WHEREAS the Bay of Islands Electric-power Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") is desirous of raising the sum of thirty-five thousand pounds (£35,000) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), being portion of a loan of two hundred thousand pounds (£200,000), known as "Additional Areas Loan, 1945," authorized by a poll of ratepayers taken on the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, for the purpose of arranging for the supply and distribution of electric energy for the benefit of all that area of land included in the Bay of Islands Electric-power District by a Proclamation dated the fifteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, comprising the whole of the Counties of Whangaroa and Hokianga as present constituted, and by a Proclamation dated the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, comprising that portion of the Mangonui County as described in the Schedule thereto, and for such purpose to do all or any of such matters and things as the said local authority is empowered to do by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and the amendments thereto, and in respect of which works guarantees, as described in clauses 21-43 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, have first been given in favour of the said local authority for payments amounting in each of not less than five (5) consecutive years from the completion of such works to at least fourteen (14) per cent. of the estimated capital cost of such works; and for providing financial assistance to consumers and for trading purposes as provided in section one hundred and eighteen of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum for the said purpose up to the amount of thirty-five thousand pounds (£35,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty-five (25) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said sum shall be free of principal repayments during the first year from the date of the borrowing thereof.

(4) Thereafter the said sum, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the balance of the term amounting to twenty-four (24) years.

(5) The payment of interest for the first year and thereafter the payment of the instalments of principal and interest shall be made in New Zealand.

(6) No interest after the first year and no instalments of principal and interest shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(7) The rate for brokerage, underwriting, and procurator fees in respect of the raising of the said sum or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(8) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

The above estimates may be compared with last season's actual average yields, which were: Wheat, 38.02 bushels; oats, 54.18 bushels; and barley, 37.11 bushels.

In accordance with the above estimates, the total yield of wheat for the season 1945-46 should be approximately 5,400,000 bushels, as against an ascertained yield of 6,992,204 bushels for the season 1944-45.

The area from which oats were threshed for the five seasons ending with 1944-45 averaged 25 per cent. of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year, the total yield of grain would be approximately 2,400,000 bushels, as against a yield of 4,209,143 bushels for the season 1944-45.

On a similar assumption in regard to barley, the total yield of grain would be approximately 2,100,000 bushels, as against 1,384,957 bushels for the season 1944-45.
