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Amending a Proclamation altering Boundaries of Clutha and Southland Counties and including Areas in Macleannan Riding, Clutha County, and Toetoes Riding, Southland County

A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Counties Act, 1920, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend the Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 19 of the twenty-eighth day of the same month at page 375, altering the boundaries of the Clutha and Southland Counties and including areas in the Macleannan Riding of the Clutha County and the Toetoes Riding of the Southland County, by revoking the description of the boundaries of the Clutha County set forth in the Third Schedule thereto and substituting in lieu thereof the description in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE
CLUTHA COUNTY

BOUNDED towards the north by a right line running due east from a point in the middle of Back Creek in Block V, Rankleburn Survey District, due west from Trig. Station D, said survey district, to the middle of the Clutha River; thence towards the east and north-east by a line along the middle of the said Clutha River and the Koa Branch thereof to the ocean; thence towards the south-east generally by the ocean to the middle of the Longbeach Creek, north-westerly by the centre of that creek to Chaslands Highway; thence westerly by that highway to the eastern boundary of Block XV, Waikawa Survey District; thence northerly by that boundary and the eastern boundary of Block XIV, Waikawa Survey District; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said Block XIV; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of Section 5, Block XIV, Mokoreta Survey District, and its production to the northern side of the road forming the northern boundary of the said Section No. 5, by the said side of that road and the northern side of the road forming the north-eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 3 and 2, Block XIV aforesaid, to a point due south of Trig. Station EE, by a right line to the said Trig. Station EE, by the watershed over Bleak Hill to Catlin's Cone, Rimu Survey District; thence north-easterly by a straight line from Trig. D to Peg XLII, D.P. 3412, Southland Registry, on the south-western boundary-line of Run No. 258; thence again towards the south-west by the last-mentioned boundary to the Wyndham or Mokoreta River, by that river to a point in line with the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 5, Block VII, Slopedown Survey District, by a right line to and by the last-mentioned boundary-line and its production to the south-east boundary of Run No. 251 in the said Block VII; thence again towards the west generally by the last-mentioned run, by Section No. 2, Block VI, Slopedown Survey District; and the production of its eastern boundary-line to the centre of the road forming its northern boundary, by a line along the centre of the last-mentioned road and the road forming the eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 12, 13, 7, 6, 4, and 1 of Block II, Slopedown Survey District, across the main South Road, by the centre of the road forming the

eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 23 and 24, Block XII, Waipahi Survey District, to a line bearing N.E. 66° 47', by that line for a distance of 50.2 links to the angle on the eastern side of the last-mentioned road where it strikes the western boundary-line of Section No. 28, Block V, Waipahi Survey District, by that boundary-line and its production to the centre of the Waipahi River, by the centre of the Waipahi River to a point due east from the north side of a road intersecting Section No. 4, Block XI, Waipahi Survey District, by a right line to and by the northern side of that road to the eastern boundary-line of the Waikaka Survey District, by that district to the eastern boundary-line of the Chatton Survey District, by that boundary-line and its production to the middle of the Leithen River; thence again towards the north-east by a line along the middle of that river and the middle of the Pomahaka River to its confluence with the Waipahi River; and thence towards the north-west by the continuation of the line along the middle of the Pomahaka River and Back Creek to the place of commencement: excepting that portion of the Borough of Balclutha which comes within the above-described area.

Authorizing the Purchase by the Grey Electric-power Board of the Electric Works of the Reefton Electric Light and Power Company, Limited

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section seventy-six of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of

the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the purchase by the Grey Electric-power Board (hereinafter referred to as the Board) of the electric works, the property of the Reefton Electric Light and Power Company, Limited (hereinafter referred to as the company), as described in a certain agreement (hereinafter referred to as the agreement) bearing date the twenty-third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and made between the Board of the one part and the company of the other part, of which agreement a copy has been deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department.

SCHEDULE

THE conditions hereinbefore referred to are:—

(1) That the Board shall bind itself that, if and when as required by the Governor-General in Council, it shall consent to the revocation or amendment of each existing license and authority held by the company authorizing the use of water for the purpose of generating electricity, whether granted pursuant to the Public Works Act, 1928, the Mining Act, 1926, or any other authority (hereinafter referred to as the existing licenses), in so far as the same may be incompatible with any license issued under sections 318 and 319 of the Public Works Act, 1928, authorizing the Board to use water for the purpose of generating electricity and to erect certain electric lines.

(2) That the terms of such purchase shall be those set forth in the agreement so far as the same relate to the purchase of electrical works.

Authorizing the Grey Electric-power Board to use Water from the Inangahua River for the Purpose of generating Electricity, and to construct, maintain, and use Electric Works in the County of Inangahua, and revoking certain Existing Orders in Council

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 7th day of August, 1946

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, and the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, hereby grant to the Grey Electric-power Board (hereinafter referred to as the licensee) a license to obstruct, impound, and divert the waters of the Inangahua River (hereinafter referred to as the said river), in the Inangahua County, Nelson Land District, and to take and use therefrom for the purpose hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding fifty cubic feet per second at any one time; and, further doth, subject to the said terms and conditions in the First Schedule hereto, authorize the licensee to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Second Schedule hereto; and, further, for the purposes of section seventy-six of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, doth hereby authorize the licensee to construct, maintain, and use the said electric works; and, further, with the consent of the licensee, doth hereby revoke the Orders in Council described in the Third Schedule hereto as from the day on which this Order in Council becomes effective.

FIRST SCHEDULE

I. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and by Regulation 6 of the Water-power Regulations 1934 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor. The existing lines now in service, if taken over by the licensee, shall be reconstructed within twelve months of the licensee taking over such lines so as to comply with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the said river at the headworks situated in Block XIV, Reefton Survey District.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions herein contained, to maintain and use the following works for the purposes of this license:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of a dam and necessary intake;
- (b) Water-race leading from the intake to the power-house hereinafter referred to;
- (c) Tail-race from the power-house to the said river;
- (d) Power-house with all necessary equipment for generating electricity;
- (e) The electric lines described in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage shall be 230 volts between terminals.

6. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY

The licensee shall not in respect of electrical energy generated under the authority of this license make any charge exceeding the corresponding charge which the licensee may from time to time be duly authorized to make in respect of electrical energy obtained by the licensee from other sources and distributed within the Grey Electric-power District.

7. DURATION OF LICENSE

This license shall, unless sooner determined, continue in force until the 26th day of April, 1964.

8. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of this license in accordance with the Water-power Regulations 1934, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand recorder to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the State Hydro-electric Department, and rental shall be assessed on the half-hourly maximum kilowatt demand for the year at the rate of £1 per annum per kilowatt of maximum demand so recorded, or such lesser rate as may be fixed after compliance by the licensee with the said regulations. Failing such installation, rental shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 98 kilowatts.

9. TELEGRAPH LINES

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph lines which are the property of the Post and Telegraph Department and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

10. PROVISIONS FOR CHANGEOVER

The following provisions shall apply in respect of the allocation of the cost of adjusting, altering, or replacing installations on any changeover which may take place in the system of supply:—

(1) The consumer's installation shall be classified as follows:—

Class A: Installations in which the wiring is found to be in accordance with the regulations governing the same, and which require only such alteration as are necessitated by the change of system.

Class B: All other installations.

(2) The cost of alterations shall be allocated as follows:—

Class A: The whole of the cost shall be paid by the licensee.

Class B: The cost of alterations due to change in system shall be paid by the licensee, and all other costs shall be paid by the consumer.

(3) In cases where it is inconvenient for the consumer to pay in full at the time of the alterations the cost for which he is liable, the licensee shall make suitable arrangements to finance the work.

(4) All alterations required shall, unless the licensee otherwise agrees, be carried out by the licensee or its contractors or agents.

(5) In the event of any dispute arising out of matters affected by this clause, a Board of Appeal (whose decision shall be final) shall be set up to decide such dispute, which Board of Appeal shall consist of the following:—

(a) A Stipendiary Magistrate, or some person acceptable to both parties, who shall be Chairman;

(b) One representative appointed by the licensee; and

(c) One representative appointed by the consumer on whose premises the alterations are necessary.

The costs of setting up the Board of Appeal shall be payable by the parties in such proportions as the Board may decide.

SECOND SCHEDULE

PART A

ELECTRIC lines in portion of the County of Inangahua shown by means of red lines on plans marked P.W.D. 37985 and 117989, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington.

PART B

Such distribution and service lines branching from the said electric lines as may from time to time be necessary for the distribution of electrical energy within the County of Inangahua and reasonably incidental to the electrical works authorized by this license.

PART C

All other electrical works reasonably incidental to the construction and use of the above-mentioned lines or any of them.

2. The Chairman shall have an original as well as a casting vote, and shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister charged with the administration of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and of the regulations made thereunder.

Honours and Awards approved by His Majesty the King

Air Department,

HIS Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards to members of the Royal New Zealand Air Force in recognition of gallant services rendered during the war:—

Victoria Cross

Squadron Leader Leonard Henry Trent, D.F.C.

Citation:—

"On 3rd March, 1943, Squadron Leader Trent was detailed to lead a formation of Ventura aircraft in a daylight attack on the power-station at Amsterdam. This operation was intended to encourage the Dutch workmen in their resistance to enemy pressure, and the target was known to be heavily defended. The importance of bombing it regardless of enemy fighters or anti-aircraft fire was strongly impressed on the aircrews taking part in the operation. Before taking off Squadron Leader Trent told the deputy leader that he was going over the target whatever happened.

"All went well until the eleven Venturas and their fighter escort were nearing the Dutch coast. Then one bomber was hit and had to turn back. Suddenly large numbers of enemy fighters appeared. Our escorting fighters were hotly engaged and lost touch with the bombing force. The Venturas closed up for mutual protection and commenced their run up to the target. Unfortunately, the fighters detailed to support them over the target had reached the area too early and had been recalled. Soon the bombers were attacked. They were at the mercy of fifteen to twenty Messerschmidts, which dived on them incessantly. Within four minutes six Venturas were destroyed. Squadron Leader Trent continued on his course with the three remaining aircraft, and in a short time two more Venturas went down in flames. Heedless of the murderous attacks and of the heavy anti-aircraft fire which was now encountered, Squadron Leader Trent completed an accurate bombing run, and even shot down a Messerschmidt at point blank range. Dropping his bombs in the target area he turned away. The aircraft following him was shot down on reaching the target.

"Immediately afterwards his own aircraft was hit and went into a spin and broke up. Squadron Leader Trent and his navigator were thrown clear and became prisoners of war. The other two members of the crew perished. On this, his twenty-fourth sortie, Squadron Leader Trent showed outstanding leadership. Such was the trust placed in this gallant officer that the other pilots followed him unwaveringly. His cool unflinching courage and devotion to duty in the face of overwhelming odds rank with the fine examples of these virtues."

“Since the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross, this officer has taken part in numerous operational sorties. Under his brilliant leadership the squadrons of his Wing materially contributed to the success of the Sicilian campaign. Later, in 1945, Wing Commander Barry completed many bombing and low level attacks in Spitfire aircraft, displaying throughout brilliance and courage as a pilot and leader. In February, 1945, he led his squadron in a highly successful attack on a heavily defended bridge at Grisolera, and a month later he located and attacked a concentration of railway transport to such good effect that four locomotives were destroyed and over seventy goods trucks damaged. In addition, he has been tireless in organizing and leading missions in close support of the Eighth Army. An outstanding Wing Leader, this officer gained the absolute confidence of all the pilots under his command.”

The Sale of Tallow Control Order 1946

- (v) The construction of terraces.
- (vi) The construction of fences (not including fence posts).
- (vii) The construction of garden walls.
- (viii) The construction of retaining-walls.
- (ix) The construction of swimming baths.
- (x) The construction of swimming pools.
- (xi) The construction of fishponds and other ponds.
- (xii) The manufacture of precast concrete ornaments.
- (xiii) The manufacture of garden furniture.

4. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller no person shall sell, supply, dispose of, or part with the possession of, or deliver cement or ready mixed concrete unless he is satisfied that it is not intended to be used for any of the aforesaid purposes.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by adding, after clause 6, the following heading and clause:—

"SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

"7. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any purveyor of meals, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any meals to which this Order applies where extraordinary charges are incurred for any reason, or special amenities are provided, or special services are rendered by the purveyor. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to specified meals or may relate generally to all meals to which this Order applies supplied by the purveyor while the approval remains in force."

Price Order No. 590 (Milk) (Whakatane)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 590, and shall come into force on the 8th day of August, 1946.

2. In this Order—

"Whakatane Milk District" means the district within a radius of three miles from the post-office at Whakatane:

"Commercial user" means a person who buys milk or cream for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances):

"Consumer" means a person who buys milk or cream for purposes other than resale:

"Shop dairy" means a shop where milk or cream is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise and where the milk or cream so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to milk or cream sold to a Hospital Board for use in any institution under the control of that Board or to milk or cream sold for use in any separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all milk and cream wherever produced that is sold—

- To the occupier of any shop dairy within the Whakatane Milk District; or
- By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer within the Whakatane Milk District.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK AND CREAM TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk or cream to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows:—

- In respect of milk or cream sold by the occupier of a shop dairy: As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy:
- In respect of milk or cream sold otherwise than at a shop dairy: As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.

(3) Where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day, the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed as follows:—

- For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of half-pint or less, the price shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order:
- For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of more than half-pint but less than two pints (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more), the price shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order:
- For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of two pints or more (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more), the price shall be computed at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Schedule hereto for two pints:

(d) Where the quantity of milk supplied to any one purchaser in any one day (exclusive of quantities supplied in measurements of half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon, the maximum price that may be charged shall be computed by reference to the total quantity of milk so supplied to the purchaser during that day.

(4) Where any milk or cream to which this Order applies is sold otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Schedule hereto, or otherwise than in a multiple of any specified quantity, the price shall be computed as follows:—

- (a) Where the quantity supplied is less than the smallest specified quantity, the price shall be a proportionate part of the price of the smallest specified quantity:
- (b) Where the quantity supplied exceeds a specified quantity but is less than twice the specified quantity, the price of any surplus over that specified quantity shall be a proportionate part of the price of that specified quantity:
- (c) Where the quantity supplied exceeds twice the amount of the nearest lower specified quantity but is not an exact multiple of that specified quantity, the price of any surplus over the nearest multiple of the specified quantity shall be a proportionate part of that specified quantity.

(5) If in respect of any milk or cream the price charged in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.
