The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21--01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage and the transmitting voltage shall be approximately 230 volts direct current.

#### 7. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of this licence, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the State Hydro-electric Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 3 kilowatts.
