PURSUANT to section eight of the Coinage Act, 1933, and for the purposes of determining the dimensions, the designs, and the denominations, weights, and composition of cupro-nickel coins to be made and issued under the said Act, and the amount of the remedy to be allowed in the making thereof, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim as follows:

1. This Proclamation may be cited as the Coinage Proclamation, 1947.
2. There may be made and issued cupro-nickel coins of the denominations specified in the Schedule hereto.
3. The designs and dimensions of the said cupro-nickel coins shall be the same as those set out in Part I of the Coinage Proclamation,

1939, in respect of silver coins.

4. The composition and weights and the amount of the remedy to be allowed in the making of the said cupro-nickel coins shall be as specified in the Schedule hereto.

- 6. The Board may erect on and exhibit from the said wharf and maintain thereon at its own expense such lights as the Board may deem necessary for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister of Marine.

The licence, rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force and be effectual until the 31st December, 1960, and no longer, unless in the meantime such licence, rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, resumed, or revoked by competent authority; and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such licence, right, power, or privilege without the consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained.
- 12. The licence, rights, powers, and privileges granted and conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be revoked and resumed at any time by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever on giving to the Board three calendar months' previous notice.

If the Board shall commit or suffer a breach of the terms and conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any or them, then this Order in Council and every licence, right, power, or privilege hereunder may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Board or other proceedings.

Building Construction Control Notice No. 23

NOTICE is hereby given that, pursuant to the Supply Control Regulations 1939 and the Building Emergency Regulations 1939, I hereby require and direct as follows:-

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Building Construction Control Notice No. 23.
- 2. This notice shall come into force on the day next following the date of publication thereof in the Gazette.
- 3. No owner, within the meaning of the Building Emergency Regulations 1939, of any galvanized steel sheets (new or second-hand) of a kind referred to in clause 4 or clause 5 hereof shall sell, supply, dispose of, or part with the possession or control of any of the sheets to any other person unless—
  - (a) The owner first receives an application duly completed by that other person on a form approved by the Building Controller and provided for the purpose by the owner;
    (b) The application is submitted to and approved by the Building Controller or some person authorized by the Building Controller in that behalf; and
    (c) The owner forwards every such application to the Building

  - (c) The owner forwards every such application to the Building Controller, P.O. Box 1708, Wellington, or as he directs, at such time as he directs:

Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply in any case where the owner is satisfied that the galvanized sheets are intended to be used for a purpose specified in clause 4 or clause 5 hereof.

- 4. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person shall use galvanized corrugated steel sheets (new or second-hand) for any purpose other than the manufacture of supply-tanks of 100-gallon capacity or more or the repair of existing galvanized corrugated steel or galvanized corrugated iron roofs of dwellings but not including a total of more than one-fourth of the area of the existing roof. existing roof.
- 5. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person shall use flat galvanized steel or iron sheets or galvanized corrugated steel or iron sheets which have been flattened (new or second-hand) for any purpose other than the manufacture of door and window flashings, termite cappings in districts in which the Termites Act, 1940, applies, pumice-concrete washing-copper casings, hot-water cylinder casings, tops and bottoms for galvanized iron tanks of 100-gallon capacity or more, baths, sinks, lead-edged ridging, roof valley linings, eaves gutters, and rain-water downpipes.

  6. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller.
- 6. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person, whether manufacturer, contractor, subcontractor, or owner, shall use new or second-hand ridging, eaves gutters, or rain-water downpipes manufactured from galvanized steel or iron,

whether new or second-hand, for any purpose other than the repair of existing galvanized steel or iron ridging, eaves gutters, or downpipes of dwellings only.

- 7. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person shall use copper (other than copper tube) for any building or constructional work otherwise than for the manufacture of washing coppers, hot-water cylinders, drainage vent stacks, flushing cisterns, or supply-tanks of up to 50 gallons in capacity. For the purposes of this clause the term "copper" includes copper sheets and parts of copper sheets and any other kind or form of copper capable of being fabricated for the purposes of any kind of constructional work.
- 8. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person shall use copper tube for any constructional work otherwise than as piping for conveying hot water (including any exhaust pipe from a hot-water cylinder) and as a cold-water feed-pipe from a supply-tank or pressure-reducing valve to a hot-water cylinder.
- 9. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person shall use screwed steel conduit for the enclosure of electric cable for internal wiring in any case where an alternative method of enclosure or covering is provided for in the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, but such alternative method of enclosure or covering shall be used.
- 10. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person shall use corrugated asbestos cement sheets

  - (a) For wall sheathing; or(b) For the purpose of roofing new houses built in urban areas in the North Island.
- 11. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no owner or person acting in the general management or control of any sash and door factory or joinery factory shall manufacture any door or allow or permit any door to be manufactured therein unless the door is one of the types specified in, and conforming to, the requirements of the New Zealand Emergency Standard Specification entitled "New Zealand Emergency Standard Specification for Doors," issued by the New Zealand Standards Institute under the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, bearing date November, 1945, and numbered N.Z.S.S. E. 106, as amended from time to time, or with any specification which may hereafter be issued in substitution therefor. For the purposes of this clause "door" means a door exceeding 4 ft. 6 in. in height, but not exceeding 7 ft. 6 in. in height; but does not include a cupboard door or a door for any domestic outbuilding or garage.
- 12. In any case where an application has been made to any local authority, whether before or after the publication of this notice, for a permit for any constructional work, the local authority shall not issue the permit therefor without the precedent consent of the Building Controller.
- 13. In any case where any person proposes to commence any constructional work and no permit therefor is required from a local authority, that person shall not commence the work without the precedent consent of the Building Controller unless the work is—
  - (a) Paperhanging or painting which is not prohibited by clause
  - 16 hereof; or

    (b) Work which is maintenance or replacement work or which relates only to fixtures and fittings and in which the value of the building materials required to be used does not exceed £10.
- 14. Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person shall use cement or ready mixed concrete for any of the following purposes:—

  - (i) Concrete paving.(ii) The manufacture of concrete paving slabs.

  - (ii) The manufacture of concrete paving slabs.
    (iii) Concrete curbing and channelling.
    (iv) The construction of paths.
    (v) The construction of terraces.
    (vi) The construction of fences (not including fence-posts).

    (x) The construction of swimming-pools.

Except with the precedent consent of the Building Controller, no person shall use paint containing white lead or linseed oil for the purpose of painting or coating the external exposed surface of any walls, whether part of a building or not, finished in concrete, as bestos-cement sheets, brick, plaster, or stone
