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Crown Land set apart as a Provisional State Forest

A PROCLAMATION

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby set apart the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto as a provisional State forest.

SCHEDULE

TARANAKI LAND DISTRICT.—WELLINGTON CONSERVANCY

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District, Stratford and Ohura Counties, containing by admeasurement 1,053 acres, more or less, and described as follows:—

All that area containing 600 acres, more or less, being Sections 12, 13, and 14, Block I, Taurakawa Survey District. (S.O. plan 921.)

Also all that area containing 453 acres, more or less, being Subdivision 2 of Section 2, Block VII, Aria Survey District. (S.O. plan 7000.)

As the same are more particularly delineated on plans Nos. 52/13 and 70/1, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

The Balclutha Milk District Constitution Order 1945

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Milk Act, 1944, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and declare as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Balclutha Milk District Constitution Order 1945.

2. Those parts of New Zealand consisting of the Borough of Balclutha and parts of Clutha and Bruce Counties, described in the Schedule hereto, are hereby constituted and declared a milk district under the Milk Act, 1944, as from the fourteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, with the name of the "Balclutha Milk District".

3. The Milk Authority of the said district shall be the Balclutha Borough Council.

4. The Clutha and the Bruce County Councils shall each be entitled to have one representative on the Milk Committee of the Balclutha Borough Council, and from time to time shall be entitled to nominate one person each for that purpose.

5. The Balclutha Borough Council shall from time to time appoint to the Milk Committee of the Borough Council the two persons nominated by the Clutha and Bruce County Councils pursuant to clause four hereof.

SCHEDULE

ALL that area, being the Borough of Balclutha and parts of Clutha and Hillend Survey Districts, commencing at the northern corner of Section 13, Block XXXV, Clutha Survey District; thence easterly generally by the boundary of the Borough of Balclutha to the Main South Road; thence north-easterly and easterly along that road and Benhar Road to the south-eastern corner of Section 8, Block I, Hillend Survey District; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of said Section 8 for a distance of 2500 links; thence south-easterly by a right line, at a right angle to the said south-eastern boundary, to the railway reserve; thence south-westerly along that reserve to the boundary of North Molyneux Survey District; thence north-westerly and south-westerly by that boundary to a railway reserve; thence north-westerly along that reserve to the boundary of the Borough of Balclutha; thence south-westerly generally along that boundary to Lot 24, Rosebank Estate; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of said Lot 24 to its south-eastern corner; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of said Lot 24 to a road, across that road; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 11, 9, and 7, Block XXXIII, Clutha Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of said Section 7; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of said Section 7 to the north-western boundary of D.P. 2900; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the south-eastern corner of Lot 4, Rosebank Estate; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of Lots 4, 3, and 2, Rosebank Estate, to a road; thence north-easterly along that road to the Main South Road; thence south-easterly along the Main South Road to a road forming the north-western boundary of D.P. 2317;

thence north-easterly generally along the north-eastern, north-western, and again north-eastern boundaries of said D.P. 2317 to Section 13, Block XXXV, Clutha Survey District, and north-easterly along the north-western boundary of said Section 13 to the place of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked 94/15, deposited in the office of the Milk Marketing Division of the Marketing Department, Wellington, and thereon edged red.

PURSUANT to the Government Railways Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1945, and shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the 12th day of June, 1922, and published in the *Gazette* on the 15th day of the same month at page 1583, as the same are enuring under the Government Railways Act, 1926 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations as amended by the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the 8th day of June, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* on the 11th day of the same month at page 1874, and by the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1926, on the 17th day of December, 1938, and published in the *Gazette* on the 21st day of the same month at page 2814, is amended—

- (a) By revoking the figures and word "15 to 16" next following the words "as an apprentice" and substituting the figures and word "15 to 17";
- (b) By adding at the end thereof the following proviso: "Provided further that, in special circumstances, the age at entry of an apprentice may be extended by the General Manager at his discretion."

3. In respect of any probationer (other than an apprentice) who is a discharged serviceman within the meaning of Part I of the Rehabilitation Act, 1941, and whose application for employment in the Department is made within a period of one year from the date of coming into force of these regulations or from the date he lawfully ceased to serve as a serviceman, whichever date is the later, the age at entry as limited by Regulation 16 of the principal regulations amended as aforesaid may be extended by the General Manager at his discretion.

Consenting to the Raising of a Loan of £15,000 by the Bay of Islands Electric-power Board and prescribing the Conditions thereof

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS the Bay of Islands Electric-power Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising a loan of forty-seven thousand pounds (£47,000), to be known as "Reticulation Extension Loan (No. 2) 1945" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of further reticulating the Board's inner area, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"):

And whereas by Order in Council made on the sixteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, consent was given to the raising of a portion thereof amounting to twelve thousand pounds (£12,000):

And whereas the said local authority is arranging to raise a further portion thereof amounting to fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said sum:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum for the said purpose up to the amount of fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty (20) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said sum shall be repaid by half-yearly instalments of principal of not less than three hundred and seventy-five pounds (£375) each, extending over the term as determined in clause one above.

(4) The payment of interest and the repayment of principal in respect of the said sum shall be made in New Zealand.

(5) No amount payable as either interest or as principal in respect of the said sum shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(6) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the raising of the said sum or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(7) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the sixteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Whangarei Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of a loan of thirty-three thousand six hundred and thirty pounds (£33,630), to be known as "Stormwater Loan, 1939":

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not yet been exercised to the extent of eight thousand two hundred and sixty pounds (£8,260):

And whereas the authority has lapsed in accordance with the provisions of clause six of the said Order in Council, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to raise the balance of the said loan or any portion thereof except in accordance with the provisions of a further Order in Council that may be issued pursuant to section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"):

And whereas the said local authority is now desirous of raising the balance of the said loan amounting to eight thousand two hundred and sixty pounds (£8,260) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), and it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to raise the said sum on the conditions hereinafter set out:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred

on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum up to the amount of eight thousand two hundred and sixty pounds (£8,260), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

- (1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be borrowed shall not exceed twenty (20) years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.
- (3) The said sum or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.
- (4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no such instalment shall be paid out of loan-moneys.
- (5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurator fees in respect of the borrowing of the said sum or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.
- (6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.
