(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty (20) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds seven shillings and sixpence (£3 7s. 6d.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said sum shall be free of principal repayments during the first year from the date of the borrowing thereof.

(4) Thereafter the said sum, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the balance of the term amounting to nineteen (19)

(5) The payment of interest for the first year and thereafter the payment of the instalments of principal and interest shall be made in New Zealand.

(6) No interest after the first year and no instalments of principal and interest shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(7) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the raising of the said sum or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised. any amount raised.

(8) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.
