PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby authorize the Lyttelton Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as the licensee) to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto on the following conditions.

CONDITIONS

1. Implied Conditions

The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENCE TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. System of Supply

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (a) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935.

4. Duration of Licence

4. Duration of Licence
Unless sooner determined, this licence shall continue in force
until the 12th day of March, 1959; provided that, in so far as it
authorizes the licensee to erect and use electric lines to supply consumers within the area of supply of the Christchurch City Council,
but not in so far as it authorizes the licensee to erect and use any
other electric lines, it shall cease and determine when a supply of
electricity becomes available to those consumers from the Christchurch City Council.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY

The licensee shall not in respect of electrical energy supplied from the electric lines authorized to be used by this licence make any charge exceeding the corresponding charge which the licensee may from time to time be authorized to make in respect of electrical energy supplied by the licensee from electric lines authorized to be used by any other licence for the time being held by it.

The single bronze oak leaf emblem signifying in the Armed Forces and the Merchant Navy, either a Mention in Despatches, a King's Commendation for Brave Conduct, or a King's Commendation for Valuable Service in the Air, if granted for service in the Second World War, 1939–1945, is worn on the riband of the War Medal, 1939–1945. If the War Medal has not been granted, the amblem is worn directly on the cost after any medal ribandatt emblem is worn directly on the coat after any medal ribands #1.

Mention in Despatches, 1945, and Subsequently

The single bronze oak leaf emblem, if granted for service in operations after the cessation of hostilities in the Second World War, is worn on the riband of the appropriate General Service Medal. If a General Service Medal has not been granted, the emblem is worn directly on the coat after any medal riband‡‡.

The single bronze oak leaf emblem is also used in the Forces to denote a King's Commendation for Brave Conduct or a King's Commendation for Valuable Service in the Air granted since the cessation of hostilities in the Second World War.

King's Commendation for Brave Conduct, 1939-1945, and Subsequently

The emblem of sliver laurel granted to civilians, other than those in the Merchant Navy, to denote a King's Commendation for Brave Conduct during the Second World War, 1939-1945, is worn on the riband of the Defence Medal. When the Defence Medal has not been granted or the award is for services subsequently to the war, the emblem is worn directly on the coat after any medal ribands‡‡.

King's Commendation for Valuable Service in the Air, 1939-1945, and Subsequently

The oval silver badge granted to denote a civil King's Commendation for Valuable Service in the Air is worn on the coat immediately below any medals or medal riband‡‡, or in civil air line uniform on the panel of the left breast pocket.

SUMMARY OF THE WEATHER FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1947

General.—August was a favourable month. As in the previous two months temperatures were relatively mild. Stock has wintered exceptionally well, and with few exceptions feed is abundant. Conditions for lambing and calving were good, although the cold rains of the 17th in the Wairarapa caused some losses among new lambs.

Rainfall.—Hawke's Bay had only about half the average rainfall. The greatest excesses were in Nelson and in parts of the Wairarapa, but even there departures from normal were not great. In Marlborough and in North and South Canterbury the rainfall was also in excess, but elsewhere totals differed little from the average.

Temperatures Over the August Province mean temperatures were equal to or slightly below the average. Over the remainder

but elsewhere totals differed little from the average.

Temperatures.—Over the Auckland Province mean temperatures were equal to or slightly below the average. Over the remainder of the country they were above average, greatest departures being in Canterbury and on the West Coast. On the 5th Christchurch recorded its highest August temperatures since 1902, while in Wellington the 25th was the warmest day of any August since 1909.

Sunshine.—It was a very sunny month about Dunedin and over mid-Canterbury, the excess amounting to forty hours and twenty-five hours respectively over the average for August. Totals were below average on the West Coast and in Nelson and the Wairarapa, though only by small amounts.

Weather Sequence.—For the first few days barometers remained very low to the south, while an anticyclone moved across the North Tasman Sea, the centre passing North Cape on the 3rd. The weather was showery in Westland, but fair elsewhere.

With the arrival of a cold front from the west, rain became heavy for a time in Westland on the 4th. The development of a small disturbance over South Auckland on the following day caused brief but heavy rain, and some thunderstorms locally. A vigorous cold front traversed the South Island during the night of the 6th and the North Island on the following morning. Heavy rain and some severe thunderstorms accompanied its passage, while a strong showery south-westerly current followed, gales occurring in exposed places.

On the 8th a long narrow ridge of high pressure moved in from the west, giving a temporary improvement. Next day a depression formed over Southland. With pressure rising steadily to the south-east, it began to move slowly north-eastwards up the South Island, crossing Cook Strait on the 10th, and later moving away east of the North Island. Ahead of the depression, rain was chiefly confined to western districts, but the cold southerlies which followed brought dull wet weather to the east coast. Much snow fell on the higher parts of both Islands, with some ligh south-east of the Dominion.

On the 12th north-easterlies were freshening as a complex trough approached from the west. Except to the east of the South Island ranges conditions were generally unsettled until the 15th, while this trough, followed by a secondary cold front, moved slowly eastwards

across the country.

Although there was a temporary improvement in the east on the night of the 15th, conditions were even then deteriorating again in

Attnough there was a temporary improvement in the east on the light of the 15th, conditions were even then deteriorating again in the west with the approach of another complex trough from the Tasman Sea.

A depression which formed in this trough moved across the North Island during the night of the 16th. Cold southerlies soon spread over the Dominion, rising to strong gale force for a time about Cook Strait and the southern half of the North Island, and bringing heavy rains to this area. It soon cleared in the South Island, but another cold southerly change on the 19th was accompanied by a period of showers east of the Alps. An intense anitcyclone then built up over New Zealand and, although showers persisted about Gisborne until the 21st, the weather otherwise was fine with hard frosts in both Islands.

With the centre of the antiqueless point the Alphada on the 22nd on extension because the move clowly continued.

With the centre of the anticyclone near the Chatham Islands on the 22nd, an extensive depression began to move slowly eastwards across the Tasman Sea. North-easterly winds prevailed, later becoming strong in the north. Brilliantly fine weather continued over most of the country, but rain soon developed in the far north and extended gradually over the remainder of the Auckland Province. On the 25th it spread to Taranaki, Nelson, and the West Coast, and a general deterioration followed.

One low-pressure centre passed over the South Island on the night of the 26th, another over Auckland on the 28th, while a third moved across Nelson and Cook Strait on the 29th. During this generally unsettled period rain fell at times over most of the country, though falls

were not substantial.

South-westerly conditions prevailed for the final two days, the weather being fair east of the main ranges, but changeable and showery elsewhere.

Price Order No. 761 (Milk and Cream)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

- This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 761, and shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
 (1) The Price Orders specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.
 (2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
 3. (1) In this Order—
 - - "Commercial user" means a person who buys milk or cream for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances):
 "Consumer" means a person who buys milk or cream for purposes other than resale:
 "Shop dairy" means a shop where milk or cream is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise and where the milk or cream so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy.
- (2) References in this Order to milk districts shall be deemed to be references to the milk districts described in the Second Schedule hereto.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

- 4. (1) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to milk or cream sold to a Hospital Board for use in any institution under the control of that Board or to milk or cream sold for use in any separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926.
- (2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all milk and cream wherever produced that is sold in any of the milk districts described in the Second Schedule to this Order—

 - (a) To the occupier of any shop dairy; or(b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK AND CREAM TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk or cream thich this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

 (2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows:—
 - - (a) In respect of milk or cream sold by the occupier of a shop dairy: As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy: (b) In respect of milk or cream sold otherwise than at a shop dairy: As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.
- (3) Where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day, the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed as follows:—
 - (a) Where the total quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of a half-pint or less, the price of all milk so supplied during the period shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Third Schedule hereto for a half-pint:
 - (b) Where the total quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of more than a half-pint but less than two pints, the price for all milk so supplied during the period (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more) shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Third Schedule hereto:
 - (c) Where the total quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of two pints or more, the price for all milk so supplied during the period (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more) shall be computed on the total quantity of milk supplied during the period at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Third Schedule hereto for two pints:
 - (d) Where the total quantity of milk supplied to any one purchaser in any one day (exclusive of milk supplied at any one time in a lot of a half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon, the maximum price that may be charged shall be computed on the total quantity of milk so supplied to the purchaser during that day at the appropriate rate fixed in the Third Schedule
- (4) Where any milk or cream to which this Order applies is sold otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Third Schedule hereto, or otherwise than in a multiple of any specified quantity, the price shall be computed as follows:—

 - (a) Where the quantity supplied is less than the smallest specified quantity, the price shall be a proportionate part of the price of the smallest specified quantity:

 (b) Where the quantity supplied exceeds a specified quantity but is less than twice the specified quantity, the price of any surplus over that specified quantity shall be a proportionate part of the price of that specified quantity:

 (c) Where the quantity supplied exceeds twice the amount of the nearest lower specified quantity but is not an exact multiple of that specified quantity, the price of any surplus over the nearest multiple of the specified quantity shall be a proportionate part of that specified quantity.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all milk and cream wherever produced that is sold—

(a) To the occupier of any shop dairy within the Blenheim Milk District, the Greymouth Milk District, or the Lyttelton Milk District; or
(b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer within the Blenheim Milk District, the Greymouth Milk District, or the Lyttelton Milk District.

(b) Where the total quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of more than a half-pint but less than two pints, the price for all milk so supplied during the period (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more) shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Schedule hereto:

(c) Where the total quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of two pints or more, the price for all milk so supplied during the period (exclusive of milk so supplied on any one day of a total quantity of one gallon or more) shall be computed on the total quantity of milk supplied during the period at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed in the Schedule hereto for two pints:

(d) Where the total quantity of milk supplied at any one time in a lot of a half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon, the maximum price that may be charged shall be computed on the total quantity of milk so supplied to the purchaser during that day at the appropriate rate fixed in the Schedule hereto.
