PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Allan Alexander Thorn and William Craven Eyles, of Pokororo, Wakefield, Farmers (hereinafter referred to as the licensees), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of an unnamed stream situated in Lot III, D.P. 194, being part Section 49, Block XIII, Motueka Survey District, in the Land District of Nelson, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding half a cubic foot per second at any one time, and to erect the electric lines hereinafter described.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Water-power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the said stream at a point in Lot III, D.P. 194, being part Section 49, Block XIII, Motueka Survey District, in the Nelson Land District, as indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 123089, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensees are hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 123089:—

- Headworks consisting of a weir and intake giving a static head of approximately 90 ft.:
- Pipe-line and water-race from such headworks to the power-house hereinafter described:
- Pelton wheel and power-house with all necessary equipment for generating electricity:
- Tail-race leading from the power-house to the said stream:
- Electric lines leading from the power-house aforesaid across the said stream and Lots II and III, D.P. 194, being part Section 49, Block XIII, Motueka Survey District, to a shearing-shed and the licensees' houses.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE

This license shall, unless sooner determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1967, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other public source of supply, whichever is the earlier.

6. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage and the transmission voltage shall be approximately 230 volts direct current.

7. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of the license, the licensees may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the State Hydro-electric Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 1.5 kilowatts.

Royal Commission to Inquire into and Report on Claims preferred by Members of the Maori Race touching certain Lands known as Surplus Lands of the Crown

GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

To Our Trusty and Well-beloved Counsellor SIR MICHAEL MYERS, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, HANARA TANGIAWAHA REEDY, of Ruatoria, Farmer, and ALBERT MOELLER SAMUEL, of Auckland, Retired: GREETING.

WHEREAS, prior to the assumption of British sovereignty over the Islands of New Zealand, divers tracts or portions of land therein were claimed to be held by divers persons other than members of the aboriginal race (hereinafter referred to as land claimants) by virtue of purchases, or pretended purchases, gifts, or pretended gifts, conveyances, or pretended conveyances, or other titles either mediately or immediately from one or more of the Chiefs and other members of the aboriginal tribes inhabiting New Zealand:

And whereas by divers instructions under the hand of one of Her Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, Proclamations of the Governor of New South Wales and the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, an Act of the Colony of New South Wales, and Ordinances and Acts of the Colony of New Zealand it was in effect provided that titles to land in New Zealand should not be recognized which did not proceed from or were not or should not be allowed by Her Majesty:

And whereas by the Land Claims Ordinance of 1841, Session 1, No. 2, it was enacted and ordained, amongst other things, that the sole and absolute right of pre-emption from the aboriginal inhabitants of the Colony of New Zealand vested in and could only be exercised by Her Majesty, Her heirs, and successors, and that all titles to land in the said Colony of New Zealand which were held or claimed by virtue of purchases, or pretended purchases, gifts, or pretended gifts, conveyances, or pretended conveyances, leases, or pretended leases, agreements, or other titles either mediately or immediately from the Chiefs or other individuals or individual of the aboriginal tribe inhabiting the said Colony and which were not or might not thereafter be allowed by Her Majesty, Her heirs, and successors, were and the same should be absolutely null and void:

And whereas, following upon a recital that Her Majesty had in certain instructions been pleased to declare Her Majesty's gracious intention to recognize claims to land which might have been obtained on equitable terms from the said Chiefs or aboriginal inhabitants or inhabitant of the said Colony of New Zealand and which might not be prejudicial to the present or prospective interests of such of Her Majesty's subjects who had already resorted or who might thereafter resort to and settle in the said Colony, power was conferred on the Governor to appoint Commissioners who should have full power and authority to hear, examine, and report on all claims to grants of land in virtue of any of the titles aforesaid in the said Colony of New Zealand:

And whereas by divers other Ordinances and Acts of the General Assembly further provision was from time to time made in the premises:

And whereas by Proclamations of the Governor bearing date respectively the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, Her Majesty's sole and absolute right of pre-emption from the said aboriginal inhabitants was or purported to be waived to the extent therein appearing:

And whereas under divers of the enactments aforesaid Commissioners were appointed to examine into and report on the land claims, whether arising out of dealings with the aboriginal inhabitants of the Colony prior to the establishment of British sovereignty or since that period with the sanction of the Government or under the Proclamations aforesaid:

And whereas, in accordance with the recommendations of the aforesaid Commissioners, grants of land were made and issued out of lands which had been the subject of such dealings as aforesaid (whether prior to the establishment of British sovereignty or thereafter), and by reason of the limitations imposed by certain of the Ordinances and Acts hereinbefore referred to, parts only of certain areas the subject of the said dealings were granted by the Crown to the land claimants, the remaining parts of such areas (hereinafter referred to as surplus lands) remaining demesne lands of the Crown:

And whereas in and by petitions to Parliament and otherwise members of the Maori race have from time to time claimed and contended that the surplus lands should have reverted to the members of that race who would but for the purchases, gifts, conveyances, or other agreements aforesaid have been the owners thereof according to their customs and usages or to their successors by Native title:

And whereas the Government has not admitted such claims and contentions as aforesaid but is desirous that the members of the Maori race so claiming and contending should be afforded an opportunity of pleading and proving the justice and merit of their claims and contentions to the end that if those claims and contentions are well founded in equity and good conscience the General Assembly may be enabled to consider what relief (if any) should be accorded or granted to them:

Now know ye that We, reposing trust and confidence in your impartiality, knowledge, and ability, do hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint you, the said

Hanara Tangiawha Reedy, and
Albert Moeller Samuel

to be a Commission—

(a) To inquire in a general way into the transactions by reason of which certain parcels of land, being demesne lands of the Crown, became surplus lands as aforesaid, and particularly into any specific transactions the terms of which may be brought before you by any

person interested, including transactions relating to the lands referred to in the Schedule hereto, and to report whether, having regard to the circumstances in which the lands of which the surplus lands formed part were originally alienated or disposed of by the aboriginal owners thereof, the surplus lands or any part thereof ought in equity and good conscience to have been or be returned to or vested in the former aboriginal owners thereof or have been and be regarded as Native land.

(b) If it be reported that the surplus lands or any part thereof ought in equity and good conscience to have been so returned or vested or so regarded, then to recommend what compensation in money or money's worth should now be granted to the representatives or descendants of the aboriginal owners, parties to such original alienation or disposition as aforesaid.

(c) To inquire into and report upon the claims and allegations made in the petitions referred to in the Schedule hereto so far as such claims and allegations are not covered by the preceding paragraphs of this order of reference, and to recommend what relief (if any) should be accorded in respect of the prayers of the several petitions.

And in any case where you shall see fit to recommend that compensation in money or money's worth should in equity and good conscience be granted in respect to any of the matters confided to you by these Presents, you shall further report for whose benefit—that is to say, whether that of any particular person, hapu, tribe, or other group or class of persons—the amount of such compensation should be appropriated and applied:

And we do hereby appoint you, the said

Sir Michael Myers,

to be Chairman of the said Commission:

And for the better enabling you to carry these Presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these Presents at such times and places as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place as you think fit, and so that these Presents shall continue in force, and the inquiry may at any time and place be resumed although not regularly adjourned from time to time or from place to place:

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose save to His Excellency the Governor-General, in pursuance of these Presents or by His Excellency's direction, the contents of any report so made or to be made by you or any evidence or information obtained by you in the exercise of the powers hereby conferred upon you except such evidence or information as is received in the course of a sitting open to the public:

And you are hereby authorized to report your proceedings and findings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And, using all due diligence, you are required to report to His Excellency the Governor-General in writing under your hands not later than the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, your findings and opinions on the matters aforesaid, together with such recommendations as you think fit to make in respect thereof:

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE

ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1947, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Council of the International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, § 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to § 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the Office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Oslo.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 617, and shall come into force on the 21st day of October, 1946.
2. (1) The Price Orders specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
3. In this Order—

(3) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any paint to which this Order applies sold elsewhere than in one of the respective places mentioned with respect to that paint in subclause (2) hereof shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Second Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any transport or other charges actually and reasonably incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery into his store: Provided that the amount added in respect of such charges shall not in any case exceed 1s. per gallon.

(4) If in respect of any lot of paint sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

6. The maximum prices fixed in the Second Schedule hereto for first-quality finishing paint (white, cream, and tints) apply only with respect to first-quality paint as defined in clause 3 hereof. Any finishing paint that is not first-quality shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be second-quality paint, and the maximum prices fixed in the said Schedule for second-quality finishing paint shall apply unless on application duly made to the Tribunal a special price has been approved therefor.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

7. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any paint to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of paint, or may relate generally to all paint to which this Order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 618 (Onions)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 618, and shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1946.

2. (1) Price Order No. 465† is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The said regulations” means the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939*:

“Distributor”, in relation to any lot of onions, means a wholesaler, as defined in the said regulations, who sells those onions otherwise than to a retailer for purposes of retail sale:

“Grower”, in relation to onions, means a person engaged in the business of growing onions for sale:

“Grower’s station”, in relation to any grower, means the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower’s premises:

“Old season onions” means onions planted before the 1st day of April, 1946.

The expression “f.o.r.s.i.” means free on rail, sacks or other containers included:

(2) References in this Order to grades are references to grades of onions determined in accordance with the Board of Trade (Onion) Regulations 1938†.

(3) In computing for the purposes of this Order the weight of any onions no account shall be taken of the weight of any thick necks or tops that may be attached thereto.

(4) Terms and expressions defined in the said regulations when used in this Order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by those regulations.

4. Subject to any general or specific directions that may be given by or on behalf of the Tribunal, any expenses that are reasonably incurred by a wholesaler or retailer in undertaking the transport of any onions at his own expense may be regarded for the purposes of this Order as if they were transport charges paid by him, and the maximum price of any onions sold by him shall be determined accordingly.

5. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any onions to which the Order is applicable are sold otherwise than by weight.

6. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

7. (1) This Order applies with respect to all onions grown in New Zealand (except onions of the type known to the trade as “spring onions” and “shallots”) that are sold by any grower, distributor, wholesaler, or retailer on or before the 31st day of December, 1947, for human consumption.

(2) Every sale of any such onions shall be deemed to be a sale for human consumption unless at the time of the sale there is a bona fide agreement or stipulation between the buyer and the seller that the onions to which the sale relates are intended for a specific purpose other than human consumption.

FIXING PRICES OF ONIONS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Growers’ Prices

8. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any grower for any onions to which this Order applies shall be at the rate of the appropriate price prescribed in the following scale, namely:—

(2) Where any onions sold by a grower are delivered by him otherwise than f.o.r.s.i. the grower’s station, the maximum price that may be charged by the grower shall be the appropriate price fixed in accordance with subclause (1) hereof, increased by the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by him in effecting delivery, and then reduced by the amount of the charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the onions f.o.r.s.i. the grower’s station.

Distributors’ Prices

9. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any distributor for any onions to which this Order applies shall be at the rate of a price per ton equal to the sum of the following amounts:—

- (a) The price per ton actually paid or payable to the grower by the same or any other distributor:
- (b) The grading, transport, or other charges (if any) actually paid by the same or any other distributor on each ton of the onions:
- (c) An amount computed at the rate of 25s. per ton.

10. Where any wholesaler who does not normally carry on business as a distributor sells any onions to another wholesaler (thus becoming a distributor in respect of that transaction) the price to be charged by the vendor may exceed the maximum price determined in accordance with the last preceding clause by such amount as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties to the transaction: Provided that in any such case the maximum price that may be charged by the purchasing wholesaler in accordance with the next succeeding clause shall be determined as if he had bought the onions at the price paid by the wholesaler from whom he bought them.

Wholesalers' Prices

11. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any onions to which this Order applies and which are sold by him to a retailer for purposes of retail sale shall be at the rate of a price per ton equal to the sum of the following amounts :—

- (a) The price per ton actually paid or payable by the wholesaler to the grower or any other person :
- (b) The transport or other charges (if any) payable by the wholesaler on each ton of the onions :
- (c) An amount equal to 2½ per cent. of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof (to cover the estimated loss due to shrinkage or other natural causes) :
- (d) An amount computed at the rate of 30s. a ton for lots of ½ ton or more, and computed at the rate of 40s. a ton for lots of less than ½ ton.

(2) For the purposes of this Order, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the said regulations, any person who sells any onions by retail in quantities of not less than 5 cwt. to any one purchaser for delivery at one time shall in respect of such sale be deemed to be a wholesaler, and the prices fixed by the last preceding subclause shall apply accordingly with respect to every such sale.

Distributors and other Wholesalers to specify Grades of Onions on Relevant Invoices

12. Every distributor or other wholesaler who sells any onions to which this Order applies shall specify in the relevant invoice, with respect to each item, the grade of the onions comprised in the item.

Retailers' Prices

13. (1) Except as provided in subclause (2) of clause 11 hereof and subject to the provisions of subclauses (3), (4), (5), (6), and (7) hereof, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any onions to which this Order applies shall be at the rate of a price per pound equal to the sum of the following amounts :—

- (a) The price per pound actually paid or payable by the retailer for the onions :
- (b) The transport or other charges (if any) paid or payable by the retailer on each pound of the onions :
- (c) An amount equal to 33½ per cent. of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof.

(2) The retail price of any onions, computed in accordance with the last preceding subclause, shall be calculated by reference to the prices and weights disclosed in the appropriate invoices.

(3) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this clause, but subject to the provisions of subclauses (4) and (5) hereof, the retail price of any onions to which this Order applies shall not in any case exceed a price at the rate of the appropriate price prescribed in the following scale, namely :—

(6) If in respect of any lot of onions sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

(7) Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any person concerned, may authorize special prices or margins of profit in respect of any onions to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary freight charges are incurred by any wholesaler or retailer in obtaining delivery from the source of supply nearest or most convenient of access to him. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this subclause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of onions or may relate generally to all onions to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

DUTIES IMPOSED ON RETAILERS

14. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any onions to which this Order applies shall keep for a period of not less than two months a record showing with respect to every purchase of such onions made by him by way of wholesale the following particulars :—

- (a) The date of purchase :
- (b) The name and address of the wholesaler from whom they were purchased :
- (c) The trade description of the onions purchased :
- (d) The quantity purchased :
- (e) The price paid.

15. Every retailer who offers or exposes any onions to which this Order applies for sale in any shop shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the onions to which it relates as to be obviously in relation thereto a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound of the onions and the word "Pickler", "Graded", or "Ungraded", as the case may be.
