PURSUANT to the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Waitomo Electric-power District so as to include the areas described in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, situated in the County of Kawhia, bounded by a line commencing at a point in Block IX, Kawhia North Survey District, known as Urawitiki Point, being on the southern side of the entrance to Kawhia Harbour, and running easterly generally along the southern shores of the said harbour, to and up the middle of the Waiharakeke Stream to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Taumatotara No. 1F Block; thence along a right line, to and along the north-western and south-western boundaries of the said block, crossing a public road and the Waiharakeke Stream aforesaid, and along the south-western boundary of Taumatotara No. 1G Block, the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of Taumatotara No. 4B 4 Block, to and along the south-western and southern boundaries of Lot 11, as shown on the plans numbered 7460, 7461, and 7462, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland, being part of Hauturu West G 2 No. 2B 2 Block, crossing two intervening public roads, to and along the southern boundary of Section 1, Block III, Kawhia South Survey District, a right line across a public road, to and along the generally southern boundary of Section 5, Block IV of the said survey district, to its most easterly corner; thence southerly generally along the western boundary of Section 8, Block I, Orahiri Survey District, to and along the generally western boundary of Section 1, Block VIII, Kawhia South Survey District, and a right line being the last-mentioned boundary produced to the middle of a public road; thence easterly along the middle of the public roads forming the generally southern boundary of the aforesaid Section 1 and the western boundaries of Sections 3A and 3, Block V, Orahiri Survey District, to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 3, Block IX, Orahiri Survey District; thence along a right line to and along the western boundaries of the said Section 3 and Section 7 of the said Block IX, and a right line being the last-mentioned boundary produced to the middle of the Lemon Point - Waitomo Caves Main Highway; thence westerly generally along the middle of that main highway to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Lot 1 of Section 6, Block XVI, Kawhia South Survey District; thence along a right line, to and along the said north-western boundary and the north-western boundary of Kinohaku West O 1 Block, and a right line being the said boundary produced to the middle of Manga-tuahaia Stream; thence up the middle of that stream to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Lot 1 of Section 6 aforesaid; thence along a right line to and along the said south-western and southern boundaries of Lot 1 of Section 6 aforesaid, to and along the north-western boundaries of Lot 16, as shown on the plan numbered 8072, deposited as aforesaid, being part Kinohaku East No. 2 No. 6B 2 Block, and Section 3, Block IV, Maungamangero Survey District, and a right line being the last-mentioned boundary produced to the middle of the Tawarau River; thence down the middle of the said river to its confluence with the Mangaohae Stream; thence up the middle of the said Mangaohae Stream to a point in line with the northern boundary of part Section 1, Block II, Maungamangero Survey District; thence along a right line crossing a public road, to and along the said northern boundary and the northern boundaries of Sections 2 and 5 of the said Block II, and Section 2 and 7, Block I of the said survey district, and a right line being the last-mentioned boundary produced across a public road, to and along the generally eastern, northern, and western boundaries of Section 3 of Block I aforesaid, the north-western boundary of Section 4 of the said Block I, the north-eastern boundary of Section 3, Block II, Whareorino Survey District, the abutment of a public road, the eastern and north-eastern boundaries of part Section 2, Block VI, Marokopa Survey District, to and along the eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Section 2B of Block VI aforesaid, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundary of Section 16 of the said Block VI, and the abutment of a public road to the shores of the Tasman Sea; thence northerly generally along the said shores to Urawitiki Point, the point of commencement. Price Order No. 730 (Jams manufactured by Plowmans (1944), Ltd.)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 730, and shall come into force on the 4th day of July, 1947.

2. (1) In this Order—

“ Assorted case lot ” means a lot comprising different varieties of jams, and consisting of five dozen 14 oz. containers, or two and a half dozen 28 oz. containers, or one dozen 6 lb. containers, or half-dozen 10 lb. containers, or two dozen 16 oz. jars:

“ Jam ” means the product obtained by the processing of cane sugar and fruit of any kind or of different kinds (with or without the admixture of other substances), whether such product is sold or offered for sale as jam, or jelly, or conserve, or marmalade, or by any other name or description.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by those regulations.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Nothing in this Order applies with respect to any jam that is specially prepared by the manufacturer for the use of diabetics and is labelled accordingly.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies to all jam that is manufactured by Plowmans (1944), Ltd., but does not apply to jam manufactured by any other manufacturer.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF GOODS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Manufacturer's Prices

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by the manufacturer for any goods to which this Order applies, when sold to a wholesaler otherwise than in assorted case lots, shall be the appropriate price specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price per dozen containers that may be charged or received by the manufacturer for any goods to which this Order applies, when sold to a wholesaler in assorted case lots, shall be ascertained by dividing the sum of the appropriate maximum prices, as specified in the Schedule hereto, of all the jam comprised in the lot by the number of containers comprised in the lot and multiplying the result by twelve.

(3) The maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be reduced by trade discount of 10 per cent. thereof, and the prices so calculated shall be further reduced as follows:—

(a) By a discount of 3 per cent. thereof where payment is made within seven days from the date of invoice; or

(b) By a discount of 2½ per cent. thereof where payment is made after seven days from the date of invoice but on or before the 20th day of the month following the month in which delivery is made to the wholesaler.

(4) In respect of deliveries (whether made to a wholesaler or to any person on behalf of a wholesaler) to Auckland, Wellington, Napier, Hastings, Christchurch, Dunedin, or Invercargill, the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed as for delivery free of transport charges into the consignee's store.

(5) In respect of deliveries (whether made to a wholesaler or to any person on behalf of a wholesaler) to Greymouth, Westport, Lyttelton, Bluff, Hamilton, Gisborne, New Plymouth, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Wairoa, Masterton, Dannevirke, Hawera, Hokitika, Timaru, Oamaru, Blenheim, Nelson, Picton, or Motueka, the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed as for delivery by the consignor on the same terms and conditions as for payment of charges on account of sea freight, marine insurance, and rail freight as existed prior to the coming into force of this Order.

Wholesalers' Prices

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any goods to which this Order applies, when sold otherwise than in assorted case lots, shall be the appropriate price specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any goods to which this Order applies when sold in assorted case lots shall be ascertained by dividing the sum of the appropriate maximum prices, as specified in the Schedule hereto, of all the jam comprised in the lot by the number of containers comprised in the lot and multiplying the result by twelve.

(3) Subject to the provisions of subclause (5) hereof, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any goods to which this Order applies by any wholesaler in the course of a business carried on elsewhere than at Auckland, Wellington, Palmerston North, Wairoa, Christchurch, Dunedin, Invercargill, Timaru, Oamaru, Blenheim, Nelson, Picton, Motueka, Greymouth, Westport, Lyttelton, Bluff, Hamilton, Gisborne, New Plymouth, Wanganui, Napier, Hastings, Masterton, Dannevirke, Hawera, or Hokitika, shall be the price fixed by subclause (1) or subclause (2) hereof (whichever is appropriate), increased as follows:—

In respect of 16 oz. jars: By 6d. per dozen.
In respect of 14 oz. containers: By 3d. per dozen.
In respect of 28 oz. containers: By 6d. per dozen.
In respect of 6 lb. containers: By 1s. 3d. per dozen.
In respect of 10 lb. containers: By 2s. per dozen.
In respect of other containers: By ¼d. per pound of net contents of containers.

(4) The prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed subject to the same terms and conditions with respect to cash and other discounts and with respect to freight arrangements as existed between individual wholesalers and retailers immediately prior to the coming into force of this Order.

(5) The foregoing provisions of this clause shall apply with respect to sales made by the manufacturer to a retailer for purposes of retail sale.

Retailers' Prices

6. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any goods to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions, namely:—

(a) When sold by a retailer in any area within which any wholesaler carrying on business in any of the cities or boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, Dunedin, Invercargill, Timaru, Oamaru, Blenheim, Nelson, Picton, Motueka, Greymouth, Westport, Lyttelton, Bluff, Hamilton, Gisborne, New Plymouth, Wanganui, Napier, Palmerston North, Wairoa, Hastings, Dannevirke, Masterton, Hawera, or Hokitika normally undertakes the free delivery of goods to retailers, the maximum retail price shall be the appropriate maximum price specified in the Schedule hereto.

(b) When sold by a retailer in any other area, the maximum retail prices shall be the appropriate maximum price specified in the Schedule hereto, increased as follows:—

- In respect of 16 oz. jars: By 1d.
- In respect of 14 oz. containers: By ½d.
- In respect of 28 oz. containers: By 1d.
- In respect of 6 lb. containers: By 3d.
- In respect of 10 lb. containers: By 5d.
- In respect of other containers: By ½d. per pound of net contents of container.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorize special maximum retail prices in respect of any goods to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary freight charges are incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery from the source of supply that is nearest or most convenient of access to him. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this subclause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of goods or may relate generally to all goods to which this Order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 732 (Sugar)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 732, and shall come into force on the 7th day of July, 1947.

2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 672†, 686‡, and 724§ are hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order—

“The company” means The Colonial Sugar Refining Company, Limited:

The expressions “the Auckland Sugar District”, “the Southern Sugar District”, and “the Sugar Free Delivery Area” mean respectively the districts and area recognized by the sugar trade at the time of the coming into force of this Order as the Auckland Sugar District, the Southern Sugar District, and the Sugar Free Delivery Area, as the case may be:

“Manufacturer” means any person who, under the authority of a licence or permit from the Rationing Controller, endorsed with the words “Full price,” purchases sugar for use in manufacturing processes from the company under contract, from a distributor or from a retail storekeeper:

“Distributor” means a duly recognized agent of the company who acquires sugar for resale to retail storekeepers or to bakers, sugar boilers, or other persons using sugar in manufacturing processes, and, with respect to sales of sugar made direct by the company to retail storekeepers or to bakers, sugar boilers, and other persons using sugar in manufacturing processes, includes the company:

“Direct customer” means any person other than a manufacturer or distributor who purchases sugar direct from the company:

“Retail storekeeper” means a person licensed as a retailer of sugar under the provisions of the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942||.

(2) References in this Order to metropolitan areas shall be deemed to be references to the metropolitan areas described in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. (1) This Order applies only with respect to sugar manufactured by the company and sold in New Zealand.

(2) The maximum prices fixed by this Order are fixed with respect to sugar sold in packages in accordance with the customary usage in the sugar trade, and no charge shall be made by the company or any distributor for any containers other than drums or kegs used in respect of invert sugar and sacks (as distinct from 70 lb. bags) used in respect of raw sugar or boil-out sugar.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF SUGAR TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Company's Prices

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum net price that may be charged or received by the company for any sugar to which this Order applies—

(a) That is sold to a manufacturer or a distributor shall be the appropriate price fixed in the First Schedule hereto:

(b) That is sold to a direct customer shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Third Schedule hereto.

(2) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, the maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed subject to delivery terms as follows:—

(a) Where the sugar is for delivery within the Sugar Free Delivery Area: Free of all transport charges:

(b) Where the sugar is for delivery within the Auckland Sugar District but beyond the Sugar Free Delivery Area: F.o.r. Auckland or f.o.b. Auckland, as the case may require:

(c) Where the sugar is for delivery in the Southern Sugar District: F.o.b. Auckland.

(3) The delivery terms set out in the last preceding subclause apply only with respect to sugar delivered in a lot of a half-ton or more, and to sugar, irrespective of the weight thereof, that is delivered together with golden syrup or treacle and the total weight of the consignment of sugar and golden syrup or treacle is a half-ton or more.

Distributors' Prices

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause and of subclause (5) of the next succeeding clause, the maximum net price that may be charged by a distributor for any sugar to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed with respect to sugar sold in lots of a half-ton or

more, and to sugar, irrespective of its weight, sold together with golden syrup or treacle where the total weight of the consignment of sugar and golden syrup or treacle is a half-ton or more.

(3) (a) Where the sugar is for delivery within the Sugar Free Delivery Area the maximum prices fixed by this clause are fixed free of all transport charges.

(b) Where the sugar is for delivery otherwise than within the Sugar Free Delivery Area the maximum prices fixed by this clause are fixed on the basis of f.o.r. or f.o.b. Auckland, as the case may require, and may be increased by the appropriate proportion of such of the following charges as have been actually incurred by the distributor in respect of the sugar concerned:—

(i) Sea-freight charges:

(ii) Marine and war-risk insurance charges computed as if the value of the sugar was the price charged by the distributor in accordance with this Order:

(iii) Wharfage charges:

(iv) Harbour Board improvement rate charges:

(v) Rail charges:

(vi) Cartage charges:

Provided that no such increase shall exceed the amount of the charges that would have been incurred had the sugar been transported by the most economical route normally available and that nothing in this clause shall authorize the addition of cartage charges greater than would have been incurred had cartage been effected by a common carrier at current rates.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (2) hereof where, with respect to any lot of sugar or any lot of sugar delivered together with golden syrup or treacle, the inclusive weight of the lot is less than a half-ton, the maximum price of the sugar in the lot shall be calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause, and may be increased by the amount customarily imposed with respect to such sales in accordance with trade practice in operation on the 14th April, 1947.

Duty imposed on Distributors

(5) Where with respect to any sugar sold by a distributor the price fixed in accordance with the Second Schedule is increased by any of the charges specified in subclause (3) of this clause, the total amount of such charges, calculated at a rate per ton, shall be shown separately on the invoice relating to such sale, and full details of each such charge shall be made available to the purchaser and to the Tribunal if and when required.

Retail Storekeepers' Prices

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retail storekeeper carrying on business in any of the Metropolitan Areas of Auckland, Christchurch, Dunedin, or Wellington, or in any of the cities or boroughs of Gisborne, Greymouth, Hastings, Invercargill, Napier, Nelson, New Plymouth, Oamaru, Timaru, Wanganui, or Westport for any sugar to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retail storekeeper carrying on business elsewhere than in one of the places specified in the last preceding subclause shall be the appropriate price fixed by that subclause increased by the proportionate part of any transport charges incurred by the retail storekeeper: Provided, however, that the amount added by way of transport charges shall not in any case exceed the amount that would have been incurred had the sugar been purchased by the retail storekeeper from the distributor whose place of business was nearest or most convenient of access to the premises of the retail storekeeper and been conveyed to the storekeeper by the most economical route normally available at a cost not exceeding the cost that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current rates.

(3) Where delivery of any sugar is effected otherwise than over the counter or where the sale is not for cash, the maximum price of that sugar shall be the appropriate maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by ¼d. per pound, provided that where both such conditions apply the appropriate maximum price shall not be increased by more than ¼d. per pound.

(4) If in respect of any lot of sugar sold by a retail storekeeper the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, the maximum price of the lot shall be calculated to the nearest upward halfpenny.

(5) Where sugar is sold by a retail storekeeper to a manufacturer the price shall be increased by an amount calculated at the rate of £22 8s. 1d. per ton: Provided that when sugar so sold to a manufacturer is replaced by the retail storekeeper the price paid by the retail storekeeper to a distributor shall be increased by an amount calculated at the rate of £22 8s. 1d. per ton.

PROVISION FOR SPECIAL PRICES

8. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by the company or by any distributor or by any retail storekeeper, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any sugar to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary charges (transport or otherwise) are incurred by the company or by the distributor or by the retail storekeeper. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of sugar, or may relate generally to all sugar to which this Order applies sold by the company or by the distributor or by the retail storekeeper while the approval remains in force.

PROVISION WHEREBY CONTRACTS MAY BE MADE FOR SALE OF SUGAR AT PRICES EXCEEDING THE MAXIMUM PRICES FIXED BY THIS ORDER

9. Except with respect to sugar sold by a retail storekeeper, nothing contained in this Order shall be deemed to forbid the making or carrying out of a contract for the sale of any sugar to which this Order applies at a price exceeding the appropriate price fixed by this Order, provided such sale is made subject to the condition that if payment is made by prompt cash in accordance with the customary usage of the trade in the place of delivery the price shall be reduced to the appropriate price fixed by this Order.

PROVISION FOR ADDITIONAL CHARGES WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN CONTAINERS

10. (1) The several prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order may be increased by an additional charge in respect of containers as follows:—

- (a) For drums (5 cwt.) used in respect of invert sugar: By £3 per drum:
- (b) For kegs (1½ cwt.) used in respect of invert sugar: By £1 10s. per keg:
- (c) For sacks (as distinct from 70 lb. bags) used in respect of raw sugar or boil-out sugar: By 1s. per sack.

(2) On the return to the company, at its Chelsea refinery, of any drums or kegs in respect of which an additional charge has been made in accordance with the last preceding subclause, a rebate of the amount of the additional charge shall be allowed by the company in respect of all such drums or kegs returned, in good order and condition, without cost to the company by way of freight or other charges. There shall be no rebate with respect to any additional charge made for sacks.

"That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest, instalments of principal, and other charges on a loan of £20,000 (known as the 'Housing Loan, 1947'), authorized to be raised by the Taradale Town Board under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of the acquisition of land and the erection of workers' dwellings thereon, the said Taradale Town Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of three and one-eighth pence (3 $\frac{1}{8}$ d.) in the pound (£) on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the Taradale Town District; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable on the 31st day of March in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five years or until the loan is fully paid off."

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Oamaru Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest and other charges on a loan of twelve thousand three hundred pounds (£12,300), authorized to be raised by the Oamaru Borough Council and called 'The Conversion Loan Repayment Loan, 1948, of £12,300,' the Oamaru Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of seventy-two one-hundredths of a penny (72/100d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the annual value) of all rateable property in the whole of the Borough of Oamaru; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan and shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each and every year until the last maturity date of the debentures securing the said loan, being the 1st day of January, 1953, or until all such debentures are fully paid off."
