For the purposes of this Order, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the said regulations, any person who sells by retail to any one purchaser, for delivery at any one time, not less than three standard crate lots of export-size, medium-size, or pancake-size cheeses, whether or not all the standard crate lots contain the same size of cheeses, shall in respect of that sale be deemed to be a wholesaler, and the provisions of this Order as to maximum wholesale prices shall apply accordingly with respect to every such sale. to every such sale.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER
