WHEREAS by section thirty of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, on petition in that behalf signed by a majority of the persons qualified to be enrolled on the ratepayers' list for any proposed district, constitute and declare any area of land of not less than one thousand acres a rabbit district under and for the purposes of Part II of the said Act:

And whereas, in pursuance of the provisions of the said section thirty of the said Act, a petition has been received praying that the area of land described in the Schedule hereto be constituted and declared a rabbit district under and for the purposes of Part II of the said Act:

And whereas the said petition is signed by a majority of the persons in the said area of land qualified to be enrolled on the ratepayers' list for the said proposed district, and it is deemed expedient to give effect to the prayer of the petitioners accordingly:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute by the specific name of the "Eketahuna Rabbit District" and declare that area of land defined in the Schedule hereto to be a rabbit district under and for the purpose of Part II of the said Act; and doth hereby further declare that the basis on which the Board to be established for the said district shall first levy its general rate shall be on the basis of the acreage of the rateable property in the said district.

- (b) When sold by a wholesaler whose premises are situate elsewhere, the maximum price shall be 18s. 3d. per dozen cans.

4. The maximum prices that may be charged or received by any retailer for any canned herrings to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows:—

- (a) When sold by a retailer whose premises are situate in any area within which any wholesaler carrying on business in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin normally undertakes the free delivery of goods to retailers, the maximum price shall be 2s. 2d. per can;
- (b) When sold by a retailer whose premises are situate elsewhere, the maximum price shall be 2s. 3d. per can.

Special Prices where Extraordinary Charges Incurred

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer may authorize special maximum wholesale or retail prices in respect of any canned herrings to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. RESOLUTION

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Dannevirke Hunt Club at a meeting held on the 17th day of April, 1946, at Dannevirke, with a recommendation by the Chairman of such club, Mr. Duncan Holden, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. Duncan Holden, the Chairman of such club and the meeting, moved, and Mr. W. H. Gaisford seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

THE DANNEVIRKE HUNT CLUB

REGULATIONS

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Dannevirke Hunt Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as the said club), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the property situated in the district of Hastings, and known as the Hastings Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

- Bookmakers;
- Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents;
- All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association;
- Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support;
- Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908:

Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Dannevirke Hunt Club were made and passed by such club on the 17th day of April, 1946, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
