PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order :--

PRELIMINARY

- This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 678, and shall come into force on the 1st day of May, 1947.
 (1) Price Orders No. 4747 and 6557 are hereby revoked.
 (2) The revocation of the said Price Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed

- - December, or January next following the date of sowing: "Spring swedes", in respect of swedes grown in the Land Districts of Southland, Otago, or Canterbury means those harvested between the 1st day of December and the 15th day of March next following the date of sowing and, in respect of swedes grown elsewhere in New Zealand, means those harvested during any of the months of October, November, December, or January next
 - ensewhere in New Zealand, means those harvested during any of the months of October, November, December, or January next following the date of sowing : ain crop ", in relation to carrots, parsnips, and swedes, means all such vegetables other than those hereinbefore referred to as spring carrots, spring parsnips, or spring swedes respectively. " Main crop

(2) Spring carrots, spring parsnips, and spring swedes may be sold as such in the localities specified in the Schedule hereto only during the months specified in such Schedule in relation to the sale of such vegetables in those localities. Any spring carrots, spring parsnips, or spring swedes not sold during such months shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be main crop vegetables, and the provisions of this Order relating to spring carrots, spring parsnips, and spring swedes shall not apply to those vegetables not sold as aforesaid.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. (1) This Order applies with respect to the sale for human consumption of any vegetables of any of the classes specified in the Schedule

hereto. (2) Every sale of any such vegetables shall be deemed to be a sale for human consumption unless at the time of sale there is a bona fide agreement or stipulation between the buyer and the seller that the vegetables to which the sale relates are intended for a specific purpose other than human consumption.

- - (a) Sales to retailers (whether made by the grower or any other person); and
 (b) Sales to users in any case where a lot of not less than 5 cwt. of any one class of vegetable to which this Order applies is sold to any one purchaser for delivery at any one time.

7. (1) The provisions of this Order fixing prices by reference to the weight of the vegetables to which any sale relates shall apply notwithstanding that in any such case the seller may sell or purport to sell otherwise than by weight.
(2) In computing the weight of any vegetables to which the maximum wholesale prices fixed by this Order apply the weight of the case or other container shall be excluded.

case or other container shall be excluded.
8. (1) All spring carrots, spring parsnips, and spring swedes shall have attached thereto foliage not exceeding 5 in. in length, and in computing for the purposes of this Order the weight of those vegetables the weight of such attached foliage may be taken into account.
(2) All main crop carrots, parsnips, and swedes shall have foliage trimmed to within half an inch of the crowns thereof.
(3) No vegetables to which this clause relates shall be exposed or offered for sale unless the provisions of this clause relating

to foliage have been complied with.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES OF VEGETABLES TO WHICH THIS OBDER APPLIES

9. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause and of clause 11 hereof, the maximum wholesale prices of vegetables to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the Schedule hereto. (2) The wholesale prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery at the wholesaler's store or other premises from which delivery to

the purchaser is effected.

(3) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler elsewhere than at premises occupied by him, he may add to the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the Schedule hereto the reasonable cost of delivery, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates.
(4) The maximum wholesale prices fixed by this Order are exclusive of the cost of the case or other container.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF VEGETABLES TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

10. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause and of clause 11 hereof, the maximum retail prices of vegetables to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts :---

- (a) The price actually paid or payable by the retailer for the vegetables and for the cost of the case or other container:
 (b) Any transport charges up to and including 2s. 6d. per cwt. actually paid or payable by the retailer:
 (c) With respect to carrots, parsnips, swedes, kumaras, and pumpkins an amount equal to 40 per cent., and with respect to cabbage and silver beet an amount equal to 50 per cent. of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof.

and (0) nereof: (2) The retail price of any vegetables, computed in accordance with the last preceding subclause, shall be calculated by reference to the prices and weights disclosed in the appropriate invoices. (3) If in respect of any lot of vegetables sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny. (4) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this clause but subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause and to the provisions of clause 11 hereof, the retail price of any vegetables to which this Order applies shall not in any oase exceed the price determined in accordance with the Schedule hereto. (5) Where the transport charges incurred by any retailer in obtaining delivery of any vegetables to which this Order applies from the source of supply that is nearest or most convenient of access to him exceeds 2s. 6d. per hundredweight, the retail price determined in accordance with subclause (1) of this clause and the maximum retail price specified in the Schedule hereto may each be increased in accordance with the following scale :---

Where the transport charges are— More than 2s. 6d. per hundredweight but not more than 4s. per hundredweight : By ‡d. per pound. More than 4s. per hundredweight but not more than 6s. per hundredweight : By ‡d. per pound. More than 6s. per hundredweight : By ‡d. per pound.

PROVISION FOR SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

11. Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by the grower or by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special prices or margins of profit in respect of any vegetables to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the grower or wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of vegetables or may relate generally to all vegetables of any kind to which this Order applies sold by the grower or wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

DUTY IMPOSED ON RETAILERS

12. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any vegetables to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the vegetables to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound of the vegetables.

- - (a) A person occupying a shop where cream is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise and where the cream is sold in the form in which it is received into the shop; or
 - (b) A person who sells cream for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other
- substance or substances): when used with reference to cream, means "Gallon' 9.95 lb. by weight or 160 fluid ounces by measure.

(2) References in this Order to milk districts are references to the following milk districts: Auckland Metropolitan, Balclutha, Christchurch Metropolitan, Dannevirke, Dunedin, Eltham, Feilding, Gisborne, Hamilton, Hastings, Hutt Valley and Bays Metropolitan, Invercargill, Napier, Nelson, New Plymouth, Oamaru, Palmerston North Metropolitan, Rotorua, Stratford, Tauranga, Timaru, Wanganui, Westport, Whangarei, Ashburton, Greymouth, Hawera, Waipukurau, Te Puke, Whakatane, Levin, Lyttelton, and Kaiapoi-Rangiora, being the district defined in Price Order No. 506§ and the districts defined in the several Price Orders to which Price Order No. 668¶ applies respectively. applies respectively.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies only with respect to cream sold to a cream-vendor for sale by way of retail in any milk district to which this Order applies during the months of May to September (inclusive) in any year

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF CREAM TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES 5. The maximum price that may be charged or received for any cream to which this Order applies shall be—

- - For $\frac{1}{2}$ pint bottles, or 4 oz. cartons : 6d. each. For $\frac{1}{2}$ pint bottles, or 8 oz. cartons : 1s. each. For 1 pint bottles, or 16 oz. cartons : 2s. each. For loose cream in a quantity of less than 2 pints : At the rate

 - of 2s. per pint. For loose cream in a quantity of 2 pints or more : At the rate of 15s. 8d. per gallon.

Notes on the Weather for March, 1947

General.—March was a pleasant month, notable for the high proportion of bright sunny days and light winds. Although there was very little rain over most of the country, many heavy dews, combined with the absence of wind, prevented pastures from becoming seriously parched. In general, conditions were very favourable for farming. Harvesting, however, has been delayed in Canterbury by the lack of

drying winds. Rainfall.—In the North Island, rainfall totals were above normal about Gisborne, on the east coast of the Wellington Province, and from Hamilton northwards over the southern half of the Auckland Peninsula. Over the remainder of the Island the rainfall was below

from Hamilton northwards over the southern half of the Auckland Peninsula. Over the remainder of the Island the rainfall was below normal, with highest deficiencies in North Taranaki. With few exceptions the South Island was very dry. Along the Kaikoura Coast and in the Ashburton District rain towards the end of the month managed to bring the total up to the average. Most of the provinces of Otago, Southland, and Westland received less than a fifth of the average for March. *Temperatures.*—In the North Island mean temperatures were above normal, except in North Auckland, the eastern portion of the Wellington Province, and in parts of Hawke's Bay. Departures were of the order of one degree. Central Otago and the West Coast were from two to four degrees warmer than the average. Temperatures over the rest of the South Island were also above average. There were widespread frosts in the South Island on the 22nd and 28th. *Sunshine.*—Over most of the country the duration of sunshine was above average. Palmerston North was particularly well favoured in this respect, while Invercential experienced the sunniest March since records commenced in 1913. The totals for Hawke's Bay and

Weather Sequence.—The month opened with fine warm weather, as an anticyclone moved slowly eastwards across the country. On the 4th winds freshened temporarily in the south ahead of a cold front, which brought some rain to Westland and Southland. The front rapidly weakened as it moved slowly north-eastwards. Winds changed to cool south-easterlies, and an anticyclone advanced on to the

South Island.

A spell of settled weather and light winds followed, although skies were cloudy at times and morning fogs were fairly general. Over

Canterbury, in particular, the fogs were regular and persistent. Shallow troughs moved eastwards across the South Island on the 9th and on the 11th. The former brought local heavy rains to the south-western Sounds, but elsewhere neither trough produced more than a few showers, which were confined to the area south of Westport and Dunedin.

and Dunedin. An anticyclone intensified rapidly over the South Island on the 12th, while a depression deepened east of the Chatham Islands. Dull misty weather developed along the east coast, and southerly winds became strong between Cook Strait and East Cape. On the 14th the centre of the anticyclone lay to the east of the South Island. A deep and extensive cyclonic depression which had moved down from the tropics was then centred near Norfolk Island. Showers occurred in the Gisborne area and along the east coast of the Auckland and Coromandel Peninsulas on the 14th and 15th, while easterly winds became strong in the north. The cyclone, however, did nothing further to relieve the dry conditions prevailing over the country, for it became stationary and rapidly weakened, though not filling up finally until the 20th. In the South Island, during this period, a weak trough which passed eastwards across the southern portion on the 14th caused brief rain in South Westland and Southland. Similar, but even weaker troughs, on the 15th and 19th brought only scattered showers. Fors were widespread on the mornings of the 17th and 18th. Fogs were widespread on the mornings of the 17th and 18th. showers.

showers. Fogs were widespread on the mornings of the 17th and 18th. Most places experienced a period of rain as a cold front moved slowly north-eastwards across the country during the 21st and 22nd. The anticyclone following brought a rapid clearance to the South Island, and frosts were widespread on the night of the 22nd. With the development of a depression to the north-west of North Cape, barometers began to fall steadily on the 23rd. Easterly winds rose to gale force in the Auckland District, and rain spread southwards over the whole of the North Island. On the following day the deterioration extended to the South Island, with the exception of Southland and South Westland. The weather improved again in Nelson on the 25th, but elsewhere conditions remained unsettled as the northern depression began to move slowly down the Auckland Peninsula. Continuing on a south-eastward course the centre passed Napier early on the morning of the 26th. That night there were strong southerly gales locally about Cook Strait, but conditions gradually moderated thereafter. As the depression moved slowly away to the east, an anticyclone spread from the Tasman Sea across the South Island, later extending over the whole country and becoming stationary. Changeable showery weather persisted in the Gisborne and Northern Hawke's Bay Districts until the 30th, but for most of the Dominion the month ended with three days of brilliantly fine weather.
