Proclaiming Tribal Districts under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section six of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the parts of New Zealand described in the Schedule hereto to be tribal districts for the purposes of the said Act, and do hereby assign to each of the several districts the name appearing at the head of the description of each such district.

SCHEDULE

THE PANGURU TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that portion of the Hokianga County, bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station H, Waiwhakaruku, in Block IV, Whangape Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line to the easternmost corner of Old Land Claim 197, in Block XIII, Mangamuka Survey District, and that line produced to the middle of the Hokianga Harbour; thence south-westerly generally down the middle of that harbour to the sea; thence north-westerly to and along the sea-coast and to the middle of the Whangape Harbour; thence north-easterly generally up the middle of that harbour and the Awaroa River to the Awaroa Bridge on the Herekino-Broadwood Road; thence south-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station 42, Pareokawa, and a right line to Trig. Station H, Waiwhakaruku, the place of commencement.

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THE NORTHERN HOKIANGA TRIBAL DISTRICT

All that portion of Hokianga and Bay of Islands Counties, bounded by a line commencing at the Awaroa Bridge on the Herekino-Broadwood Road; thence north-easterly and south-easterly generally along the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of the Hokianga County, being the middle of the Awaroa River, the crossing of a public road, the northern boundary of Section 1, Block X, Whangape Survey District, the western boundaries of Sections 68 and 69, Block II, Whangape Survey District, the northern boundaries of the said Section 69 and Sections 67, 66, and 60, all of Block II aforesaid, the western boundaries of Sections 35 and 36, Block XV, Takahue Survey District, the northern boundary of the said Section 36, the northern boundaries of the State Forest Reserve (*New Zealand Gazette* of the 28th January, 1904, at page 310), the western boundary of the Mangamuka West No. 2 Block, the western and northern boundaries of the Mangamuka West No. 3 Block, the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of the Mangamuka East Block, the north-western boundary of the Omahuta State Forest Timber Section 2 to Trig. Station Ratakamaru, the north-eastern boundary of the said Timber Section 2 and Timber Sections 6 and 16, the northern boundary of Block XVI, Maungataniwha Survey District, the middle of the Whakatereterekia Stream and the Mangapa River, to its junction with the Waipapa River; thence south-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station B in Block II, Omapere Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station A1, Pukewharariki; thence due easterly along a right line to the boundary of the Hokianga County; thence southerly generally along that county boundary, being the western boundaries of Block XIV, Omapere Survey District, and Block II, Punakitere Survey District, the middle of the Mangatōa Stream and the Punakitere River, the western boundary of the Wharepoke Block, the northern and western boundaries of the Ninihi Block, the western boundaries of Sections 1, 2, 3, and part of the western boundary of Section 15, all of Block X, Punakitere Survey District, the north-western boundary of State Forest Reserve (*New Zealand Gazette* of 7th June, 1906, at page 1428), and the northern boundary of Section 4, Block XIII, Punakitere Survey District; thence north-westerly generally along the north-eastern boundaries of Section 3, Block XIII aforesaid, the north-eastern boundaries of Section 24, Block XVI, Waoku Survey District, and Sections 9 and 7, Block XII, Waoku Survey District, and the eastern boundaries of State Forest Reserve (*New Zealand Gazette* of 28th July, 1881, at page 959), to its northernmost corner; thence north-easterly along a right line to the easternmost corner of Whawharu B South No. 4 Block; thence north-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station 2 in Block IV, Waoku Survey District, and a right line to the northernmost corner of Motukiore E Block; thence westerly along a right line passing through Trig. Station 103, Oparia, in Block XIV, Mangamuka Survey District, to the middle of the Waima River; thence northerly and westerly generally along the middle of the Waima River and Hokianga Harbour to the eastern corner of the Panguru Tribal District hereinbefore described; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of that district to the Awaroa Bridge on the Herekino-Broadwood Road, the place of commencement.

THE SOUTHERN HOKIANGA TRIBAL DISTRICT

All that portion of the Hokianga County, bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Waipoua River, in Block V, Waipoua Survey District; thence north-westerly generally to and along the sea-coast and to the middle of the Hokianga Harbour; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly generally along the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of the Northern Hokianga Tribal District, hereinbefore described, to the north-western corner of Section 4, Block XIII, Punakitere Survey District; thence southerly generally along the western boundaries of the said Section 4, Sections 6 and 7, all of Block XIII aforesaid, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of the Mangakahia River; thence westerly along the northern boundaries of Block I, Tutamoe Survey District, and Block IV, Waipoua Survey District; thence southerly along the western boundary of the last-mentioned block and of Block VIII, Waipoua Survey District, to the middle of the Waipoua River; thence westerly generally down the middle of that river to its mouth, the point of commencement.

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945, I, Peter Fraser, Native Minister, do hereby declare the parts of the several tribal districts described in the Schedule hereto to be tribal committee areas for the purposes of the said Act, and do hereby assign to each of the several areas the name appearing at the head of the description of each such area.

SCHEDULE

PANGURU TRIBAL DISTRICT

Mitimiti Tribal Committee Area

ALL that area bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea-coast in Block XIII, Whangape Survey District, being the southern corner of Whakarawera B Block; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of that block to its south-eastern corner; thence south-easterly along a right line to the northernmost corner of Matihetihe No. 1g No. 4 Block, in Block XIV, Whangape Survey District, and a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section 7, Block II, Hokianga Survey District; thence easterly along a right line passing through the southernmost corner of Old Land Claim 350 to the middle of the Hokianga Harbour; thence southerly down the middle of that harbour to the sea; thence north-easterly to and along the sea-coast to the southern corner of Whakarawera B Block, the point of commencement.

Notice regarding Payment for Pharmaceutical Supplies under the Social Security Act, 1938

[Form Pharm. S.B.—1 (1946)]

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

DRUG TARIFF, SEPTEMBER, 1946

PURSUANT to section 90 of the Social Security Act, 1938, I, Arnold Henry Nordmeyer, Minister of Health, do hereby fix as hereinafter appears the prices to be paid for medicines, drugs, materials, and appliances supplied to persons entitled to claim pharmaceutical benefits under the said Act, and the terms and conditions subject to which such medicines, drugs, materials, and appliances shall be supplied, and for that purpose do hereby direct as follows:—

1. This direction may be cited as "the Drug Tariff (September, 1946)."

2. This direction shall apply to all pharmaceutical requirements supplied on or after the 1st day of September, 1946, to persons entitled to claim pharmaceutical benefits under the said Act, and to the supply on or after that date of all pharmaceutical requirements so supplied.

3. The Drug Tariff (November, 1943), shall not apply to any pharmaceutical requirements supplied on or after the 1st day of September, 1946, to persons entitled to claim pharmaceutical benefits under the said Act or to the supply on or after that date of any pharmaceutical requirements so supplied.

INTERPRETATION

4. In this drug tariff, including the New Zealand Formulary, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"B.P." means the 1932 edition of the British Pharmacopoeia, together with the seven addenda thereto in existence at the 1st day of February, 1945:

"B.P.C." means the 1934 edition of the British Pharmaceutical Codex, together with the seven supplements thereto in existence at the 1st day of February, 1945:

"The Fund" means the Social Security Fund established under the Social Security Act, 1938:

"N.Z.F." means the New Zealand Formulary of pharmaceutical requirements, with the prices thereof (when specified therein), rules for pricing, directions, and prohibitions in respect of the supply of pharmaceutical requirements published by the Minister for the purposes hereof, together with all amendments thereof by way of additions thereto, deletions therefrom, or any other alterations thereof contained in any addenda to the said formulary published as aforesaid:

"Proprietary preparation" means any compound or preparation that is prescribed in any medical prescription by reference to any trade-mark or trade-name or by reference to the name of the manufacturers thereof:

"The regulations" mean the Social Security (Pharmaceutical Supplies) Regulations 1941:

Expressions used herein and defined in the regulations have the meanings assigned to them by the regulations.

SCOPE OF TARIFF

5. Unless excluded by the operation of one of the provisions of the table subjoined to this clause, all the medicines, drugs, and materials, a monograph on, or formula of, which appears in the N.Z.F., B.P., and B.P.C., shall be deemed to be included in this drug tariff and to be pharmaceutical requirements for the purposes hereof.

Table of Materials excluded from Tariff

Except in so far as the same are hereinafter specifically allowed, the following materials, notwithstanding that a monograph thereon or formula thereof may appear as aforesaid, shall not be deemed to be included in this drug tariff:—

- Materials unconditionally excluded.*—Materials expressly excluded by the N.Z.F.; cosmetics, soaps, tooth-pastes, tooth-powders, all other toilet preparations; insect-exterminators, insect-repellants; cleansing-agents generally.
- Materials allowed only if and when included in the N.Z.F. and then only to the extent (if any) therein specified.*—Proprietary preparations; serums, vaccines, anti-toxins; sterilized glucose solutions and sterilized salt-solutions.

(c) *Materials allowed only when included in a Medical Prescription as Ingredients to be dispensed in Combination with Pharmaceutical Requirements, and then only to the Extent (if any) therein specified.*—Food (as defined in the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908); distilled water; local anæsthetic, general anæsthetic; *spiritus coloniensis*, chloroform, ether; ethyl alcohol of a total quantity not exceeding 2 fluid ounces of alcohol (90 per cent. by volume); intoxicating liquor as defined in the Licensing Act, 1908, comprising not more than 12½ per cent. by volume of the resultant mixture.

RULES FOR STANDARD

6. No claim by a contractor on the Fund in respect of the supply of pharmaceutical requirements shall be allowed unless the requirements comply:—

- (a) With any standard prescribed by regulations under the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908:
- (b) In the absence of any such standard, with any standard prescribed by the N.Z.F.:
- (c) In the absence of any such standards as aforesaid, with any standard prescribed by the B.P.:
- (d) In the absence of any of the foregoing standards, then with any standard prescribed by the B.P.C.

PRICE RULES

7. (1) Where the price of any pharmaceutical requirement is specified in the N.Z.F., a contractor claiming on the fund in respect thereof shall be paid that price.

(2) Where the price of any pharmaceutical requirement is not so specified, a contractor claiming on the Fund in respect thereof shall be paid therefor the price computed in accordance with the rules for pricing set out in the N.Z.F.

CLAIMS ON THE FUND

8. Pursuant to Regulation 14, a contractor may submit claims for payment for pharmaceutical requirements supplied in respect of half-monthly periods, but in every case where a claim is first received after the expiration of three months from the end of the period covered therein, then, unless the contractor satisfies the Medical Officer of Health that he has a reasonable ground for his delay in submitting the claim, there shall be deducted from the amount thereof, in addition to any other discount to be allowed thereon, a further amount equal to ten per cent. (10 per cent.) of the net amount of such claim.

9. *Maximum Quantity: Extended Order and Bulk Supply.*—In pursuance of any one medical prescription and one "repeat" thereof endorsed thereon a contractor may claim on the Fund in respect of pharmaceutical requirements supplied to a person entitled thereto in quantity sufficient to provide that person with treatment for a period not exceeding thirty days, but, except as provided in the next succeeding clause hereof, a claim for any quantity in excess thereof shall not be made on the Fund.

10. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the last preceding clause, where a medical practitioner certifies in writing, either in the original medical prescription or in a confidential application addressed to a Medical Officer of Health, that the person to whom the pharmaceutical requirements is to be supplied is suffering from a chronic complaint which does not require regular medical supervision or that he is living in such isolated circumstances as to render impracticable the normal mode of supply of pharmaceutical requirements, and also that in the opinion of the medical practitioner no danger is involved in the use thereof without medical supervision, such Medical Officer of Health may authorize a supply of such pharmaceutical requirement up to a quantity sufficient to supply such person for a period not exceeding four months.

(2) In any such case a contractor on return of the medical prescription concerned with the authority of the Medical Officer of Health endorsed thereon may supply the pharmaceutical requirements and claim on the Fund accordingly.

11. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, for the purpose of supplying the anticipated pharmaceutical requirements of the inmates or members of a licensed hospital for a period not exceeding four months, any medical practitioner may, in the form of an application addressed to the Medical Officer of Health, prescribe for the members of such institution as a group in the name of the person in charge thereof.

12. A contractor who supplies pharmaceutical requirements in accordance with a medical prescription of the kind described in clause 11 hereof, shall be entitled to claim on the Fund therefor, provided the following conditions have been complied with, namely: the medical prescription shall be signed and dated by the medical practitioner prescribing the same, be authorized by a Medical Officer of Health and endorsed with his signature, and countersigned and dated by the person in charge of the institution on receiving such pharmaceutical requirements, in proof of the supply thereof by the contractor.

13. (1) The pharmaceutical requirements comprised in any medical prescription of the kind described in clause 11 hereof, shall, until they are administered to the individual members of such institution, be kept in a suitable room or cupboard on the premises of such institution, which room or cupboard shall be kept locked by the person in charge of the institution, except during the time it is occupied or used by him or his responsible deputy.

(2) Such pharmaceutical requirements shall be administered by the person in charge of such institution or his responsible deputy solely for the benefit of the individual members thereof from time to time as and when they require the same.

MIDWIFERY ORDER

14. For the purposes of Regulation 8 of the regulations, the materials or preparations described in the September, 1946, addendum to the N.Z.F., shall be deemed to be authorized midwifery pharmaceutical requirements, and contractors may claim on the Fund in respect of the supply of the same to the extent therein set out.

Thyroid tablets (fresh gland) allowed until 31st December, 1946, when official preparations only will be allowed at the cost of the Fund.

Water soluble analogues of vitamin K.

The following substances and preparations when supplied in the manner described hereunder:—

- (1) Penicillin for parenteral use when supplied by a public Hospital Board and where the approval of a pathologist, if available, is obtained or, if not available, the approval of the Medical Superintendent of a public hospital;
- (2) Diphtheria antitoxin and tetanus antitoxin manufactured by the Commonwealth Serum Laboratories and supplied by a public Hospital Board or by the Department of Health.

STANDARDS FOR SUBSTANCES AND PREPARATIONS SUPPLIED AT THE COST OF THE FUND LAID DOWN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (b) OF CLAUSE 6 OF THE DRUG TARIFF

(1) *Aluminium Hydroxide Gel*

(a) *Alumina Content.*—Aluminium hydroxide gel shall contain the equivalent of not less than 3.6 per cent. and not more than 4.4 per cent. w/v of Al_2O_3 , chiefly in the form of hydrous oxide of aluminium.

(b) *Acid-consuming Capacity.*—Each gram of aluminium hydroxide gel shall neutralize from 12.5 to 25 mls of N/10 hydrochloric acid using Bromophenol blue as an indicator.

(c) *Reaction.*—The pH of aluminium hydroxide gel shall be between 6.7 and 6.9.

(d) *Limit of Chloride.*—Contains not more than 0.25 per cent. as sodium chloride.

(e) *Limit of Sulphate.*—Contains not more than 0.05 per cent. as sulphate.

(f) *Aluminium Sulphate.*—Nil.

(g) *Acid Insoluble Matter.*—Contains not more than 0.005 per cent.

NOTE.—Sufficient flavouring and sweetening agents may be added. Sodium benzoate in any amount not exceeding 0.5 per cent. may be added as a preservative.

(2) *Dried Aluminium Hydroxide Gel*

(a) *Acid-consuming Capacity.*—Each gram of dried aluminium hydroxide gel shall neutralize not less than 250 mls of N/10 hydrochloric acid.

(b) *Ignition Test.*—The weight of Al_2O_3 contained in the residue ignited to constant weight shall be not less than 47.5 per cent. and not more than 52.5 per cent. of the weight of dried aluminium hydroxide gel taken for the assay.

(3) *Colloidal Calamine; Colloidal Kaolin; Colloidal Zinc Oxide*

The above substances shall comply with the respective tests for identity and purity described in the B.P. for calamine, heavy kaolin, and zinc oxide, and, with respect to limits as to the size of particles, shall comply in each case with the limits described in the B.P. for light kaolin.

PART 2.—PRICE RULES UNDER CLAUSE 7 OF THE DRUG TARIFF (SEPTEMBER, 1946)

Except as provided in the following rules, no payment shall be made from the Fund in respect of any proprietary preparation supplied by a contractor.

Subject to the discount provided for under clause 8 of the Drug Tariff (September, 1946) and, in the case of a medical practitioner, the discount provided under the Medical Benefit Regulations, the prices of pharmaceutical requirements supplied at the cost of the Fund shall be determined as follows:—

1. Price rules under subclause (1) of clause 7 of the Drug Tariff (September, 1946):—

- (a) Penicillin: 10 per cent. additional on cost price.
- (b) Sera: 5 per cent. additional on cost price.

(c) In respect of the forms of any pharmaceutical requirement, whether proprietary or not, included in the N.Z. Formulary under the Table of Materials allowed under paragraph (b) of clause 5 of the Drug Tariff (September, 1946), the Fund shall pay the amount that would have been payable from the Fund if the cheapest of the available forms of the substance or preparation had been prescribed (not exceeding in any case the appropriate amount specified in the First Schedule to the Rules for Prescription Pricing), and any excess of the price over the amount so payable from the Fund shall be payable to the contractor by the person to or for whom such preparation has been supplied. For the purposes of this proviso a preparation shall be deemed to be available if the contractor can obtain it from any wholesale dealer carrying on business in whichever of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin is nearest or most convenient of access to the contractor's place of business.

2. Price rules under subclause (2) of clause 7 of the Drug Tariff (September, 1946):—

(1) In respect of pharmaceutical requirements supplied by a contractor in accordance with the said regulations, the Fund shall pay the price and additional fees, if any, computed in accordance with the provisions of clauses 5, 8, 9, 13 to 16, 17 (3), 18 to 21, and 24 to 26 (all inclusive), and the First, Second, and Third Schedules of the Rules of Prescription Pricing issued by the Pharmacy Plan Industrial Committee and approved by the Minister.

(2) In respect of proprietary forms of any pharmaceutical requirement that is supplied in accordance with a medical prescription and provided that the proprietary preparation (whether a single substance or a combination of ingredients) supplied by a contractor is identical in composition with any drug, medicine, or medicinal preparation of which a monograph or formula is published in any official pharmaceutical publication or is listed in bold-faced type in the New Zealand Formulary, the Fund shall pay the following or whichever of the said amounts is the least:—

(i) The retail price of the proprietary preparation supplied by the contractor, together with the appropriate dispensing fee; or

(ii) The retail price of any other proprietary preparation that was available to the contractor and that he could properly have supplied in fulfilment of the prescription, together with the appropriate dispensing fee; or

(iii) The amount that would have been payable if the substance or the several ingredients of the preparation had been separately dispensed.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to the board products manufactured by Whakatane Paper Mills, Ltd., of the several kinds specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF BOARD PRODUCTS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by Whakatane Paper Mills, Ltd., for any board products to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply only with respect to board products for which orders are accepted for delivery in the January–March, 1947, cycle, or succeeding cycles.

(4) The maximum prices fixed by this Order are fixed for quantities of not less than 3 tons of one size, caliper, and quality, or of not less than 5 tons of one caliper and quality, with not more than two sizes in one delivery, and where delivery is required otherwise than in conformity with this subclause the maximum prices may be increased by £2 per ton.

(5) The maximum prices fixed by this Order for combination board are for sales of not less than 1,000 sheets of a size 30 in. by 40 in. For sales of a lesser number of sheets an additional charge may be made at the rate of not more than £2 per 1,000 sheets.

(6) The maximum prices as aforesaid are fixed in respect of sales f.o.r. to purchaser's nearest railway-station in the North Island or c.i.f. Lyttelton, Dunedin, Port Chalmers, or Bluff (by direct steamer only) in the South Island.
