Now, therefore, his Excention the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to William Wakarua, Ngarino Tamou, Hoani Reweti, as trustees for the inhabitants of the locality, the control of the foreshore as described in the First Schedule hereto, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE

THAT portion of the foreshore at Tuaropaki (Shell Rock), Block XIV, Wairoa Survey District; as the same is shown coloured red on plan marked M.D. 6134, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

Nothing herein contained shall authorize the trustees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are or may hereafter be in force. 5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore. 6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the trustees to

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the trustees to remove, or cause to be removed, any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained. 7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years from the 22nd day of February, 1947, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority. 8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the trustees three calendar months' previous notice in writing.
