And whereas the Auchand Harbour board (heremater caned the Board) is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain land in Freeman's Bay, Auckland Harbour, and the said reclamation is of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Board has applied to the Governor-General in Council for an order authorizing the execution

Governor-General in Council for an order authorizing the execution of the said harbour-works : And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation and is for the benefit of the public : Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize and empower the Board to reclaim from the sea in Freeman's Bay, Auckland Harbour, the area of land shown edged red on plan marked M.D. 8611, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with plan marked M.D. 8611, subject to the provisions of the said Act.

4. (1) The dues set out under their respective headings in the First Schedule hereto shall be payable on goods imported into or exported from the County by any means whatsoever.
(2) Wherever in the said First Schedule dues are made payable by the ton the tonnage shall be computed upon the ton by measurement (being forty cubic feet) or upon the ton by weight according to which mode of computation produces the larger sum.
5. (1) The master, owner, or agent of every vessel shall give to the wharfinger or other person deputed by the Council one or more copies, as the wharfinger or such other person may reasonably require, of the bills of lading, freight-lists, or manifest of the goods, or other proper account of all goods intended to be landed from the vessel, and the name or names of the consignees to whom such goods are intended to be delivered. Such bills of lading, freight-lists, manifests, or other accounts shall contain full particulars of the number of items, weights, or measurements of such goods, according as freight is payable thereon by number, weight, or measurement.
(2) Every person exporting goods from the County shall, before shipping such goods, deliver to the wharfinger, or other person deputed by the Council, a full and true account of all such goods, containing full particulars of the number of items, weights or measurement.

6. All dues on inward goods must be paid on the delivery from wharf of goods landed on the wharf and on goods not so landed at the time they are landed on shore, and on outward goods before they

are shipped. 7. The respective regulations made under the said Act and referred to in the Second Schedule hereto are revoked.



Engineering is classified only in the three main branches of Civil, Electrical, and Mechanical. Where an engineer has not satisfied the Board's requirements for qualification in one of these main branches, the restrictive or specialist class in which he is accepted is shown accepted is shown.

It is also to be noted that corporate membership of one of the recognized British Engineering Institutions entitles the holder to be styled as a "Chartered Engineer," but this information is omitted from the list.

Price Order No. 688 (Milk-Foxton)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order :--

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 688, and shall come into force on the 8th day of May, 1947. 2. In this Order-

- "Foxton Milk District" means the district within a radius
- "Foxton Milk District " means the district within a radius of five miles from the post-office at Foxton :
 "Commercial user " means a person who buys milk or cream for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substance): substance or substances) :
- substances or substances):
 "Consumer" means a person who buys milk or cream for purposes other than resale:
 "Shop dairy" means a shop where milk or cream is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise and where the milk or cream so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to milk or cream sold to a Hospital Board for use in any institution under the control of that Board or to milk or cream sold for use in any separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all milk and cream wherever produced that is sold—

- (a) To the occupier of any shop dairy within the Foxton Milk District ; or
- (b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer within the Foxton Milk District.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK AND CREAM TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES 4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk or cream to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price

- set out in the Schedule hereto. (2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows :-
 - (a) In respect of milk or cream sold by the occupier of a shop dairy: As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy :
 - (b) In respect of milk or cream sold otherwise than at a shop dairy: As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.

(3) Where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day, the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed as follows :---

- (a) For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of half-pint or less, the price shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order :
 (b) For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of more than half-pint but less than two pints (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more), the price shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order :
 (c) For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of two pints or more (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more), the price shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order :
 (c) For all milk supplied during the period in measurements of two pints or more (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more), the price shall be computed at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Schedule hereto for two pints :
 (d) Where the quantity of milk supplied to any one purchaser in any one day (exclusive of quantities supplied in measurements of half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon, the maximum price that may be charged shall be computed by reference to the total quantity of milk
- gallon, the maximum price that may be charged shall be computed by reference to the total quantity of milk so supplied to the purchaser during that day.

(4) Where any milk or cream to which this Order applies is sold otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Schedule hereto, or otherwise than in a multiple of any specified quantity, the price shall be computed as follows :-

- (a) Where the quantity supplied is less than the smallest specified quantity, the price shall be a proportionate part of the price of the smallest specified quantity :
