PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Ohura Cosmopolitan Club (Inc.), of Ohura (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto on the following conditions.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this license, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENSE TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be two-wire direct current. Electrical energy shall be transmitted at a pressure of 120 volts direct current between terminals.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE

Unless lawfully determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1967, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

5. CHARGES ON SALE

(1) The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes and 6d. per unit for all other purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include electrical energy used for such purposes directly or indirectly from the source of supply except where used to charge a secondary battery for standby emergency lighting only.

(2) Payment shall not be demanded from any consumer at intervals apart of less than twenty-one days.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty (hereinafter called the said Order in Council), and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Birkenhead Borough Council (hereinafter called the said local authority) of the sum of four thousand pounds (£4,000) by a loan to be known as Sewerage Connections Loan, 1938 (hereinafter called the said loan):

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not been fully exercised:

And whereas the authority has lapsed in accordance with the provisions of clause seven thereof, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to raise the said loan, except in accordance with the provisions of a further Order in Council that may be issued pursuant to section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called the said Act):

And whereas it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to raise portion of the said loan amounting to two thousand four hundred pounds (£2,400) (hereinafter called the said sum) on the conditions hereinafter set out:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum up to the amount of two thousand four hundred pounds (£2,400), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed seven (7) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said local authority shall, before raising the said sum or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking fund at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates per centum which shall be not less than twelve pounds nineteen shillings (£12 19s.), such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said sum for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, the first such payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender or lenders is computed on the said sum or any part thereof so raised.

(4) The payment of interest and the repayment of principal in respect of the said sum shall be made in New Zealand.

(5) No amount payable as either interest or sinking fund in respect of the said sum shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(6) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurement fees in respect of the raising of the said sum or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(7) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the eleventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, consent was given to the raising in New Zealand by the Birkenhead Borough Council (hereinafter called the said local authority) of the sum of two thousand four hundred pounds (£2,400) (hereinafter called the said sum), being portion of a loan known as Sewerage Connections Loan, 1938 (hereinafter called the said loan), such consent being given subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, including, *inter alia*, the provision that the rate of interest that might be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof should be such as should not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per centum per annum:

And whereas the said local authority, pending the raising of the said sum in accordance with the said determinations, is desirous of borrowing the said sum of two thousand four hundred pounds (£2,400) or part thereof by hypothecation or mortgage pursuant to section thirty-four of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, of the debentures authorized to be issued in respect of the said sum:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section seven of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, and by section eight of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1933, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the said local authority, pending the raising of the said sum in accordance with the said determinations, borrowing the said amount of two thousand four hundred pounds (£2,400), or any part thereof, by the hypothecation or mortgage of the said debentures at a rate of interest not exceeding four pounds (£4) per centum per annum, and hereby prescribes that the said local authority shall, before the said amount or any portion thereof is borrowed by way of hypothecation pursuant to the authority of this Order in Council, establish a sinking fund, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking fund in accordance with clause three of the aforesaid Order in Council of the eleventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, and in all respects as if such borrowing of the said amount or part thereof by way of hypothecation were the raising of a loan within the meaning of that clause.

Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces 1927.—Amendment No. 55

B. C. FREYBERG, Governor-General

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto, the Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the 25th day of May, 1927.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, Amendment No. 55.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces 1927 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof, except as otherwise provided.

4. Appendix VIII of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended by Amendment No. 35) is further amended as follows:—

THE EFFICIENCY DECORATION

(1) Paragraph 17: After subparagraph 5 (a) (vi) add:—

“(vii) In the Royal Navy, the Regular Army, the Royal Air Force, the Royal New Zealand Navy, the New Zealand Permanent Forces, the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force, the New Zealand Temporary Staff, the Royal New Zealand Air Force, or a Permanent Force of a British Dominion or Colony during the period 2nd September, 1939, and the date of the disbandment of the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force: Provided the officer was commissioned between these dates and subsequently obtained a commission in an Auxiliary Force.”

“(viii) In Class I or Class II of the New Zealand National Military Reserve subsequent to 20th July, 1939, and service in the New Zealand Home Guard subsequent to the 10th September, 1941 (on which date the Home Guard was constituted a part of the New Zealand Defence Forces).”

(2) Paragraph 17: After subparagraph 6 add:—

“(6A) An officer of the New Zealand Territorial Force or the National Military Reserve who was serving on a voluntary agreement in any authorized Auxiliary Force of the Empire or its Reserves on the 2nd September, 1939, shall be entitled, provided he actually served, or was attested and thereby accepted the obligation for service beyond the boundaries of the Dominion, Colony, &c., in the forces of which he was serving on the 2nd September, 1939, to count as two-fold all embodied service as an officer on the active list between the 2nd September, 1939, and the date of disbandment of the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force, and all such embodied service in the ranks on the active list between those dates as full single qualifying service towards the twenty years required, whether such service was in the Naval Forces, Military Forces, or Air Forces of any part of the Empire: Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to embodied service in the New Zealand or any other forces rendered in the performance of training that would have been acquired if a state of war had not existed between the dates herein mentioned.”

(3) Paragraph 17, subparagraph 7 (a), fifth line: After “(5) (a) (vi)” insert “(5) (a) (vii).”

THE EFFICIENCY MEDAL

(4) Paragraph 18, subparagraph (5) (i), third line: *Delete* “and Cadets,” and *substitute* “Class I or Class II National Military Reserve subsequent to 20th July, 1939, Home Guard subsequent to 10th September, 1941, and Cadets.”

(5) Paragraph 18: After subparagraph (5) (ii) add:—

“(ii) (a) Commissioned service in the case of those men who were commissioned after service in the ranks of an authorized Auxiliary Force of the Empire during the period 2nd September, 1939, and the date of disbandment of the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force, and who, having relinquished their commissions, re-enlist in the ranks of an authorized auxiliary force prior to 1st January, 1949.”

(6) Paragraph 18: After subparagraph (5) (iv) add:—

“(v) Service in the Royal Navy, the Regular Army, the Royal Air Force, the Royal New Zealand Navy, the New Zealand Permanent Forces, the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force, the New Zealand Temporary Staff or the Royal New Zealand Air Force, only during the period 2nd September, 1939, and the date of disbandment of the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force.”

(7) Paragraph 18: After subparagraph (6) (i) add:—

"(i) (a) A Warrant Officer, N.C.O., or man of the New Zealand Territorial Force, or Class I or Class II of the National Military Reserve, who was serving on a voluntary agreement in any authorized Auxiliary Force of the Empire on the 2nd September, 1939, shall be entitled, provided he actually served, or was attested and thereby accepted the obligation for service beyond the boundaries of the Dominion, Colony, &c., in the forces of which he was serving to count as twofold all embodied service on the active list between the 2nd September, 1939, and the date of disbandment of the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force, whether such service was in the Naval Forces, the Military Forces, or the Air Forces of any part of the Empire: Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to embodied service in the New Zealand or any other forces rendered in the performance of training that would have been required if a state of war had not existed between the dates herein mentioned."

(8) Paragraph 18, subparagraph (7) (i) is revoked and the following substituted:—

"(7) (i) During the period 4th August, 1914, to 31st December, 1921, or 2nd September, 1939, and the date of disbandment of the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force."

(9) Paragraph 18, subparagraph (8): After "(5) (iv)" in second line, insert "and (5) (v)."

(10) Paragraph 18, subparagraph (8): Add at end of subparagraph (ii) "or 2nd September, 1939, and the date of disbandment of the 2nd New Zealand Expeditionary Force."

By-laws for Conduct of Election of Members of the Board of Governors of the Canterbury Agricultural College

WHEREAS regulations for the election of members of the Board of Governors of the Canterbury College and Canterbury Agricultural College were duly made on the 29th day of April, 1897, and the 14th day of May, 1898, under the provisions of the Canterbury College and Canterbury Agricultural College Act, 1896, and published in the *Gazette*, 1897, Volume I, page 957, and 1898, Volume I, page 865:

And whereas Canterbury Agricultural College is now governed by and incorporated under the Canterbury Agricultural College Act, 1930:

And whereas, consequent upon the alteration of representation made in respect of the appointment of members to the Board of Governors of the Canterbury Agricultural College, it is desired to repeal the above regulations so far as the same affect the Canterbury Agricultural College and to enact by-laws in their place:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in Canterbury Agricultural College by virtue of the Canterbury Agricultural College Act, 1930, and with the approval of the Council of the School of Agriculture under the provisions of the School of Agriculture Act, 1937, and with the consent and approval of His Excellency the Governor-General and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Canterbury Agricultural College doth hereby make the following by-laws relating to the conduct of elections of members of the Board of Governors of the Canterbury Agricultural College:—

1. The Returning Officer shall be the Registrar of the College or such other person as the Board of Governors may appoint.

2. For the purpose of the election of members of the Board of Governors of the Canterbury Agricultural College the Returning Officer (appointed by that Board) shall prepare five electoral rolls, namely:—

(1) A parliamentary electoral roll, in which he shall enter the names and addresses of such of the members of the Legislative Council and the House of Representatives as for the time being are entitled to elect members of the Board of Governors of the Canterbury Agricultural College:

(2) Three agricultural and pastoral societies' electoral rolls, to be known respectively as—

(a) The North Canterbury Agricultural and Pastoral Society's Roll;

(b) The Mid-Canterbury Agricultural and Pastoral Society's Roll; and

(c) The South Canterbury Agricultural and Pastoral Society's Roll;

in which respective rolls he shall enter respectively the names and addresses of such agricultural and pastoral societies duly incorporated under the Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Act, 1908, as have their principal offices within the Provincial District of Canterbury for the respective portions of the said province defined and referred to in the said Act as the North Canterbury, Mid-Canterbury, and South Canterbury portions of the said province:

(3) A graduates' and diploma-holders' roll in which he shall enter the names of graduates of the University of New Zealand whose names are on the books of the college, and the names of the holders of diplomas granted by the college.

3. The expression "person" includes an agricultural and pastoral society within the portions of the Provincial District of Canterbury as defined by the above-named Act.

4. The Returning Officer shall prepare and from time to time amend the electoral rolls either on his own motion, or pursuant to any claim or objection, by entering therein or removing therefrom the name of any elector of whose qualification or want of qualification, as the case may be, he is satisfied, and by otherwise correcting any error in any such roll.

5. The electoral rolls, or copies thereof, shall be kept open to public inspection at all reasonable times at such convenient place in the college as the Board of Governors appoints in that behalf.

6. Any person possessing the necessary qualification for enrolment on any roll may make and forward or deliver to the Returning Officer a claim for enrolment in the form or to the effect following:—

CLAIM FOR ENROLMENT AS ELECTOR OF CANTERBURY AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE

(1) Claimant: [Set out the full name and address of the claimant, thus: A.B., of Christchurch, or as the case may be.]

(2) Qualification: [Set out the qualification, thus: Bachelor of Agricultural Science of the New Zealand University, duly entered on the books of the Canterbury Agricultural College, or the holder of a diploma granted by the Canterbury Agricultural College, as the case may be, or Agricultural and Pastoral Society having its principal office within the portions of the Provincial District of Canterbury known as North Canterbury, Mid-Canterbury, or South Canterbury, as the case may be.]

(3) Roll in respect whereof this claim is made: [Set out name of roll, thus: Graduates' Electoral Roll, or as the case may be.]

The claimant hereby claims to be entered on the above-mentioned roll as an elector of the Canterbury Agricultural College.

Dated at, this day of, 194..

[Signature of the claimant, thus: A.B., or the Agricultural and Pastoral Society of by its Chairman, C.D., or as the case may be.]

To the Returning Officer of Canterbury Agricultural College.

7. Claims for enrolment may be signed in the name and on behalf of an Agricultural and Pastoral Society by the Chairman or any two members of the governing body thereof.

8. Any person who is entered on any electoral roll of the Canterbury Agricultural College and possesses the necessary qualifications in respect of any other electoral roll of the same college may make and forward or deliver to the Returning Officer a claim for transfer from the first to the secondly-mentioned roll, and on receipt of such claim before either of the said rolls is closed, and for the purposes of an impending election, the Returning Officer, if satisfied that the claimant possesses the necessary qualification, shall transfer his name accordingly.

9. Claims for transfer shall be in the form or to the effect following:—

THE CANTERBURY AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE: CLAIM FOR TRANSFER

(1) Claimant: [Set out full name and address of claimant.]

(2) Roll on which he is at present entered: [Set out name of roll, thus: Graduates' Electoral Roll, or as the case may be.]

(3) Roll to which he claims to be transferred: [Set out name of roll, thus: Parliamentary Electoral Roll, or as the case may be.]

(4) Qualifications by virtue whereof he claims to be transferred: [Set out qualifications, thus: Graduate of the University of New Zealand, whose name is on the books of the college, or holder of a diploma, or as the case may be.]

The claimant hereby claims to be transferred from the first-mentioned to the secondly-mentioned roll, as above.

10. Any person may, by notice under his hand delivered to the Returning Officer or posted to him at the college buildings, object to any electoral roll on the grounds—

(1) That any person whose name is on the roll does not possess the necessary qualification; or

(2) That any person whose name is not on the roll possesses the necessary qualification and is entitled to have his name entered thereon.

11. Forthwith, after receipt of such objection, the Returning Officer shall inquire into and dispose of the same.

12. Any person aggrieved by any decision or act of the Returning Officer relating to any roll may appeal therefrom to the Board of Governors by notice under his hand addressed to the Board and delivered at the college not later than 5 o'clock on the afternoon of the day next before the day on which such roll is to be closed for the purposes of an impending election.

13. Every such appeal shall, before the roll is closed, be heard and determined by the Board of Governors at a meeting held for the purpose; and the Returning Officer shall amend the roll in such manner as the Board, when disposing of the appeal, directs.

14. Every ordinary election shall be held on the first Monday in December, and every casual election shall in every case be held on such day as the Board of Governors appoints, being not more than the thirty-fifth day after such vacancy occurs. A casual vacancy shall be deemed to occur on the day on which the Board of Governors is apprised of the fact.

15. The Returning Officer shall by advertisement publicly notify in respect of each election—

- (1) The day on which the election will be held and the hour at which the poll will be closed ;
- (2) The respective classes of electors entitled to vote and the number of candidates for whom each such class is entitled to vote ;
- (3) The day and hour for the closing of nominations and also of every roll relating to the election ;
- (4) The total number of candidates to be elected.

16. (1) Such advertisement shall be published in not less than three issues of some newspaper published or circulating in the Provincial District of Canterbury, or in the four main centres of New Zealand as may seem appropriate according to the classes of electors concerned. The first advertisement shall appear not later than the twenty-eighth day before the day of the election.

(2) An interval of not less than three days shall elapse between each such issue and the next, and the last issue shall appear not later than the fourteenth day next preceding the day on which the election is to be held.

17. Every candidate shall be nominated in writing by one or more electors entitled to vote for his election.

18. Each such elector may nominate any number of candidates not exceeding the number to be elected by the electors belonging to the same class as the nominating elector.

19. Every nomination-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following :—

A.B., or [as the case may be], the [set out the full name of the agricultural and pastoral society or other person], being an elector duly entered on the Parliamentary, or, as the case may be, Graduates' and Diploma-holders', or Agricultural and Pastoral Societies' Electoral Roll of the Canterbury Agricultural College, hereby nominates [set out the full name and address of each candidate the elector wishes to nominate] as (a) candidate(s) for election to the Board of Governors by the electors on the aforesaid roll, at the election to be held on the day of, 194...

Candidate's consent to be subscribed at the foot of nomination-paper.

20. If the nomination-paper does not bear the written consent of the candidate nominated, such consent may be given by him to the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed, and every nomination-paper shall be void in so far as concerns any candidate whose consent is not duly given as aforesaid.

21. Nomination-papers may be signed in the name and on behalf of an agricultural and pastoral society by the Chairman or any two members of the governing body thereof and under the common seal (if any) of such body.

22. Nominations shall close at noon on the fourteenth day before the day of the election.

23. Forthwith after the nominations are closed the Returning Officer shall prepare and post to each elector at his address as appearing on the roll of electors entitled to vote a printed voting-paper containing in alphabetical order of surnames and stating occupations a printed list of all the duly nominated candidates for whom such elector is entitled to vote ; and such voting-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following :—

VOTING-PAPER FOR USE AT ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE DAY OF 194... OF MEMBER(S) OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE CANTERBURY AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE BY [set out the class of electors].

Candidates

[Set out in alphabetical order of surnames the full name of every duly nominated candidate, and state occupation.]

Directions

The number of candidates to be elected is [specify the number].

The voter must draw a line through the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote, and the number of candidates whose names are left uncanceled must not exceed the total number of candidates for whom the voter is entitled to vote.

This voting-paper must be signed by the voter and enclosed in a sealed envelope, and if posted to the Returning Officer must be posted on or before the day of the election, or if delivered to him must be delivered before the day of the election or not later than five o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

If the voter is an agricultural and pastoral society the voting-paper may be signed in the name and on behalf of such society by the Chairman of the meeting at which the vote is given.

24. The vote of an agricultural and pastoral society shall be given by resolution of the governing body thereof at a meeting held for the purpose at such time on or before the date of the election as will permit of sufficient time for the voting-paper reaching the Returning Officer within the time prescribed by the next ensuing clause hereof ; and the Chairman of such meeting shall, in the name and on behalf of the society, mark and sign the voting-paper in accordance with such vote and forward the same to the Returning Officer in a sealed envelope.

25. The voting-paper, if delivered to the Returning Officer, must be delivered in a sealed envelope before the day of the election, or not later than five o'clock on the afternoon of that day ; and, if posted to him, must be posted in a sealed envelope on or before that day.

26. The poll shall close at five o'clock in the afternoon of the day of the election ; but all voting-papers shall be included and counted which are received by the Returning Officer in due course of post before the close of the sixth day after the day of election.

27. A voting-paper shall be informal in any of the following cases, that is to say :—

- (1) If it is not duly signed by the elector ; or
- (2) If the candidates whose names are left uncanceled exceed in number the total number of candidates for whom the elector is entitled to vote ; or
- (3) If, being delivered to the Returning Officer, the sealed envelope containing the voting-paper is not delivered at his office before the close of the poll ; or
- (4) If, having been forwarded by post, the sealed envelope containing the voting-paper is not received at the office of the Returning Officer before the seventh day after the day of election, or if, from the postmark on the envelope or otherwise, the Returning Officer is satisfied that it was not posted until after the day of the election.

28. On the seventh day after the day of the election the Returning Officer shall open and examine all the voting-papers duly delivered to him or received by him through the post as aforesaid, and, after rejecting all informal voting-papers, shall ascertain the candidates (not exceeding the total number to be elected by each class of electors) who have received the greatest number of the votes of such electors, and shall declare such candidates to be elected.

29. If by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more candidates the election is not complete, the Returning Officer shall give a casting-vote determined by lot in the presence of the Chairman or two members of the Board of Governors and thereby complete the election.

30. Forthwith after the completion of the election the Returning Officer shall notify in the Gazette the names of the persons elected, and the respective classes of electors by whom they are elected.

31. If any candidate is nominated for election to the same Board by more classes of electors than one, he shall, before the day of the election, notify to the Returning Officer the seat he desires to hold in the event of his receiving votes qualifying him for election to more seats than one on that Board ; or, if he fails to duly give such notification, the Returning Officer shall himself, before the close of the poll, determine the seat which such candidate shall hold in such event as aforesaid, and post to him a written notification thereof ; and, on the happening of such event, the Returning Officer shall declare him elected to that seat accordingly, whereupon every other seat for which he is so qualified shall be deemed to be vacant, as in the case of a casual vacancy.

32. The respective regulations dated the 29th day of April, 1897, published in the supplement to the New Zealand Gazette of the 29th day of April, 1897, page 957, and the 12th day of May, 1898, published in the supplement to the New Zealand Gazette of the 19th day of May, 1898, page 865, are hereby revoked.

33. All rolls, applications, appointments, and generally all documents, matters, and things, and all periods of time which originated under any regulation, under the Canterbury Agricultural College Act, 1930, or under the Canterbury College and Canterbury Agricultural College Act, 1896, and its amendments, and are or were of continuing effect at the time of the coming into force of these by-laws, shall enure for the purposes under the Canterbury Agricultural College Act, 1930, as if they had originated under regulations made under such Act, and shall, where necessary, be deemed to have so originated.

The above by-laws were duly made and adopted by the Board of Governors of the Canterbury Agricultural College this 31st day of October, 1945.

Price Order No. 606 (Milk) (Levin)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 606, and shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1946.

2. In this Order—

“Levin Milk District” means the district within a radius of three miles from the post-office at Levin:

“Commercial user” means a person who buys milk or cream for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances):

“Consumer” means a person who buys milk or cream for purposes other than resale:

“Shop dairy” means a shop where milk or cream is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise and where the milk or cream so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to milk or cream sold to a Hospital Board for use in any institution under the control of that Board or to milk or cream sold for use in any separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all milk and cream wherever produced that is sold—

(a) To the occupier of any shop dairy within the Levin Milk District; or

(b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer within the Levin Milk District.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK AND CREAM TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk or cream to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows:—

(a) In respect of milk or cream sold by the occupier of a shop dairy: As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy:

(b) In respect of milk or cream sold otherwise than at a shop dairy: As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.

(3) Where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day, the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed as follows:—

(a) For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of half-pint or less, the price shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order:

(b) For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of more than half-pint but less than two pints (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more), the price shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order:

(c) For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of two pints or more (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more), the price shall be computed at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Schedule hereto for two pints:

(d) Where the quantity of milk supplied to any one purchaser in any one day (exclusive of quantities supplied in measurements of half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon, the maximum price that may be charged shall be computed by reference to the total quantity of milk so supplied to the purchaser during that day.

(4) Where any milk or cream to which this Order applies is sold otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Schedule hereto, or otherwise than in a multiple of any specified quantity, the price shall be computed as follows:—

(a) Where the quantity supplied is less than the smallest specified quantity, the price shall be a proportionate part of the price of the smallest specified quantity:

(b) Where the quantity supplied exceeds a specified quantity but is less than twice the specified quantity, the price of any surplus over that specified quantity shall be a proportionate part of the price of that specified quantity:

(c) Where the quantity supplied exceeds twice the amount of the nearest lower specified quantity but is not an exact multiple of that specified quantity, the price of any surplus over the nearest multiple of the specified quantity shall be a proportionate part of that specified quantity.

(5) If in respect of any milk or cream the price charged in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR AUGUST, 1946

General.—August was a windy month, with frequent rain in most districts. The westerly type of weather which set in early during July continued with only two brief interruptions. The average atmospheric pressure for the month was unusually low. Hence, except in very protected eastern localities, conditions have been very changeable, with many intense showers. As temperatures were coolest near the end of the month spring growth did not make the advance expected. Persistent rain has kept the ground sodden in Auckland, Taranaki, Manawatu, and Westland, and this has been detrimental to stock. In Auckland and Hawke's Bay, where the summer drought was worst, many cows have died at calving. The wet weather has been hard on young lambs, and the Wairarapa, which had a cool wet conclusion to the month, was one of the areas most affected.

Rainfall.—The totals for the month were above normal, the exceptions being on the east coast. Gisborne had barely half its usual amount, and deficiencies occurred from East Cape to Waipukurau and in most localities from Blenheim to Dunedin. Totals exceeded double the average from the Waikato through the King-country down to the Manawatu, and for many parts it was the wettest August for a number of years. Districts about and west of the Southern Alps had totals from 10 to 30 in. There was some flooding at times in all the wet areas mentioned. A feature of the weather of July and August was the unprecedented persistence of rain-days, these continuing without any break for over 30 days at many stations. Waipoua State Forest had 64 days commencing from 27th June, and, as further examples, the following stations may be mentioned: Henderson and Hamilton each 36 days, New Plymouth 38 days, Tangarakau (Taranaki) 43 days, and Westport 35 days.

On several occasions thunderstorms were widespread.

Temperatures.—Western and southern districts of the South Island had temperatures very slightly cooler, while elsewhere they were rather milder than normal.

There was heavy snow in the Alps on the 5th and 6th, in the Nelson ranges on the 13th, and falls occurred in the National Park area and the Wellington ranges from the 26th to 29th.

Sunshine.—East of the main ranges, with the exception of the Wairarapa, sunshine was somewhat better than usual, but mainly moderate deficiencies were registered elsewhere.

Te Pahi (Te Hapua) recorded 176.1 hours, Manutuke (Gisborne) 183.0, Napier 179.9, Nelson 175.5, Blenheim 178.8, Timaru 175.7, and Alexandra 185.3 hours.

Weather Sequence.—Two cold fronts associated with a deep depression to the south moved eastward over the Dominion on the 1st and 2nd. A secondary developed on a third cold front and past south-eastward over the North Island on the 3rd. West or north-west winds were strong at times, while heavy rain fell in the Southern Alps and Westland and moderate amounts over the North Island.

Early on the 4th a cold front advanced from the south-west, another following it thirty hours later. There were strong gusty westerlies generally, and both fronts, except in districts protected by the ranges, were associated with very showery conditions and scattered thunderstorms. After another cold front passed on the 6th, showers became more isolated.

By the 8th winds had turned more southerly and moderated as an anticyclone passed to the north of New Zealand. Two cold fronts passed eastward on the 9th and 10th, each being preceded by strong north-westerlies and accompanied by showery conditions in western districts and some thunder occurred. Thereafter winds tended south-westerly, and with a wedge over New Zealand the weather was clearer generally.

A weak cold front affected the South Island early on the 12th, and this was soon followed by a pair of fronts connected with a very deep depression travelling south of New Zealand and giving a record low barometer reading of 948 mb. at Campbell Island at 9 a.m. on the 13th. Squally westerly to north-westerly gales were widespread, the weather being showery except in very sheltered localities. Heavy falls occurred in the Southern Alps.

A shallow depression developed in the western portion of the last front, which became stationary over Auckland and brought moderate rains as it moved south-east across the North Island early on the 15th. Winds had decreased somewhat and a slight wedge gave temporarily fair conditions, but the next front was over the South Island on the 16th. Next day a depression developed on it immediately west of Auckland and moved rapidly toward Chatham Island. To the north of the centre strong gales prevailed for a period, and some rain occurred in northern and central districts.

A weak cold front moved up the South Island on the 18th, but mainly fair south-westerly conditions prevailed.

A depression from the central Tasman Sea moved eastward over the North Island on the 20th, giving rain in central and northern districts. Southerlies set in and prevailed until the 22nd. A wedge meanwhile was extending on to southern New Zealand, where the weather was fine with frosts. A more general improvement spread from the west.

A small depression developed on a new trough and passed over Westland and Canterbury, most of the rain being in the former province.

The cold front of a depression immediately south of New Zealand on the 25th brought showers and thunderstorms, strong westerlies being general. On the 27th and 28th, with winds more southerly, moderate rains occurred east of the ranges. It was fine in Westland and improved elsewhere. From the 27th to the 30th an anticyclone was located to the south, but on the 31st it travelled to the north-west, while a depression approached from the north-west and caused rain in North Auckland.

By-laws regulating Traffic on the Waikanae, Otaki, and Ohau River Bridges on the Levin-Paekakariki State Highway

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section 9 of the Main Highways Act, 1922, and by section 155 of the Public Works Act, 1928, the Main Highways Board doth hereby make the following by-law in respect of the above-mentioned bridges, and doth hereby declare that the said by-law shall come into force on the 18th day of September, 1946.

BY-LAW

1. That the Main Highways Board hereby gives notice that no person shall drive or take, or permit to be driven or taken, any vehicle upon or over the Waikanae, Otaki, and Ohau River Bridges on the Levin-Paekakariki State Highway at a greater speed than 10 miles per hour, or if the maximum axle load is in excess of 5½ tons, or if the gross weight of the vehicle and load is in excess of 10 tons.

2. (a) No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven or allow any cattle in excess of forty at any given time to pass along or over the above-mentioned bridges.

(b) Cattle includes any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf.

3. (a) Every person who does or cause or procures to be done anything contrary to the terms of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence.

(b) Every person guilty of an offence against this by-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds (£5) for each such offence.

The foregoing by-laws were made by a resolution duly passed at a meeting of the Main Highways Board held at Wellington on 18th September, 1946.
