Authorizing the Tauranga Electric-power Board to erect, maintain, and use Electric Lines in Parts of the County of Rotorua

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, and the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the Tauranga Electric-power Board (hereinafter with its successors and assigns referred to as the licensee) to lay, construct, put up, place, and use electric lines within those parts of the County of Rotorua added to the Tauranga Electric-power District by Proclamations dated the tenth day of July, one thousand

nine hundred and thirty-one, and published in the *Gazette* on the sixteenth day of the same month, at page 2101, and dated the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and published in the *Gazette* on the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, at page 401, such electric lines at present proposed to be used being indicated by yellow lines on the plans marked P.W.D. 125403 and 125404, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington; and, further, for the purposes of section seventy-six of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, subject to the said conditions, doth hereby authorize the licensee to construct and maintain the said electric works.

SCHEDULE

1. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

IN respect of the lines hereby authorized, the licensee shall comply with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with any regulations made or to be made in amendment or amplification thereof or in substitution therefor. The conditions by clause 27-11 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 directed to be implied in all licences shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (c), (d), (e), and (f) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The primary distribution voltage shall be 11,000 volts between phases.

3. DURATION OF LICENCE

This licence shall, unless sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 20th day of April, 1968. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this licence by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this licence.

4. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes and 6d. per unit for all other purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include electrical energy used for such purposes directly or indirectly from the source of supply, except where used to charge a secondary battery for standby emergency lighting only; and, provided further, that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 10d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for such other purposes. In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £16 per kilovolt-ampere per year plus ½d. per unit. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £180 per year.

Authorizing Samuel Frederick Collier, of Otaio Gorge, Timaru, Runholder, to use Water for the Purpose of generating Electricity

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Samuel Frederick Collier, of Otaio Gorge, Timaru, Runholder (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), a licence, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to take and use from the Otaio River at a point situated in Rural Section 22851, Nimrod Survey District, in the Land District of Canterbury, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water not exceeding six cubic feet per second at any one time.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Water-power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This licence is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

Water shall be used under this licence solely for the purpose of generating electricity up to a maximum capacity of 3½ kilowatts at 230 volts direct current, and shall be taken from the stream at the point in Rural Section 22851, Nimrod Survey District, indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 125376, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this licence, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 125376:—

Price Order No. 723 (Candles)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 723, and shall come into force on the 23rd day of June, 1947.

2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 135† and 441‡ are hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Price Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies with respect to ordinary household candles manufactured in New Zealand.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF CANDLES TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. Subject to the provisions of clause 5 hereof the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for candles to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows:—

(a) Where supplies of candles are delivered to a retailer by a wholesaler who buys or is able to buy "freight free" or who not buying "freight free" receives or is entitled to receive a credit or other concession or allowance in respect of freight, and the retailer does not himself incur any freight charges, the maximum retail price per packet of six candles shall be	1	9	
(b) In any other case the maximum retail price per packet of six candles shall be	1	9½	
(c) Where candles are sold by a retailer otherwise than in packet lots of six candles each, the maximum retail price shall be	0	4	

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorize special maximum retail prices in respect of any candles to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of candles or may relate generally to all candles to which this Order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 724 (Amendment No. 2 of Price Order No. 672) (Sugar)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 724, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 672† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 20th day of June, 1947.

3. The principal Order, as amended by Price Order No. 686‡, is hereby further amended as follows: By omitting clause 5, and substituting the following clause:—

"5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause and of sub-clause (5) of the next succeeding clause, the maximum net price that may be charged by a distributor for any sugar to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Second Schedule hereto.

"(2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding sub-clause are fixed with respect to sugar sold in lots of a half-ton or more, and to sugar, irrespective of its weight, sold together with golden syrup or treacle where the total weight of the consignment of sugar and golden syrup or treacle is a half-ton or more.

"(3) (a) Where the sugar is for delivery within the Sugar Free Delivery Area the maximum prices fixed by this clause are fixed free of all transport charges.

"(b) Where the sugar is for delivery otherwise than within the Sugar Free Delivery Area the maximum prices fixed by this clause are fixed on the basis of f.o.r. or f.o.b. Auckland, as the case may require, and may be increased by the appropriate proportion of such of the following charges as have been actually incurred by the distributor in respect of the sugar concerned:—

- "(i) Sea-freight charges;
- "(ii) Marine and war-risk insurance charges computed as if the value of the sugar was the price charged by the distributor in accordance with this Order;
- "(iii) Wharfage charges;
- "(iv) Harbour Board improvement rate charges;
- "(v) Rail charges;
- "(vi) Cartage charges;

"Provided that no such charge shall exceed the charge that would have been incurred had the sugar been transported by the most economical route normally available and with respect to cartage charges being not more in any case than the charges that would have been incurred had cartage been effected by a common carrier at current rates.

"(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (2) hereof where, with respect to any lot of sugar or any lot of sugar delivered together with golden syrup or treacle, the inclusive weight of the lot is less than a half-ton, the maximum price of the sugar in the lot shall be calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause, and may be increased by the amount customarily imposed with respect to such sales in accordance with trade practice in operation on the 14th April, 1947.

"DUTY IMPOSED ON DISTRIBUTORS
