Road to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 32, Block XII, Mapara Survey District; thence westerly to and along the southern and western boundaries of the said Section 32 to a point due east of the northernmost corner of Section 33, Block XII, Mapara Survey District; thence westerly across the Mangaiti Road and along the northern boundary of the said Section 33 to the eastern boundary of Section 14, Block XII, Mapara Survey District; thence generally in a southerly direction along the eastern boundaries of the aforesaid Section 14, Section 6, and Section 14, Block II, Tangitu Survey District, to the Takiri Road; thence along such road to a point opposite the north-eastern corner of Section 17, Block II, Tangitu Survey District; thence across the road and generally in a south-westerly direction along the boundary of the aforesaid Section 17 to the most western corner of Section 18, Block II, Tangitu Survey District; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of Blocks II and I, Tangitu Survey District, to the Kakara Road; thence across the said road and along the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of Block IV, Aria Survey District, to the eastern corner of Section 10, Block III aforesaid; thence along the southern boundary of Block III, Aria Survey District, and the eastern boundary of Block VI aforesaid to the south-eastern corner of Subdivision 3 of 16, Block VI aforesaid; thence along the southern boundary of the aforesaid Subdivision 3 of 16, the southern and western boundaries of Subdivision 2 of 17, the south-eastern boundary of Section 5, the south-eastern and southern boundaries of Section 6, and the southern boundary of Section 15, all of Block VI, Aria Survey District, to the Waitewhena Road; thence across and along that road to the south-eastern corner of Section 8, Block V, Aria Survey District; thence along the southern and western boundaries of the said Section 8, the southern boundaries of Sections 3 and 2, the western boundaries of Sections 2 and 1, all of Block V, Aria Survey District, and the western boundaries of Sections 21, 19, 22, and 11, all of Block I, Aria Survey District, to the Paraheka Stream; thence down the middle of the Paraheka Stream to the middle of the Mokau River; thence up the middle of the Mokau River to a point in line with the north-western boundary of part Mangaawakino 8A 2B 2 Block; thence along a right line to and along the said north-western boundary, and a right line across Section 5 of Block VI, Awakino East Survey District, and a public road, to and along the north-western boundary of part Mangaawakino 8A 2B 1 Block, the north-western boundaries of Mangaawakino Nos. 7 and 6 Blocks, the northern boundary of Mangaawakino No. 4 Block, the northern and western boundaries of Mangaawakino No. 1c Block, the north-western boundary of part of Mangapapa B 2 Block, as shown on the plan numbered 1087, deposited as aforesaid, and a right line being that boundary produced to the middle of the Mokau River; thence up the middle of the Mokau River to a point in line with the southern boundary of Subdivision 1 of Section 3, Block III, Mokau Survey District; thence to and along the southern and western boundaries of the said Subdivision 1 of Section 3, the northern, western, and southern boundaries of part Section 3 to the eastern boundary of Lot 13 on the plan numbered 3049, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at New Plymouth; thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said Lot 13, along the southern boundaries of Lots 7 and 6 on the plan numbered 3836, deposited as aforesaid, to Tawariki Trig. and a right line across a public road, to and along the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 4 of Block I aforesaid, to and along the southern boundary of Section 6B, Block II, Orahiri Survey District, and a right line being that boundary produced to the middle of Tapuae Road; thence northerly generally along the middle of that road to a point in line with the southern boundary of Lot 2 of Section 7 of Block II aforesaid; thence along a right line, to and along the southern and south-eastern boundaries of the said Lot 2, the south-eastern boundary of Lot 1 of Section 7 aforesaid, and the south-eastern boundary of Section 5 of Block II aforesaid, to and along the south-western boundary of Section 25, Block III, Orahiri Survey District, a right line across a public road, to and along the generally southern and eastern boundaries of Section 29 of Block III aforesaid, along the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Section 7 of the said Block III to the north-western corner of Section 17 of Block III aforesaid; thence along a right line, passing through the said Section 7, to the south-western corner of part Otorohanga No. 2c 2B Block; thence easterly along the generally southern boundary of the said block, crossing the intervening public road, the south-eastern boundary of Section 5 of Block III aforesaid, to and along the south-western boundary of Section 6, Block IV, of the said survey district, and a right line crossing a public road, and passing through Sections 7B and 8A of Block IV aforesaid to the south-western corner of Section 43 of the said Block IV; GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith:

To Our Trusty and Well-beloved RONALD HUGH WHITE, of OTANE, Sheep-farmer, the Honourable Mr. RICHARD EDDY, of Wellington, Member of the Legislative Council, LIONEL CHARINGTON GARDINER, of Waiau, Sheep-farmer, WALLACE FLETCHER METCALFE, of Te Araroa, Sheep-farmer, WILLIS ALAN SCAIFE, of Wanaka, Sheep-farmer, and HOWARD WILFRED YOUREN, of Napier, Sheep-farmer: GREETING.

- (4) The availability, efficiency, and utilization of labour, both permanent and casual, in the industry, with special reference to the drift of rural population and the possibility and means of attracting labour to the country, including the improvement of rural housing and the provision of community, social, and recreational amenities comparable with those of the towns:

And to report the steps which you may deem to be practicable and desirable to meet such detrimental conditions as you may find to exist in the industry in respect of the several matters aforesaid, whether by way of adjustment, reorganization, or otherwise, and any other measures which you may deem necessary or expedient to improve the conditions of the sheep-farming industry and to promote the welfare of the persons engaged or employed therein:

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose save to His Excellency the Governor-General, in pursuance of these presents, or by His Excellency's direction, the contents of any report so made

or to be made by you, or any evidence or information obtained by you in the exercise of the powers hereby conferred upon you except such evidence or information as is received in the course of a sitting open to the public :

And it is hereby declared that the powers hereby conferred shall be exercisable notwithstanding the absence at any time of any one or more of the members hereby appointed so long as the Chairman, or a member deputed by the Chairman to act in his stead, and two other members be present and concur in the exercise of such powers :
