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Proclaiming Tribal Districts under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section six of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the parts of New Zealand described in the Schedule hereto to be tribal districts for the purposes of the said Act, and do hereby assign to each of the several districts the name appearing at the head of the description of each such district.

SCHEDULE

THE WESTERN KAIKOHE TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that portion of the Hokianga and Bay of Islands Counties, bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station C, Putahi, in Block XI, Omapere Survey District; thence north-easterly along a right line to the junction of the Waikaramu and Old Bay Roads with the Kaitaia-Whangarei Road in Block IX, Kawakawa Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station K in Block IX aforesaid; thence south-westerly along a right line to the northernmost corner of Motatau No. 3s Block, and a right line to the westernmost corner of Section 13, Block IV, Punakitere Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line to the westernmost corner of Motatau No. 1B No. 5B No. 3 Block, in Block VI, Motatau Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station XXVI, Ngatitara, in Block XII, Punakitere Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line, passing through Trig. Station XXVIA, to the northern boundary of the middle portion of Nukutawhiti Block, being the boundary of the Bay of Islands County; thence westerly and northerly generally along that county boundary, being part of the said northern boundary of the middle portion of Nukutawhiti Block and its production westwards to the middle of the Awarua River, down the middle of that river and up the middle of the Mangakahia River to a point in line with the production south-eastwards of the north-eastern boundary of Aukumeroa No. 2 Block; to and along that boundary and its production north-westwards to the middle of the Mangakahia River, up the middle of that river and a small stream forming part of the north-eastern boundary of Section 3, Block XV, Punakitere Survey District, to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 3 aforesaid, along that boundary and part of the western boundary of that section, across a public road, and along the other part of the western boundary and its production to the middle of the Mangakahia River, and up the middle of that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section 13, Block XIII, Punakitere Survey District, to and along that boundary and part of the eastern boundary of Section 14, Block XIII aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of that section, across a public road to the nearest road angle, along the western boundaries of Sections 6 and 4, Block XIII aforesaid, along part of the southern, south-eastern, and north-eastern boundaries of Kohatutaka Block, the eastern boundaries of Section 2, Block VI, and Section 2, Block II, Punakitere Survey District, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of the Punakitere River, down the middle of that river and up the middle of the Mangatōa Stream, to and along the eastern boundary of

Block I, Punakitere Survey District, and the production of that boundary, across Blocks XIII and XIV, Omapere Survey District, to a point due east of Trig. Station A¹, Pukewharariki; thence due west along a right line to that trig. station; thence northerly along a right line towards Trig. Station B, in Block II, Omapere Survey District, to its intersection with the northern boundary of Section 5, Block X, Omapere Survey District; thence north-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station LA in Block X aforesaid; thence due east along a right line to the shores of Omapere Lake, and easterly generally along the northern shores of that lake to a point on a right line between Trig. Station H, in Block IV, Omapere Survey District, and Trig. Station C, Putahi, in Block XI, Omapere Survey District; thence south-westerly along that line, crossing portion of Omapere Lake, to the said Trig. Station C, the point of commencement.

THE EASTERN KAIKOHE TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that portion of the Hokianga and Bay of Islands Counties, bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of the Mangapapa Stream and the Waipapa River, in Block XIII, Kaeo Survey District, and being a point on the boundary of the Bay of Islands County; thence north-easterly along that county boundary to the sea-coast, being the middle of the Waipapa River and the Pukatea Stream to the western boundary of Section 9, Block XIV, Kaeo Survey District, the southern boundary of State forest (*Gazette*, 1933, page 3403), to Trig. Station 1, Mangingangina, the southern boundaries of Mangingangina or Motukauri Block, the southern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 4, Block XV, Kaeo Survey District, the south-western and eastern boundaries of Section 35, Block XII, Kaeo Survey District, the generally western side of the road forming the eastern boundaries of Sections 35 and 3 of the said Block XII, Section 4, Block XI, and Section 31, Block XII aforesaid, a right line, being the production of the northern end of the western side of the said road, across another public road, the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 30, Block XII aforesaid, the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 32, Block XII aforesaid, the southern boundaries of Old Land Claim 25, the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 3, Block VIII, Kaeo Survey District, the south-eastern boundaries of Old Land Claim 19, and the right bank of the Takou River to the sea-coast; thence easterly and southerly generally along the sea-coast, and including Moturoa and other adjacent islands, to the north-eastern corner of Block IV, Kawakawa Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line to the Opua Wharf; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern side of the Opua-Whangarei Railway Reserve to the middle of the bridge at the mouth of the Whangae River; thence westerly along a right line to the junction of the Whangae Road with the Oromahoe-Opua Road, in Block VIII, Kawakawa Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station Y, in Block XI, Kawakawa Survey District; thence westerly along a right line to Trig. Station K, in Block IX, Kawakawa Survey District, being a point on the boundary of the Western Kaikohe Tribal District hereinbefore described; thence westerly generally along that boundary, to the intersection of a right line from Trig. Station A¹, Pukewharariki, to Trig. Station B, in Block II, Omapere Survey District, with the northern boundary of Section 5, Block X, Omapere Survey District; thence north-easterly along that line to Trig. Station B aforesaid; thence north-westerly along a right line to the confluence of the Mangapapa Stream with the Waipapa River, the point of commencement.

THE KAWAKAWA TRIBAL DISTRICT

All that portion of the Bay of Islands County, bounded by a line commencing at Howe Point, in Block IX, Bay of Islands Survey District; thence easterly along a line to Motukokako on Piercy Island; thence southerly along a line, so as to include adjacent islands, to a point on the sea-coast on the northern boundary of Whangaroa-Ngaiotonga No. 4r Block, and being a point on the boundary of the Bay of Islands County; thence westerly, southerly, and again westerly generally along that county boundary, being the northern and north-western boundaries of the said 4r Block, the north-western boundary of Whangaroa-Ngaiotonga No. 4g Block, the north-eastern and western boundaries of the Tutaematai Block, the western boundaries of Sections 6 and 5, Block XII, Russell Survey District, the western boundaries of Waikokopu Block, Punaruku Block, the north-western and western boundaries of Punaruku No. 2 Block, the western and southern boundaries of Paremata-Mokau Block, the western boundary of Section 3, Block IV, Hukerenui Survey District, the northern boundary of Section 11, Block IV aforesaid, and its production across a public road, the eastern, northern and western boundaries of Section 11, Block III, Hukerenui Survey District, across a public road, the western boundaries of Sections 12 and 13, Block III aforesaid, and Sections 5 and 6, Block VII, Hukerenui Survey District, the northern and western boundaries of Section 3, the western boundary of Section 4, both of Block VII aforesaid, the western boundary of Puhipuhi No. 4A 1 Block, the northern and part north-eastern boundaries of Section 50, Block VI, Hukerenui Survey District, the northern and western boundaries of Section 65, Block VI aforesaid, the production north-easterly of the north-western boundary of Section 66, Block VI aforesaid, a right line across a public road, the north-western boundary of Section 66 aforesaid, the production of that boundary to the middle of the Waitutu River, the middle of that river and the Ngaruawahine Stream, the eastern side of a public road intersecting Section 17, Block X, Hukerenui Survey District, across that road, the northern side of the Whangarei-Kawakawa Main Highway, the production northwards and the western boundary of Section 19, Block X aforesaid, the northern boundaries of Sections 38 and 49, a right line across a public road, the northern and western boundaries of Section 61, a right line across a public road, the western boundaries of Sections 48 and 50, the northern and western boundaries of Section 51, the production of the last-mentioned boundary across a public road, the northern boundary of Section 52, all the aforesaid sections being of Block X, Hukerenui Survey District, a right line bearing due south across a public road, the northern, western, and south-western boundaries of Section 32, Block IX, Hukerenui Survey District, the western boundary of Section 32, Block X aforesaid, the northern boundaries of Sections 3, 4, and 5, Block XIII, Hukerenui Survey District, the eastern boundaries of Sections 24 and 23, Block IX aforesaid, the northern boundary of the said Section 23, the western boundaries of Sections 23 and 24 aforesaid, across a public road, the northern and part western boundaries of Section N.W. 13, Block XIII aforesaid, the northern boundary generally of the Mangakowhara Block, the northern and part south-western boundaries of Kaikou No. 3 Block, crossing several intervening roads, and part of the northern boundary of the middle portion of Nukutawhiti Block, to a point on the boundary of the Western Kaikohe Tribal District hereinbefore described; thence northerly, easterly, and again northerly generally along that boundary to Howe Point, the point of commencement.

WHEREAS the Mackenzie County Council (hereinafter called the said local authority), being desirous of raising a loan of one thousand eight hundred pounds (£1,800), to be known as "Aorangi Hall Loan, 1946" (hereinafter called the said loan), for the purpose of purchasing the Aorangi Hall in Fairlie Township for

The Institute of Horticulture Examinations Order 1947

PURSUANT to the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Act, 1927, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Institute of Horticulture Examinations Order 1947.

2. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.

3. For the purposes of this Order the “said Act” means the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Act, 1927.

4. Approval of the scheme of examination for the granting of certificates and diplomas in horticulture set forth in the Schedule to the Order in Council made under the said Act on the 10th day of March, 1928, and published in the *Gazette* on the 15th day of the same month at page 701, is revoked:

Provided that such revocation shall not affect the validity of any act, certificate, or diploma properly done or granted while the said approval was in force.

5. The scheme of training and examination for the granting of certificates and diplomas under the said Act set forth in the Schedule hereto and submitted by the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture for approval pursuant to section 4 of the said Act, as modified by section 60 of the Statutes Amendment Act, 1946, is hereby approved for the purposes of the said Act.

SCHEDULE

SCHEME OF TRAINING AND EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR THE CERTIFICATES AND DIPLOMA IN HORTICULTURE OF THE ROYAL NEW ZEALAND INSTITUTE OF HORTICULTURE (INC.)

1. Preliminary

(1) THIS scheme of training and examination is issued under the authority of the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Act, 1927, as amended by the Statutes Amendment Act, 1946.

(2) In this scheme, unless inconsistent with the context,—

“Act” means the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Act, 1927:

“Garden” means any botanic, institutional, municipal, nursery, or private garden in which the prescribed course of training and instruction in practical horticulture appropriate to the certificate or diploma sought may be undergone by the candidate:

“Junior certificate” means the Junior Certificate in Horticulture granted by the Institute:

“Intermediate certificate” means the Intermediate Certificate in Horticulture granted by the Institute:

“Diploma” means the National Diploma in Horticulture (N.D.H. (N.Z.)) granted by the Institute:

“Examining Board” means a committee set up by the Institute for the purpose of controlling all matters relative to examinations under the Act:

“Institute” means the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture (Inc.).

2. Award of Certificates and Diploma

The Examining Board, acting for and on behalf of the Institute, may issue a junior certificate to a candidate who has passed the Junior Examination, an intermediate certificate to a candidate who has passed the Intermediate Examination, and a diploma to a candidate who has passed the Diploma Examination: Provided that in each case the candidate satisfies all the conditions prescribed by the Board for the appropriate examination.

3. General Requirements

The examinations are open to candidates of either sex.

Before being eligible to qualify for the Institute's certificates or diploma, a candidate must in general comply with the following conditions:—

(1) He must register his name with the Institute: Provided that no registration shall be effective before the first day of January nearest the candidate's sixteenth birthday:

(2) He must furnish evidence, on registration, that he has secured the Primary School Certificate or its equivalent; or he must satisfy the Examining Board that he is competent to proceed with the examinations of the Institute:

(3) He must satisfy the Examining Board that he has been engaged in horticulture, including a substantial amount of practical work, for the period prescribed for the examination concerned (hereinafter referred to as practical experience):

(4) He must submit for the approval of the Examining Board on such occasions as it may require an account, in the form of a diary, of the work in which he has been engaged, and of such other matters of horticultural interest as have engaged his attention. If his diary is not considered satisfactory, the period of practical experience required may be extended for such further term as the Examining Board may determine.

4. Equivalent Status

The Examining Board may in its discretion accept, for the purposes of the award of a certificate or a diploma, proof of the passing of an equivalent examination held by some competent public authority, and the Examining Board may also accept a pass in one or more subjects of an examination conducted by some competent public authority as equivalent to a pass in one or more similar subjects of the Institute's examinations. Further, any of the conditions of the examination may be waived if the Examining Board is satisfied that substantially equivalent conditions have been complied with by the candidate.

5. Conduct of Examination

(1) The examinations for the Institute's certificates and diploma shall be held in the month of November, at such centres as may be recognized from year to year as suitable and necessary.

(2) Every candidate for an examination must give notice of his intention to sit such examination, in such manner as the Examining Board may determine, not later than *31st day of July* immediately preceding the examination: Provided that any application in respect of examinations conducted by the Education Department must be forwarded to the Director of Education, Wellington C. 1.

6. Examination Fees

Every candidate for examination shall pay half a guinea for each subject in respect of examinations conducted by the Institute.

7. Subjects of Examination

The following shall be the subjects of the examination:—

A. Junior Examination

(1) General science or chemistry (as for the School Certificate examination of the Education Department).

* (2) Book-keeping.

(3) Horticultural botany.

(4) Principles of plant protection.

† (5) Oral and Practical Examination I.

B. Intermediate Examination

(6) Principles of botanical classification.

(7) Principles of Horticulture I.

(8) Practice of Horticulture I.

(9) Special Subject I, selected from the list appended to this clause.

† (10) Oral and Practical Examination II.

C. Diploma Examination

(11) Principles of Horticulture II.

(12) Practice of Horticulture II.

(13) Special Subject II. Normally the same subject as that chosen for the Intermediate Examination.

† (14) Oral and Practical Examination III.

(15) Thesis.

Special Subjects

Candidates will be expected to display a reasonable knowledge of a subject chosen from the following list:—

(1) Fruit-growing.

(2) The flower garden in all its aspects.

(3) Trees and shrubs, together with their propagation and use in horticulture.

(4) Landscape gardening.

(5) Vegetable-growing.

(6) Nursery management.

(7) Glass-house management and crops.

(8) Horticultural seed-production and plant-breeding.

(9) Lawns and playing fields.

(10) Horticultural mycology.

(11) Horticultural entomology.

(12) Systematic botany of families and genera of the principal horticultural plants.

8. Pass Conditions

(1) A pass in the Junior Examination shall not be awarded until the candidate has passed in all the subjects of that examination, and has satisfied the Examining Board that he has had two years' practical experience: Provided that such period may be reduced to one year in the case of a candidate who has passed the School Certificate Examination, or its equivalent, and who was registered not earlier than the 1st day of January nearest his seventeenth birthday.

(2) Subjects (1), (2), and (3) may be taken in the month of November following registration; unless registration was effected later than the 31st day of March in that year. Subjects (4) and (5) may not be taken until the period of service referred to in the last preceding subclause has been completed.

(3) A pass in the Intermediate Examination shall not be awarded until the candidate has passed all the subjects of that examination, and has satisfied the Examining Board that he has had two years' practical experience after passing the Junior Examination, or has had not less than four years in all of such practical experience.

(4) Subject (2) may be taken at any time before the Intermediate Examination is completed. Subjects (6) and (7) may be taken at the November examinations following the passing of the Junior Examination. Subjects (8), (9), and (10) may not be taken until the practical experience required for the award of an intermediate certificate has been obtained.

(5) A pass in the Diploma Examination shall not be awarded until the candidate has passed all the subjects of that examination, and has satisfied the Examining Board that he has had two years' practical experience after passing the Intermediate Examination, or has had not less than six years in all of such practical experience.

(6) Subjects (11) and (13) may be taken at the November examination following the passing of the Intermediate Examination. Subjects (12) and (14) may not be taken until the practical experience required for the award of the diploma has been obtained.

(7) Where the required period of practical experience will end not later than the 31st day of March in any year it may be assumed, but only for the purpose of entering for an examination, to have ended on the 31st day of October of the preceding year, provided that the candidate undertakes to continue in his employment till the required period of practical experience is completed.

* This subject may be deferred and taken as part of the Intermediate Examination.

† The oral and practical test will be combined and the oral questions asked mainly about the demonstration, practical operation, or identification performed by the candidate.

(8) The thesis, Subject (15), shall be submitted to the Examining Board not later than the 30th day of September in the year of the examination, and not before the candidate is eligible to be examined in Subjects (12) and (14).

(9) One or more subjects may be taken at a time, and a candidate may be credited with a pass in one or more subjects.

(10) Notwithstanding the condition laid down in subclauses (4) and (6) of this clause, if a candidate requires only one subject to complete a pass in one of the examinations, he may, if the Examining Board agrees, proceed with those subjects of the next higher examination which he would have been permitted to take had he secured a complete pass in the lower examination, but he shall not be credited with a pass in more than two subjects of the higher examination until he has completed all the requirements for a pass in the lower examination.

(11) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided, in the event of any student producing to the Examining Board evidence, in such form as it shall deem sufficient, of his intention to leave the Dominion for the purpose of pursuing his horticultural studies abroad, the Board may approve of such student presenting himself for the examination for the junior or intermediate certificate, or for the diploma, after one of the two years of practical experience prescribed at that stage for the certificate or diploma for which he desires to sit. If, in any such case, the candidate passes the examination, he shall be provisionally recognized as having done so, but the appropriate certificate or diploma shall not be issued until he produces satisfactory evidence of the completion by him of the required period of practical experience.

9. Thesis

Every candidate for the diploma shall submit a thesis dealing concisely with a special subject, or with some portion of a special subject, to be chosen by the candidate from the list set forth in clause 7 hereof, and approved by the Examining Board. His choice of subject must be submitted for the approval of the Examining Board not less than eight months before the date of examination. In the thesis the candidate shall describe some work actually carried out by him, and shall make reference to any features that he regards as original. He shall also append a bibliography of the subject. The thesis, together with a statutory declaration (in a form obtainable from the Institute) to the effect that it is substantially the candidate's own work, shall be submitted to the Examining Board not later than the 30th day of September in the year of examination. The Examining Board shall examine the thesis, and decide whether it is satisfactory. If it is considered satisfactory, but the candidate has failed to pass the Diploma Examination, the Board shall decide whether the thesis shall be approved provisionally or rejected. If it is provisionally approved, such approval shall be confirmed as soon as the candidate has passed the Diploma Examination. The thesis shall be regarded as the property of the candidate, and shall be returned to him.

10. Examination of University Graduates

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided, any person holding a degree or diploma equivalent to the B.Sc. degree of the University of New Zealand shall be eligible to sit for the Diploma Examination, provided that—

(1) Botany is a subject passed by him in the degree course;

(2) (a) He has completed two years' practical general horticultural training in New Zealand to the satisfaction of the Examining Board; or

(b) He has working experience in gardening of not less than four hundred hours in a garden as defined in clause 1 hereof, together with either not less than two years' experience as a teacher of horticulture or some closely allied subject, including adequate practical work; or not less than two years' experience in a branch of specialized horticulture such as fruit-growing or in forestry or in seed work.

11. Qualification for Extra Certificates

A candidate who has passed the Diploma Examination may qualify for a certificate in respect of any of the special subjects mentioned in clause 7 hereof other than that chosen as the special subject in the Diploma Examination: Provided that there shall be a period of at least one year between the passing of the Diploma Examination and the examination for such certificate, and provided also that only one special subject may be taken in any one year.

12. Notification of Results

Candidates will be notified of the results of the examinations at the earliest possible opportunity, and not later than the 28th day of February following the examination.

13. Programme of Subjects

The prescriptions in the subjects of the examinations shall be as follows:—

Junior Examination

(1) General Science or Chemistry

For these prescriptions see the regulations for the time being in force relating to the School Certificate examination issued by the Education Department, Wellington C. 1.

(2) Book-keeping

The recording of straight-forward cash and credit transactions in cash book, journal, and ledger; the preparation of a gross revenue and expenditure account, profit and loss account, and balance-sheet; the keeping of time sheets and wages book; tax deductions from wages; elementary knowledge of banking, insurance, and general commercial practice.

The standard of the examination will be approximately that of the Public Service Entrance Examination for 1945 as defined by the Education Department.

(3) Horticultural Botany

The candidate must show a satisfactory elementary knowledge of the following, based on observation and simple experiments. He should have practice in the use of the hand-lens and the drawing-pencil:—

- A. The structure and contents of the living plant cell, with special reference to protoplasm and nucleus; the structure of plants, based on a study of the organs of a typical fern, herb, shrub, and tree. The main life-forms of flowering plants (*e.g.*, annuals, biennials, perennials, rhizomatous plants, creeping plants, climbing plants, &c.).
- B. Modifications of plant organs for special functions, with particular reference to water- and food-storage organs, drought resistance, climbers, symbiosis.
- C. The processes of nutrition, with special reference to (a) absorption, translocation, and transpiration of water, together with the intake of food materials from the air and soil; (b) carbon assimilation, nitrogen assimilation, respiration; (c) the elaboration of foods within the plant, especially carbohydrates and proteins, their consumption and storage, and the elimination of waste products.
- D. Methods of reproduction, asexual and sexual, with special reference to their importance for plant propagation and plant breeding.
- E. The relation of the plant to its environment, including the influence of soils, water, light, temperature, wind. The chief resultant plant formations (*e.g.*, forest, scrub, grassland, swamps, with reference to their horticultural significance).

(4) Principles of Plant Protection

A general knowledge of the morphology and life history of an eelworm, an earthworm, a wood-louse, an earwig, an aphid, a scale insect, a beetle, a house fly, a moth, and a mite.

A general knowledge of the morphology and life history of a bacterium, a downy mildew, a powdery mildew, a mould, a polypore, an agaric, rusts, and common virus diseases of potato and tomato.

The methods of preparation, strength, and times of application of sprays in general use, including Bordeaux mixture, Burgundy mixture, lead arsenate, lime sulphur, nicotine, oil, and sulphur.

Methods of treating the soil by steam or by chemical substances to control fungous and insect or other animal pests.

Glasshouse hygiene and the effects of temperature, humidity, and soil moisture on pest and disease control in glasshouses.

Seed and bulb disinfection by chemicals and by hot-water treatment.

Pests and disease control by hygiene, elimination of weeds, crop rotation, and cultural methods.

(5) Oral and Practical Examination I

Propagation of plants by seeds, hard-wood and soft-wood cuttings, division, and layering.

Garden tools and implements, including those motor-driven, their care and use.

Common operations in the garden (*e.g.*, pricking out seedlings, potting up or potting on, use of water-can and hose, wrenching and lining out, digging and trenching, preparation of seed-beds, staking and tying plants).

Identification of common pests and diseases, and their control.

Identification of commoner trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants, including weeds, especially plants indigenous to New Zealand and amenable to cultivation.

Intermediate Examination

(6) Principles of Botanical Classification

The divisions of the plant kingdom, with special reference to the major distinctions between the following groups: Bacteria, algæ, fungi, mosses, liverworts, ferns, gymnosperms, monocotyledons, dicotyledons.

Elementary knowledge of the commoner families of flowering plants met with in horticulture, especially—

And the recognition of the more important genera of the above cultivated in gardens.

(7) Principles of Horticulture I

Soils.—The origin and classification of soils; chief constituents and their physical properties (*e.g.*, water-holding power, heat-absorbing power, porosity, capillarity, texture; chemical constituents of soil, and of the soil solution; function of sand, clay, and humus in various forms).

Garden Operations.—The principles underlying various operations, the tools and implements used, and their general effect; digging, trenching, hoeing, cultivating; preparation of soil for various crops; drainage in garden, field, and nursery; mulching, watering.

Plant Propagation.—Structure of stem, root, and seed; principles underlying propagation by seed, cutting, budding, grafting, layering, subdivision, and by tubers, corms, and bulbs; conditions necessary for propagation in each case.

Pruning.—The general principles governing the pruning of common plants of all classes and kinds for various purposes.

(8) Practice of Horticulture I

Operations connected with the soil, including cuts and fills, levels, and grades.

Drainage of surface and sub-soil on hills and flat country.

Cultural operations for the year in different parts of the country, as regards herbaceous plants, including lawn grasses.

Propagation, planting, and care (including pruning) of hard-wood plants.

Glasshouse construction, ventilation, heating, and management.

Land surveying, areas up to half an acre, moderately level, locating objects thereon, putting in level and grade pegs.

Garden design, including layout and planting.

Plant pathology, including spraying, fumigation, and other means of controlling plant diseases and pests.

(9) Special Subject I

Chosen from the list of special subjects set out in clause 7.

(10) Oral and Practical Examination II

Propagation of plants by budding, grafting, inarching, and more difficult types of hard-wood cuttings; also the different types of stocks.

Pruning and planting trees and shrubs for different purposes.

Lawns—preparation, sowing, turfing, and maintenance.

Glasshouse construction and heating.

Drainage and formation of yards, paths, and drives.

Identification of pests and diseases; and their control.

Identification of trees, shrubs, and other plants, their propagation and use, especially plants indigenous to New Zealand and amenable to cultivation.

The student should submit for discussion a garden plan, including planting list.

Diploma Examination

(11) Principles of Horticulture II

The substance of prescription No. (7) and the following:—

Fertilizers and Manures.—The physical and chemical properties of the various fertilizers available and of lime; the method of use and function of each in plant growth and its effect on the soil; the composition and valuation of fertilizers; the composition and value of common animal manures; the manufacture and use of compost.

Soil biology, with reference to the normal flora and fauna of good loam; nitrification and denitrification; decomposition of humus, and value of leguminous crops.

Rotation of Crops.—Its object and methods, with particular reference to the vegetable garden.

Plant Breeding.—The methods of raising new types and varieties by selection and controlled pollination.

Climate.—Relation of heat, light, moisture, and wind to the growth of plants and to the spread and control of pests and disease.

Horticultural Geography of New Zealand.—A knowledge of the principal soil types and climatic regions within New Zealand and the plants associated with them. The garden as a plant association.

(12) Practice of Horticulture II

In addition to prescription No. (8), the following is included:—

Trees and shrubs, their planting and management for the production of fruit, timber, shelter, or ornament.

Herbaceous plants, especially those grown for cut flowers, fruit, and vegetables, including selection and seed production.

Glasshouse and frames, the propagation and cultivation of ornamental and food crops therein.

Packing and storing flowers, fruit, and vegetables for sale, transport, or future use.

Land surveying and mapping areas up to 5 acres, necessary instruments, their use and care.

Garden design and specification, properly inscribed, showing layout and planting, with specification, including terraces, steps, dry walls, ponds, and rock gardens.

Irrigation and watering systems.

(13) Special Subject II

(Normally the same subject as chosen for the Intermediate Examination.)

The candidate will be expected to show a deeper and more complete knowledge than that required in the Intermediate Examination.

(14) Oral and Practical Examination III

Tree surgery and pruning of specimen and avenue trees.

Acclimatization of plants (including bulbs) from the Northern Hemisphere and elsewhere.

Storage and packing of fruit and flowers, vegetables, and seeds.

Self-pollination and cross-pollination of flowers.

Instruments and equipment used in survey and mapping small areas, their use and care.

Official soil surveys and their use in horticultural planting and cropping.

Simple estimates in garden construction (*e.g.*, amount of soil to raise level of given area, or amount of metal for specified path or road).

Sprays and spraying for control of plant diseases and pests.

Identification of plants, their propagation and use.

The New Zealand National Airways Corporation By-laws

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 12th day of March, 1947

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to subsection two of section thirty-three of the New Zealand National Airways Act, 1945 (hereafter referred to as the said Act), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby approve the by-laws made by the New Zealand National Airways Corporation pursuant to subsection one of the said section thirty-three on the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

PART I

SHORT TITLE

1. These by-laws may be cited as the New Zealand National Airways Corporation By-laws.

INTRODUCTORY

2. The following terms used in these by-laws shall (except where inconsistent with the context) have the meanings hereby given to them:—

- “The Act” means the New Zealand National Airways Act, 1945, and its amendments;
- “The Corporation” means the New Zealand National Airways Corporation;
- “Director” means a director of the Corporation and includes a person duly acting as a deputy of a director;
- “Authorized officer” or “authorized person” means, in relation to any matter, any servant of the Corporation acting or employed in that matter by order or with the concurrence (whether precedent or subsequent) of the Board or of the General Manager or in pursuance of any other lawful authority;
- “Goods” means all kinds of movable property, including animals and mails but excluding baggage (luggage), accompanying a passenger;
- “Consignor” means the person consigning any goods, and shall include the owner, agent for the owner, or any other person having any right, title, or interest to or in such goods or the possession thereof;
- “Consignee” means the person to whom any goods are consigned, and shall include the agent for any owner, any agent for the sale or custody of such goods, the holder of any document of title representing such goods, and any other person having any right, title, or interest to or in such goods or the possession thereof;
- “Air service” means any service owned or operated by the Corporation for the carriage by air of passengers or goods;
- “Airport” means any definite and limited ground or water area licensed or approved under the Air Navigation Regulations 1933 and intended to be used and capable of being used either in whole or in part for the landing or departure of aircraft owned or operated by the Corporation, and includes any hangars or other buildings or structures erected thereon, and the runways, tarmac, and their surroundings.

Words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number, and words importing the plural number only shall include the singular.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine.

PART II

CARRIAGE OF GOODS

Consignment-notes

3. All goods tendered for carriage by the Corporation shall be—

- (1) Accompanied by the Corporation's consignment-note duly completed and signed by the consignor or his agent; or
- (2) Addressed as is hereinafter provided and lodged at any booking-office of the Corporation in exchange for the Corporation's goods label, which may be had on personal application by the consignor or his agent.

All goods shall conform with the Corporation's requirements as to fitness for air transport, and shall bear the addresses of both the consignor and the consignee written legibly in a durable manner. The consignor, or his agent, shall be responsible for the correctness of all particulars (including nature and character of goods) inserted in any consignment-note or goods label.

The Corporation reserves the right to reject any consignment-note inaccurately or insufficiently completed.

Suitability of Goods

4. Only goods suitable for carriage in the Corporation's aircraft will be accepted for carriage, and the Corporation may at any time refuse to accept for carriage any goods which, in the opinion of any of its servants or agents, are or may be unsuitable for carriage by air.

Live animals and creatures may in the discretion of the Corporation be carried by special arrangement, particulars of which can be obtained on application to the Corporation.

Prohibited Goods

5. The carriage of any of the following as goods on the aircraft of the Corporation is absolutely prohibited:—

Acetone.
Acetylene (liquid).
Acids (except citric and tartaric).
Ammonia.
Ammonia sulphate.
Arrack.
Benzoline.
Benzene.
Bi-sulphate of carbon.
Carbonic acid (in steel cylinders).
Carbonic acid gas.
Celluloid and xylonite and other similar substances.
Calcium carbide.
Camphor oil.
Camphine.
Cartridges.
Chlorate of potash.
Chlorate of soda.
Collodion.
Cordite.
Eau oxygenee.
Ether.
Explosives of all kinds (including percussion caps).
Fireworks and crackers.
Films (unless contained in fire-proof metal containers).
Fulminating powder.
Gunpowder.
Hydrogen peroxide.
Kerosene.
Matches (lucifer and percussion of all kinds).
Methylated spirit.
Meal worms.
Naphtha.
Natrium peroxide.
Nitrate of soda.
Nitro-glycerine.
Nitro of lime calcium.
Pyridine.
Paraffin (liquid petroleum and its products, excepting when used for fuel and contained in tanks provided for the purpose).
Phosphorus.
Rockets.
Safety dynamite fuses (with or without detonators).
Saltpetre.
Spirits of wine.
Varnishes containing spirit.
Any form of combustible material flashing under 73° F.

Receipts Prima facie Evidence only

6. Receipt without qualification of any goods by the Corporation shall be *prima facie* evidence only that the goods were delivered to the Corporation in good order and condition.

Off-loading

7. If any question shall arise at any time before or during carriage as to an aircraft of the Corporation being overloaded, any authorized officer of the Corporation may, in his discretion, decide which goods (if any) shall be carried and which goods (if any) shall be off-loaded, and neither the consignor nor the consignee shall have any claim against the Corporation in respect of any such decision not to carry or to off-load.

Time-tables not Binding

8. While the Corporation's time-tables are intended to furnish average times of arrival and departure and will be maintained as far as may be practicable, these are not guaranteed, and the Corporation does not undertake that its aircraft will arrive or depart at the times shown in the time-tables.

The Corporation does not undertake to deliver goods by any fixed or certain time or to carry any goods by any particular air service or aircraft.

Cancellation and Postponement of Flights

9. The Corporation reserves the right to decide if the meteorological and other conditions for flight are safe and suitable, and to cancel or postpone departures or arrivals and to determine if landings should or should not be made at any particular times or places.

Connecting Goods Services

10. If instructed by the consignor so to do, the Corporation will endeavour to make connections with other transport whether by air, by sea, or by land, but the Corporation shall not be responsible for any loss or delay occasioned by its inability for any reason whatsoever to make any such connection.

Freight Charges

11. Goods will be carried at the freight charges set out from time to time in the Corporation's tariff.

Freight and other charges for carriage shall be prepaid by the consignor unless otherwise agreed upon.

Insurances

12. The Corporation is prepared, as agent for the consignor on his request and on prepayment of the appropriate premium, to effect insurances against loss of or damage to goods in accordance with the consignor's instructions, in so far as such instructions may be capable of being carried out by the Corporation as the consignor's agent.

Receiving and Delivery Points

13. Goods will be received from consignors and delivered to consignees at a town air terminus of the Corporation or by arrangement with and in the discretion of the Corporation at the airport at the point of departure or arrival, as the case may be.

Receipt or delivery of goods may be arranged at other places only by special arrangement with the Corporation and upon payment of such extra charge as may be required by the Corporation.

Non-delivery to Consignee

14. If for any reason goods cannot be delivered to the consignee the consignor will indemnify the Corporation against all expenses resulting from such non-delivery, including payment of any return freight charges on such goods.

In the event of non-delivery to the named consignee the Corporation may sell perishable goods, or other goods which it is impossible to return to the consignor, and payment or tender to the consignor of the proceeds of any such sale after deduction of all proper charges and expenses in relation thereto shall be a complete discharge to the Corporation from all liability in respect of such goods.

Complaints and Claims

15. All complaints, claims, or inquiries concerning goods shall be made by the consignor in writing and addressed to the office of the Corporation at which such goods were handed over to it.

All actions and proceedings against the Corporation, its directors, officers, and agents shall be brought in strict compliance with the provisions of section 32 of the Act.

Limitation of Corporation's Liability

16. In respect of the carriage of goods the Corporation assumes the liabilities, obligations, rights, and protection of a common carrier, subject to the following special limitations and exceptions:—

(1) If the Corporation shall have exercised all due diligence to make the aircraft carrying any goods in all respects airworthy and properly manned, equipped, and supplied—

(a) Neither the Corporation nor its agents shall be responsible for loss or damage arising or resulting from faults or errors in navigation or in the management of the aircraft:

(b) Neither the Corporation nor its agents or servants shall be responsible for loss or damage arising or resulting from—

(i) Dangers and perils associated with aerial navigation:

(ii) Acts of God:

(iii) Acts of public enemies:

(iv) Inherent defect, quality, or vice of the thing carried:

(v) Insufficiency of package:

(vi) Pillage or theft facilitated by insufficiency of package:

(vii) Seizure under legal process:

(viii) Any act or omission of the consignor or owner of the goods or his agent or representatives:

(ix) Saving or attempting to save life or property or deviating in rendering such service.

(2) Neither the Corporation nor its agents or servants shall in any event be or become liable for any loss or damage to or in connection with any goods to, say, greater extent than the actual value of such goods, or in the case of partial loss or damage the actual extent and value of such partial loss or damage, but in neither case shall its liability exceed fifty pounds (£50) for any one package or unit unless the nature and value of such goods have been declared by the consignor before acceptance for carriage and inserted in the Corporation's consignment-note, and such additional charges in respect thereof as may have been fixed by the Corporation paid by the consignor.

Any declaration embodied in the Corporation's consignment-note shall be *prima facie* evidence only of value and shall not be binding or conclusive on the Corporation.

By agreement between the Corporation and the consignor a limit in excess of fifty pounds (£50) may be fixed.

(3) Neither the Corporation nor its agents or servants shall be responsible in any event or in any amount for loss or damage to or in connection with goods if the nature or value thereof has been knowingly mis-stated by the consignor in the consignment-note.

(4) The foregoing provisions shall not apply in relation to the carriage by air of live animals or creatures or of other goods which in the consignment-note are stated as being carried by special arrangement at the consignor's risk.

PART III

CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS AND BAGGAGE

Tickets and Reservations

17. Passengers and baggage will be carried at the fares and rates set out from time to time in the Corporation's tariff.

No passenger will be permitted to emplane until he has surrendered the passenger ticket issued to him.

The issue of a passenger ticket without a reservation endorsed thereon shall not constitute a reservation for any particular date,

aircraft, or service, and any passenger presenting himself for emplaning without prior reservation will not be permitted to emplane until and unless all reservations have been taken up and an unreserved seat is then available for such passenger.

Reservations may be made on or at any time after the issue of a ticket, and passengers are referred to the Corporation's information sheets as to the procedure to be followed to secure reservations.

Intending passengers who have not made reservations shall report to the Corporation's office at the airport of departure not less than thirty (30) minutes before the time appointed for the departure of the aircraft by which they wish to depart, and so far as the Corporation may be able to do so unreserved accommodation will be allotted to such passengers.

All tickets issued shall be valid and available for six (6) calendar months from the date of issue shown thereon. A ticket shall not be transferable and shall be used by the passenger named only.

All passengers will be carried subject to the limitations, reservations, and exceptions provided by these by-laws.

Privilege and Concession Tickets

18. Any passenger emplaning on a ticket issued to him by the Corporation otherwise than for payment of the prescribed fare shall in all respects be carried subject to the provisions of these by-laws.

Such passenger shall have the same rights, obligations, privileges, and immunities as are applicable in the case of fare-paying passengers.

Return Tickets

19. The return portion of any ticket shall be valid and available for return journey for six (6) calendar months from the date of issue shown thereon, and all return tickets shall, in respect of both the outward and the return journey, be subject to the provisions of these by-laws relating to reservations.

The issue of a return ticket with a reservation for the outward journey shall not constitute a reservation for any particular date, aircraft, or service in respect of the return journey, for which a separate reservation may be made by the passenger prior to the date on which the passenger intends to return.

Ground Transportation

20. Transportation will be provided without additional charge for passengers by the Corporation between the town terminus of the Corporation and the airport of departure or arrival. The assembly places for passengers and the times of departure will be from time to time advised by the Corporation's time-tables and upon tickets when reservations are made.

Children's Rates

21. (1) Children under three (3) years of age carried in the arms of an adult will be carried free, but no adult will be permitted to carry free more than one child under three (3) years of age.

(2) If any adult is accompanied by more than one child under three (3) years of age such adult will be required to pay for one seat (if available) at half-rates, and in such case the child accompanying such adult shall be entitled to the appropriate baggage-allowance in respect of children under twelve (12) years of age.

(3) Children over three (3) years of age and under twelve (12) years of age will be carried at half-fare.

(4) In cases (2) and (3) above the Corporation will endeavour to allot a seat at half-fare, but the Corporation reserves the right to allot available accommodation to adult passengers.

Baggage-allowance

22. (1) Each passenger shall be entitled to a free allowance in respect of baggage of thirty-five (35) pounds.

(2) Children under twelve (12) years of age travelling at half-fare shall be entitled to a free baggage-allowance of seventeen (17) pounds.

(3) Children under three (3) years of age for whom no fare is being charged under By-law No. 21 (1) are not entitled to any baggage-allowance.

(4) In the case of any passenger or child of any age arriving from abroad by air or proceeding abroad by air with baggage in excess of the limits fixed by this by-law, the Corporation may increase the foregoing free baggage-allowance to such limits as it may in its discretion deem appropriate.

Excess Baggage Charges

23. All baggage in excess of the limits provided by By-law No. 21 will be carried upon the condition that—

(1) Any excess baggage of adult passengers beyond thirty-five (35) pounds shall be charged for at half freight rates up to sixty (60) pounds and at full freight rates for any weight in excess of sixty (60) pounds.

(2) Any excess baggage of children (travelling at half-rates) beyond seventeen (17) pounds shall be charged for at half freight rates up to thirty (30) pounds and at full freight rates for any weight in excess of thirty (30) pounds.

Prohibited Articles

24. (1) Passengers are prohibited from carrying on their persons or in their baggage—

(a) Articles which are prohibited by any statute or regulation from being carried in aircraft.

(b) Live animals or creatures.

(c) Any intoxicating drink or any alcoholic liquor.

- (d) Dangerous articles, arms, munitions, explosives, corrosives, and articles which may be easily ignited; articles or things which are offensive or evil smelling; and all articles of a character likely to inconvenience passengers or which are or may be dangerous to the aircraft, its crew, and passengers, and to any goods carried therein.
- (e) Any passenger wishing to carry any arms and ammunition for hunting or sporting purposes may be given permission so to do provided that such arms are unloaded and dismantled as much as possible and carried in a case, and that such arms and ammunition are packed in such a manner as to cause no danger to the aircraft, its crew, and passengers, or to any goods carried thereon.

(2) Any passenger committing a breach of this by-law may, in the discretion of the pilot in charge or any authorized officer of the Corporation, be refused carriage or may be off-loaded at any convenient point in the course of the journey.

Carriage of Baggage

25. Baggage will be carried by the Corporation upon and subject to the following conditions:—

(1) The following property is excluded from carriage as baggage:—

- (a) Articles which, owing to their dimensions, their weight, or their character are, in the opinion of the Corporation, unsuitable for carriage as baggage in aircraft:
- (b) Goods (merchandise).

(2) Baggage, other than baggage which the passenger is permitted by an authorized officer to retain during trip, shall be handed over at the booking-office or airport, and the Corporation will furnish the passenger with a baggage check therefor.

(3) If any contravention of the Corporation's by-laws as to the carriage of baggage is suspected the Corporation may verify if the contents of the baggage comply with these by-laws. The bearer of the baggage check will be called upon to assist at such verification. If he does not attend, or if he cannot be found, verification will be effected by an authorized officer of the Corporation in his absence. If a contravention is proved the cost of verification shall be paid by the bearer of the baggage check.

(4) Delivery of the baggage will be made to the bearer of the baggage check against delivery of the baggage check. The Corporation shall not be bound to verify if the bearer of the check is entitled to take delivery.

(5) Failing presentation of the baggage check the Corporation shall be only bound to deliver the baggage if the claimant establishes his right. If such right appears to be insufficiently established the Corporation may require security to be given as a condition of the release of the baggage.

(6) The receipt without complaint of baggage by the bearer of the baggage check or other party entitled shall be *prima facie* evidence that the baggage has been delivered in good order and condition and in accordance with the contract of carriage.

(7) In case of loss of contents or damage to baggage the passenger or person presenting the baggage check shall lodge a complaint to the Corporation immediately after discovery of the damage, and no complaint will be entertained by the Corporation if made more than twenty-four (24) hours from the time of receipt of the baggage.

(8) Baggage will be carried when possible in the same aircraft as the passenger if the load of the aircraft permits, but the Corporation shall be under no obligation in this respect and may forward baggage by any other aircraft.

Cancellations and Refunds

26. (1) If any passenger holding a reservation does not arrive (or arrives too late to permit the necessary formalities being completed in time) for the aircraft for which he holds such reservation, the reservation shall lapse and the ticket shall become invalid, and the passenger shall not be entitled to any refund in respect thereof, but the Corporation upon application in that behalf may, in its discretion, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, refund any fare in whole or in part and upon and subject to such conditions as it may impose.

(2) If any reservation is cancelled and the Corporation is notified not less than twenty-four (24) hours before the scheduled time of departure the fare, less ten (10) per centum for cancellation and incidental charges, will upon surrender of the ticket be refunded or, at the option of the applicant, applied towards the purchase of a new ticket.

(3) If any reservation is cancelled less than twenty-four (24) hours before the scheduled time of departure the ticket shall become invalid, and the passenger shall not be entitled to any refund in respect thereof, but the Corporation may, on application in that behalf in its discretion, apply the provisions of subclause (1) of this by-law to any such application.

(4) If any flight is cancelled by the Corporation by reason of weather or any other condition, or if any aircraft returns to the airport of departure without having made a landing on the flight, the passenger shall be entitled to repayment of the whole of the fare. If any flight is partially cancelled and the passenger is not carried to his destination by other transportation at the Corporation's expense he shall be entitled to repayment of the fare for the non-completed portion thereof.

(5) Any application for refund of fare shall be lodged within four (4) weeks from the named date of travel or prior to the expiry date of the ticket (whichever may be the earlier) at the booking-office which issued the ticket. Any application out of time will not be considered by the Corporation.

D

Breaks in Journey and Stop-overs

27. Any passenger wishing to stop over at any intermediate airport shall notify the Corporation and make arrangements in that behalf at the time of booking, and shall obtain separate reservations and separate tickets for the different stages of the journey.

The unused portion of the ticket of any passenger who for his own convenience breaks a through journey without having made the aforesaid arrangements shall become invalid, and the passenger shall not be entitled to any refund in respect thereof, but the Corporation may, on application in that behalf in its discretion, apply the provisions of subclause (1) of By-law No. 26 to any such application.

Time-tables

28. The hours stated on any ticket or on any time-table or notice issued by the Corporation for the departure or arrival of the Corporation's aircraft from or at any specified place are appointed as the times that it is intended that so far as circumstances shall permit the aircraft shall depart from or arrive at such place, but such departure or arrival at the time stated is not guaranteed, and the Corporation shall not be under any liability or other responsibility for any delay, detention, or other loss or injury whatsoever which may arise therefrom.

Seats

29. Allotments of specified seats on the aircraft will be made, but the first pilot in charge of the aircraft or any authorized officer of the Corporation in his discretion may at any time prior to or during flight require any passenger or passengers to exchange seats.

Off-loading

30. (1) The pilot in charge of any aircraft or any authorized officer of the Corporation may refuse to allow any person whom he shall consider to be an undesirable passenger to emplane, or may require any such person having already emplaned to deplane at any time prior to or at any stage of the trip and notwithstanding that such person may be the holder of a ticket.

(2) The fare or the unused portion thereof of any such passenger shall be refunded by the Corporation, unless in the opinion of the pilot in charge or the authorized officer such passenger was under the influence of alcohol or self-administered drugs, or by his own misconduct in any respect had made himself an undesirable person to carry in the aircraft; and in such event the ticket of such passenger shall become invalid and the fare be forfeit to the Corporation.

(3) Except as provided in this by-law the Corporation shall be under no liability to any passenger for any expenses or loss whatsoever caused or occasioned to such passenger by his being so refused permission to emplane or being so deplaned.

Passengers proceeding independently to Airport

31. Passengers holding reservations who do not avail themselves of the transport provided by the Corporation shall arrive at the airport of departure not less than fifteen (15) minutes before the scheduled time of departure of the aircraft by which they intend to travel.

Any passenger holding a reservation and arriving at the airport of departure less than fifteen (15) minutes before the scheduled time of departure may be refused his carriage, and in such event the ticket of such passenger will become invalid and the passenger shall not be entitled to any refund in respect thereof, but the Corporation may, on application in that behalf in its discretion, apply the provisions of subclause (1) of By-law No. 26 to any such application.

PART IV

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY IN RESPECT OF PASSENGER'S BAGGAGE

32. (a) The Corporation shall be liable in respect of checked baggage to the same extent and subject to the same conditions, limitations, exceptions, and provisos as apply to the "Carriage of Goods," as set out in By-law No. 16, relating to the carriage of goods by air.

(b) The Corporation shall be liable in respect of baggage or other articles (including currency) of which the passenger shall himself retain charge to the same extent and subject to the same conditions, limitations, exceptions, and provisos as apply to the "Carriage of Goods," as set out in By-law No. 16, relating to the carriage of goods by air, except that in lieu of the limitation therein provided the liability of the Corporation shall be limited in respect of all such baggage or other articles (including currency) to the sum of fifty pounds (£50) New Zealand currency for and in respect of each such passenger.

EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE ARISING FROM DELAYS AND DETENTIONS

33. (a) *Forced Landings.*—The Corporation shall not be liable for any claim in respect of loss or delay to or detention of any passenger arising out of or connected with any forced landing or other landing made in the course of the trip, and whether the trip is continued or abandoned, and whether or not the passenger is obliged to proceed to his destination independently of the Corporation.

(b) *Emergency Conditions.*—The Corporation shall not be liable for any claim in respect of loss, delay, to or detention of any passenger caused or occasioned directly or indirectly by compliance or non-compliance with orders or directions howsoever given by His Majesty's Government (which expression shall include the Government of any British Dominion, Colony, or Dependency), or any Department of State, or any person acting or purporting to

act with the authority of such Government, or any Department thereof, and the holder of any ticket shall be deemed to have accepted it subject to any requisition by any such Government.

If any reservation is requisitioned by any such Government a full refund of the value of the ticket will be made, and thereafter the Corporation shall be under no liability whatsoever to the holder of such ticket.

(c) The Corporation shall not be liable for any claim in respect of loss or delay, to or detention, of any passenger arising out of strikes or civil commotion, or combination of workmen and others.

PART V

GENERAL BY-LAWS

34. No person shall travel or attempt to travel in any aircraft without having previously paid the proper fare or with intent to evade payment thereof.

35. No person having paid the fare for a certain distance shall, knowingly and wilfully, proceed in any aircraft beyond such distance without previously paying the additional fare for such additional distance and receiving the permission of the pilot in charge or any authorized officer to continue as a passenger of the aircraft.

36. No person shall enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave any aircraft until instructed to do so by the pilot or any authorized officer of the Corporation.

37. No person shall take or attempt to take into any aircraft any article or object prohibited by By-law No. 24.

38. No passenger or other unauthorized person shall at any time enter or attempt to enter the cockpit or control cabin of any aircraft or interfere with or use or operate any of the controls, equipment, or appliances of any aircraft other than those appliances especially provided for the use and operation of passengers as such.

39. All passengers, visitors, and other persons shall comply immediately with all orders in any way relating to its aircraft given by the pilot in charge or any authorized officer.

40. No passenger shall open or attempt to open the cabin doors of any aircraft at any time.

41. No passenger shall throw or attempt to throw anything out of any aircraft after emplaning during flight or prior to deplaning.

42. No passenger, visitor, or other person, whether a servant of the Corporation or not, shall smoke or light any match in any aircraft or within fifty (50) feet of any aircraft or attempt to do so unless expressly authorized so to do by the pilot in charge of any aircraft or by an authorized officer of the Corporation, but this by-law shall not apply to any building on any airport or compartment in an aircraft in which appears a statement under the authority of the Corporation that smoking is permitted therein.

43. No person shall place his foot or feet upon any seat or part of a seat in any aircraft.

44. No person shall break, destroy, mar, or interfere with any fitting or any part of the equipment of any aircraft of the Corporation or any other property of the Corporation, nor attempt to do so.

45. No person shall make use of insulting or abusive language to any servant of the Corporation while in the execution of his duty, or make use of indecent, insulting, or blasphemous language on any part of the Corporation's premises or in any aircraft.

46. No person shall commit any nuisance or gamble on any part of the premises of the Corporation or in any aircraft, or do any act therein which shall unlawfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

47. No unauthorized person shall enter or attempt to enter any of the Corporation's hangars, or enter or attempt to enter any of the Corporation's other premises other than booking-offices and waiting-rooms provided for use of passengers.

48. No servant of the Corporation shall receive any gratuity on pain of dismissal, and no person shall give or offer a gratuity to any such servant.

Penalties

49. In addition to and not in substitution for any forfeiture, liability, or other consequence which may be incurred by any person in terms of these by-laws, if any person fails or refuses or neglects to do anything required by these by-laws to be done, observed, or performed, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined or required or authorized to be done, or wilfully does anything prohibited by these by-laws, every such person in each and every case so offending shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).

Price Order No. 665 (Apples and Pears)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 665.
(2) This Order shall come into force on the 24th day of March, 1947.

2. (1) Price Orders No. 317† and No. 663‡ are hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
“Bushel case”, in relation to apples, means a package of the kind numbered 1 in the First Schedule to the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940§, and, in relation to pears, means a package of the kind numbered 2 in the said Schedule;
“Half-bushel case”, in relation to apples, means a package of the kind numbered 5 or 6 in the First Schedule to the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940§, and, in relation to pears, means a package of the kind numbered 6 in the said Schedule;
“Internal Marketing Division” means the Internal Marketing Division of the Marketing Department;
“Retailer's railway-station”, in relation to sales by a wholesaler to a retailer, means the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the retailer's premises.

(2) References in the First and Second Schedules to this Order to counts and grades are references to the counts and grades of apples and pears respectively, determined in accordance with the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940§, as modified in accordance with the Apple and Pear Marketing Regulations 1942||.

(3) Terms and expressions defined in the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by those regulations.

4. The provisions of this Order fixing prices by reference to the weight of the fruit to which any sale relates shall apply notwithstanding that in any case the seller may sell or purport to sell otherwise than by weight.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

5. This Order applies with respect to all sales of apples and pears grown in New Zealand.

6. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES

7. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for apples to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the First Schedule hereto.

(2) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for pears to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) The several wholesale prices fixed by this clause are fixed as for delivery by the wholesaler to the retailer at the wholesaler's store. Where, with the concurrence or by direction of the Internal Marketing Division, delivery to the retailer is effected at the retailer's railway-station, freight charges to the retailer's railway-station from the depot from which the fruit is actually supplied will be borne by the Internal Marketing Division.

(4) The several wholesale prices fixed by this clause do not include the price of the case for which an additional charge may be made not exceeding 6d. in respect of apples and 5d. in respect of pears.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES

8. (1) For the purposes of the Third and Fourth Schedules hereto, the retailer's cost into store per bushel case of any apples or pears sold by him by way of retail sale shall be determined as if on the day of the retail sale he had bought the fruit from a wholesaler at the appropriate maximum wholesale price ruling on that day, and the amount of the retailer's cost into store of any such fruit shall be ascertained as follows:—

(a) Where no transport expenses have been incurred by the retailer in effecting delivery into his shop or other premises, his cost into store per bushel case shall be the appropriate maximum wholesale price per bushel case increased by the cost of the case:

(b) Where any transport expenses have been actually and reasonably incurred by the retailer in effecting delivery into his shop or other premises as aforesaid of fruit delivered to him either at the wholesaler's store or at the retailer's railway-station, as the case may be, the retailer's cost into store per bushel case shall be the appropriate maximum wholesale price per bushel case increased by the cost of the case and further increased by a proportionate part of the transport expenses incurred by him as aforesaid (not exceeding in respect of transport expenses sixpence per bushel case or threepence per half-bushel case, or the charges that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current rates, whichever is the less).

(2) If in respect of any variety or grade of apples or pears there is no maximum wholesale price ruling on the date of any retail sale, the maximum retail price shall be the maximum retail price that was last fixed in respect of such apples or pears.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause, if by reason of a reduction of the maximum wholesale price of any apples or pears the maximum retail price is reduced, the reduction of the maximum retail price shall not take effect until noon of the day on which the reduction of the maximum wholesale price took effect.

9. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for apples to which this Order applies, when sold by him in bushel-case or half-bushel-case lots or in 10 lb. lots, shall be determined in accordance with the Third Schedule hereto.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for apples to which this Order applies, when sold by him otherwise than in accordance with the last preceding subclause, shall be the appropriate price per pound fixed in the Third Schedule hereto.

(3) Except as otherwise provided in this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for pears to which this Order applies, when sold by him in bushel-case or half-bushel-case lots or in 10 lb. lots, shall be determined in accordance with the Fourth Schedule hereto.

(4) Except as otherwise provided in this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for pears to which this Order applies, when sold by him otherwise than in accordance with the last preceding subclause, shall be the appropriate price per pound fixed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

(5) Where any apples or pears are sold in any lot exceeding 10 lb., but otherwise than in half-bushel-case or bushel-case lots, the maximum price per pound of any surplus (being less in every case than 10 lb.) shall be the appropriate maximum price fixed by subclause (2) or subclause (4) hereof, as the case may require.

(6) Where the transport expenses actually and reasonably incurred by a retailer in effecting delivery of any fruit into his shop or other premises (not exceeding in any case the charges that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current rates) exceeds 9d. per bushel case or 4½d. per half-bushel case, the maximum retail price that may be charged or received by the retailer shall be the prescribed maximum price as aforesaid, increased as follows:—

(a) In the case of fruit sold by him in bushel-case lots, the prescribed maximum price may be increased by the amount by which the transport charges exceed 9d. per case:

(b) In the case of fruit sold by him in half-bushel-case lots or in lots of 10 lb. or more (but otherwise than in bushel-case lots), the prescribed maximum price may be increased by a proportionate part of the amount by which the transport charges exceed 9d. per bushel case or 4½d. per half-bushel case:

(c) In the case of fruit sold otherwise than as aforesaid, the prescribed maximum price may be increased by ½d. per pound.

(7) If in respect of any apples or pears sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

(8) The several retail prices fixed by this clause include the price of the cases or other containers in which the fruit is delivered to the purchaser.

RETAILERS TO EXHIBIT RETAIL PRICES

10. Every retailer who offers or exposes any apples or pears to which this Order applies for sale in any shop shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the fruit to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound of the fruit.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR FEBRUARY, 1947

General.—With one notable exception February's weather was fairly settled. A severe storm in the middle of the month caused extensive damage to property. Strong southerly gales which accompanied the storm wrecked havoc among Hawke's Bay orchards. Crops, vegetables, and power lines suffered badly over the southern part of the North Island. The cold wet conditions during the storm adversely affected stock, and there were some losses among freshly shorn sheep. Although some flooding occurred in the Wairarapa District the rain was in general very beneficial to crops and pastures.

Snow was reported down to the foothills in both islands on the 15th. Rain is still badly needed in Central Otago and over most of the Auckland Province.

Rainfall.—The total rainfall for the month was above normal over the Wellington and Hawke's Bay Provinces, on the Canterbury Plains, and along the Kaikoura Coast. An exception was a small area centred on Palmerston North. Highest excesses were on the coastal belt from Cape Palliser to Napier, where the rainfall amounted to two or three times the average. Over the remainder of the country totals were below normal, deficiencies being in many places substantial. For some districts this was the fourth consecutive month with deficient rainfall. Noteworthy in this respect were parts of Central and North Otago and the area from Lake Taupo to the Bay of Plenty.

Temperatures.—For the fifth consecutive month mean temperatures have failed to exceed the normal. Departures were small, however, being of the order of one or two degrees. During the second week of the month many places recorded their highest temperatures for the summer. In Wellington the maximum reading on the 13th was the highest since February, 1935. This warm spell was more than offset by the cold storm period immediately following. Light frosts occurred in many districts on the 27th and 28th.

Sunshine.—A preponderance of cloudy days kept sunshine totals slightly below normal in the southern part of the country; elsewhere they were above normal. In west coast districts particularly the month was exceptionally sunny. Although sunshine readings at Westport go back for only ten years, the total of 255.7 hours was 62.9 hours above the next highest value. New Plymouth and Nelson also have not had a sunnier February in the last thirty and twenty-five years respectively.

Weather Sequence.—Barometers were high during the first few days of the month, and fine summer weather prevailed over the greater part of the country. A weak cold front which had moved on to Southland on the 1st advanced slowly northwards. It was followed by cooler temperatures and a period of light rain in the south and in districts east of the ranges. The front dissipated over South Auckland on the 3rd. An anticyclone which had been intensifying on the south was then centred over Canterbury.

On the 6th skies were cloudy over most of the South Island. Light rain fell most of the day in South Westland, and also over the greater part of Otago.

A deep depression sped south-eastwards past Campbell Island on the 8th. Heavy rain fell for a time in Westland and Southland as the cold front associated with this depression moved rapidly northwards over the country. Fresh southerly winds and much colder temperatures followed the frontal passage. Showers persisted for a time on the Southland coast, but elsewhere there was a rapid clearance. In the meantime an extensive depression which was approaching from the north had turned the winds to fresh south-easterlies over the northern part of the country. Under its influence rain fell during the 9th on the east coast of the Auckland and Coromandel Peninsulas and about Gisborne. The weather remained unsettled in the latter area, but there was a temporary improvement in the north on the following day. On the 11th an anticyclone straddled the South Island. The depression which had moved away to a position about five hundred miles north-east of Auckland then began to return slowly towards New Zealand, bringing widespread rain to the northern half of the North Island.

A vigorous cold front which began to move rapidly up the South Island early on the 13th was followed by cold southerly winds and general rain. A clearance in the north due to the filling of the northern depression was only temporary. By the following morning the cold outbreak had extended as far as Cook Strait, while the winds were gradually increasing with the development of a depression east of the South Island. On the afternoon of the 14th barometers fell rapidly with the sudden deepening of another depression over the middle of the North Island. By next morning it had developed into a cyclonic storm of exceptional severity, being at that time centred one hundred miles south-east of Napier. From about New Plymouth and Napier in the north, to Christchurch in the south, strong southerly gales caused considerable damage to property and communications, one gust of 94 m.p.h. registered at Ohakea equalling the highest gust yet recorded in New Zealand. Heavy rain caused minor flooding in the Wellington and Wairarapa districts. Temperatures were very cold, and snow was reported down to the foothills in many places. On the 16th strong winds and cold showery weather still continued, but conditions were gradually moderating. The Gisborne area was the last to clear, showers persisting there until the following evening.

An anticyclone covered the country during the next few days, giving settled weather with rising temperatures. Early on the 20th a small depression moved rapidly south-eastwards past Stewart Island. A period of rain in Southland and in West Coast districts accompanied the passage of the associated cold front. The strong south-westerlies to the rear of the front soon moderated. Three days' settled weather followed, as the centre of an anticyclone moved eastwards across the country. On the morning of the 21st skies were overcast east of the main ranges, where some patches of light drizzle were reported.

North-westerlies freshened in the South Island ahead of the next cold front, which reached Invercargill on the morning of the 24th. Heavy rain fell for a time in Southland and Westland, but elsewhere the front produced little or no rain. In its passage across the North Island the front was retarded, due to the development of a small depression which moved away rapidly eastwards from Hawke's Bay on the 26th. The influence of this depression, combined with the advance of an intense anticyclone on to the South Island, caused a strengthening of the southerly winds and the development of a few showers on the east coast and about Cook Strait. Next day there were still a few showers about Gisborne and the Southland coast, but elsewhere the weather was fine. A weak secondary cold front which moved rapidly northwards on the 28th caused only a few scattered showers along the east coast, but it was followed by a marked drop in temperatures.
