Altering the Boundaries of the North Canterbury Electric-power District

### [L.S.] B. C. FREYBERG, Governor-General A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the North Canterbury Electric-power District so as to include the area described in the Schedule hereto.

ALL that area in the Land District of Canterbury, being portion of the County of Ashley, situated in the Mount Thomas and Mairaki Survey Districts, and bounded by a line commencing at a point on the existing boundary of the North Canterbury Electric-power District on the eastern bank of the Okuku River, being the intersection of that bank with the western boundary of Block XI, Mount Thomas Survey District; thence southerly along the western boundary of the said Block XI to its intersection with the northern boundary of Block XIV, Mount Thomas Survey District; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the said Block XIV to its intersection with the right bank of the Garry River; thence southerly along the right bank of the Garry River to the north-western boundary along the right bank of the Garry River to the north-western boundary of Rural Section 6399; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundary of the said Rural Section 6399 to its intersection western boundary of the said Rural Section 6399 to its intersection with a public road; thence southerly along that road to the northern boundary of Rural Section 11568; thence westerly, southerly, and easterly along the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the said Rural Section 11568 to the right bank of the Garry River; thence following the right bank of the Garry River to the southern boundary of Reserve 894; thence following the existing boundary of the North Canterbury Electric-power District, as defined in the First Schedule to the Local Legislation Act, 1933, to the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 123999, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Wellington Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as the said club), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the property, situated in the district of Manawatu and known as the Awapuni Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings said club for race meetings.

(c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association:

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support:

means of support:

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908:

Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation. for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Wellington Racing Club were made and passed by such club on the 1st day of August, 1946, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
