THE RIGHT HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS the Bay of Islands County Council (hereinafter called the said local authority) proposes, pursuant to the provisions of section three of the Main Highways Amendment Act, 1928, to borrow the sum of nine hundred and eighty-two pounds (£982), by a loan to be known as Main Highways Loan, 1946 (hereinafter called the said loan), for the purpose of paying its portion of the cost of renewing the Te Keene Bridge on the Pakaraka-Awanui Main Highway:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of nine hundred and eighty-two pounds (£982), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall be ten (10) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

(4) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

WHEREAS the Auckland City Council (hereinafter called the said local authority), being desirous of raising a loan of fifty-two thousand two hundred pounds (£52,200), to be known as Housing (Titoki Street) Loan, 1946 (hereinafter called the said loan), for the purpose of moving, re-erecting, and converting transit houses, and providing roading, drainage, paths, water, gas, and electricity, and other services necessary therefor on a property owned by the Auckland City Council in Titoki Street, Auckland, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called the said Act), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of fifty-two thousand two hundred pounds (£52,200), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

The Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1946

PURSUANT to the Government Railways Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1946, and shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the 12th day of June, 1922, and published in the *Gazette* on the 15th day of the same month at page 1583, as the same are enuring under the Government Railways Act, 1926 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 1 of the principal regulations, as amended by the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1926, on the 17th day of December, 1938, and published in the *Gazette* on the 21st day of the same month at page 2814, is amended by revoking the definition of "Housekeeper" and substituting the following:—

" 'Housekeeper' means a person, residing with an employee, whose sole occupation is to keep house for such employee and who is not substantially dependent upon the income of a person other than such employee.

" For the purposes of this definition the term 'employee' means an employee who is not married, or, if married, is not living with his wife or her husband, and who is a *bona fide* householder.

" If any question arises as to whether any person is a 'housekeeper' within the meaning of this definition or as to whether any employee is a *bona fide* householder, it shall be determined by the General Manager."

3. (1) Regulation 16 of the principal regulations, as amended (a) by the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the 8th day of June, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* on the 11th day of the same month at page 1874, and by the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1926; (b) on the 9th day of September, 1929, and published in the *Gazette* on the 12th day of the same month at page 2447; (c) on the 17th day of December, 1938, and published in the *Gazette* on the 21st day of the same month at page 2814; and (d) on the 12th day of September, 1945, and published in the *Gazette* on the 20th day of the same month at page 1162, is amended by inserting immediately before the first proviso the following words:—

" As a junior trainee mechanican .. 16 to 20 years last birthday."

(2) This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1946.

4. (1) Regulation 22 of the principal regulations, as amended by the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1926, on the 9th day of September, 1929, and published in the *Gazette* on the 12th day of the same month at page 2447, is amended by inserting the following paragraph immediately after paragraph (a):—

" (aa) In the case of a trainee mechanican or a junior trainee mechanican three years computed from the date of taking up duty as a probationer:

" Provided that the General Manager may in special circumstances extend the last-mentioned probationary period for such period as he deems fit."

(2) This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1946.

5. (1) Regulation 23 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) By inserting between the number "23" and the words "in no case" the number "(1)" in parentheses:

(b) By revoking all the words thereof from and including the words "provided however" to the end of the regulation:

(c) By substituting for the words so revoked the following words:—

" (e) In the case of a trainee mechanican or junior trainee mechanican unless he has passed to the satisfaction of the General Manager such examinations as may be specified by the General Manager in the following subjects, namely:—

" Electricity and Magnetism:

" Telephony, Introductory:

" Telephony, Stage I:

" Telephony, Stage II:

" Provided that the General Manager may in special circumstances modify the requirements of this paragraph to such extent as he deems fit."

" (2) Nevertheless, in any case where, on the report of the Permanent Head, the Minister is satisfied that any cadet has not had reasonable opportunity of qualifying for or passing any examination hereinbefore specified his period of probation may be extended for such time not exceeding twelve months as the Minister may determine.

(2) This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1946.

6. Regulation 26A of the principal regulations (as inserted by the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1926, on the 7th day of March, 1940, and published in the *Gazette* on the 14th day of the same month at page 380) is revoked.

7. (1) The employment or continued employment of every person (other than administrative officers and persons exempted by the Minister from the provisions of this regulation pursuant to subsection (3) of section 23 of the Statutes Amendment Act, 1945) shall be conditional upon his holding membership in one of the following service organizations, namely:—

(a) The Amalgamated Society of Railway Servants:

(b) The Engine-drivers, Firemen, and Cleaners' Association:

(c) The New Zealand Railway Officers' Institute (Incorporated):

(d) The New Zealand Railway Tradesmen's Association.

(2) Every person who is required by this regulation to become a member of a service organization shall be deemed to have complied with that requirement if within the time specified in clause (3) hereof he makes application for membership of an organization in accordance with the rules of the organization.

(3) (a) A person who is a member of the Department on the first day of April, 1946, shall make his application for organization membership within eight weeks after that date.

(b) A person who thereafter becomes a member of the Department shall make his application for organization membership within eight weeks after the day on which he becomes a member.

(c) A person not being a member of the Department who after the first day of April, 1946, is employed for not less than forty hours a week for a continuous period of not less than four weeks, or who is not so employed but is employed for less than forty hours a week for a continuous period of eight weeks shall make his application for organization membership within eight weeks after the expiration of the said period of four weeks, or, as the case may be, eight weeks.

8. (1) Every apprentice electrician who during his first three years of apprenticeship passes or has passed the examinations in both theoretical and practical electrical wiring prescribed for registered electrical wiremen by the Electrical Wiremen's Registration Act, 1925, shall be awarded a diploma allowance of 1d. an hour. Such allowance shall be payable from the last day on which was held any part of the examinations at which he was successful in passing, or from the date of coming into force of this regulation, whichever is the later, and shall continue to be paid during the remainder of his service as an apprentice conditionally upon his maintaining a satisfactory standard of work and conduct.

(2) Any diploma allowance awarded in pursuance of clause (1) hereof shall be in addition to the apprentice's classified rate of pay, and shall not be payable during any period in respect of which the apprentice shall not be in receipt of wages from the Department.

(3) The Department shall refund the fees paid by any apprentice electrician for instruction at night classes at a public technical school or college during the period from the commencement of his apprenticeship until he shall have passed the examinations referred to in clause (1) hereof, on production of a report from the Director of the technical school or college showing that the apprentice has attended not less than 70 per cent. of the lectures and classes (excluding any that he has been precluded from attending through absence on duty) and that his work and conduct at such lectures and classes have been satisfactory:

Provided that if the fees are paid by instalments the amount of the refund after the first year shall be computed on the scale for fees paid in advance.

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Ohakune Lakes Scenic Board (herein referred to as the Board), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Monday, the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, at two o'clock p.m., in the Fire Brigade Station, Goldfinch Street, Ohakune, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be the Chairman of the Board. He may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

3. Special meetings may be convened at Ohakune by the Secretary, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman for such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board may, with the approval of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation, make such rules as it deems necessary for the good conduct of the public frequenting the reserve, and may set apart areas for camping-grounds or other purposes, and may fix reasonable charges for the use thereof in accordance with a scale to be approved from time to time by the Minister.

9. No tree, shrub, or plant of any kind which is not indigenous to the Ohakune district shall be planted in the reserve without the permission of the Minister.

10. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

11. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.
