along the boundary of the Christchurch Drainage District (as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1943, page 596), to the north-eastern boundary of the Christchurch-Lyttelton Railway Reserve; thence continuing south-easterly along that boundary, it being also the existing boundary of the Christchurch Drainage District aforesaid, to the point of commencement.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty-one of the Fire Brigades Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General in Council may, on the application of any Fire Board established under the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, extend the powers of that Board to borrow moneys in excess of the limits fixed by the said section:

And whereas application has been made by the New Plymouth Fire Board for such increase in the borrowing-powers of the said Board as provided by the said section thirty-one, and it is desirable to grant such request:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the powers of the said Board to borrow moneys in excess of the limits fixed by the said section thirty-one are hereby extended, but so as not to exceed the sum of twelve thousand six hundred and four pounds; provided that no moneys as aforesaid shall be borrowed except subject to the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, and its amendments.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, situated within the Counties of Rotorua and Taupo, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand praying that the said area be constituted a drainage district under the provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby constitute and declare the area of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a

district for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, and to be called by the name of the "Reporoa Drainage District"; and also, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the fourth section of the said Act, doth hereby declare that the Board of Trustees of the said district shall consist of five persons to be elected as members of the said Board, and under and in accordance with the said Act.

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the north-western side of the portion of Laurie Avenue (described in the Schedule hereto) within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-line of the said portion of street.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of August, 1945

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Exhibitions Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the holding of a public exhibition of works of industry and art, to be conducted by the Canterbury Manufacturers' Association in the King Edward Barracks, Christchurch, from the eleventh day to the twenty-fifth day of August (inclusive), one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and to be known as the New Zealand Industries Fair; and doth hereby declare the said exhibition to be an exhibition within the meaning of the said Act, and doth hereby suspend, subject, however, to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto, all the provisions of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, the Factories Act, 1921-22, and the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all awards and industrial agreements in force under the last-named Act, in so far as such provisions relate to the hours of commencing or ceasing work or to the issue of permits for overtime or extended hours, or to holidays or half-holidays, or to the closing of shops to any person, and so far as such provisions relate to hours of work done or business conducted or service carried out, in, or upon the premises aforesaid during the period aforesaid by or on behalf of the bodies conducting the said exhibition, or by or on behalf of any exhibitor of works of industry or art at the said exhibition, or by any person employed in or about the said exhibition.

SCHEDULE

1. EIGHT hours shall constitute a day's work in or about the exhibition, and, with the exception set out in clause 2 hereof, such hours shall be worked consecutively.

2. No person shall be employed in or about the exhibition for more than four hours without an interval of at least three-quarters of an hour for a meal.

3. Any person employed during any day in or about the exhibition who is employed on such day in excess of eight hours, or before the hour of 8 a.m. or after the hour of 10.30 p.m. (whether such excess employment is in or about the exhibition or otherwise), shall be paid for such excess employment at not less than one-half as much again as the ordinary rate for the first two hours and at not less than twice the ordinary rate thereafter, and any person employed in or about the exhibition on any day that would, but for the provisions of this Order in Council, have been a whole holiday for such person by virtue of any Act or of any award or industrial agreement, shall be paid for all work done on such day at not less than twice the ordinary rate, whether such work is performed wholly in or about the exhibition or otherwise.

4. No male under eighteen years of age and no female shall be employed in or about the exhibition after the hour of 10.30 p.m.

5. For the purposes of the enforcement of an award or industrial agreement any provision of which has been suspended by this Order in Council, any officer of the industrial union or association concerned who is authorized in writing in that behalf by such union or association shall be entitled to interview at his place of employment any person employed in or about the exhibition under that award or industrial agreement at such time or times as may be agreed upon by and between such officer and the employer of such persons, and for this purpose any such officer shall be entitled at any reasonable time to have access to the Register of Passes issued by the Canterbury Manufacturers' Association.

6. Nothing in this Order in Council shall be deemed to affect any provisions in an award or industrial agreement requiring workers subject to such award or industrial agreement to be members of a union.

THE MAORI COUNCIL OF THE TAKITIMU MAORI DISTRICT

BY-LAWS

The Maori Council of the Takitimu Maori District, constituted under the Maori Councils Act, 1900, and its amendments, and the Health Act, 1920, hereby makes the following by-laws, such by-laws to come into operation upon approval thereof by the Governor-General and the publication of the same in the *Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION

In these by-laws, except where inconsistent with the context or when otherwise expressly provided, the following expressions shall have the meanings attached thereto—

"The said Acts" means the Maori Councils Act, 1900, and its amendments, and the Health Act, 1920;

"The Council" means the Maori Council of the Takitimu Maori District constituted under the said Acts;

"Committee" or "Village Committee" means the Village Committee of a Maori kainga, village, or pa appointed by the Maori Council under the provisions of the said Acts;

"District" means the Takitimu Maori District proclaimed by the Governor-General under the provisions of the said Acts;

"Native Township" means a township constituted under the Native Townships Act, 1910;

"Prescribed" means prescribed by rules or regulations made under the said Acts or by these by-laws.

A.—GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. Upon the death of any Maori, the particulars required to be registered concerning such death shall be furnished to the nearest Registrar of Births and Deaths of Maoris within two weeks after the date of death, and in accordance with Part IV of the regulations providing for the registration of births and deaths of Maoris.

Failure to comply shall render the offender liable for a first offence to a penalty not exceeding £2.

2. In every case of death, where the deceased has not been attended by a qualified practitioner or by a district health nurse, the committee shall investigate the circumstances surrounding such death with regard to the nature of illness, duration, treatment, and names of persons who treated or were in attendance on deceased, and report the result of this investigation to the Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages of Maoris.

3. Human corpses shall be buried, if the death occurs between the 15th day of March and the 15th day of September (both days inclusive) in any year, within four days after death; and if the death occurs between the 16th day of September and the 14th day of March (both days inclusive), within three days after death, unless the Medical Officer of Health or any person authorized by him shall otherwise direct.

4. Where death has occurred from an infectious disease, the corpse shall be buried within twenty-four hours after death. The corpse shall be removed from the dwelling, tent, hospital, or place where death occurred to the cemetery without being allowed to lie in state at any intermediate village, and no tangi shall be held.

5. It shall be the duty of the nearest relatives of the deceased, or, in their absence, of the owner or occupier of the house or premises wherein deceased died, to comply with the provisions of by-laws 3 and 4; and all or any of them shall be deemed guilty of a breach thereof as the Council may deem fit, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence.

6. No human corpse shall be buried, except with the permission of the Council, in any other place than a burial-ground recognized by the inhabitants of a Maori kainga, or reserved or set apart by them or some duly constituted authority as a burial-ground.

7. No human corpse shall be permitted to lie in state inside or in front of any meetinghouse but may, if encased in a casket, lie in state at some other spot in the vicinity that may be indicated by the chairman of the committee.

B.—BUILDINGS

8. No person shall erect a dwellinghouse upon any site not having natural or artificial subsoil drainage sufficient to prevent such site being damp, or upon any site having matter thereon which may prove injurious to the health of the occupants of such buildings. The ground underlying every dwellinghouse shall be so formed and graded that no water can flow or lodge thereon or under any part of such building. Where the site of an erected dwellinghouse is considered injurious to the health of the occupants, the Council may order the owner or occupier to remove such building to a more healthy site.

9. Every person who shall erect a dwellinghouse shall construct every room intended to be used as a living-room or sleeping-room so that the same shall be not less than 8 ft. 6 in. in height from the floor to the ceiling in every part; provided that every room intended to be used as aforesaid with a sloping or unceilinged roof shall be not less than 8 ft. in height from the floor to the roof, over one-half the superficial area of such room, and no wall thereof shall have a height of not less than 5 ft. before any slope of the roof commences.

10. Every person who shall erect a dwellinghouse shall provide that for every sleeping-room therein there shall be at least 63 square feet of floor space to each adult or every two children under ten years of age sleeping in that room, and there shall be a window-space clear of frames equal in area to at least one-tenth of the area of the floor of such room, of which window-space at least one-half shall be made to open.

11. Every person who shall erect a dwellinghouse must provide each sleeping-room with a boarded floor so that there shall be between the underside of every joist, plate, stringer, and bearer on which such floor may be laid or supported and the upper surface of the ground a space of 6 in. at the least in each part, and he shall cause the area below such floor to be thoroughly ventilated by some effectual method.

12. In the case of houses already erected the Council may require the owner or occupier of any dwellinghouse which does not comply with Section B, clauses 10 and 11, to make such alterations or additions as may be deemed necessary.

B

13. The Council may, or shall if the Medical Officer of Health so directs, order the removal or destruction of any building in a dirty and unwholesome state, if in its opinion it is unsuitable for human habitation, or if the owner or occupier thereof fails after due notice to clean, renovate, or himself remove or destroy the same.

14. The chairman of the committee, or any person duly authorized by the committee in that behalf, may, by notice in writing, direct the owner or occupier of any house or other building in a dirty and unwholesome state to clean or cause the same to be cleaned within a time to be specified in such notice.

15. Any person refusing or neglecting to comply with notice for removals, alterations, or cleaning under clauses 8, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14 shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1 for the first offence and £5 for every subsequent offence, and in the case of persistent refusal or neglect to comply, the committee may order the work to be done. Any costs incurred by the committee in and about such removals, alterations, or cleanings shall be a debt due to the committee, recoverable as liquidated damages by process in a Magistrates' Court.

16. The Committee may, in its discretion, ease or modify the application of the foregoing clauses 8, 12, 13, and 14 in the case of any old, ill, or feeble person occupying any such buildings as aforesaid, so that such clauses shall not press heavily on such person. The chairman of the committee shall report the case and all the circumstances to the chairman of the Council, whereupon the Council shall consider such case and decide whether it shall devote part of its funds towards cleaning and otherwise improving the dwellings of such sick, old, or feeble persons.

17. The owner or occupier of a dwellinghouse shall be held responsible for preventing more persons sleeping in any room thereof than are allowed by the floor-space laid down in clause 10. Failure to comply with this shall render him liable to a penalty not exceeding 5s. for a first offence and not exceeding 10s. for every subsequent offence.

Movable and Temporary Dwellings

18. Every person who shall own or occupy temporarily a tent, shed, whare, or similar structure shall be responsible that the same is clean, dry, weatherproof, and ventilated. Each adult and every two children under ten years of age shall be provided with 20 square feet of floor-space.

19. Every person who shall own or occupy a tent, shed, whare, or similar structure which is in such a state as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or which is so overcrowded as to be injurious to the health of the inmates, whether or not members of the same family, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1 for the first offence, and not exceeding £5 for every subsequent offence.

Meeting-houses

20. All provisions of the clauses in these by-laws relating to buildings used as a dwellinghouse shall apply to meeting-houses.

21. All meeting-houses shall be provided with sufficient privy-accommodation for each sex to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health.

22. No sweepings or rubbish shall be deposited under the floor of a meeting-house.

23. The committee shall direct the carrying-out of any necessary alterations or additions under these by-laws, and in the event of the owner or persons concerned in the meeting-house refusing to carry out such alterations or additions such meeting-house may be closed down until the by-laws are complied with.

C.—DRAINAGE

24. The Council shall make such by-laws regarding drainage to suit the particular circumstances of their district as the Medical Officer of Health approves.

25. It shall be an offence for any person to cause any waste water from any dwellinghouse in a Maori kainga to be discharged over the ground in such a manner as to cause a nuisance, or into any dry ditch, or watercourse flowing through a Maori kainga.

26. Where any system of drainage for the disposal of waste water is installed in any dwellinghouse it shall be an offence if the owner or occupier does not keep such drainage system clean.

D.—NUISANCES

27. No nightsoil, refuse, or offensive rubbish shall be cast or deposited or allowed to flow into any spring, stream, or watercourse that flows through or past a Maori kainga and which is used as a water-supply by the inhabitants of such kainga or other kainga on the banks of such stream or near such spring.

28. No person who is the owner or occupier of any premises within a Maori kainga shall permit or suffer any nightsoil or refuse or any offensive rubbish or matter of any kind whatever to accumulate or remain or be in or upon such premises so as to be injurious or dangerous to health or as to cause an offensive smell.

29. No horses, cattle, sheep, dogs or other animals shall be buried within a Maori kainga.

30. No person shall throw or leave any dead animal, or cast or deposit any nightsoil or refuse or any offensive rubbish or matter of any kind whatever, on any property within a Maori kainga whereby any nuisance is or is likely to be created.

31. It shall be the duty of every owner or occupier in a Maori kainga to either cause all household refuse and rubbish to be disposed of in any place set apart in such Maori kainga by the Council or committee, or in the absence of such place, then by burying or burning on his section in such a manner as to cause no nuisance.

32. Every person who commits a breach of any of the by-laws 27, 28, 29, and 30 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

E.—KEEPING OF ANIMALS

33. No person shall keep or allow any pigs to run loose within a Maori kainga, nor in any case to keep them so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, nor in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes or for use in a dairy; nor shall any person, after the coming into force of this by-law, permit to remain any pig-sty at a less distance than 150 ft. from any house or building used as a dwelling-house or school, or any buildings within which food intended for human consumption is prepared or stored, or at a less distance than 50 ft. from any road or the boundary of any occupied neighbouring property.

F.—PRIVIES

Regulating all Privies

34. The owner or occupier of every dwellinghouse shall provide the same with a privy.

35. Every person who shall construct a pan or tube privy in connection with a building shall construct such privy at a distance of 10 ft. at the least from any living-room or any room where foodstuff is intended to be stored.

36. (a) It shall be an offence for any person who shall construct a privy in connection with a building to construct such privy within the distance of 40 ft. from any well, spring, or stream of water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or otherwise in such a position as to render any such water liable to pollution.

(b) Water closets may be attached to a dwelling, and every water closet shall have a sufficient and permanent supply of water for flushing purposes, and shall be connected to a sewer or septic-tank installation or other such means of disposal as the Inspector of Health may approve. All drainage-work, connections, and plumbing-work shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

37. Every privy shall in all respects be well and substantially erected. It shall be provided with a sufficient opening for ventilation as near the top as practicable, and communication directly with the external air. It shall be enclosed on all sides and be provided with a door.

38. The occupier of the premises on which any privy is situated shall keep such privy in a good state of repair and in a thoroughly clean and sanitary condition.

39. The owner or occupier of any premises in connection with which a privy has been erected shall use or cause to be used a sufficiency of dry earth or sawdust or ashes so that the excrement shall be so covered that no nuisance shall arise therefrom.

Regulating Pan-privies

40. Where a pan-privy is used, such privy shall be constructed and cleansed in the following manner:—

(a) Every person who shall construct a pan-privy in connection with a building shall construct such privy in such a manner and such a position as to afford ready means of access to such privy for the purpose of cleaning such privy and of removing filth therefrom:

(b) The seat of a pan-privy, the aperture in such seat and the space beneath such seat shall be of such dimensions as to admit of a movable receptacle for nightsoil of a capacity of not less than one cubic foot being placed and fitted beneath such seat in such a manner and in such a position as may effectually prevent the deposit upon the floor or sides of the space beneath such seat, or elsewhere than in such receptacle, of any filth which may from time to time fall or be passed through the aperture of such seat:

(c) The seat of such pan-privy shall be so constructed that the whole of such seat or a sufficient part thereof may be readily removed or adjusted in such a manner as to afford adequate access to the space beneath such seat for the purpose of cleansing such space, or removing therefrom or placing or fitting therein the appropriate receptacle:

(d) The receptacle in any pan-privy shall be constructed of such material and in such a manner as to prevent any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle. The aperture of the seat shall be provided with a cover, which must be kept over the aperture when the seat is not in use.

41. The occupier of every house shall cause the pans of all pan-privies used in connection with such house to be emptied and properly cleaned at least once in every week, and in any case so frequently as to prevent overflow.

42. It shall not be lawful for any person to bury nightsoil otherwise than in a pit or trench in such a manner and to such a depth as to provide that it shall have a covering of earth of at least 6 in. when the pit or trench is closed.

43. No nightsoil shall be buried within 50 ft. of any dwelling or within 60 ft. of any well. A pit may be used instead of a movable receptacle, provided such pit does not communicate directly with subsoil water. The aperture of the seat shall be provided with a cover, which must be kept over the aperture when the seat is not in use. The seat and walls surrounding the space below the seat shall be made fly-proof. In no case shall the height of the excreta within the pit be allowed to rise to within 6 in. of the surface of the ground.

Regulating Pit-privies

44. A privy of an approved type may be provided with a pit for the reception of faecal matter in place of a pan, but such pit shall not be placed as to endanger the purity of any stream, spring, or well, and shall be at least 30 ft. from any dwelling or place in which food is stored.

45. The pit of every pit-privy shall be covered by a seat so constructed as to prevent the access of flies to such pit, and for this purpose the aperture of the seat shall be provided with a cover which must be in place when the privy is not in use.

46. The pit of every pit-privy shall be covered in with clean earth before the faecal matter therein rises to within 12 in. of the surface of the ground, and the privy shall be thereafter moved.

G.—INFECTIOUS DISEASES

47. Where the Medical Officer of Health notifies that an infectious disease exists in a village or district, no hui, gathering, or tangi shall be held until such time as the village or district is declared clean of the disease.

48. Where an infectious disease has been notified in a village or district, the Council and the committee shall render every possible assistance to Native-school teachers, Native nurses, sanitary inspectors, medical officers, or health officers in the early tracing of cases of sickness in the village or district. The Council and the committee shall make it as widely known as possible that such an infectious disease exists. Any person, after receiving such notice, who does not notify cases of sickness existing in a house or camp owned or occupied by him shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

49. No person suffering or suspected to be suffering from an infectious disease shall travel or be removed to other dwellinghouses or camps already occupied, unless to a hospital, without the consent of a nurse, sanitary inspector, or medical officer.

50. Where so directed by a sanitary inspector, Native nurse, or qualified medical practitioner, no person living in a house, building, or camp where infectious disease exists shall travel about to other occupied houses or districts unless he possesses a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner that he is free from infection.

51. Any person, not acting under the instructions of a qualified medical practitioner or an official of the Department of Health, who treats cases of sickness other than in his own immediate family, or allows cases of sickness to collect in a house or camp owned or occupied by him, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

52. No clothing, blankets, or domestic utensils shall be removed for further use from a house in which infectious disease exists or has existed until such material has been properly disinfected by a Native nurse, sanitary inspector, or under the orders of a qualified medical practitioner.

53. Any person infringing any of by-laws 47, 48, 49, and 50 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and of by-law 51 not exceeding £25.

H.—TANGIS, HUIS, AND GATHERINGS

54. The committee of the village or district where a tangi, hui, or gathering is held shall be responsible for the proper regulation of such tangi, hui, or gathering from a sanitary standpoint.

55. The committee shall take steps to ensure that proper precautions are carried out with regard to cleanliness, ventilation, and overcrowding of meeting-houses, cleanliness of the marae and cookinghouses and places used for the storage of food, and the proper disposal of refuse and rubbish.

56. The committee shall take steps to ensure that sufficient privy-accommodation to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health or the Native Health Inspector is provided for each sex, and that such privies are kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

57. The committee shall take steps to prevent the fouling of water-supplies.

58. The committee shall take steps to prevent any tangi, hui, or gathering being so unduly prolonged as to be a menace to public health.

59. The committee shall prevent any acute cases of sickness remaining in a meeting-house, and shall insist on their being removed to a detached dwellinghouse, tent, or to their own homes.

60. Any person depositing excreta or urine within a Maori kainga at other than places appointed shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 10s. for each offence.

61. The committee may appoint a sanitary squad to carry out the provisions of this section. Where any expense is incurred, it shall be a charge upon the funds of the tangi, hui, or gathering, or may be raised as a levy or contribution, as the committee may deem fit.

62. Where there is no duly constituted health committee in a village where the tangi, hui, or gathering is held, the relatives of the deceased or the promoters of the hui or gathering shall be held responsible for the carrying-out of the clauses of this section.

I.—WATER-SUPPLIES

63. The Council shall make such by-laws regarding water-supplies to suit the particular circumstances of their district as the Medical Officer of Health approves.

64. Where the water-supply of any dwellinghouse is drawn from a rain-water tank it shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of every such dwellinghouse to cause such rain-water tank to be cleaned out at least once in every year and at any more frequent intervals should circumstances require.

J.—HAWKERS

65. The following by-laws shall apply to Indian, Assyrian, and other hawkers selling their goods in the Maori kaingas within the district, that is to say,—

- (1) Such person shall have a license from the Council before he may sell his goods within the kaingas of the district.
- (2) The license in the Form B in the Schedule hereto shall have force throughout the whole of the district and the fee therefor shall be £2.
- (3) The Chairman or Clerk of the Council, or a member of the Council duly authorized by the Council in that behalf, is empowered to issue such licenses.
- (4) All fees paid for licenses shall be forwarded to the office of the Council.
- (5) Any person hawking goods without a license within any Maori kainga in the district shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

A special license may be issued by the Chairman or Clerk or any member of the Council, or by the chairman of the village committee of a kainga where any hui or gathering is held, to any person desirous of hawking and selling goods at such hui or gathering on payment of 10s., or for any other kind of sale 5s. Such license shall be in force only while such hui or gathering lasts, and no longer. Any person hawking or selling goods at such hui or gathering without a special license, or without a license as provided in the foregoing by-laws, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

REGULATING SHELL-FISH

66. (1) No person shall transport into any place being a Maori village, pa, or assemblage of houses, in respect of which a Komiti Marae has been appointed, for consumption in such place any shell-fish taken from any area declared in respect of such place to be a prohibited area.

(2) If a Medical Officer of Health or Inspector of Health is of opinion that any area is contaminated or liable to contamination from sewage outfall or nightsoil-deposit he may advise the Maori Council to declare such area to be a prohibited area for the purpose of this by-law.

(3) The Maori Council may thereupon by its Chairman instruct the Chairman of any Komiti Marae to publish at the meeting-house of such place or at some other suitable place a notice that the area is a prohibited area for the purposes of this by-law, and such area shall thereupon in respect of such place be a prohibited area accordingly.

(4) Proof that any notice has been published in any place as aforesaid shall be sufficient proof that all necessary steps have been taken under this by-law for constituting the area referred to in such notice a prohibited area in respect of such place for the purposes of this by-law, and shall be *prima facie* evidence that such area continues to be a prohibited area as aforesaid.

(5) Any such declaration may from time to time by like procedure be revoked.

(6) Any person committing a breach of this by-law is liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

The powers under this by-law are in addition to and not in substitution for the powers conferred by any other Act.

K.—DRUNKENNESS

67. (1) No alcoholic liquor shall at any time be supplied, drunk, or brought to any Maori kainga.

(2) Where a public meeting is held by invitation, the person or persons issuing such invitations shall be jointly and severally liable, if he or they supply or cause to be supplied any alcoholic liquor to the visitors, or any of them, or to any person whatsoever attending such a meeting, to a fine not exceeding £5.

(3) Any person found drunk at any kainga or Maori meeting shall be liable to a fine of not less than 5s. and not exceeding £1.

(4) Any person, European or Maori, shall be guilty of an offence who—

(a) Being under the influence of liquor, enters a meeting-house or a church or some other public building within a Maori kainga:

(b) Takes any alcoholic liquor into a Maori kainga:

(c) Drinks or causes any one else to drink any alcoholic liquor in any meeting-house, church, or public building.

And such person shall be liable to a fine of not less than 5s. and not exceeding £1 for a first offence, and not exceeding £2 for every subsequent offence.

L.—SMOKING

68. Every person, whether European or Maori, who sells, gives, or supplies any cigarette, tobacco, or torori to any Maori under the age of fifteen years shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

Every Maori under the age of fifteen years who smokes tobacco, torori, or cigarettes, or any part of a cigarette, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for the first offence to a fine not exceeding 5s., and for the second offence to a fine not exceeding 10s., and for a third or subsequent offence to a fine of £1.

M.—GAMBLING

69. Any person, whether Maori or otherwise, desirous of establishing a billiard-room in any kainga, village, or pa, and any Maori desirous of establishing a billiard-room at any other place within the district, except townships (but not Maori lots within a Native township) and European settlements, shall first obtain a license from the Council, which may be granted subject to the following terms and conditions:—

(1) Such license shall be in Form C in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The fee for such license shall be £10.

(3) Such license shall remain in force for twelve months from the date thereof, unless sooner revoked by the Council as hereinafter provided.

(4) All billiard-rooms shall be properly ventilated, and shall at all times be kept clean and in good order.

They shall be provided with privy and urinal accommodation to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health or Inspector of Health.

(5) All billiard-rooms shall remain open on week-days only between the hours of 9 a.m. and 10 p.m. Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1 for the first offence, not exceeding £2 for the second offence, and for a subsequent offence shall be liable to have his license revoked.

(6) No Maori under the age of fifteen shall be permitted to play billiards on such licensed premises, and if discovered playing therein the licensee or the person for the time in charge of the premises shall be liable to a fine of £5 for the first offence, and for a second offence the Council may revoke the license.

(7) Renewal of license must be applied for before the expiry of the term for which a license has been granted.

(8) Any Maori under the age of fifteen years found playing billiards in any place whatsoever shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 5s. for the first offence, not exceeding 10s. for the second offence, and not exceeding £1 for the third offence or for every subsequent offence.

(9) Any person keeping a billiard-room or a billiard-table in any Maori kainga, and any Maori keeping such a room or table at any other place within the district, except townships (but not Maori lots within a Native township) and European settlements, without license from the Council, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £25.

(10) Any person found playing for money, whether by cards or any other game (except by billiards on licensed premises), within the precincts of any kainga shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 5s. for the first offence, not exceeding £1 for the second offence, and not exceeding £2 for every subsequent offence.

(11) Any person, the owner, or occupier of any house or premises situate in any Maori kainga, who shall permit or allow gambling or playing for money (except by billiards on licensed premises) in such house or upon such premises shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1 for the first offence, not exceeding £2 for the second offence, and not exceeding £5 for every subsequent offence.

N.—VILLAGE COMMITTEES

70. The Council may delegate wholly or in part its powers under the prescribed rules or regulations to any village committee, and such committee shall thereupon be enabled to exercise such powers within its own kainga.

The village committee shall have power to impose a penalty or a fine for any breach of regulation, and if such fine be not paid within the prescribed period the chairman of the committee shall forward a report on and evidence of such breach of regulation and of the non-payment of such fine to the Chairman of the Council.

71. The Council shall prescribe fines for by-laws for which no provision has been made.

O.—WELFARE AND MORAL WELL-BEING OF THE MAORI INHABITANTS OF THE DISTRICT

72. (1) Any person who having custody, control, or charge of a child, being a boy under fourteen years, and a girl under the age of sixteen years, wilfully ill-treats, neglects, abandons, or exposes such child in a manner likely to cause such child unnecessary suffering or injury to its health, shall pay to the Council or committee the sum of not more than £20.

(2) It shall be an offence, within any Maori kainga or Maori settlement surrounding a Maori kainga, to practise as a Tohunga, or practise on the superstition and credulity of the Maori people, by pretending to possess supernatural powers of treatment and cure of disease.

Any person infringing this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

(3) Every person within a Maori village, pa, or assemblage of houses, who ill-treats any animal or leaves any animal for any time without sufficient food or water, is liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

(4) Any person who wilfully trespasses within a Maori village and refuses to leave such village after being warned to do so by a member of the Council or of the village committee, or such person as the Council or village committee may depute for the purpose, is liable to a fine not exceeding 10s.

(5) (a) No person shall conduct a picture-show or other entertainment for profit or gain within a Maori village unless licensed to do so by the village committee.

(b) The fee for any such license shall be £1 per month or part of a month, but the village committee may remit such license fee either wholly or in part.

(c) Any person infringing against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

(6) No person shall promote or organize any hui or Maori meeting to be held within any Maori settlement without having first obtained the consent of the Maori Council or village committee thereto. Any person offending against this part of the by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

3. Ko nga tupapaku mehemea ka mate i waenganui i te 15 o nga ra o Maehe me te 15 o nga ra o Hepetema (e uru ana ano ia aua ra), i roto i te tau, me tanu i roto i nga ra e wha i muri iho o te matenga; a mehemea ka mate i waenganui i te 16 o nga ra o Hepetema me te 14 o nga ra e Maehe (e uru ana ano ia aua ra), me tanu tonu i nga ra e toru i muri iho o te matenga, haunga ia mehemea ka takoto ke te whakahaere a te Apiha Whakahaere i te Ora mo te Takiwa, a tetahi tangata ranei i whakamanaia e ia.

C.—NGA AWA KERI

24. Ma te Kaunihera e hanga nga paero e pa ana ki nga awa keri e tau ana ki nga ahuatanga o tona takiwa, i runga ano ia i ta te Apiha Whakahaere i te Ora e whakaae ai.

25. Kua whai hara te tangata mehemea ki te tahuri ia ki te mea kia ringiringitia nga wai paruparu o tetahi whare noho kei roto i tetahi kainga Maori ki te marae o taua whare e whai putake ai te pa o tetahi mate ki roto ranei i tetahi awakeri kore wai, awaawa wai ranei e rere ana ma roto i tetahi kainga Maori.

26. Mehemea ki te mahia he awakeri mo tetahi whare noho hei hari i nga wai paruparu ka whai hara te tangata nona taua whare a te tangata noho ranei i roto i taua whare mehemea ki te kore e tiakina e ia kia noho ma tonu taua awakeri.

D.—NGA PARU O TE MARAE

27. 28. E kore rawa e paingia tetahi tangata nona tetahi whare, e noho ana ranei i roto i tetahi whare i roto i tetahi kainga Maori, kia tuku i tetahi hamuti, mea rukenga, otaota haunga, i tetahi atu mea kino ranei kia haupu ana, kia takoto ana ranei i te marae, i nga taha ranei o taua kainga e whai putake mai ai mo tetahi mate, e puta mai ai ranei he haunga.

29. Kua e tanumia he hoiho, he kau, he hipi, he kuri, tetahi atu kararehe ranei ki roto i te rohe o tetahi kainga Maori.

30. Kaore e pai kia whiua, kia waihotia ranei he kararehe kua mate kia rukea, kia waihotia ranei he hamuti mea rukenga ranei, otaota haunga ranei era atu mea kino ranei ki runga i tetahi wahi i roto i tetahi kainga Maori e whai take ai kia pa mai he mate.

31. 39. Ma te tangata nona, e noho ana ranei i roto i tetahi whare kua oti nei te hanga he whare-paku mo reira, e maringi e mea ranei kia ruiruia he oneone maroke, he para haunga rakau ranei, he pungarehu ranei kia ngaro iho ai nga hamuti, kia kore ai hoki e puta ake he haunga o reira.

49. 50. Mehemea ka puta he whakahaere pera ma tetahi Kai-tiroiro, Neehi Maori, ma tetahi Takuta ranei, me kua rawa tetahi tangata e noho ana i roto i tetahi whare, puni ranei he mate rere kei reira e haere ki tetahi atu whare e nohonga ana e te tangata, ki tetahi atu takiwa ranei mehemea kaore he tiwhikete a tetahi takuta i a ia hei tohu kaore taua mate i a ia.

51.
