IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the Hauraki Plains West Drainage District by the inclusion therein of the area of land described in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said drainage district shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

AREA INCLUDED IN THE HAURAKI PLAINS WEST DRAINAGE DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Hauraki Plains County, bounded by a line commencing at a point in Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, being the western corner of Lot 3 on D.P. 21822, and being part of Waitakaruru Nos. 4A and 4B Blocks, and running north-easterly along the north-western boundary of the said No. 4A Block, being a right line across Lots 3, 2, and 1 on the said D.P. 21822, to a point on a public road, bearing 305° 21' distant 591.3 links from the easternmost corner of the said Lot 1; thence along a right line across the said public road, bearing 49° 36' 40" distant 103.2 links, to the westernmost corner of Lot 4 on D.P. 25055, being part of Waitakaruru Nos. 4A, 4B, and 3C 1 Blocks; thence along the north-western boundary of the said Lot 4, to and across a public road, and along the north-western boundary of Lot 6 on the said D.P. 25055, being part of Waitakaruru No. 3C 1 Block, to the shore of the Firth of Thames; thence south-easterly along the said shore to the right bank of the Waitakaruru Stream at its mouth; thence south-westerly generally along the said right bank to its intersection with the middle of the Pokeno-Paeroa Main Highway, and along the middle of the said main highway to its intersection with the production south-easterly of the south-western boundary of Ngarewha No. 1 Block; thence north-westerly generally along a right line, to and along the said south-western boundary, and along the south-western boundaries of Ngarewha Nos. 2B and 2A Blocks, Waitakaruru Nos. 1D 1, 1D 2, 1A 2C, 1A 6, 1A 5, 1A 3B, 1A 3C, 1A 3D, 1A 3E 2, 1A 4B Blocks, Lots 4 and 3 on D.P. 26678, being parts of Waitakaruru Nos. 3A 2, 3B, 3C 2, and 3C 1 Blocks, Lot 4 on D.P. 16095, being part of Waitakaruru No. 3C 1 Block, and Lot 4 and part of Lot 3 on D.P. 21822, being parts of Waitakaruru Nos. 3C 1 and 4A Blocks, to the westernmost corner of the said Lot 3; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of the said Waitakaruru No. 4A Block, being a right line across Lots 3, 2, and 1 on the said D.P. 21822, to a point on a public road, bearing 305° 21' distant 591.3 links from the easternmost corner of the said Lot 1; thence along a right line across the said public road, bearing 49° 36' 40" distant 103.2 links, to the westernmost corner of Lot 4 on D.P. 25055, being part of Waitakaruru Nos. 4A, 4B, and 3C 1 Blocks; thence along the north-western boundary of the said Lot 4, to and across a public road, and along the north-western boundary of Lot 6 on the said D.P. 25055, being part of Waitakaruru No. 3C 1 Block, to the shore of the Firth of Thames; thence easterly generally along the said shore to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE

HAURAKI PLAINS WEST DRAINAGE DISTRICT

ALL that area situated in the Auckland Land District, in the Hauraki Plains County, bounded by a line commencing at a point in Block X, Thames Survey District, where the left bank of the Piako River meets the Firth of Thames; thence running in a southerly direction generally up the said left bank to its junction with the southern end of the eastern side of the Puhanga Canal;

thence northerly along the eastern side of that canal to its intersection with the production north-easterly of north-western boundary of Section 3, Block V, Waihou Survey District; thence along a right line, to and along the said north-western boundary of the said Section 3 and the north-western boundary of Section 2 of the said Block V to a public road; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern side of the said public road to a point being the production easterly of the northern boundary of Section 33, Block IV, Piako Survey District, along a right line across the said road, to and along the northern boundaries of the said Section 33 and Section 31 of the said Block IV, and a right line, being the last-mentioned boundary produced across the Waitakaruru-Maukoro Canal, to the middle of a public road running along its western bank; thence south-easterly along the middle of the said public road to a point being the production north-easterly of the north-western boundary of Section 84, Block IV, Piako Survey District aforesaid; thence along a right line to and along the said north-western boundary and the north-western boundary of Section 40, the north-eastern boundary of Section 2, both of Block VIII, Piako Survey District, to the south-western corner of Section 3 of the said Block VIII; thence along the centre of a drain through Section 2 aforesaid to a point on the south-western boundary of that section 630 links from its north-western corner; thence along that boundary and a right line across a public road to the south-eastern corner of Section 5, Block III, Piako Survey District aforesaid; thence along the generally north-western side of that road to the southern corner of Section 33, Block VII, Piako Survey District aforesaid; thence north-westerly generally along the north-eastern side of another public road forming the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 33, 34, 9, 3, and 1, Block III aforesaid, along a right line across another public road, to and along the north-eastern side of the public road passing through Waitakaruru No. 1B 2A No. 2 Block, and a right line, being the production of the north-western end of the last-mentioned roadside, across railway land, and another public road to its northern side; thence along the northern side of that road and a right line, being the production of its western end, to the middle of the Paeroa-Pokeno Main Highway; thence along the middle of the said main highway to its intersection with the production south-easterly of the south-western boundary of Ngarewha No. 1 Block; thence north-westerly generally along a right line, to and along the said south-western boundary, and along the south-western boundaries of Ngarewha Nos. 2B and 2A Blocks, Waitakaruru Nos. 1D 1, 1D 2, 1A 2C, 1A 6, 1A 5, 1A 3B, 1A 3C, 1A 3D, 1A 3E 2, 1A 4B Blocks, Lots 4 and 3 on D.P. 26678, being parts of Waitakaruru Nos. 3A 2, 3B, 3C 2, and 3C 1 Blocks, Lot 4 on D.P. 16095, being part of Waitakaruru No. 3C 1 Block, and Lot 4 and part of Lot 3 on D.P. 21822, being parts of Waitakaruru Nos. 3C 1 and 4A Blocks, to the westernmost corner of the said Lot 3; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of the said Waitakaruru No. 4A Block, being a right line across Lots 3, 2, and 1 on the said D.P. 21822, to a point on a public road, bearing 305° 21' distant 591.3 links from the easternmost corner of the said Lot 1; thence along a right line across the said public road, bearing 49° 36' 40" distant 103.2 links, to the westernmost corner of Lot 4 on D.P. 25055, being part of Waitakaruru Nos. 4A, 4B, and 3C 1 Blocks; thence along the north-western boundary of the said Lot 4, to and across a public road, and along the north-western boundary of Lot 6 on the said D.P. 25055, being part of Waitakaruru No. 3C 1 Block, to the shore of the Firth of Thames; thence easterly generally along the said shore to the point of commencement.

Authorizing the Wellington Harbour Board to reclaim Land in Balena Bay, Evans Bay, Wellington Harbour

WHEREAS it is provided by the one-hundred-and-sixty-eighth section of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, authorize any local authority or Harbour Board to reclaim from the sea areas, not exceeding five acres in extent, in any case where he considers that the reclamation will not affect navigation and is for the benefit of the public:

And whereas the Wellington Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain land in Balena Bay, Evans Bay, Wellington Harbour, and the said reclamation is of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Board has applied to the Governor-General in Council for an order authorizing the execution of the said harbour-works:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and is for the benefit of the public:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize and empower the Board to reclaim from the sea in Balena Bay, Evans Bay, Wellington Harbour, the land coloured red on plan marked M.D. 8442, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with plan marked M.D. 8442, subject to the provisions of the said Act.
