Altering the Boundaries of the Dannevirke and Central Hawke's Bay Electric power District's

PURSUANT to the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Dannevirke and Central Hawke's Bay Electric-power Districts by excluding the area described in the First Schedule hereto from the Dannevirke Electric-power District and including such area in the Central Hawke's Bay Electric-power District and de hereby declare that the boundaries of the Central District, and do hereby declare that the boundaries of the Central Hawke's Bay and Dannevirke Electric-power Districts shall be those described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto respectively.
