A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Schedule to the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 128 of the twenty-third day of the same month, at page 3778, defining the middle-line of a road in Blocks I and II, Otahuhu Survey District—viz., a deviation of the Auckland-Hamilton Main Highway—and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the said road shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### AIR SEA RESCUE

THE following notice, M. 300, issued by the Minister of Transport, London, is republished herewith for general information.

#### NOTICE TO SHIPOWNERS AND MASTERS

1. In view of the great increase in the employment of aircraft over the sea, the following arrangements have been made to render assistance to aircraft in distress and to ensure the rescue of passengers and crew of aircraft casualties at sea.

the sea, the following arrangements have been made to render assistance to aircraft in distress and to ensure the rescue of passengers and crew of aircraft casualties at sea.

2. As Masters are already aware, every Master, on receiving information of distress at sea from any source (including aircraft in distress at sea) is required to render assistance to every person who is in danger of being lost, unless the Master is unable, or in the special circumstances of the case, considers it unreasonable or unnecessary to do so or unless he is released from his obligation by the fact that another ship has undertaken this duty or he receives information that his assistance is no longer required.

3. All information concerning aircraft in distress at sea is passed to the R.A.F. Rescue Control Centre in whose area of responsibility the casualty has occurred or is likely to occur. Aircraft will then be sent, if necessary and practicable, to search for and fix as accurately as possible the position of the casualty. Such aircraft will carry equipment for dropping to survivors. Reliance for rescue will be placed upon naval and merchant ships and on lifeboats of the R.N.L.I. When rescue is unlikely to be effected within a reasonable time by such means, aircraft carrying an airborne lifeboat will be sent. It should be appreciated that the range of the airborne lifeboat as a surface craft is limited and that there may be injured survivors. The assistance of a merchant or other ship may therefore still be required to effect the final rescue.

4. The assistance that can be given to aircraft in distress may be limited in practice by the short time which aircraft normally remain afloat. For this reason it is important that Masters of ships within a reasonable distance of an aircraft in distress should proceed with the greatest possible speed to her assistance.

5. Every endeavour will be made to give merchant ships an accurate position of an aircraft casualty, dinghy, or airborne lifeboat. An aircraft will, if practicable, be kept

reasonable distance of the position of the casualty additional assistance from the rescue agencies mentioned in paragraph 3 will always be sought.

6. When given such a fix the ship should at once consult any other ships in the neighbourhood on the best procedure to be adopted, as is the practice in the case of casualties to merchant ships, and a decision should be reached as quickly as possible as to which ship, if any, can best render assistance. The ship proceeding to the casualty should answer the Station sending the broadcast, giving its identity, position, and intended action.

7. Merchant ships will ordinarily be informed of casualties to aircraft by wireless from a Shore Station, or from a search or rescue aircraft. They may, however, pick up S.O.S. messages from aircraft in distress, in which case they should act as in 6 above and also relay the messages to the nearest Shore Station.

8. Where a merchant ship has received an S.O.S. message direct from an aircraft in distress and is proceeding towards the casualty, a bearing should be taken on the transmission, and a message sent by the merchant ship to the Shore Station or other vessels in the vicinity giving the call-signal of the distressed aircraft and the time at which the distress message was received, followed by the bearing and time at which the signal ceased.

9. Merchant ships may receive information of distress in any of the following ways:—

of the following ways:

A. By W/T on the international distress frequency from-

(i) A distressed aircraft still in flight (see Appendix A for the form of such message);
(ii) Survivors after casualty has occurred by hand-operated emergency radio transmitter (see Appendix B for form of message);
(iii) A shore wireless station (see Appendix C for form

of message;
(iv) A search aircraft (see Appendix D).

B. By visual signals from-

(i) A distressed aircraft;

Apart from other obvious signs, an aircraft may indicate it is in distress by firing a succession of red pyrotechnical lights. Navigation markers dropped by aircraft at sea, emitting smoke or flame and smoke, should not be mistaken for distress signals. Low flying is not in itself an indication of distress. Aircraft in distress which are forced to alight in the sea are instructed to do so ahead and on the lee of a ship.

(ii) A search aircraft—by signalling lamp using the international procedure and plain language;

If the aircraft wishes to guide the ship to the position of the casualty or survivors it will fly low round the ship. It may fire a succession of green pyrotechnical lights or make a series of green flashes. It will then fly off in the direction in which the ship is to be led. British pilots are instructed to rock their aircraft laterally when flying off in the direction of the casualty. The ship should acknowledge receipt of this signal and of any signal under (ii) above by a succession of "T's" in Morse code, or by day, by hoisting the answering signal consisting of a pennant with alternate red and white vertical stripes.

- (iii) Survivors in the sea, in an aircraft rubber dinghy or air-borne lifeboat. Such signals may consist of any of the following:
  - 1. Firing pyrotechnical signals emitting one or

1. Firing pyrotecnnical signals emitting one or more red stars.
2. Flashing a heliograph.
3. Flashing S.O.S. or other distinctive signal by hand torch or other signalling lamp.
4. Flying the international distress signal consisting of a flag with a ball, or anything resembling a ball, above or below it.

5. Flying the aircraft dingly distress flag consisting

above or below it.

5. Flying the aircraft dinghy distress flag consisting of a red pennant with a white circular patch.

6. Blowing of whistles.

7. Lighting small flares giving a greenish light, lasting for about four seconds.

8. Using fluorescene dye marker giving an extensive bright green colour to the sea around the survivors.

9. A dinghy may also be located by yellow kite being flown to support the aerial for the emergency radio transmitter.

#### APPENDIX A

Form of Distress Calls and Messages from Military Aircraft on 500 kc/s.

- 1. The exact form of W/T distress call or message from an aircraft in flight will depend on the time available to send it between the onset of the emergency and the landing of the aircraft in the sea. This may be only a matter of seconds.

  2. When time permits, a separate distress call and distress message will be sent in the following form:—
- - (a) Distress Call:

S.O.S. (made three times). Prosign "D.E." Aircraft call sign (made three times). Twenty seconds dash. Prosign "K."

- 3. The above distress call and message may be sent together in the following form :-
  - (c) Distress Call and Message combined:

Text of the message (as in paragraph 2 (b) above). Prosign "K."

#### APPENDIX B

Form of Distress Message from an Aircraft Dinghy Emergency Transmitter on 500 kc/s.

- 1. The emergency W/T transmitter is fitted with an automatic keying device to transmit repeatedly one of the following signals:—
  - (a) SOS followed by a long dash.

    This will normally be sent.
  - (b) AA followed by a long dash.
- 2. Alternatively, the hand keying switch may be used to transmit other messages in Morse code.

#### APPENDIX C

Form of Aircraft Distress Broadcast by British Shore W/T Station by W/T on 500 kc/s. and by R/T on 1650 kc/s.

- 1. The international distress frequencies will be used to notify ships at sea of aircraft or personnel in distress. Distress broadcasts will normally be made immediately on receipt of definite distress information and irrespective of other action taken to effect rescue. Once rescue has been effected, the distress broadcasts will be cancelled by the originator.
- by the originator.

  2. Broadcasts on the distress frequency will be sent out by G.P.O. stations in accordance with the priority borne by the prefix. Transmissions will be made over a period and in accordance with G.P.O. instructions to coast W/T stations. Any acknowledgment received will be passed to the originator.

  3. Messages broadcast to shipping concerning aircraft in distress will be sent in one of the following forms:—

(a) Concerning a known aircraft casualty:-

"Rescue aircraft begins S.O.S. . . . . . ." (followed by the text, giving a position in latitude and longitude and including a request to any ship near the position to answer the message and give its identity, position, and proposed action.)

The message will always be in plain English.

(b) Concerning an aircraft missing on a flight over the sea but concerning which there is no other definite distress information. The message will be in the nature of a request to shipping on or near the route to keep a lookout for survivors, &c.

"Rescue aircraft begins XXX by the text of the message which will include the route of the aircraft).

The message will be in plain English and need not be answered unless it contains a request to do so.

#### APPENDIX D

Communication with Aircraft Searching for Survivors

- (1) All military aircraft on search and rescue operations mainwatch on 500 kc/s. (W/T) at the following times:-
  - (i) From ten minutes past each hour until twenty minutes past each hour.
  - (ii) From forty minutes past each hour until fifty minutes past each hour. (All times are G.M.T.)

Messages under para. 9 A (iv) may be sent to merchant ships at these times and messages from ships to aircraft should similarly be sent at these times. Searching aircraft and merchant ships should maintain wireless silence on this frequency from 15 to 18 and

from 45 to 48 minutes past each hour.

(2) Merchant ships should use their normal W/T and R/T call (2) Merchant ships should use their normal W/T and R/T call signs when communicating with aircraft. An aircraft wishing to send a message to a merchant ship by W/T without knowing its call sign will use the signal of inquiry "CQ" in place of the call sign of the ship and "GEZAA" followed by the last two numerals of the aircraft's service number instead of its own call sign. A merchant ship wishing to call an aircraft without knowing its call sign will use "GEZAA" in place of the call sign of the aircraft.

(3) Military aircraft on search and rescue operations maintain continuous watch on 6500 kc/s. (W/T) by day and 3805 kc/s. (W/T) at night and W/T messages to them may be sent by ships on those frequencies. Aircraft will answer such messages on the same frequency.

# Weather Summary for the Month of July, 1947

General.—The most noteworthy feature of July's weather was the succession of active depressions which crossed the Auckland Province, resulting in frequent and at times heavy rains in this region. A spell of westerly weather occurred in the middle of the month

when two deep depressions passed close to Southland.

On the whole it was a good winter month for farmers. Stock is in good condition and, although frosts were frequent in the South Island, the abundance of sunshine has, in most places, prevented the soil from becoming unworkable. Autumn-sown wheat is reported

to be coming on well.

Rainfall.—Only in the Auckland Province, excluding the Raglan-Waikato districts, was the total rainfall above average. North of Gisborne and about the Coromandel Peninsula over double the average was recorded, while Mangawai, with a total of 11.34 in., had its wettest month since observations began in 1917. On the other hand South Canterbury and most of Otago experienced their driest month for over fifty years. At several stations no measurable rainfall was recorded during the month. In North Canterbury, too, it was a very dry month.

Temperatures.—In Central Otago, Southland, and the Canterbury Plains mean temperatures were slightly below normal. Elsewhere they were above normal, although in most places by only small amounts. Greatest excesses of almost two degrees occurred in the interior

There was snow down to sea level in the south on the 17th, 28th, and 30th, but fails were light.

Sunshine.—The total sunshine was above normal over most of the South Island. Although a few persistent fogs kept it below normal in Central Otago, the remainder of the province, and Canterbury as well, enjoyed considerable excesses. July records for sunshine were broken at Ashburton, Christchurch, Hanmer Springs, and Lincoln. Wellington also had a sunny month, but conditions elsewhere in the North Island were below normal, greatest defficiencies being reported from eastern parts of the Auckland Province.

Weather Sequence.—On the 1st an anticyclone covered most of the Dominion, but a depression was approaching from the North Tasman Sea. Rain developed over the Auckland Province, later extending to North Taranaki and down the East Coast of the North Island. The depression crossed North Auckland or the morning of 3rd and moved away stadily eastwards. The heaviest rainfalls were near the Coromandel Peninsula, where some local flooding occurred. In the South Island, meanwhile, the weather had been fine though frosty. On the 5th, however, light rain began to fall in South Westland with the development of a complex disturbance in the Central Tasman Sea. During the approach of this disturbance an intense anticyclone remained almost stationary to the east of the country.

From the 5th to the 10th skies were mainly cloudy east of the South Island ranges, morning fogs being common, but elsewhere this was a period of dull unsettled weather and intermittent rain. Some substantial falls were reported from the Auckland Province, especially about the Bay of Plenty.

On the 12th a depression from the Tasman Sea was centred over the Auckland Peninsula, while another had formed south-east of Cook Strait. After giving further rain to the northern and eastern parts of the North I

east.

On the 20th a depression was located off Westland. Taking a rather unusual course it moved northwards, crossed North Cape on the morning of the 22nd, and later moved away slowly to the east. Accompanying the depression a band of rain spread northwards over the North Island, and for the next few days conditions remained unsettled and showery over the North Auckland, Coromandel, and Gisborne districts. Elsewhere there was a rapid clearance as an anticyclone built up over the South Island, the weather remaining fine until the 25th except in Southland where the passage of a weak trough on the 21st was attended by a few showers.

During the 26th a shallow trough moved eastwards across the country, a depression forming next day east of Marlborough. Light rain fell in most places, and some showers persisted on the 27th. On the 28th it was fine generally.

During the 29th rain developed in the far north, later extending over the northern half of the Island as a depression moved southeastwards across Auckland and the Bay of Plenty. On the following day a weak secondary depression crossed North Auckland, while a cold front advanced rapidly over the South Island, followed by cold showery south-westerlies. Next morming there was a rapid improvement as the front moved north-eastwards off the country.
